SUBJECT: Consultants

1. [Redacted] stated that [Redacted] contract was dated on 16 May 1952 and was to run to 16 May 1953. However, this is in conflict with the [Redacted] regulations that consultants cannot be carried over beyond the fiscal year ending 1 July. Therefore, technically, [Redacted] contract ran out in July 1952.

[Redacted] stated he would put through the present request for his services but asked that I bring this matter to your attention.

2. In this connection, I recall that [Redacted] contract was renewed in July 1952 and will expire 1 July 1953. Inasmuch as we plan to use his consulting services, it will be necessary to re-negotiate his contract in the near future. It is also a point, whether it is important or not, that [Redacted] is a consultant to the Training Division. In re-negotiating his contract, it may be well to change this so he will be a consultant to this Division.
