MEMORANDUM FOR:

SUBJECT : Coordination of

1. Friday, 21 January 1966, I met with Dr. [redacted] Chief, Division of Toxicology, [redacted] for the purpose of discussing the [redacted] on drug Screening.
2. After a brief review of the proposal in my presence, Dr. [redacted] stated that, on the surface the proposal looked acceptable, but that he would prefer to study it in detail. I left the proposal with him and informed him that I would return within a week.
3. Thursday, 27 January 1966, I returned to [redacted] to confer with Dr. [redacted] once again concerning the [redacted] Proposal.
4. Dr. [redacted] first comment was that the techniques described seemed too elaborate and that simpler tests could be used to evaluate incapacitating agents. I explained that we were looking for more subtle effects than frank incapacitation. He agreed, that in this case, the suggested techniques were rational.
5. Dr. [redacted] only other objection was the introduction of basic pharmacology early in the screen. I agreed on this point and will take it up with Dr. [redacted]
6. Dr. [redacted] stated that the price was in line with his experience. He also stated that [redacted] was capable and did work for [redacted]
