A. Yes, sir, I did.

A. The girl in Mr. Chester Lane's office. I asked her to word it. It is not like a lawyer would say it, but I asked her to use my own words like I would say it, and if you want me to explain anything, I will do that for you.

She took it down as I gave it to her. I want some relief so that my child can continue his schooling. I got 10 more weeks for him to go and I want a letter to Major Burg so that I can get it out there quickly and stop them from thinking that the FBI is looking for me. What I want is a letter or something to convince these people of just what the FBI is doing - andI don't know what they are doing, of course, I can't interfere with the whole FBI, but it seems to me that these two fellows are interfering with me.

Q. What are they doing wrong?

- A. Legally nothing wrong, only to go around to different people and say they are looking for me, if they are looking for me I am there.
- Q. They are checking the story that you gave them.
- A. A month and a half seems to be a long time to be doing that, don't you think so.
- Q. Do you suggest that they should not be permitted an opportunity to check your story?
- A. I didn't give them any story, only the affidavit that I made with Mr. Lane here.
- Q. The affidavit which you gave to Mr. Chester Lane was in turn presented to the Court and a copy of it was given to me. Now naturally it is my duty as the U.S.A.-I can't take that affidavit on its face value - I have to check the affidavit and see whether what you say is true or false, and the only way I can do that is by using the FBI to do it.
- A. It all centers around Utah Place and not a word about Aberdeen.
- Q. I can't tell the FBI how to conduct their investigation, that is semething which they have control over.
 - I think you are the man responsible for the case.
 - Any more you can tell me?

The facts would be that it seems to me that in a town that small it wouldn't take up the time of 2 FBI for 1 month and a half and I move out of the town with my wife, as the affidavit stated, and then instead of leaving the child alone they work on the child and my wife.

BY MR. LANE:

- Q If you check and see if you paid the boy's board and room, your difficulties with respect to the board will be resolved. As far as I know, the FBI has not questioned your boy. I don't see how they would interfere with him at all. What I want to know, and if you can give me specific instances when the FBI violated any of your rights, I will take it up with the FBI because they are not instructed to interfere with any of your rights and, to my knowledge, they never have. But, if you can give me specific instances when they have, based on fast not hearsay, I will take it up with the proper autherities. A New, she can't get a job. That's fasts. She can't ge back to the Mayflewer. Suppose they go into the Flying Clipper in Aberdson where she is working new and she lowes her job on account of the FBI, is that a fact?
- Q What fact? The FBI certainly have a right to interrogate her.
- A They never go near her or ma. It is always the employer or the landlady or somebody like that.
- Q I don't see why the employer or landlady should take offense.
- A I agree, too, I don't see why.
- Q We have a right, as officers of the Government, to sheck with people and I don't think the surpose or intent of the FBI is to, in any way, intimidate you or to try to influence anybody to injure you in any way or your wife or your child. If I thought for one moment that was their purpose or they were attempting to do that, I personally would see that it was stopped and the person reprimanded but you have not shown me anything. A I can't convince these people up there. That is one thing I can't do.

EY MR. ROBINSON: .

Q You agree they are acting irrationally? A I agree they are in - I think, when they go and investigatemen and ask questions, I think they should go out and say "Don't put the boy out."

- Q The people who refuse to give your wife back hor job and take -
- A I say this, 9 out of 10 people, I don't know whether you people know or not, whither honest or hardworking, as soon as you mention the FBI, they get scared, they think something is wrong.

BY NR. LANE:

- Q Why is that? You wouldn't get seared if they mentioned the PBI. Neither would I.
- A It is a very peculiar thing.

BY MR. CHESTER LANE:

He was a sorgeant in the Army and docan't scare so easy. A I don't scare so easy. They can follow me 24 hours a day but let them leave the wife and boy alone.

BY MR. LANBI

- Q They have more important things to do than follow you 24 hours a day.
- A I am just using that as a supposition. I would rather have them annoy me 24 hours a day.
- Q The fact they question you -
- A They don't question me. Everybody else but me.
- Q But they question people in places where you were supposed to have been; things you said in your affidrit; I assume they want to check on these.
- A There is nothing in that affidavit concerning Aberdeen.
- Q But we can't tell the FBI what to de. There may be things in that affidavit which may require them to ask questions in Aberdeen. I would be the last one to tell them their business.
- A I don't expect that. The only thing I am after, I just want them to let my wife and child along.
- Q I can't see from what you tell me -
- A You are the last straw. I figured I could get come bely from you.
- Q If you demonstrated to me the FBI has done anything unethical or illegal, I could take sens action but, from what I see thus far, I cannot agree the FBI has done any thing unsthical or illegal.

BY MR. CHESTER LANE:

Can I try to interpret what Mr. Leisman is asking here. Part of it relates to this. The FBI may be in some way improperly acting. Apart from that, he made the point when he started and now, his real problem is people are immediately suspicious and worried and I think I heard him ask you whether there wasn't some possibility of getting some kind of letter or what that could quiet the suspicious these people are developing, because the FBI are asking questions, there must be something wrong.
