Dear Mr. Greenewald, Jr.:

I refer to your October 10, 2019, request to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, for the release of certain material under the Freedom of Information Act (Title 5 USC Section 552). Of the relevant documents retrieved in response to your request, ten were considered to be of primary interest to our office and were referred to us for appropriate action.

After careful review, we have determined that all ten may be released in part. Information is exempt from release at the request of the FBI, pursuant to the following exemptions:

- 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(3), which concerns matters specifically exempted from release by statute. In this instance, 50 U.S.C. § 403-1(i)(1) (currently at 50 U.S.C. § 3024(i)(1)) (National Security Act of 1947).
- 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(6), which concerns material if disclosed, would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of an individual's personal privacy.
- 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(7)(c), which concerns records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes which could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of an individual's personal privacy.
- 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(7)(e), which concerns records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, which would divulge techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions.



At 1:30 p.m., Mr. BENNINGTON, U.S. State Dept. Security, telephonically contacted the writer and stated that he was in Honolulu in connection with the visit of Prime Minister Trudeau of Canada. He advised that he was staying in Rm. 394, Royal Hawaiian Hotel and if he could not be contacted there, he could be contacted through [redacted] HPD, who would be aware of his location at all times.

He requested that any information received concerning possible demonstrations of activities in connection with the Prime Minister's visit be disseminated to him.

This will confirm telephone call by Bureau to Supervisor [Redacted] of your office regarding following information received by Bureau from Department of State: Lawrence Gruza, Office of Security, Department of State, advised Bureau telephonically 10/31/68 of subject's expected arrival in New York City 4:45 p.m. 11/1/68 via Canadian Jet Star plane arriving at the Marine Terminal, La Guardia Airfield. Trudeau is to attend a theater on the evening of 11/1/68 and is to have lunch with U Thant, Secretary General, United Nations, at the Canadian Consulate at noon 11/2/68. He will attend the theater again that evening, however, the remainder of his itinerary is not known. [Redacted] advised any additional information would be made available. [Redacted] requested that any information received by the Bureau indicating possible physical harm or embarrassment to the Prime Minister Trudeau should be furnished to the local State Department representative in New York City.

Reference is made to Bulet to WFO 3/10/69 in caption'd matter, copies of which were furnished Baltimore. This letter indicated that the Department of State had advised that Prime Minister Trudeau of Canada will arrive in the U.S. at Andrews Air Force Base, Maryland, on 3/24/69. He is scheduled to depart the U.S. from the same Air Force Base on or about 3/25/69 and his visit will be exclusively in Washington, D.C.

The referenced letter also indicated that State Department requested that it be furnished with any information which would reflect the presence of any effort designed to cause physical harm or embarrassment to the Prime Minister during his visit. Recipients of the referenced communication were instructed to handle this matter in conformity with provisions in Section 105 J, page 5, Manual of Instructions, and to immediately notify the Bureau of any pertinent information received.

By letter dated 3/13/69 Keith O. Lynch, Chief, Division of Protective Security, Department of State, under the caption of "Cuban Power" noted that the Cuban Power organization has carried out terrorist activities against Canadian establishments in the U.S. in the past. State requested that FBI furnish the Division of Protective Security the identity, physical description and photographs of any known or suspected Cuban Power members presently in the Washington, D.C., area or en route thereto.

WFO and the other recipients of this communication will advise by return airtel unless the urgency of the situation requires more expeditious handling of any information they may have along the lines specifically requested concerning Cuban Power members by the Department of State. Copies of such communications must, of course, be furnished to WFO.
