DETAILS: AT WASHINGTON, D. C.

The following investigation was conducted by SA JOHN J. MASSE.

The Detroit Office, by teletype dated May 16, 1949, advised that BURNETTA FISHER (nee CATLETT) stated that a typewriter, which she no longer had, was given to her by her brother, PERRY CATLETT, when she entered Dunbar High School at Washington, D. C., and that it was possible that the Dunbar High School might have specimens submitted by her which she prepared on this typewriter.

Mrs. L. W. FITCHETT, Registrar, Dunbar Senior High School, 1st and N Streets, N. W., Washington, D. C., made available a record which reflected that PAULINE BURNETTA CATLETT (Mrs. FISHER), born August 13, 1925, entered Dunbar High School on February 5, 1940 from Browne Junior High School and graduated from Dunbar on June 16, 1942. The school record listed her residence as 1127 48th Place, N. E., Washington, D. C. and her Guardian as Mrs. M. B. MARLOW.

Mrs. FITCHETT advised that there are no typewriter specimens submitted by BURNETTA CATLETT in the records of the Registrar's Office.

Mrs. G. W. FAIRLEY, Assistant Principal, Dunbar High School, advised that there are no typewriter specimens submitted by BURNETTA CATLETT in the Office of the Principal; she stated the only possible additional. record might be maintained in the Office of Guidance Counselor.

Mrs. J. T. WILDER, Guidance Counselor, searched her records but found nothing on BURNETTA CATLETT.

The records indicated both Mrs. FAIRLEY and Mrs. WILDER had taught CATLETT in classes; both stated that they had no documents submitted by CATLETT which might serve as typewriter specimens.

Mrs. WILDER contacted the following former teachers of CATLETT in an effort to obtain typewriter specimens submitted by the latter, with negative results:

BURNETTA CATLETT (Mrs. FISHER), in a recent interview conducted by the Detroit Office, has indicated she may have submitted a Biology paper while attending Dunbar High School prepared on the typewriter in question; she added that she believed, however, that the Biology paper had been destroyed.

Mr. A. F. NIXON, CATLETT'S Biology Teacher while she attended Dunbar High School, has searched his records in an effort to find any typewritten paper which might have been submitted by CATLETT. He stated; however, that although he still maintained a record of her grades he had no papers submitted by her, typewritten or otherwise.

Mrs. ARNETHA STOVALL, Clerk in the Principal's Office, Browne Junior High School, 24th and Benning Road, N. E., Washington, D. C., produced a school record on PAULINE BURNETTA CATLETT, born August 13, 1925, which reflected that she entered Browne Junior High School on September 20, 1937 and attended until she transferred to Dunbar Senior High School on February 5, 1940. The record consisted of a single page, with no correspondence whatsoever available. Mrs. STOVALL advised that there was no additional record maintained by Browne Junior High School.

By teletype dated May 18, 1949, the Detroit Office advised that BURNETTA FISHER (nee CATLETT) stated that she had been employed by the Civil Service Commission and the General Accounting Office in Washington, D. C. subsequent to her attendance at Dunbar High School.

JOHN ROBERSON, Personnel Office, United States Civil Service Commission, 8th and F Streets, N. W., made available microfilm records which reflected that Mrs. BURNETTA P. FISHER was employed by the Civil Service Commission in Washington, D. C. as a Junior File Clerk from October 12, 1942 to April 11, 1943 when she was transferred to the General Accounting Office. The microfilm records contained a Form 375, (September, 1941), which was executed by Mrs. FISHER on October 3, 1942; the major portion of this form is filled out in typewriting and is signed, Mrs. BURNETTA P. FISHER.

This typewriter specimen is being submitted to the FBI Laboratory. for its consideration. Kisseloff-8798

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There was no other possible typewriter specimen submitted by Mrs. FISHER in the microfilm records.

JOSEPH CHANDLER, Mails and Files Division, United States Civil Service Commission, searched the records of his division as well as the Service Records and Previous Correspondence Files in an effort to locate a typewritten specimen submitted by Mrs. FISHER; he advised, however, that there is no such specimen available.

VIRGIL POTTS, Division of Investigations, General Accounting Office, displayed a personnel file which reflected that Mrs. BURNETTA P. FISHER, born August 13, 1925, entered on duty with the General Accounting Office on April 12, 1943 as an Under Clerk in the Consolidated Accounting Division; further that she was discharged effective January 24, 1944 because of "abandonment of position." The records indicated that she had been on leave without pay since October 16, 1943. The file contained a letter dated January 5, 1944 from the United States Civil Service Commission to Mrs. FISHER which indicated her address as 4524 Harding Avenue, Detroit, Michigan. The file contained no typewriter specimens or correspondence of any kind submitted by Mrs. FISHER.

According to VIRGIL POTTS, all General Accounting Office Personnel Files up to January 1, 1945 have been "stripped" of all correspondence and extraneous material; he said such files now contain only Personnel Action Sheets.

Mr. POTTS contacted JOHN J. FEISSNER, Chief of the Section in which Mrs. FISHER had been employed, in an effort to obtain possible typewriter specimens submitted by her; he advised, however, that none were available.

By teletype dated May 17, 1949, the New York Office advised that Mrs. JAMES McQueen (nee MARGARET LOCKEY) stated that she had received a typewriter from her father, IRA LOCKEY, sometime in 1945 and that she returned it to him about sixteen months ago. She further stated that she had attended Dunbar High School in Washington, D. C., that she studied Typing one year while there and that Dunbar High School might possibly have some specimens of her typing prepared on this typewriter.

Mrs. L. W. FITCHETT, Registrar, Dunbar Senior High School, 1st and N Streets, N. W., Washington, D. C., exhibited a school record which reflected that MARGARET REBECCA LOCKEY, born January 9, 1929, entered Dunbar High School on September 20, 1943 from Browne Junior High School and that she left Dunbar High School on March 20, 1946 without graduating.

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Mrs. FITCHETT advised that there are no typewritten specimens submitted by LOCKEY in the Registrar's Office.

Mrs. G. W. FAIRLEY, Assistant Principal, Dunbar High School, formerly taught LOCKEY while latter attended Dunbar High School, advised that she had no typewritten specimens submitted by LOCKEY in her possession, nor were any such specimens available in the Office of the Principal.

Mrs. J. T. WILDER, Guidance Counselor, found a folder on LOCKEY in the records of her office; however, there were no typewritten specimens contained therein.

Mrs. J. M. NIGHTENGALE, LOCKEY's Typing Teacher at Dunbar High School, advised that all typing by the students was normally done on school machines. She stated that she has no documents or correspondence submitted by LOCKEY which might serve as typewritten specimens.

Mrs. WILDER contacted the following former teachers of LOCKEY in an effort to obtain possible typewriter specimens submitted by LOCKEY. She advised that no such specimens were available as far as their records are concerned.

Mrs. ARNETHA STOVALL, Clerk in the Principal's Office, Browne Junior High School, 24th and Benning Road, N. E., Washington, D. C., made available a school record which reflected that MARGARET R. LOCKEY, born January 9, 1929, entered Browne Junior High School on February 3, 1941 and attended until she was transferred to Dunbar Senior High School on September 20, 1943. The record listed her parent as IRA LOCKEY, 101 (changed to 440) - 58th Street, N. E., Washington, D. C.

Mrs. STOVALL stated that there are no typewritten specimens nor correspondence of any kind submitted by LOCKEY available in the records of this school.

Washington Field Office letter dated May 16, 1949 to the Director with a carbon copy to New York sets out the results of an interview with PERRY M. CATLETT, JR., 733 Howard Road, S. E., conducted on May 13, 1949. PERRY CATLETT, in discussing the typewriter he claims to have received from ALGER HISS years ago, stated that he had attempted to have the typewriter repaired

at a repair shop, then located at the northwest corner of Connecticut Avenue and K Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. He stated that it was his recollection that he was told at the repair shop that the typewriter could not be fixed because the manufacturer was out of business and parts could not be obtained.

Miss MARY PETHERBRIDGE, Head of the Bookkeeping Department, Randall H. Hagner and Company, Incorporated, 1321 Connecticut Avenue, N. W., advised that her records reflected that her company has managed the building located on the northwest corner of Connecticut Avenue and K Street continuously since as early as 1931. She advised that the address of this building at this location is 1000 Connecticut Avenue, N. W. She further stated that the records show that the Woodstock Typewriter Company rented Rooms 1 and 2 (second floor) from September 15, 1938 to September 15, 1940. She stated that the entire second floor of the building is currently occupied by Radio Station WWDC. Miss PETHERBRIDGE added that her records indicated that the Woodstock Typewriter Company had formerly been located at 1726 K Street, N. W.

Miss PETHERBRIDGE further advised that her records failed to show that any other typewriting company had rented space in this building.

It is noted that PERRY CATLETT, when interviewed on May 13, 1949 stated that he had attempted to have the typewriter repaired at a repair shop located on the northwest corner of Connecticut Avenue and K Street, N. W. If his information is accurate, it would appear from the records of the Randall H. Hagner and Company, Incorporated that he brought the typewriter to the Woodstock Typewriter Company, then located at 1000 Connecticut Avenue, N. W. sometime between September 15, 1938 and September 15, 1940.

It is further noted that PERRY CATLETT, when interviewed on May 13, 1949, indicated that it was his recollection that he was told at the repair shop that the typewriter could not be fixed because the manufacturer was out of business and parts could not be obtained.

However, on the possibility that the typewriter may have been left for repair with the Woodstock Typewriter Company and that the records including dates of such repair might be available, the following efforts have been made to date in an attempt to locate records of the Woodstock Typewriter Company, while they were located at 1000 Connecticut Avenue, N. W.

JAMES M. LANIER, Shop Foreman, Typewriter Sales and Service Company, 811 17th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. advised that he had been Service Manager for the Woodstock Typewriter Company for about one and one-half years when the company was located at 1000 Connecticut Avenue, N. W. He stated that

the Woodstock Typewriter Company moved to 918 F Street, N. W. after leaving Connecticut Avenue, stayed there until about two or three years ago when the Washington, D. C. Branch Office of the Woodstock Typewriter Company was discontinued and the franchise to handle Woodstock typewriters was given to the Leon Typewriter Company, 400 6th Street, N. W. He advised that repair records were kept by the Woodstock Typewriter Company when they were located on Connecticut Avenue; he stated, however, that he does not know what happened to them and is under the impression that they were either destroyed or returned to the home office in Chicago, Illinois.

Miss GENEVIEVE HORN, currently employed at McIntosh and Sheridan, Incorporated, 1210 18th Street, N. W., advised that she had formerly been Manager of the Washington, D. C. Branch Office of the Woodstock Typewriter Company from March of 1940 until November of 1943; she stated that the office when she first joined them had been located at Connecticut Avenue and K Street, N. W. and that in September of 1940 the company moved to 918 F Street, N. W. She said that the company had maintained repair books on Connecticut Avenue, and that about the time the company moved to F Street a new set of repair books was started. She stated that she was certain that the old books as well as the new were in existence for sometime in the office of the company when it was located on F Street. She further advised that after the Woodstock Typewriter Company Branch Office in Washington, D. C. was discontinued about late 1945, the repair books were taken by KELL REIMANN as far as she knew. She said REIMANN had been Service Manager of the company while it was located on F Street.

KELL REIMANN, Kell Typewriter Company, 1313 North Courthouse Road, Arlington, Virginia, advised that he had formerly been Service Manager for the Washington, D. C. Branch Office of the Woodstock Typewriter Company when the company was located at 918 F Street, N. W. He produced the record books of repairs done by the Woodstock Typewriter Company, which he said constituted a record of repairs done by the company while it was located on F Street; he said as far as he knows the records did not include repairs done by the company. when it was located on Connecticut Avenue and K Street, N. W.

An examination of the repair records in REIMANN's possession reflected that there was no record of repairs earlier than August of 1940. Mr. REIMANN said that he believed he had all the records of the Washington, D. C. Branch Office of the Woodstock Typewriter Company available. He added that if there were any prior records, it is his belief that such were probably destroyed.

Inasmuch as the Woodstock Typewriter Company was located at Connecticut Avenue and K Street, N. W. in August and part of September of 1940, the records in the possession of REIMANN were searched through the months of August and September of 1940 but no record of Typewriter 5N230099 was noted.

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The following investigation was conducted by SAS CHARLES W. PEASINGER and CARL N. DE TEMPLE:

> VERNON F. MARLOW 12 Logan Circle, N. W. Washington, D. C.

On May 17, 1949, VERNON MARIOW was reinterviewed at his place of business, Lansburgh's Department Store Warehouse at South Capitol and P Streets. In addition to information previously furnished, VERNON MARLOW offered the following:

With regard to the typewriters located at the residence of Dr. EASTER and JOHN F. MARLOW, VERNON stated that JOHN F. MARLOW had a typewriter which was a standard model which he recalled was green, which is in contradiction to information previously offered in that the typewriter owned by BURNETTA was green in color. He also stated that Dr. EASTER was in possession of a typewriter which was a portable. He could not recall the make of this typewriter. He added that BURNETTA also owned a typewriter which was a gift from her brother MIKE and that this was a standard typewriter, although different from the one owned by JOHN F. MARLOW. VERNON could offer no further description of any of these typewriters nor could he furnish additional information as to the approximate time the typewriter came into the possession of BURNETTA.

To the best of his knowledge, VERNON stated that the last time he saw the typewriter owned by BURNETTA was in approximately March, 1945, at which time it was on the dining room table of the residence at 1127 48th Place, N. E. He recalls this time as it was immediately after the death of Dr. EASTER and that BURNETTA had come to Washington to attend his funeral. VERNON explained that immediately after the funeral he and MARY EASTER accompanied the body of Dr. EASTER to Waco, Texas, for burial. He believes he was away from Washington for about two weeks and it was upon his return that he noticed the typewriter at that address. VERNON insisted that he had no knowledge of the ultimate disposition of this typewriter even though he was placed in complete charge of the disposition of the household furnishings and property of Dr. EASTER.

With regard to the transportation of the refrigerator and radio from 1127 48th Place, N. E., to 410 Kenilworth Terrace, N. E., the residence of IOUISE BELL, VERNON MARLOW insisted that these transactions were personally handled by himself; that his wife, IOUISE, may have been present but that she certainly had nothing to do with the payment of the transportation or any settlement with IRA LOCKEY. At this time, MARLOW recalled that when the radio

was returned to 1126 48th Place, N. E., the phonograph portion of the radio was broken which necessitated repair. It may be pointed out that this further substantiates the information offered by IRA LOCKEY on May 16, 1949, concerning this radio.

VERNON MARLOW was questioned in length concerning his knowledge of this typewriter; however, he failed to offer anything additional not previously set forth in this report. It is to be noted that an additional statement was not obtained from MARLOW; that it was found that on repeated questioning concerning a particular point, he would alter his story on almost every point discussed on every occasion that the question was brought up, and, for this reason, it was impossible to obtain a definite statement of fact from him.

> Mrs. LOUISE MARLOW 2730 Wisconsin Avenue, N. W. Washington, D. C.

Mrs. LOUISE MARIOW was reinterviewed, at which time she furnished the following signed statement, the original of which is being forwarded to the New York Office with a copy of this report.

> "Washington, D. C. May 18, 1949

"I Mrs. LOUISE MARLOW, make the following statement to CARL N. DE TEMPLE and CHARLES W. PEASINGER, whom I know to be Special Agents of the F.B.I. I am making this statement concerning a typewriter which I understand is a matter of official investigation by the F.B.I.

"In about 1936, my husband VERNON MARLOW and myself moved into a house at 1126-48 Place, N. E. This is across the street from the JOHN MARLOW home at 1127-48 Place, N. E. where Dr. R. A. EASTER, MAMIE MARLOW and BURNETTA CATLETT lived. MAMIE MARLOW is my husband's mother. During the time from 1936 to 1946 when I left 1126-48 Place, N. E., I visited often at 1127-48 Place, N. E., and knew the people living there quite well. I do not recall that BURNETTA CATLETT ever had a typewriter. Dr. EASTER had an old standard typewriter which was black and which he kept in his office usually covered. I do not recall the make of typewriter Dr. EASTER had or what became of it.

"Dr. EASTER died in February, 1945. About two years before he died he got a new grey portable typewriter. After his death MARY EASTER, his

wife, came to Washington from Texas and took his body to Texas for burial. She took the new portable typewriter with her. She turned a radio combination and refrigerator over to VERNON and myself and left VERNON in charge of disposing of Dr. EASTER's office things.

"In about March, 1945, VERNON got a Mr. LOCKEY who had a truck and they moved the radio combination and refrigerator to my mother's, LOUISE BELL, at 710 Kenilworth Terrace, N. E. In about August, 1945, VERNON and Mr. LOCKEY moved the radio from my mother's to our house at 1126-48 Place, N. E. VERNON handled these movements and I didn't have anything to do with paying Mr. LOCKEY for helping.

"Neither VERNON nor I have ever owned a typewriter nor has one ever been in our house or yard to my knowledge.

"I do not recall my children ever playing with a typewriter nor anyone giving or selling a typewriter to Mr. LOCKEY.

"About five weeks ago lawyer HOUSTON and a white man came to my mother's home and asked me about a typewriter. They said it was a very important piece of evidence and they were trying to trace its possession. I gave them the same information as is in this statement. I do not think I could recognize the old typewriter that Dr. EASTER had if I saw it again. As far as I can recall this was the only typewriter around 1127-48 Place, N. E., except the new portable that Dr. EASTER said he bought.

"I have read this three page statement, and it is true to the best of my knowledge. I have initialed all three pages.

ERNEST BELL, aka Billy. Bell 410 Kenilworth Terrace, N. E. Washington, D. C.

ERNEST BELL was interviewed on May 18, 1949, at which time he furnished the following signed statement, the original of which is being forwarded to the New York Office with a copy of this report.

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"Washington, D. C. May 18, 1949

"I; ERNEST BELL, also known as Billy Bell, make the following statement to CARL N. DE TEMPLE and CHARLES W. PEASINGER whom I know to be Special Agents of the F.B.I. This statement concerns a typewriter which I understand is matter under official investigation of the F.B.I.

"My mother is LOUISE MARLOW, the wife of VERNON MARLOW. I live at 710 Kenilworth Terrace, N. E. VERNON and LOUISE MARLOW lived at 1126-48 Place, N. E. until about 1946. Across the street at 1127-48 Place, N. E. a Dr. R. A. EASTER lived until his death in 1945. I recall seeing an old typewriter in the back yard at Dr. EASTER's. I don't know what kind of typewriter it was or to whom it belonged. I think it was black.

"I also recall that about this time, 1945, I saw an old typewriter on a table in Vernon Marlow's back yard. I don't think they were the same typewriter because the one in VERNON's back yard was in bad shape and not in as good condition as the one I saw at Dr. EASTER's.

"About this same time I went to the home of IRA LOCKEY to go fishing with him and saw a typewriter on the floor on a chair in the living room. This typewriter looked to me like the one I had seen at Dr. EASTER's. I asked LOCKEY where he got the typewriter and he said he got it from VERNON. There was no further conversation between us about the typewriter.

"I don't know what happened to the typewriter I saw on the table in VERNON's back yard. I think the typewriter that I saw at Mr. LOCKEY's is the one I had previously seen at Dr. EASTER's.

"In about January or February, 1949, VERNON MARIOW called me on the telephone and asked what I had done with the typewriter. I asked him what typewriter he was talking about and he said the one that had been at Dr. EASTER's. He said I was going to get in some trouble and asked what I had done with it. I told him I didn't know where it was and asked if he was talking about the one he gave to Mr. IOCKEY. But he said he hadn't given IOCKEY any typewriter. He said he was going to send MIKE CATLETT and some man down to see me.

Later MIKE and this man came down and we went and talked to BERTHA HALL but she said she didn't know anything about it and that we should see Mr. LOCKEY. Next day MIKE and I went over to see Mrs. HALL and she said she thought Mr. LOCKEY sold it to a junk man.

"I have not talked to anyone else about the typewriter except Mr. DE TEMPLE and Mr. PEASINGER. MIKE CATLETT gave me a dollar for helping him to try and find the typewriter. I have read this three page statement and it is true as I remember it and I have initialed each page.

> VERNELLE MARLOW 710 Kenilworth Terrace, N. E. Washington, D. C.

VERNELLE MARLOW, on May 18, 1949, was reinterviewed, at which time she reiterated information previously furnished and stated that a search of the premises of 710 Kenilworth Terrace in an effort to locate any typewritten specimens emanating from instant typewriter was fruitless.

Photographs of numerous typewriters, including Woodstock typewriters, with the names obliterated were displayed to VERNELLE MARIOW but she was unable to identify any of them as being similar in appearance with the typewriter she had seen at the VERNON MARLOW home.

> GERTRUDE SPEERS 710 Kenilworth Terrace, N. E. Washington, D. C.

Miss GERTRUDE SREERS, aged fifteen years, cousin of VERNELLE MARLOW, stated that about four or five years ago she and VERNELLE played with an old typewriter which was located in the backyard of VERNON and LOUISE MARLOW at 1126 48th Place, N. E. GERTRUDE could offer no information as to how the typewriter came to be located at that address nor did she have any knowledge of its ultimate disposition. GERTRUDE also explained that she did not, at any time, recall seeing a typewriter located on the premises of 1127 48th Place, N. E. GERTRUDE also explained that she did not actually type any material on the

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typewriter; that it was used merely for her amusement which she described as "typing pecking;" further, that she could offer no information as to the possible location of any specimen which might have been typed on instant typewriter.

Photographs of numerous typewriters, including Woodstock typewriters, with the names obliterated were displayed to GERTRUDE SPEERS but she was unable to identify any of them as being similar in appearance with the typewriter she had seen at the VERNON MARLOW home.

> Mrs. MARY LOCKEY 229 63rd Street, N. E. Washington, D. C.

Mrs. MARY LOCKEY advised she is employed at the Hilbert Optical Company, 726 11th Street, N. W., and is the wife of IRA W. LOCKEY, JR. She states she married IRA LOCKEY, JR., following his return from the Armed Forces in 1946 and recalled seeing the typewriter at her father-in-law's home, 704 Kenilworth Avenue, N. E., from about that time until in January, 1949, when her husband brought it from her father-in-law's home to their home so that her daughter, MILDRED PURDY might attempt to use it. She advised they kept it at their home until about April, 1949, when IRA LOCKEY, SR., requested its return. She stated her husband, IRA W. LOCKEY, JR., had moved the typewriter from the father-in-law's place to their home and back to the father-in-law's home. She advised she did not know where IRA W: LOCKEY, SR., had obtained the typewriter nor did she know of her own knowledge of the disposition of it. She advised she had never typed anything on the machine, although both she, her husband and her daughter had "pecked" away on it. She said it did not work well. She advised she had made a search of her home and possessions in an attempt to locate items typed by her daughter on this machine but had been unsuccessful in locating any.

Photographs of numerous typewriters with the names obliterated were displayed to her and she identified the photograph of a Woodstock typewriter manufactured in 1926 as being most like the typewriter which she had formerly had in her possession.

> MILDRED PURDY 229 63rd Street, N. E. Washington, D. C.

MILDRED PURDY advised she is the daughter of MARY LOCKEY and that she recalled an old Woodstock typewriter at her grandfather's, IRA LOCKEY's, house.

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She stated she played with it there and that several months ago IRA LOCKEY, JR., brought it to their home at 229 63rd Street, N. E., and she attempted to use it in her school work. She said she had typed various items which she handed in and which items were subsequently returned to her. She stated she had made a search through her possessions for some of these specimens but had been unable to locate any. She said that about a month ago, IRA LOCKEY, JR., had returned the typewriter to IRA LOCKEY, SR., at the latter's request. She does not know the method in which IRA LOCKEY, SR., obtained the typewriter nor does she know of her own knowledge his disposition of it.

> Mrs. MARIAN HILL 731 Lowrie Place, N. E. Washington, D. C.

Mrs. MARIAN HILL advised she was the daughter of IRA LOCKEY, SR., and recalls her father had an old typewriter around the house in about 1945. She stated it was in poor condition; that she does not know where her father obtained it; that she never used it and that she would not recognize it if she saw it again. She advised that she did not have in her possession any material typed on this typewriter nor did she know where same could be located. She stated that her sister PEGGY, now Mrs. JAMES MC QUEEN, had worked for a Dr. RANDALL in about 1946 or 1947, and that RANDALL had an office on Florida Avenue, N. W., between 1st and 3rd Streets. MARIAN HILL said that to her knowledge PEGGY LOCKEY had never used the typewriter to type any of Dr. RANDALL's business.

> BERTHA HALL 722 Kemilworth Avenue, N. E. Washington, D. C.

BERTHA HALL made available a large box of papers and miscellaneous itme which she stated contained possessions of Mr. and Mrs. JAMES MC QUEEN. Contents of this box were examined, at which time two specimens of typewriting were located. They were initialed by BERTHA HALL and reporting Agents and furnished to the Federal Bureau of Investigation Laboratory by letter dated May 20, 1949, for comparison with specimens Q6 through Q 69. These specimens consisted of a carbon copy of a letter to the Finance Officer, Holabird Army Depot, Maryland, from STAFFORD J. MC QUEEN and a copy of an application for Federal employment filed by STAFFORD J. MC QUEEN to the U. S. Civil Service Commission and dated in July, 1947.

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REPORT OF FBI LABORATORY RE SPECIMEN K-740

By report dated May 23, 1949, the FBI Laboratory advised that an application for federal employment dated July 26; 1947 bearing the name, STAFFORD JIMMY McQUEEN, 1207 Park Road, N. W., Apartment 101, Washington, D. C., identified by the Laboratory as Specimen K-740 received from the Washington Field Office on May 20, 1949, was examined and it was concluded that the machine which was used to type Specimen Q-6 through Specimen Q-69 was the same machine which typedSpecimen K-740 above. The characters appearing on Specimen K-740 correspond most closely to the typewriting standards at the Laboratory for Woodstock pica type, space ten letters to the inch.

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The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent WILLIAM H. ATKINSON.

Mrs. ELVA HARRIS nee JACKSON 44 23rd Ord Street, Northeast

Mrs. ELVA HARRIS resided across the street from BURNETTA FISHER, nee CATLETT, during the period BURNETTA FISHER is alleged to have owned a Woodstock typewriter.

Mrs. ELVA HARRIS on May 19, 1949, was interviewed in the home of her mother at 1128 48th Place, Northeast. She advised that she and BURNETTA CATLETT were brought up together as children. She advised that BURNETTA and her younger sister, MARY, resided across the street at 1127 48th Place, Northeast, with their foster parents, Dr. and Mrs. EASTER. She stated that she was very close to BURNETTA during her early teens and stated that they used to travel to and from high school together. BURNETTA attended Dunbar High School and Mrs. HARRIS attended Armstrong High School which was directly across the street from Dunbar. She considered herself to be BURNETTA's closest friend during this period. After they both graduated from high school in June 1942, they did not continue their close relationship as Mrs. HARRIS obtained employment and was married during 1944.

Mrs. HARRIS advised that although Dr. EASTER did not encourage children to visit his home, she was a frequent visitor. She recalls that in Dr. EASTER's office there was an old, heavy, desk-type, straight-back and high carriage typewriter. She does not recall ever seeing or hearing anyone use this typewriter and she has no knowledge as to who owned the typewriter or how it was obtained. She believed that she first saw this typewriter during the time she was attending Junior High School, thus it must have been obtained during 1938 or 1939. She advised that Dr. EASTER did not employ office help and that she can never recall BURNETTA CATLETT ever typing. She stated that she does not know if BURNETTA studied typing at Dunbar, but she states that BURNETTA CATLETT, several other girls and herself frequently gathered together to do their homework even though they attended different high schools. She can recall nothing that would indicate that BURNETTA CATLETT was studying typing.

She believed that Dr. EASTER died in 1944 or 1945. After his death, the household split up and BURNETTA FISHER moved to Detroit with her husband. She recalls that BURNETTA FISHER moved her personal belongings with her to Detroit, however, she cannot state if the typewriter that she had seen in Dr. EASTER's office was moved by BURNETTA FISHER when she moved to Detroit.

After Dr. EASTER's death, Mr. JOHN MARLOW moved back to the home at 1127 48th Place, Northeast. She advised that she was not in a position to know what disposition was made of the furniture in the house at that time and that

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she had no definite information pertaining to the typewriter. After Mr. MARLOW moved back into the house, she has never entered or visited the house, and thus, could furnish no information as to whether the typewriter remained in the house after the EASTER household broke up.

She advised that the typewriter on Dr. EASTER's desk is the only typewriter that she had ever seen in the EASTER household. She does recall, however, that BURNETTA's sister, MARY, was given a toy typewriter to play with.

She advised that she has only received Christmas greetings from BURNETTA FISHER and that she knows of no typewritten correspondence in her possession or in the possession of any other individual that emanated from Mrs. FISHER.

On May 20, 1949 Mrs. HARRIS examined photographs of various typewriters. After examining these photographs, she advised that she believed that there were two typewriters that seemed similar to the typewriter she had observed in Dr. EASTER's office at 1127 48th Place, Northeast. She selected a photograph of a Woodstock typewriter that was manufactured in 1926 and the photograph of an L. C. Smith typewriter that was manufactured about 1936. She advised that she picked these two photographs as being similar to the typewriter in EASTER's home because the top portion of the carriage was gened and permitted her to see the keys and arms. She also stated that the ribbon rotated on two spindles that were on top of the carriage.

Miss MARY JACKSON 1128 48th Place, Northeast

Miss MARY JACKSON resided across the street from BURNETTA FISHER, nee CATLETT, during the period BURNETTA FISHER is alleged to have owned a Woodstock typewriter.

On May 20, 1949 Miss JACKSON stated that BURNETTA FISHER's younger sister, MARY, was in the same age group as she and they were childhood companions. She frequently visited Dr. EASTER in his home to play with MARY. She recalled that there was an old, heavy typewriter in Dr. EASTER's office. She did not know when the typewriter was obtained or to whom it belonged. She cannot recall anyone ever using this typewriter. She stated that while she and MARY CATLETT were rather young, MARY CATLETT received a toy typewriter. After Dr. EASTER died and his household was broken, she stated that she has not visited the family that resides at that address since that time. Thus, she did not know if the typewriter was removed by members of the EASTER household after his death.

Miss JACKSON stated that she has never received any typewritten correspondence from any members of the EASTER household.

She examined photographs of various typewriters and after deliberation, she believed that the typewriter that was in Dr. EASTER's office was similar to photographs of a Woodstock typewriter that was manufactured in 1926 or an L. C. Smith typewriter that was manufactured about 1936. She believed that these typewriters were similar because she recalled that the carriage of the typewriter in Dr. EASTER's office was opened and permitted one to see the keys; likewise, she recalled that the ribbon rotated around two pins on top of the carriage of the typewriter. She advised that she would have no idea as to the make of the typewriter in Dr. EASTER's office.

She advised that the only other persons that she could think of who would have possibly been in the EASTER home and may have seen the typewriter would be patients of Dr. EASTER. She advised that her mother was a patient of Dr. EASTER, but at this time she is seriously ill and could not be interviewed.

Mrs. ADA SCOTT 710 Lamont Street, Northwest

Mrs. ADA SCOTT resided in the neighborhood of 1127 48th Place, Northeast, during the time BURNETTA FISHER is alleged to have owned a Woodstock typewriter.

On May 19, 1949, Mrs. SCOTT stated that she lived in the 1100 block of 48th Place until 1921. She then moved from that area and did not return to the neighborhood until 1940. From 1940 to 1947, she resided at 1056 48th Street, Northeast. She advised that she was a patient of Dr. EASTER and had visited his home frequently as a patient. She stated that she does not recell any typewriter in Dr. EASTER's office or in his residence. She advised that BURNETTA CATLETT resided with Dr. EASTER and that BURNETTA was about the same age as one of her children. However, she can never recall BURNETTA CATLETT ever typing and cannot recall that she studied typing at Dunbar High School. She stated that after Dr. EASTER's death about 1940, she never visited anyone residing at 1127 48th Place, Northeast. She stated that she has never corresponded with any members of the EASTER household and was not in a position to know anyone who had done so.

ROBERT J: DUNHAM Supervisory Examiner District of Columbia Income Tax Division Government of the District of Columbia Room 9, District Building

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Mr. DUNHAM searched the records of the District of Columbia Income Tax Division to determine if an income tax return had ever been filed by IRA LOCKEY, 704 Kenilworth Avenue, Northeast. He advised that there was no record of IRA LOCKEY ever having filed an income tax return in the District of Columbia.

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The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent DONALD D. CONNORS on May 23 and 24, 1949.

HENRY JULIAN WADLEIGH

It will be recalled that New York teletype dated May 19, 1949 requested the Washington Field Office to ascertain the exact date when HENRY JULIAN WADLEIGH embarked for Turkey. As set out in the Washington Field Office teletype of May 23, 1949, it has been ascertained that WADLEIGH departed from New York City on March 9, 1938 aboard the SS Washington on his trip to Turkey. WADLEIGH telephonically advised on May 23, 1949 that he had ascertained this data from an expense account in the possession of one NORMAN BURNS who also was a fellow passenger with WADLEIGH on the SS Washington.

BURNS, who is the Assistant Chief of the Department of Foreign Trade, U. S. Department of State, with offices in Room 510 of the State Department Annex #7, and who resides at 3123 N. Military Road, Arlington, Virginia, upon interview, May 23, 1949, advised that he had received a . telephone call from WADLEIGH on May 22, 1949 and that WADLEIGH had asked BURNS if he, BURNS, had any information bearing on their departure from New York. BURNS stated that he thereupon advised WADLEIGH that he had a copy of an expense voucher for this trip and upon referring to this expense voucher, indicated that they sailed from Pier 59, 12:00 noon on March 9, 1938. It was the opinion of BURNS and WADLEIGH concurs that this vessel was a United States Lines Ship. BURNS has indicated that he would be willing to testify and to produce his State Department expense voucher if desired. It is pointed out that BURNS' testimony predicated upon his expense voucher, is probably not as desirable as to the departure of the SS Washington as would be the records of the United States Lines.

The following investigation was conducted on May 24, 1949 by Special Agent E. M. MULLIN.

MARRIAGE OF PERRY MURPHY CATLETT, JR.

It will be recalled that in the report of Special Agent JOHN E. HOWARD dated May 18, 1949 at Washington, D. C., it is set out that PERRY CATLETT advised that he was married in 1941 at which time he gave the Woodstock typewriter to his sister, BURNETTA, and further, that ALGER HISS was present at PERRY CATLETT's wedding.

The records of the Marriage License Bureau, District of Columbia, indicated that an application for marriage dated September

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10, 1941 was filed by PERRY MURPHY CATLETT, age 20, a Washington, D. C. resident and one URSULA VERONICA FLETCHER, age 19, also a Washington, D. C. resident. The witness in this application was CLAUDIA CATLETT, mother of PERRY CATLETT. Marriage license #229325, was issued upon this application and the records indicated that the marriage ceremony was performed by the Reverend VINCENT J. ASSING at Epiphany Catholic Church at Washington, D. C. on September 18, 1941.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agents JOHN B. VAN ETTEN and DONALD D. CONNORS on April 11, 1949.

NEIGHBORS OF ALGER HISS

It will be recalled that New York letter dated March 22, 1949 requested that Mrs. BALTHASAR H. MEYER, 3327 P Street, N. W., and Mrs. MORTIMER GRAVES, 3331 Dent Place, N. W., be interviewed as neighbors of ALGER HISS.

Mrs. MEYER, interviewed by Special Agent JOHN B. VAN ETTEN, advised that she knew "absolutely nothing about the ALGER HISSES' and that prior to the hearings of the House Committee on Un-American Activities she had not believed herself acquainted with them. At this time, Mrs. MEYER recalled that there was a Mrs. HISS associated with the ^Emergency Feeding and Housing Unit, a neighborhood wartime civilian unit. Mrs. MEYER advised that she did not know whether this was Mrs. DONALD HISS or Mrs. ALGER HISS. Mrs. MEYER could furnish no further information.

The residence at 3331 Dent Place, N. W., formerly occupied by Mrs. MORTIMER GRAVES, is currently under lease to a Mrs. RUTH WILSON, who is extremely ill and unavailable for interview.

Mr. E. TOMILSON, 3329 Dent Place, N. W., advised Special Agent DONALD D. CONNORS that Mr. and Mrs. MORTIMER GRAVES are currently in Europe and are not expected to return until some time after July 1, 1949. Mr. TOMILSON advised that Mrs. WILSON's lease expires on that date and he expects GRAVES to return at about that time. He could furnish no further information.

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RECORDS OF PASSPORT DIVISION, DEPARTMENT OF STATE

By teletype dated May 17, 1949, the Washington Field Office was requested to recheck the records of the Passport Division, Department of State, to determine if any passports were issued to ALGER HISS and PRISCILLA HISS during 1924 to 1927, at which time it was also requested that the records be checked against the names of PRISCILLA FANSLER and PRISCILLA HOBSON.

No record was available for PRISCILLA HISS or PRISCILLA FANSLER or additional record for ALGER HISS was found other than that reported in the report of Special Agent JOHN J. WALSH dated February 28, 1949, at Washington, D. C. in instant case and on page 25 thereof.

Passport No. 498-761 was issued to FRANCIS THAYER HOBSON on December 16, 1924. The application submitted in conjunction with the obtaining of this passport indicated that FRANCIS THAYER HOBSON intended to travel and study in France, Italy, England, Spain, Germany and Switzerland for the possible duration of one year. On December 30, 1925, this passport was amended to include PRISCILLA, wife of FRANCIS THAYER HOBSON. The passport was also extended to December 20, 1925 and again on December 16, 1926. The address given by FRANCIS THAYER HOBSON at the time of this last extension was the Bankers Trust Company, Paris, France.

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IDENTIFICATION OF MARKINGS ON DOCUMENT Q-5 CAPTIONED "SINO-JAPANESE SITUATION".

On May 17, 1949, New York Office by teletype requested that the initials appearing on page 16618 of Document Q-5 captioned "Sino-Japanese Situation" be identified, and further that the identity be established of the persons or person affixing the numbered notations on the margin of Document Q-5 on pages 16624 and 16625.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent JOHN B. VAN ETTEN;

WALTER H. ANDERSON, Chief of the Records Branch, Division of Communications and Records, State Department, advised that CHARLES D. DYE, Chief of the Research Section, Records Branch, State Department, placed the notations "#1", "#2", "#3", "#4", and "#5" in the margin of Document Q-5 on pages 16624 and 16625. The notations were placed there incidental to the State Department's search for the original document. It was subsequently determined from CHARLES DYE that DYE had actually made such notations.

Mr. MAXWELL McGAUGHEY HAMILTON, Far Eastern Division, State Department, was interviewed by Special Agent VAN ETTEN regarding the initials on page 16618 of the designated Document Q-5. He advised that the initials are those of four different persons. The specific initials reading from left to right are "MS", "H", "DT", and "B".

The initials "MS" are those of MYRL S. MEYERS who in January 1938 was an officer in the Far Eastern Division of the State Department, Chinese Affairs, under MAXWELL McGAUGHEY HAMILTON. MEYERS' present address is 902 Euclid Avenue, Berkeley, California. He is a retired State Department employee.

The initial "H" is that of HAMILTON himself who at that time (January 7, 1938) was Chief of the Far Eastern Affairs Division.

The initials "DT" are those of a DOROTHY TUGGLE who at that time was a clerk in the Division of Far Eastern Affairs. According to Mrs. RANDOLPH DAVIDSON, Division of Central Services, Transportation Branch, State Department, DOROTHY TUGGLE died five years ago.

The initial "B" which faintly appears in the righthand margin of this document is that of JOSEPH W. BALLANTINE, who at the time was an officer in the Division of Far Eastern Affairs under HAMIL-TON, in charge of Japanese Affairs. BALLANTINE is retired from the State Department and is presently employed with the Brookings Institute in Washington, D. C.

In the course of the interview with MAXWELL McGAUGHEY HAMILTON, he indicated he frequently came in contact with ALGER HISS at the State Department, but that they did not mix socially. Prior to the testimony of ELIZABETH BENTLEY before the House Un-American Activities Committee, nothing had ever come to HAMILTON's attention which would give him any reason to question the activity or associates of ALGER HISS. He has never been in receipt of any correspondence from ALGER HISS and has never had any personal discussions or relations with him.

REINTERVIEW OF RAYMOND SYLVESTER CATLETT

On May 25, 1949, RAYMOND SYLVESTER CATLETT, alias MIKE CATLETT, was reinterviewed by Special Agent COURTLAND J. JONES.

MIKE CATLETT advised that he now recalls that he transported the Woodstock typewriter in question from the HISS residence to his home by means of a delivery wagon. During the time MIKE was working in the afternoons and on Saturdays at the Sanitary Grocery Store located at 31st and M Streets, N. W. He used this delivery wagon to haul groceries for the Sanitary Grocery Store customers. It was a regulation size wagon commonly used by boys.

He advised that THOMAS EVERETT was manager of the Sanitary Grocery Store at that time. Mr. EVERETT is no longer connected with the grocery store but presently resides at 5114 Cathredal Avenue, N. W. and when contacted by Special Agent COURTLAND J. JONES on May 25, 1949, he advised that he was manager of the Sanitary Grocery Store, 31st and M Streets, N. W., from 1927 to March 1939. He specifically recalls MIKE CATLETT as having worked in this store as an order boy from about 1935 until EVERETT left this store in 1939.

MIKE CATLETT advised that during the period he received the Woodstock typewriter from the HISSES he was also working as a house-boy for a number of families in Georgetown. Among these were Mrs. W. CREIGHTON PEET, 2620 Dumbarton Avenue, N. W. and JOHN M. DURBIN, 2918 N Street, N. W., a family named HUDSON, 3048 N Street, N. W. and Miss HELEN D. LAMONTE and her sister who lived at 2924 N Street, N. W.

MIKE CATLETT recalls specifically that he received the typewriter after he began working for Mrs. PEET.

MIKE CATLETT stated he is positive that he and his brother, PERRY CATLETT, received the Woodstock typewriter prior to the time that the HISS family moved to 3415 Volta Place, N. W. He advised that his brother, PERRY, was engaged in radio repair work at the time they received the typewriter. Exhaustive efforts were made to have him clarify this statement and elaborate on it, without success. He did state that he and his brother, PERRY, were employed by the HISSES on Volta Place doing odd jobs around the house. He recalls that he

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waxed the floor of the 30th Street address after the HISSES moved out and prior to the time Mr. HOLLANDER moved in. He also did odd jobs for Mr. HOLLANDER.

MIKE CATLETT's education was further discussed with him and he advised that he attended school up to the 6th grade at the Wormley School (Prospect Avenue, between 33rd and 34th Street, N. W.) in Georgetown, Washington, D. C. He stated he quit when he was about 14 years of age, but then was forced to continue school until he reached the age of 16. MIKE CATLETT further stated that he is sure that the CATLETT family had the typewriter when he was married in 1940. His wife died and he has since remarried. He stated at no time did ALGER HISS or any of the HISS family ever use the typewriter after it came into the possession of the CATLETT family and that it remained continuously at his home until it was given to his sister, BURNETTA.

MIKE CATLETT stated that to the best of his recollection, the first full-time job he ever had was that of a laborer at Fort Belvoir, Virginia, where he was employed by either CHARLES H. TOMPKINS or E. T. JOHNSON, contractor, or both. MIKE believes that in about 1940 he secured employment as a porter in the Georgetown Medical College.

CRIMINAL RECORD OF CLAUDIE CATLETT, PERRY CATLETT, JAMES CATLETT AND RAYMOND CATLETT

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent JOHN J. MASSE:

The files of the Metropolitan Police Department were searched for any available record on CLAUDIE CATLETT, PERRY M. ("PAT") CATLETT, JAMES RALPH ("BUCK") CATLETT, and RAYMOND SYLVESTER ("MIKE") CATLETT, negroes. PERRY CATLETT, age about 29, resides at 733 Harvard Avenue, S. E., Washington, D. C., JAMES CATLETT, age about 21, and RAYMOND CATLETT, age about 27, reside at 2728 P Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., where CLAUDIE CATLETT formerly resided. CLAUDIE CATLETT, mother of the three CATLETT boys, now resides in Winchester, Virginia.

No identifiable record was found on CLAUDIE CATLETT or PERRY M. CATLETT.

The following record was found on RAYMOND SYLVESTER

CATLETT, negro:

Arrested September 9, 1939, "disorderly", age 16, released to Juvenile Court, address 2728 P Street, N. W., parents, FERRY and CLAUDIE CATLETT.

Arrested October 29, 1944, "disorderly", age 22, \$10.00 forfeit, address 2728 P Street, N. W.

Arrested March 30, 1945, "disorderly", age 23, \$5.00 forfeit, address 2728 P Street, N. W.

JAMES RALPH CATLETT, negro, 2728 P Street, N. W., arrested March 30, 1945, "disorderly", age 17, released to parents.

Reference is made to New York Teletype dated May 17, 1949 in which the Washington Field Office was requested to check the records of the Passport Division, State Department to determine if passports were issued to <u>ALGER</u> and <u>PRISCILLA HISS</u> during 1924 to 1927. It was also requested that the records be checked against the names PRISCILLA FANSLER and <u>PRISCILLA</u> <u>HOBSON</u>.

The records of the Passport Division of the State Department with reference to ALGER HISS, were reported in the report of SA JOHN J. WALSH dated February 28, 1949 at Washington, D.C. on page 25 thereof. No additional information is available at the State Department in reference to ALGER HISS. No record is available for PRISCILLA HISSor PRISCILLA FANSLER.

Passport #498-761 was issued to FRANCIS THAYER HOBSON on December 16, 1924. The application submitted in conjunction with the obtaining of this passport indicated that FRANCIS THAYER HOBSON intended to travel and study in France, Italy, England, Spain, Germany and Switzerland for possibly one year. On December 30, 1925, this passport was amended to include PRISCILLA, wife of FRANCIS THAYER HOBSON. The passport was also extended on December 30, 1925 and again on December 16, 1926. The address given by FRANCIS THAYER HOBSON at the time of this last extension was the Bankers Trust Company, Paris, France.

DETAILS: AT WASHINGTON, D. C.

It will be recalled that as set out in the referenced New York teletypes dated March 31, 1949 and April 1, 1949, DEAN IVAN LAMB recalled visiting one GREEN at the Export License Bureau of the U. S. Department of State and ascertaining from him details in regard to the sale of aircraft to Japan. It is noted that LAMB recalls that he visited GREEN probably in November, 1933. LAMB stated that this visit was made by him at the express request of ALGER HISS and that HISS had told LAMB that the data in connection with this flying boat was unavailable to the Nye Committee but it might be made available to LAMB. LAMB further observed that he and GREEN mutually recognized each other.

Mr. JOSEPH COY GREEN, of the Board of Examiners, Foreign Service, U. S. Department of State, with offices at Room 1341 Temporary Building H, State Department Annex No. 3, advised on April 7, 1949, after a close examination of his records in the Export License Bureau, that he had found a memorandum dated June 2, 1936, which memorandum was addressed to him and prepared by his assistant at that time, one CHARLES W YOST. It is noted that CHARLES YOST is now in Vienna, Austria with the Department of State. This memorandum is quoted in toto below:

> "Mr. DEAN IVAN LAMB, of 114 West Seventy-first Street, New York City, called this morning to inquire concerning the regulations governing the exportation of arms, ammunition, and implements of war of Mr. LAMB said that he had recently been appointed by the Mitsui Company as their exclusive agent for the purchase of military planes in this country. He said that he realized that Mitsui was already registered but would prefer to register himself too, in view of the fact that it would mean no extra cost to him since Mitsui was paying all his expenses. He was vague about the quantity and type of shipments which he expected to make but gave the impression that they would be sizable and would consist chiefly of military planes manufactured in this country but following Japanese designs."

Mr. GREEN advised he had no recollection whatever of DEAN IVAN LAMB and stated that in a year's time during the period 1933 to 1936, he

probably interviewed fourteen or fifteen hundred people. The memorandum quoted above, according to the routing stamp thereon, was routed to the Far Eastern Division of the State Department, the State Department of Arms and the Communications and Records Section. Clipped to the memorandum were copies of letters directed to Office of Naval Intelligence and Military Intelligence Division (now Intelligence Division of the Army), which letters advised those agencies of the substance of the memorandum which appears above. Mr. GREEN advised that this was the only record at the U.S. Department of State in connection with DEAN IVAN LAMB. Mr. GREEN resides at 10 Quincy Avenue, Chevy Chase, Maryland.

It will also be recalled that in referenced New York teletype dated April 1, 1949; LAMB mentioned one JOHN EOGHAN KELLY and stated that he had related the story of his dealings with ALGER HISS to KELLY. LAMB advised that he believed KELLY's current address could be obtained through T. W. D. DUKE, a Washington; D. C., and New York City attorney.

As set out in WFO teletype dated April 4, 1949, DUKE, whose Washington, D. C., offices are located in the EDMONDS Building and whose Washington address is 1 Scott Circle, advised on that date that in his opinion JOHN EOGHAN KELLY could be reached through his mother who resides at 20 Barker Street, Pittsfield, Massachusetts. DUKE stated he believed KELLY to be reliable although he had considered him to be pro-Nazi during the early days of Hitler's ascendancy.

On April 12, 1949, Mr. STEPHEN, RAUSHENBUSH, former Coordinator of the Nye Committee and currently an officer of the Public Affairs Institute. 1100 E Street, Southeast, advised that he had no recollection of DEAN IVAN LAMB. RAUSHENBUSH recalled in connection with the ELLIOTT ROOSEVELT-Amtorg incident that his first knowledge of this affair was given to him by an individual whose identity he cannot recall. It is noted that RAUSHENBUSH stated he could not deny that this individual might have been DEAN IVAN LAMB. RAUSHENBUSH recalls that he and a Nye Committee investigator named. JOEL/EARNEST had an appointment with this unknown individual who told them of ELLIOTT ROOSEVELT's dealings with Amtorg and that this appointment was in the apartment of CARL RAUSHENBUSH, which apartment was located on ** the west side of uptown New York. RAUSHENBUSH's brother CARL was not present at this conference and RAUSHENBUSH believes that this unidentified individual who appeared at his borther's apartment and told him and EARNEST of the Elliott Roosevelt-Amtorg dealings; was an engineer and was accompanied and represented by an attorney. RAUSHENBUSH does not recall the identity of this attorney. RAUSHENBUSH advised that he now can recall only that he and EARNEST had an appointment with this individual at the apartment mentioned; above. He does not recall how or by whom the appointment was made or how the original negotiations for the disclosure of this information was handled. He states, however, he does not connect ALGER HISS with this episode and he

believes his recollection on this point is quite clear. RAUSHENBUSH states that he recalls the incident with some clarity because he made and lost a bet with a Dupont attorney who thought that the Nye Committee would suppress this story. RAUSHENBUSH advised that he, himself, very rarely went to New York City and thought it probable that he had made this trip no more than four times during his entire stay with the Nye Committee. He is of the opinion that HISS went to New York City only four or five times. RAUSHENBUSH does not recall that he was ever in New York City in the company of ALGER HISS. The JOEL EARNEST, mentioned above, is now believed by RAUSHENBUSH to reside in Stoney Point, Rockland, County, New York.

In connection with the ELIJOTT ROOSEVELT-Amtorg affair, mentioned above, it will be recalled that according to the referenced New York teletypes, DEAN IVAN LAMB has stated that he came upon information to the effect that ELIJOTT ROOSEVELT sold a number of aircraft to Amtorg and that he, ROOSEVELT, realized a large profit from this sale. LAMB further advised that he furnished this information to the Nye Committee through ALGER HISS and STEPHEN RAUSHENBUSH.

At a later date when pictures of LAMB were available, they were displayed to RAUSHENBUSH and he advised that to the best of his recollection he had never seen LAMB. It is noted that RAUSHENBUSH advised that he could not say definitely that he had not seen LAMB or that LAMB was not the individual whom he met in his brother's apartment. RAUSHENBUSH observed that the entire incident happened approximately fifteen years ago and that his memory of the affair may not be accurate.

Ex-Senator GERALD R. NYE, who maintains offices at Room 919 Dupont Circle Building, and who resides at 6 Farington Drive, Chevy Chase, Maryland, advised on May 5, 1949 that he did not recall LAMB and after viewing the pictures of LAMB stated he had no recollection of ever having seen LAMB. It will be recalled that New York letter dated April 13, 1949, enclosed four picutres of LAMB taken during (approximately) 1924, 1935, 1938 and 1944 and requested that these pictures be displayed to NYE and RAUSHENBUSH. On May 9, 1949, Brigadier General CLAUDE MARTIN THEILE, who resides at the Brighton Hotel, 2123 California Street, Northwest, advised that he had known LAMB fairly well back in 1934 or 1935. General THEILE stated that he regarded LAMB as "the last true soldier of fortune". He recalled that LAMB was introduced to him by one JOHN EWING KELLY, whom General THEILE described as a mining engineer whom he believed to maintain offices in Newark, New Jersey. THEILE stated that at that time he, himself, was officer in charge of the Reserve Officer's G-2 and that-JOHN KELLY was his assistant. THEILE stated that KELLY in about 1934 had written a book entitled "The Last Filibuster"; that he, General THEILE, had read that book and had commented upon it. KELLY then offered to introduce to General THEILE the man about whom the book was written. This man was DEAN IVAN LAMB. General THEILE said that KELLY brought LAMB to their office on one occasion and that he had enter-

tained LAMB at his home on one or more occasions and further that he had . met LAMB in downtown Washington once or twice. General THEILE advised that he very much enjoyed talking with LAMB and that he was inclined to believe that what LAMB told him was substantially true. General THEILE could not recall that LAMB had ever mentioned any dealings with Amtorg, the Nye Committee or that LAMB had ever told him, General THEILE, that he, LAMB had received an offer to engage in espionage operations on behalf of the USSR. General THEILE recalled that LAMB professed a great familiarity with Central and South America and with the leading figures of many Central and South American countries. General THEILE advised that he believed LAMB actually did know these individuals. He recalled that on one occasion in about 1935. LAMB phoned the General's office from the Carlton Hotel and General THEILE joined him at the hotel for cocktails at which time LAMB advised that he had "just lost half a million dollars". General THEILE went on to observe that LAMB told him on this occasion that he, LAMB; had bought a gun boat for Colombia and had succeeded in sending the gun boat off to Colombia without armament. Soon after this gun boat had left, ITAMBE purchased a condemned subchaser from the U.S. Navy complete with armor. It was LAMB's plan, according to General THETIE, to overtake the gunboat with the subchaser and to commandeer the gun boat then resell it to the Colombian Government. THEILE protested that this was piracy, whereupon LAMB stated that such was not the case because Peru and Colombia were at a state of war and he, LAMB, had a commission of Admiral in the Peruvian Navy. General THEILE stated that LAMB thereupon produced and displayed his commission .- When General THEILE asked LAMB what happened to this proposition, LAMB replied that before he could overtake the gun boat, Peru and Colombia had ended their war and had signed a peace treaty. General THEILE indicated that this narrative was an excellent cross section of the stories generally told by LAMB.

It is noted that General THEILE stated he believed LAMB to be a cool, calm and collected individual and had some admiration for LAMB's personal courage. He further believed that LAMB was loyalt to the United States.

INFORMATION CONCERNING WOODS TOCK TYPEWRITER, SERIAL NO. 5N230099

MELVIN O. JOHNSON, Secretary-Treasurer, and JOSEPH SCHMITT, Vice President in Charge of Production, Woodstock Typewriter Company, Woodstock, Illinois, advised on May 19, 1949 that the company has no record of the original sale or subsequent history of Woodstock typewriter, Serial Number 5N230099, inasmuch as all old records which would have recorded such data have been destroyed. They also explained that if this typewriter had been returned to the factory for rebuilding it would have been assigned a new serial number and the old serial number would have been machined off the typewriter. A thorough search of records at the Woodstock main office in Woodstock, Illinois, was made by Mr. JOHNSON and he could locate no information concerning this typewriter.

RE ABRAHAM GEORGE STLVERMAN

Referenced New York letter requested that RICHARD COOPER, Attorney of the Railroad Retirement Board, be interviewed concerning SILVERMAN. Mr. COOPER, who continues to be employed as an Attorney at the Railroad Retirement Board, 844 North Rush Street, Chicago, advised on May 27, 1949, that he entered the employ of this agency in April, 1940 as an Attorney and that he served as Secretary of the Railroad Retirement Board for a few months during 1942. He was not personally acquainted with Mr. SILVERMAN although he saw him on several occasions in the offices of the Railroad Retirement Board with the result that he stated he could furnish no pertinent information.

INFORMATION CONFERNING ADLAL STEVENSON, GOVERNOR OF ILLINOIS.

By telephone call on May 27, 1949 the New York office requested that pertinent information concerning ADLAI STEVENSON from the files of the Chicago office be submitted. The following is a summary of this information:

In September or October, 1941, Confidential Informant T-1 advised that the names of Mr. and Mrs. ADLAI STEVENSON, St. Mary's Road, Libertyville, Illinois, appeared in a list of names on file in the offices occupied jointly by the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade and the United Spanish Aid Committee, Chicago. The purpose of this list was not known to the informant. on December 27, 1944 reported that WILLIAM CARD, Executive Secretary of the Chicago Council of American Soviet Friendship, had discussed the possibility of approaching ADLAI STEVENSON to accept a position as Chairman of the CCASF Executive Board. At this time it was indicated that STEVENSON had a good government record and was a good progressive thinking fellow. On January 10, 1945 ladvised that CARD discussed with HARLAND ALDEN the possibility of securing STEVENSON as Board Chairman of the CCASF. ALLEN stated he had succeeded STEVENSON as Chairman of the Committee to Defend America. It should be noted that the House Committee on Un-American Activities cited the Committee to Defend America by Keeping Out of War as a Communist front organization.

T-2 stated that in his opinion this organization was controlled by the Communist Party. Among the names of sponsors appears the name of ADLAT E. STEVENSON.

The Southern Congress of Human Welfare was cited as a Communist front organization by the House Committee on Un-American Activities on March 29, 1944.

Referenced New York teletype dated May 17, 1949 requested that typewritten correspondence from Mrs. JAMES MC QUEEN, also known as MARGARET LOCKEY, be obtained from the files at the American School, Chicago, Illinois.

reflects that PERRY CATLETT stated he attempted to have this typewriter repaired at a repair shop then located at the northwest corner of Connecticut Avenue and K Street, NW.

On May 28, 1949, PERRY M. CATIETT, JR., was interviewed at his home, Apartment 3, 733 Howard Road, SE, Washington, D.C. The time that he received the typewriter from the HISS family was again discussed with him and PERRY advised that he does not mean that he received the typewriter on the date that AIGER HISS actually moved from 30th Street to 3415 Volta Place, but rather during the period of the move. Elaborating, he stated that he is unable to remember specifically if the HISS family gave him the typewriter before the move or after they had actually arrived at Volta Place. He said that the HISSES could have resided on Volta Place for several months before they actually gave him the machine.

In regard to his previous statement that he had attempted to have this typewriter repaired at a repair shop located at the northwest corner of K and Connecticut, PERRY was questioned at considerable length and he advised that he is sure that this occurred in warm weather. He said that he could have taken it for repairs about a week after he received the machine or it may have been a month or two. He estimated that he tried to have it repaired not more than three or four months after receiving the machine.

The following signed statement was obtained:

"Washington D.C. May 28, 1949

"I, PERRY M. CATLETT; JR. make the following statement to COURTIAND J. JONES, who I know to be an FBI agent. I am making this statement about a Woodstock typewriter.

"During the period that AIGER HISS moved from 30th St. to 3415 Volta Place N.W, Washington D.C, they gave me a Woodstock typewriter. I can't remember whether they gave it to me before they moved or after they had moved to Volta Place. They could have lived on Volta Place for several months before they gave it to me.

"Shortly after I got the typewriter, I took it to a repair shop located at the northwest corner of "K" & Connecticut. They told me it couldn't be fixed. I can't remember exactly when I took the typewriter to be fixed. I think it was in warm weather. I could have taken it to the shop about a week after I got it or it may have been a month or 'two. I'd say it was not more than three or four months.

Hagner & Co., made a search of the records and was unable to locate a lease indicating that the Woodstock Typewriter Company had occupied 1000 Connecticut Avenue from September 15, 1938, until September 15, 1940. He advised it is the policy of the firm to destroy leases after five years. He was able to locate in the permanent file of the company a rental application card which is made out in his own handwriting indicating that the Woodstock Typewriter Company leased Rooms 1 & 2, Second Floor, 1000 Connecticut Avenue, on August 20, 1938. The rental application card reflects that the rent began on September 15, 1938, and that the premises were vacated on September 15, 1940.

The above described rental application card is being afforded the New York Office. Mr. HENRI P. HENRY has written his name on the back of this card and it has been initialed by the writer. Mr. HENRY requested that this card be returned to the Randall H. Hagner Company, Washington, D.C., after it has served its purpose.

"Detroit, Michigan May 25, 1949

"I, Burnette Pauline Fisher, do volunterily make this statement to Mahlon Coller and Joseph Hyble who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the F.B.I.. I understand that I do not have to make this statement and it is being made of my own free will and accord.

"I came to Detroit in January 1945 prior to that I had resided at 1127-48th Place N.E., Washington D.C.. At the time I came to Detroit I left a Woodstock typewriter in the home of John Marlow at 1127-48th Place. I'm not certain that I could now identify this typewriter except that if the ribbon caps are off I may be able to identify the machine. When I left Washington, Mary Easter, Vernon and Louise Marlow resided at 1127-48th Place. These people knew that the typewriter was in the house.

"I received this typewriter from my brother Perry Catlett just after he was merried which I believe was in 1941.

"I heard that the typewriter was given to my brother by <u>Mrs. Alger Hiss</u> but I don't know who told me this. I didn't have much use for this typewriter and recall only using it twice while in Dunbar Highschool, this was to prepare a Hygiene notebook and a Biology paper. I do not know where there are any specimens from this typewriter.

"At the time I left it the typewriter was in workable condition. I never had any repairs made on it except for changing the ribbon. From the time I received the typewriter until January 1945 the machine was not out of my possession.

"I only saw this machine once in 1941 at my mothers home at which time I asked my brother Ferry Catlett for it and he gave it to me. I don't know how long my brother had the typewriter before giving it to me.

"I have read this statement consisting of two pages and it is true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

that he has already talked too much and that he is relictant to answer more questions. He claims that his former friends and acquaintances are avoiding him, and that it appeared to him that all his former friends are suspects in this case and subject to questioning or investigation. RENO was advised that he could assist in expediting the investigation by relating all the pertinent espionage information in his pessession to the best of his recollection.

When questioned concerning his acquaintance with JESSE SAMUEL ZIMMERMAN, RENO advised that he had been acquainted with one "JESSE" in Baltimere in about 1936 or 1937 and before the time that he first met "KARL" or "CARL." He identified a photograph of JESSE SAMUEL ZIMMERMAN as the "JESSE" he knew but claims that he cannot remember his surname of the surname he used. He could not connect the names of "HALL" or "GRAHAM" with "JESSE" although the name "GRAHAM" sounded somewhat familiar.

With some reluctance RENO stated that "JESSE" had been some sort of CP organizer in Baltimore and worked possibly in connection with steel workers or some other class of industrial workers. He claims that he cannot remember the exact circumstances under which he met "JESSE" or how many times he had seen him, but he does recall that he, RENO, was doing some organizational work in Cumberland, Maryland, for the CP at about the time of the meeting.

RENO denies that he ever met any individual who was known as a brother of "JESSE," but he does not specifically rule out the possibility of having met a brother of "JESSE." but if he did he was not aware of it.

RENO states that he is unable to give any more information concerning the identity of "BERNIE" than what he has previously given, and stated with some resentment that he could not give any further information concerning "JESSE."

A review of the files for such information was originally requested by the El Paso Office, as a result of information received from RENO during an interview, to the effect that he may have executed some government forms within recent years containing false information.

Results of a review of Civil Service Commission files and also RENO's 201 File, are contained in reports of SA JAMES FREW, dated January 28, 1949, and April 6, 1949, at Washington, D. C., in the JAHAM case. It is to be noted that photostatic copies of government forms signed by RENO were forwarded to the New York Office as enclosures to the report dated April 6, 1949. One of such forms was designated as Form #8, mentioned in referenced Baltimore teletype.

Inasmuch as it appears that all pertinent information regarding RENQ in the Civil Service Commission files at Washington, D. C., has already been reported, no re-check of such files is being made.

Reference is made to Bureau letter to New York dated May 16, 1949 concerning a visit made to Mrs. LUCY ELLIOT DAVIS, Hancock, New Hampshire, by an attorney named RICHARD M. FIELD, of Weston, Massachusetts, who had obtained the register of the Bleak House at Peterboro, New Hampshire. As pointed out, this register had previously been examined by the FBI Laboratory and the results of the examination were negative concerning the handwriting of ALGER HISS and WHITTAKER CHAMBERS.

The Bureau and New York are advised that at the time LUCY ELLIOT DAVIS viewed the pictures of ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS and WHITTAKER CHAMBERS on May 5, 1949 she furnished, on a purely voluntary basis, information to the effect that she had turned over the Bleak House registration to a Mr. FIELD. This information she had previously telephonically made available to Boston on April 21, 1949. She indicated that Mr. FIELD had presented himself as representing "the other side of the case" and further that he had "a personal interest in it." She said Mr. FIELD made the statement that he could see nothing of value in the Bleak House registration but said he considered this important as it was "a turning point in the case." Mrs. DAVIS further advised that Mr. FIELD had also exhibited the pictures of HISS and CHAMBERS to her, which pictures she was unable to identify, and he had questioned her concerning the registration of guests during the 1937 summer season.

In connection with the instructions set forth in the reference letter, the foregoing information is being submitted in addition thereto in order that it may be made available to Messrs. Donegan and Murphy, who are preparing the Government's case in New York City.

MARY EASTER further advised that she has no knowledge of the possession or ownership of a typewriter by BURNETTA CATLETT FISHER. She stated that she is acquainted with BURNETTA CATLETT FISHER, having met her when she visited her husband in Washington.

ALDRIDGE EASTER, 1208 Bob Harrison Street, advised that his mother is a bout 64 years old and that she separated from Dr. EASTER prior to 1930. He further advised that he does not recall his mother visiting Dr. EASTER in Washington, D. C. between 1930 and 1944. He stated that she went to Washington about December 1944 and remained there until his death in the early part of 1945. He further advised that when she returned to Austin she brought a portable Underwood typewriter and a small table radio. He also advised that no other property of Dr. EASTER was brought to Austin by MARY EASTER.

ALDRIDGE EASTER also stated that he sold the portable Underwood typewriter to the Crown Jewelry Company in Austin, Texas. EASTER advised that he has never resided in Washington, D. C. and has no knowledge concerning any other typewriter than the one his rather had prior to his death. He stated that he has no information concerning where Dr. EASTER obtained the Underwood portable.

Mr. J. SILBERSTEIN, Crown Jowelry Company, East 6th Street, made available a record which reflects that an Underwood portable typewriter, serial No. F 697453 was pawned by ALDRIDGE EASTER on May 19, 1947, and placed in stock on February 23, 1949. Mr. SILBERSTEIN stated that the above typewriter has been sold to Mrs. C. W. BROOKS, 108 West 16th Street, Apartment D, Austin, Texas.

The following investigation was conducted by SA WILLIAM H. BUCKLER:

AT WACO, TEXAS:

The records of the Waco Health Department, Vital Statistics Bureau, reflect that Dr. R. A. EASTER was buried at Greenwood cometery, Waco, on March 6, 1945. NICHOLAS DOZENBERG, 425 9th Street, was interviewed, at which time he was given the description of PETER as furnished by CHAMBERS, without revealing to him that CHAMBERS had furnished this information and without revealing the possibility that PETER might be identical with BYKOV BASOW or BASSOFF. DOZENBERG was unable to identify PETER.

After this the description of BYKOV as given by KRIVITSKY and Mrs. KRIVITSKY was given to him; however, he was unable to identify BYKOV. DOZENBERG stated he did not believe that BYKOV was identical with RICHARD BASOW that he formerly knew.

It should be noted that DOZENBERG is suffering from Parkinson's Disease and states his memory is failing him badly and that any information he furnished in the past will be much more accurate than anything he could furnish now due to his failing memory and his ill health.

AT FORT LAUDERDAIE, FLORIDA

The following investigation was performed by the writter:

BLANCHE LEE, 610 Royal Plaza, former maid for <u>STEPHEN M.</u> WALTER in 1937 and 1938 while WALTER resided in the Garden Tower Apartments, 2325 15th Street, N. W., Washington D. C. next door to Apartment #311, which was occupied by ABRAHAM GEORGE SILVERMAN, recalled her acquaintanceship with the SILVERMANS' maid during this employment. BLANCHE LEE was unable to recall any of the visitors which the SILVERMANS had nor could she furnish any information concerning the rug which SILVERMAN received in 1937.

AT ST. PETERSBURG, FLORIDA

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent E. WIISON PURDY:

Miss BERTHA TYSON, 1844 2nd Avenue North, advised that she did not move to 903 St. Paul Street, Baltimore, Maryland, until 1936, at which time she took over the management of this building in addition to her duties as President of the WCTU in Maryland. She stated that her nephew, P. S. BRUNFIELD, did not reside there until sometime after she

took over the building. Miss TYSON does not recall anyone by the name of CANTWELL or answering the description of CHAMBERS as having resided there. Miss TYSON states that she knows no one by the name of EDITH who may have been a maid for the CHAMBERS.

Miss TYSON recalled that prior to the time she took over 903 St. Paul Street, it had been managed by Mrs. MARY R. HASLUP, former President of the WCTU, now deceased. During the time Mrs. HASLUP was there her niece, Mrs. ANNIE RAY WARNER, resided there with her. Mrs. WARNER now lives and works at the Florida University for Women, Tallahassee, Florida.

Photographs of Mr. and Mrs. AIGER HISS and Mr. and Mrs. WHITTAKER CHAMBERS were displayed to Miss TYSON but she was unable to identify any of them.

Mr. L. M. EDDY, 123 14th Avenue North, formerly with the Railroad Retirement Board, Washington, D. C., advised that he does not recall SILVERMAN ever having been on loan to the Treasury Department but that SILVERMAN's duties with the Board were such that he could have easily performed work for the Treasury Department in addition to his duties with the Railroad Retirement Board.

Mr. EDDY stated that SILVERMAN was not under his supervision but he did see SILVERMAN very frequently at work inasmuch as SILVERMAN was in the Railroad Retirement Board Chairman's office, which was located mear EDDY's office. At the request of Mr. MURRAY W., LATTIMER, Chairman, Mr. EDDY gave SILVERMAN his original interview for employment. This interview was only for the purpose of determining if SILVERMAN possessed the technical knowledge to hold the position of Chief Economist. According to Mr. EDDY, SILVERMAN was very highly recommended by Mr. LATTIMER for this position and LATTIMER and SILVERMAN were very close personal friems. Mr. EDDY added that he knew nothing of SILVERMAN's activities outside of working hours but that SILVERMAN had had a free hand in selecting his own subordinates.

Mr. EDDY further advised that he knew nothing of SILVERMAN having received any Persian rugs.

Miss VIRGINIA MAVES, 700 10th Avenue South, secretary to WILLIAM B. ZIFF, advised that she recalls that one DAVIDAVICHOLAS, Filipino, was employed as butler from about August, 1945 to December, 1945 by WILLIAM B. ZIFF in Washington, D. C. and that she vaguely recalls a maid by the name of CLAUDIE CATLETT who was employed there for a short time. She stated that the only address she knew for NICHOLAS was on New Hampshire Avenue, Washington, D. C. and that he was listed at this address in the 1945 telephone directory.

Reference is made to Washington Field Office letter to the Director, dated May 10, 1949.

JOHN C. DAVIDSON, who is the brother of SA C. RAY DAVIDSON, presently assigned to the Bureau, stated in an interview on May 16, 1949 that SILVERMAN told him that he had written a Thesis while at Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts. This Thesis, according to what SILVERMAN told DAVIDSON, was an analysis and proof of one of the economic theories of MARX. SILVERMAN received an A.M. Degree from Harvard in June, 1924 and a Ph D. Degree from the same school in June 1929.

Mr. DAVIDSON further advised that ALDO RAFFA, 802 Garfield Street, Bethesda, Maryland, was an employee under SILVERMAN at the RRB. According to DAVIDSON, RAFFA, whom he considers reliable, was very well acquainted with SILVERMAN both personally and professionally. DAVIDSON further related that he had no objection to his name being used as an introduction in the event it is deemed advisable to interview RAFFA.

Further DAVIDSON stated that he believed that RICHARD COOPER, presently a member of the Legal Staff of the RRB, would be able to furnish valuable information concerning SELVERMAN.

Boston is requested to conduct appropriate investigation at Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts, in an effort to locate the Thesis mentioned above. Inquiry should also be made concerning SILVERMAN'S possible membership in the Communist Party or Communist front organizations. Also information should be developed concerning SILVERMAN'S associates, at Harvard, particularly whether or not he was acquainted with ALGER HISS, in view of the fact that they each attended Harvard at the same time.

At the above address, Mrs. FRANCES CODE, a sister of MARGARET GREENFIELD, advised that she is no longer residing at this address and has been traveling throughout the country gathering material for a book. Mrs. CODE stated that her most recent address as reflected in a letter from GREENFIELD is in care of ALLEN, 964 Keeler Avenue, Berkeley 8, California.

For the information of the San Francisco Office to assist in an interview of MARGARET GREENFIELD, it will be noted that she was a former associate of ABRAHAM GEORGE SILVERMAN at the Railroad Retirement Board, Washington, D. C. where SILVERMAN was the Chief Statistician.

MARGARET GREENFIELD should be interviewed concerning her knowledge and association with SILVERMAN; further as to his personal history, background and associates when at the Railroad Retirement Board. It will be recalled that ABRAHAM GEORGE SILVERMAN has been alleged by ELIZABETH DENTLEY to have been a member of a Communist Underground organization and responsible for the transmission of information from the United States Army Air Corps concerning the B-29 Project to GREGORY SILVERMASTER who in turn passed it to Miss BENTLEY for transmission to a Russian Agent.

Also, SILVERMAN has been alleged by WHITTAKER CHAMBERS to have been a member of a Communist Underground apparatus operating in Washington, D. C. in the early 1930's.

To date SILVERMAN has declined on advice of Counsel, to make any statement concerning the above allegations which have been made against him.

Please be advised that both NYE and RAUSCHENBUSH have been interviewed and both have been shown pictures of LAMB. Both advise that they do not recall the individual shown in these pictures. Further, NYE states that while he recalls the ELLIOT ROOSEVELT-Amtorg circumstances very clearly, he does not recall that DEAN IVAN LAMB or any other individual outside the Nye Committee as having any part in this matter. As has been previously set out, RAUSCHENBUSH does not recall the name of LAMB.

Re Bureau letter April 28, 1949, requesting the Washington Dield Office to locate and interview Brigadier General <u>CIAUDE M.</u> THEILE, Retired, in connection with information allegedly given by IAMB to THEILE. Officials of the Washington Loan and Trust Company's west end office, 17th and G Streets, N. W., Washington, D. C., which is set out in the Bureau letter as THEILE's address, have advised that THEILE's actual residence is unknown to them and state that THEILE moves from hotel to hotel in the District of Columbia area. By teletype dated June 6, 1949, the New York Office advised that available information indicated that two members of the immediate family of ALGER <u>HISS</u> died by suicide, namely his father, CHARLES A. HISS, in April, 1907, probably at Baltimore, and either a sister, MARY ANN (ELIOT) EMERSON, who died in 1928, or a brother, BOSLEY HISS, who died in 1926. The place of death of EMERSON and BOSLEY is unknown but one of them is believed to have been a suicide and possibly both deaths occurred in Baltimore. The New York Office further advised that the prosecutors at New York desire photostatic copies of death certificates of both members of the HISS family who committed suicide and all obtainable information pertaining to circumstances surrounding these suicides.

SIDNEY M. NORTON, Director, Bureau of Vital Records, Baltimore City Health Department, Municipal Building, Baltimore, Maryland, advised on June 7, 1949, that the records of his office reflected a certificate of death on file concerning CHARLES A. HISS indicating that he died instantly on April 7, 1907, due to a hemorrhage, having committed suicide by cutting his throat with a razor. However, Bureau of Vital Records files fail to contain a record of the death of MARY ANN (ELIOT) EMERSON in 1928, or BOSLEY HISS in 1926, indicating that these deaths probably did not occur in Baltimore. However, investigation to ascertain the full facts concerning the deaths of these individuals will continue.

Enclosed herewith for the attention of the New York Office is the certified copy of the certificate of death concerning CHARLES A. HISS.

Reference is made to my memorandum of June 6, 1949, advising that the Court trying the Hiss case had ordered that the testimony of Chambers before the Grand, Jury in 1948 and the FBI records of the conversations with Chambers in 1943 (1942) and 1945 be made available to him so that he could review the documents to see if there is any inconsistency in what Chambers had said in the past and what he is saying now.

At 10:00 a.m. today, ASAC Belmont, New York, called and stated that Mr. Donegan had made available to the Judge, the Grand Jury minutes with reference to the two New York letters to the Bureau in which the interviews with Chambers in 1942 and 1945 are recorded. Mr. Donegan stated he had not done anything about giving them to the Judge. Donegan advised that the letters obviously contained items that were not pertinent and he wanted to advise the Judge that the interviews were recorded in two different letters. He was going to point out to the Judge that in addition to the interviews, there are references to many persons named by Chambers and some information is recorded in the letters which was taken from the files of the Bureau. Donegan's approach is that he wants to give the Judge only those portions of the letters which relate to Alger Hiss.

<u>A memorandum is being prepared which reflects the objectionable</u> material in the two letters, which actually are paragraphs setting forth in brief fashion identifying data as to persons named by Chambers, plus pertinent comments concerning them, as revealed by the files.

I told Mr. Belmont that we were making this study at the present time and before he turned the two letters over to Mr. Donegan he should contact me again. I told him also that we wished to protest the entry of the letters into evidence.

It is noted that by teletypes received from the New York Office Mr. Donegan also wants to have the addresses of the four different Agents who handled, these two different interviews for the purpose of having them subpoenaed. The search for this book was made in the presence of reporting agent and no guest registration book for the pertinent years was found. Mr. PARKS advised that he believed that in 1937 he kept index cards of guests rather than a registration book. He arrived at this conclusion because of the fact that he conducts an antique business and it was this method; namely, index cards, which he used in maintaining a record of his customers.

Photographs of UHITTAKER CHAMBERS and ALGER HISS were exhibited to Mr. PARKS but he was unable to identify either photograph as that of any individual with whom he had been acquainted.

Mr. EARLE BISHOP, who conducts a real estate business in Peterboro, New Hampshire, and who had previously rented a cottage to LAUCHLIN CURRIE in 1937 at Hancock, New Hampshire, a cottage to which WHITTAKER CHAMBERS has stated that he, ALGER HISS and PRISCILLA HISS journeyed, where interviewed in hr. BISHOP also had rented rooms to guests on an overnight basis in 1937, but, as previously reported, he was unable to furnish any guest book for that year.

Photographs of WHITTAKER CHAMBERS and ALGER HISS were exhibited to Mr. BISHOP, but no identification of either individual was effected by him.

On April 21, 1949 Mrs. LUCY ELLIOT DAVIS, presently residing in Hancock, New Hampshire, the individual who had occupied the Bleak House in Peterboro, New Hampshire, in 1937 as a guest house; which guest house was reported to have possibly been utilized by CHAMBERS and Mr. and Mrs. HISS during the reported visit of these individuals to that town in 1937, advised the Boston Office telephonically that a <u>Mr. RICHARD M.</u> FIELD, an attorney of Weston, Massachusetts, had called at her home in Hancock, New Hampshire, on that date and requested from Mrs. DAVIS the guest book for the year 1937 of the Bleak House. Mrs. DAVIS advised she furnished this guest book to Mr: FIELD.

The Burcau and New York Office were advised by teletype of the above incident on April 22, 1949.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent FREDERICK M. CONNORS at Hancock, New Hampshire:

On May 5, 1949 Mrs. LUCY ELLIOT DAVIS of Hancock, New Hampshire, who was the lesse of the Bleak House, Peterboro, New Hampshire, in the

summer of 1937, viewed photographs of HISS and CHAMBERS and was also unable to make any identification. irs. DAVIS stated that since her previous interview with the Boston Office agents she had been thinking things over. She said that in 1937 there had been a handy man on the promises, one HENRY SAVAGE, presently deceased, and who, to the bost of her recollection, on at least one occasion had taken in guests during the early part of that season without having them register.

Sho pointed out that during the 1937 season one WENDEIL KEENEY, a music teacher presently at Furmen University, Greenville, South Carolina, had been a guest at Bleak House for the entire 1937 summer season. She said that Mr. KEENEY had an excellent memory and suggested that the photographs be displayed to him to ascertain whether or not ho could possibly recollect the alleged visit of HISS-CHAMBERS.

In connection with the foregoing, at the time LUCY ELLIOT DAVIS viewed the pictures of ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS and WHITTAKER CHADBERS sho furnished; on a purely voluntary basis, information to the effect that she had turned over the Bleak House registration to a Mr. FIELD. This information she had previously telephonically made available to Boston on April 21, 1949. She indicated that Mr. FIELD had presented himsolf as representing "the other side of the case" and further that he had "a personal interest in it." She said Mr. FIELD made the statement that he could see nothing of value in the Bleak House registration but said he considered this important as it was a "turning point in the case." Mrs. DAVIS further advised that Mr. FIELD had also exhibited the pictures of HISS and CHALBERS to her, which pictures she was unable to identify, and he had questioned her concerning the registration of guests during the 1937 summer season.

Photographs of CHAMBERS, ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS wore forwarded to the Charlotte Office on May 6, 1949 in order to have these photographs exhibited to VENDELL KEENEY, montioned hereinabove.

On May 11, 1949 the Charlotte Office advised by letter that Mr. WENDELL KEENEY had been interviewed and the results of this interview are sot forth as follows by the Charlotte Office:

Ir. FENDELL KEENEY, Fine Arts Building, Furman University, Greenville, South Carolina, was interviewed on May 10, 1949, at which time he advised that he spent the summer of 1937 as a guest at Bleak House, Poterboro, New Hampshiro, and recalled the time that "She Stoops to Conquor" played at the Stearns Farm. Mr. KEENEY viewed photographs of WHITTAKER CHANBERS, ALGER HISS and PRISCILLA HISS and advised that he had no recollection of over sceing them either at Bleak House or elsewhere. He stated that it was doubtful if he would remember them even if they had stayed at Bleak House unless they had stayed for some time or had been particularly called to his attention.

She recalled that FREEMAN was a photographer in the U. S. Marine Corps and believes that he is still in the service. Mrs. AMES informed that Mrs. B.B. ECK, 7121 16th Street, N.W. is acquainted with the FREEMANS and can advise as to the correctness of their present address.

Mrs. B. B. ECK, 7121 16th Street, N.W. was interviewed by the writer and SA HARRY K. CLAYTON on April 21, 1949. She stated the FREEMANS now reside at 133 Seamen Avenue, Apartment 3A, New York 34, New York. She has known them since 1941 and does not recall whether AL FREEMAN was employed by "Work". She reported AL is short, dark and stocky appearing; that his wife, GERTA is a refugee from Austria. Mrs. ECK recalled no reason to question AL FREEMAN's loyalty to this country.

Mr. THOMAS F. VeRADY, 2126 Menominee River Parkway, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, was reinterviewed concerning the Woodstock typewriter he sold to HARRY MARTIN and his partner FANSLER in Philadelphia in the year 1927.

In again relating his recollection of the sale of a typewriter to FANSLER and MARTIN, GRADY pointed out that the sale must have been in the year 1927 for the reason that after GRADY left the employ of the Woodstock Typewriter Company in December 1927 he never again was in the business of selling typewriters and, furthermore, it could not have been prior to 1927 for the reason that HARRY MARTIN was not in business for himself selling insurance until about the middle of 1927, and GRADY is sure that he made the sale shortly after FANSLER and MARTIN became associated in the insurance business. He stated that while his recollection is that he dealt with MARTIN, it could very well be that FANSLER signed the order but he has no recollection regarding this. DETERMINE

It was pointed out to GRADY that ANN COYLE did not go to work for FANSLER and MARTIN until the fall 1928 and that she could, therefore, not have tried out the typewriter before it was sold, if he sold it in 1927. GRADY stated that he never was positive that ANN COYLE had tried out the typewriter he sold to FANSLER and MARTIN and that he could very well be confused on this matter for two reasons, the first being that he was acquainted with MARTIN over a period of several years, including the two years he, himself, sold insurance for Northwestern Mutual and does not believe that he recalls the period of ANN COYLE's employment. The second reason for his confusion in this regard was a practice they had in selling typewriters where a "junior salesman" would go around various offices and leave a typewriter on trial with a stenographer in that office. A week or so later one of the salesmen would follow up and attempt to sell the typewriter It was his original recollection that this procedure was followed in the case of the sale of the typewriter to FANSLER and MARTIN, but he is not at Kisseloff-8928 all sure on this point.

GRADY had been following the events of the HISS trial in the newspapers and remarked he noticed HISS had produced a typewriter. He stated that he could not have sold this typewriter as he sold no typewriters subsequent to leaving the employ of Woodstock in December 1927. His only conjecture on this point was that if the typewriter produced by HISS was a typewriter originally in the office of FANSLER and MARTIN, it must have been one purchased by these men from some other person. He pointed out that in those days Woodstock typewriters were relatively new on the market. They usually undersold the other old line typewriters and the other typewriter companies would not take them on trade under as good terms as the Woodstock Company. It was customary in those days for people in offices to trade their typewriters quite often and he pointed out it was possible MARTIN or FANSLER had traded the typewriter he sold them in 1927 for a new one subsequent to 1929. If this was done, GRADY believed it would probably have been a sale made by JACK CAROW who was manager of the Philadelphia Office of Woodstock, when GRADY left in 1927, and for several years thereafter.

GRADY has not contended, except on the original interview, that his commission on the sale of the typewriter to FANSLER and MARTIN was applied upon an insurance policy sold by MARTIN to GRADY. Upon second interview, previously reported, when the dates of GRADY's policies with Northwestern Mutual, together with the names of the agents selling them, were available he then recalled that he had also sold a machine to J. O. BATTERSBY, H. B. STAVERS, and W. L. COATES in 1927 when these men associated themselves together in the sale of insurance for the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company, and that it was on this policy that his commission upon the sale of a typewriter was applied to the premium on a policy. Therefore, since that time, the application of a commission on the sale of a typewriter has not entered into his recollection of selling FANSLER and MARTIN a typewriter.

It was suggested to GRADY that perhaps in January 1930 he might have sold MARTIN a typewriter even though he was no longer in that business but may have relied upon his former connections. He denied that this was possible, stating he never sold a typewriter after he left the employ of Woodstock.

Recapitulating GRADY's recollection of the sale of a typewriter to FANSLER and MARTIN resolves itself in the following. He sold a Woodstock typewriter to FANSLER and MARTIN. The only bases of his recollection as to the time of the sale are the termination of his connection with Woodstock in December 1927 and his recollection that FANSLER and MARTIN had only recently associated for the sale of insurance. If the typewriter produced by HISS, bearing serial number 5N#N230099, did, in fact, come from the office of FANSLER and MARTIN it could not have been the typewriter GRADY sold to that firm for the reason that it was manufactured in 1929 and GRADY never sold a typewriter to anybody after 1927. STRYKER THEN WENT INTO GREAT DETAILS CONCERNING ILLNESS OF CHAMBERS IN NINETEEN FORTYTWO, THE NATURE OF HIS ILLNESS, THE NAMES OF DOCTORS WHO HAD DIAGNOSED HIS CONDITION AND THOSE WHO HAD PRESCRIBED FOR HIM AND FROM THE QUESTIONS ASKED IT WAS EVIDENT THAT IT WAS BEING MEANT FOR THE BENEFIT OF DR. CARL BINGER, THE PSYCHIATRIST WHO HAS BEEN ALLOWED OVER MR. MURPHY-S SEVERAL" OBJECTIONS TO SIT INSIDE THE COURT IN ORDER TO GAIN A FULL VIEW OF CHAMBERS DURING HIS TESTIMONY. THE COURT WILL RECONVENE AT TEN FORTY FIVE AM TOMORROW.
