Since December 10, 1948, there has been considerable investigation directed toward locating a typewriter formerly in the possession of AIGER HISS and his wife, PRISCILLA HISS. This investigation was instigated as result of evidence offered in a pre-trial deposition hearing in connection with a civil action in Baltimore, Maryland on November 17, 1948, where AIGER HISS had entered suit against WHITTAKET CHAMBERS charging libel and slander. At this time, CHAMBERS produced 65 pages of typewritten documents which he alleged were copies of or excerpts from original State Department documents which were made available to him by AIGER HISS for delivery to Colonel BYKOV, his superior in Soviet espionage operations. These documents were dated variously from January, 1938 to April, 1938.

On December 15, 1948, a Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York at New York City returned an indictment against AIGER HISS, charging him with perjury on two counts in that in about the months of February and March, 1938, AIGER HISS furnished, delivered and transmitted to WHITTAKER CHAMBERS, who was not a person authorized to receive them, copies of numerous secret confidential and restricted documents from the possession and custody of the Department of State.

The FBI Laboratory examined the above described documents and concluded that the typewriting appearing on 64 of them compared most closely to standards for a Woodstock Typewriter, pica type, spaced 10 letters to the inch, made in 1929. These documents which have been commonly referred to as the "CHAMBERS" documents, have been designated by the FBI Laboratory as Q-6 through Q-69.

On May 13, 1949, information was developed at Washington, D. C. from CLAUDIE CATLETT, a former maid for ALGER HISS, that defense attorneys for ALGER HISS had recovered a Woodstock Typewriter which was formerly in the possession of HISS. Investigation by the Bureau reflects that this typewriter is a Woodstock machine, model 5N, serial 230099. Indications are that this is the typewriter used to type the "CHAMBERS" documents.

There is being set forth hereinafter an analysis of the information developed since December 10, 1948, which concerns the Woodstock Typewritter. For purposes of clarity and in an effort to show possession, this information will be set forth by years.

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According to records of the Woodstock Typewriter Company, at Woodstock, Illinois, serial 230099 was placed on a machine between March, 1929 when serial 220000 was used, and August, 1930 when serial 265000 was used. No record of the sale of a typewriter bearing serial 230099 has ever been located; however, sale of a machine with serial 230098, one digit lower than the machine in question, has been located, it occurring in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on September 21, 1932.

1929

HENRY L. MARTIN of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania states he was in partnership with THOMAS L. FANSLER from 1927 until 1930, the latter being the father of PRISCILLA HISS. It is MARTIN'S recollection that a new Woodstock Typewriter was purchased by the partnership at its inception in 1927 from THOMAS GRADY, a salesman for Woodstock Typewriter Agéncy in Philadelphia and who was described by MARTIN as unreliable. GRADY's unreliability is possibly borne out by records of the Woodstock Company which reflect that GRADY terminated his services with the Philadelphia Agency on December 3, 1927, yet, he is supposed to have sold MARTIN-FANSLER a Woodstock Typewriter which was not manufactured until 1929 and 1930.

Further indications that MARTIN-FANSLER partnership obtained a Woodstock Typewriter about 1929 appear as a result of FBI Laboratory examinations. Typewritten specimens (K-12 and K-14) from MARTIN-FANSLER written in 1927 have been definitely found non-identical with the "CHANBERS" documents. No specimens emanating from the MARTIN-FANSLER partnership have been obtained for the year 1928. A specimen bearing the date of June 29, 1929 (K-25) has been determined by the FBI Laboratory as being non-identical. However, a specimen dated July 8, 1929 (K-26) on the letterhead of the MARTIN-FANSLER partnership has been determined by the FBI Laboratory to have been prepared on a Woodstock Typewriter of the same general style on which the "CHAIBERS" documents were prepared. In reporting the results of this examination, the FBI Laboratory commented that certain typewritten characteristics appear on the July 8, 1929 specimen which do not appear on the "CHAMBERS" documents which were written in 1938, making it impossible for the Laboratory to identify or eliminate the letter of July 8, 1929. It is felt that in the intervening years between 1929 and 1938, characteristics could have been developed by normal use and wear which might account for changes in typewritter characteristics.

Specimens from the MARTIN-FANSLER partnership dated in August, 1929 (K-27, K-28, K-29 and K-30) and November, 1929 (K-212) have been identified as having been prepared on a Woodstock Typewriter but could not be identified with or eliminated as having been typed in the machine which wrote the "CHAMBERS" documents.

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2.

It is observed that the typewritten specimen from the LARTIN-FANSLER partnership dated June 29, 1929 was also found by the FBI Laboratory as non-identical with the "CHAMBERS" documents. However, a MARTIN-FANSLER specimen dated nine days later, that is, July 8, 1929, was found to have been written on a Woodstock Typewriter. While this is not by any means conclusive, there are at least indications that the Woodstock Typewriter in question was purchased on or shortly before July 8, 1929.

1930

That the Woodstock Typewriter was in possession of the MARTIN-FANSLER partnership in 1930 is evidenced by a specimen dated January 29, 1930 (K-43) and a specimen dated February 5, 1930 (K-100), in which the same conclusion was reached by the FBI Laboratory which states that these specimens were prepared on a Woodstock Typewriter of the same general style on which the "CHAMBERS" documents were prepared.

According to HENRY L. MARTIN, Mr. THOMAS FANSLER and he dissolved their partnership in 1930 and Mr. FANSLER retired to an apartment in West Philadelphia.

1931

DAISY FANSLER, sister of PRISCILLA HISS, states she was living with her parents in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania during 1931. A typewritten specimen bearing the signature of DAISY FANSLER under the date of December 6, 1931 has been identified by the FBI Laboratory as having been typed on a Woodstock Typewriter and on the same machine which typed the "CHAMBERS" documents. This specimen (K-35) is a letter addressed to the Free Library of Philadelphia and explains the absence of Miss FANSLER, an employee, due to illness.

From the above it can be concluded that the Woodstock Typewriter in question was in the possession of the FANSLER family at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in 1931.

1932

Mrs. AIGER (PRISCILLA) HISS, in a signed statement dated December 7, 1948, furnished the following information concerning her knowledge of instant typewriter:

"I have been asked to recall all of the facts concerning a typewriter which was in my possession. Some time in 1932 or 1933, as far as I can recall, my father, Mr. THOMAS L. FANSLER, was us in the insurance business in Philadelphia (he was connected with the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company, for which company he acted as a General Agent), had in his possession

a typewriter which he gave to me. I do not recall whether I had this typewriter while I was residing in New York City. I do not recall the make of this typewriter. I do not recall now, how I disposed of it. I myself am not a proficient typist, but I have typed several things on this typewriter which my father gave to me."

1933

From April, 1932 until May, 1933, AIGER HISS was employed as an associate attorney in the law firm of COTTON and FRANKLIN, New York City, and resided at 378 Central Park West, New York City, from October, 1932 until May, 1933. That AIGER HISS had access to the Woodstock Typewriter in question in 1933 is evidenced by an unsigned letter dated January 30, 1933 from 378 Central Park West, which is addressed to Mr. WALFER I. TIBBETTS of Boston, Massachusetts and which has been identified by the FBI Laboratory as having been written on the same Woodstock Typewriter which wrote the "CHAMBERS" documents. This specimen (K-17) was originally made available to the Federal Bureau of Investigation by EDWARD C. MCLEAN, attorney for ALGER HISS.

Further evidence that HISS had the Woodstock Typewriter in question during 1933 is a letter dated February 17, 1933, addressed to the Equitable Life Assurance Society of the United States signed "ALGER HISS", which typewriting has been identified by the FBI Laboratory as having been typed on the same machine as the "CHALBERS" documents.

In May, 1933, ALGER HISS was employed by the Department of Agriculture, Agricultural Adjustment Administration. He and his wife moved from . New York to 3311 - O Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., in June of that year.

1934

No typewritten specimens have been obtained which reflect that AIGER HISS was in possession of the Woodstock Typewriter during 1934. In May of this year he moved from O Street, N. W. to 2831 - 28th Street, N. W.; Washington, D. C.

1935

No specimens of typing of the Woodstock Typewriter have been obtained which were written during 1935. In April, 1935, the HISSES moved from 28th Street, N. W. to 2905 - P Street, N. W. During this time, AIGER HISS obtained employment with the U. S. Department of Justice.

1936

On June 1, 1936, the HISSES moved from 2905 - P Street, N. W. to 1245 - 30th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. In September of this year, AIGER HISS was employed by the Department of State. A specimen of typewriting (K-32) entitled, "Personal Characteristics of TIMOTHY MOBSON", bearing the date of December 9, 1936, has been identified by the FBI Laboratory as having been written on the same Woodstock Typewriter which wrote the "CHALLEERS" documents. This specimen was directed to Mr. PAUL L. BANFIELD, Headmaster of the Landon School, Bethesda, Maryland, and was submitted to him as an enclosure with a handwritten letter of ALGER HISS. This specimen is the first indication that HISS possessed the typewriter in question in Washington, D. C.

1937

A specimen of typewriting was obtained from the minute book of the Bryn Mawr Alumnae Club of Washington, D. C., which has been identified by the FBI Laboratory as having been typed on the same typewriter which wrote the "CHAMBERS" documents. This specimen (K-249) is entitled, "President's Report for the Year 1936" and is a prepared speech delivered by PRISCILLA HISS in May, 1937 at the annual election of officers for the above described club.

Additional evidence reflecting the possession of a typewriter by the HISS family in 1937 is a letter dated May 25, 1937 signed by <u>PRISCILLA</u> <u>FANSLER HISS</u> and directed to Mr. W. H. HILLEGEIST, Director of Admissions, University of Maryland, Baltimore, Maryland. The FBI Laboratory has advised that this specimen was also written on the same typewriter which wrote the "CHAMBERS" documents. This is the latest specimen obtained by the Federal Bureau of Investigation which definitely puts the Woodstock Typewriter in question in the possession of the HISS family.

Information obtained from the sons of CLAHDIE CATLETT, previously described, RAYMOND SYLVESTER CATLETT and PERRY M. CATLETT, Jr., reflect that they think the CATLETT family may have come into possession of the Woodstock Typewriter in 1937. They claim that the machine was given to them by some member of the HISS family during the period in which the HISSES moved from 1245 - 30th Street, N. W. to 3415 Volta Place, N. W. (Real estate records reflect that HISS took possession of the Volta Street address on January 1, 1938.)

Specifically, RAYMOND SYLVESTER CATLETT has stated that he recalls transporting a Woodstock Typewriter from the HISS residence to his own home in a boy's wagon. To the best of his recollection, this occurred while the HISSES resided on 30th Street, N. W.

1938

PERRY M. CATLETT, Jr. has furnished a signed statement indicating the definite possibility that he received a Woodstock Typewriter from ALGER HISS in 1938 subsequent to April of this year. This conclusion is based on information obtained reflecting that the Woodstock Typewriter Company occupied rooms 1 and 2, second floor, 1000 Connecticut Avenue, N. W. (northwest corner of Connecticut Avenue and K Street, N. W.) from September 15, 1938 to September 15, 1940.

The statement in part is as follows:

"During the period that ALGER HISS moved from 30th Street to 3415 Volta Place, N. W., Washington, D. C., they gave me a Woodstock Typewriter. I can't remember whether they gave it to me before they moved or after they had moved to Volta Place. They could have lived on Volta Place for several months before they gave it to me.

"Shortly after I got the typewriter, I took it to a repair shop located at the northwest corner of 'K' and Connecticut. They told me it couldn't be fixed. I can't remember exactly when I took the typewriter to be fixed. I think it was in warm weather. I could have taken it to the shop about a week after I got it or it may have been a month or two. I'd say it was not more than three or four months."

1939

There is no information available concerning the whereabouts of the Woodstock Typewriter during this year other than that furnished by RAYMOND and PERRYCATTETT. They each state that the machine remained in their possession until it was disposed of by PERRY when he married in 1941. No specimens of typing are available.

1940

Likewise, there is no information concerning the whereabouts of the Woodstock Typewriter during this year, nor have any specimens been located.

1941

PERRY M. CATLETT, Jr. states that he gave the typewriter to his sister, BURNETTA, when he married in 1941. Marriage records reflect that PERRY MURPHY CATLETT was married to URSULLA VERONICA FLETCHER on September 10, 1941. RAYMOND SYLVESTER CATLETT, his brother, agrees with this statement and BURNETTA, now Mrs. BURNETTA FISHER, agrees with this statement in part. Specifically, BURNETTA CATLETT FISHER states that she received a Woodstock Typewriter from her brother, PERRY, when she entered Junior High School or Senior High School in Washington, D. C. School records reflect she attended Browne Junior High School from September 20, 1937 to February 5, 1940 and Dunbar Senior High School from February 5, 1940 to February 16, 1942.

It is observed that at the time BURNETTA FISHER received the typewriter from her brother she was not living with her family but with Dr. R. A. EASTER and MANNE MARLON at 1127 - 48th Place, N. E. (both of whom are now deceased). BURNETTA FISHER states that she kept the typewriter until her departure from Washington, D. C. in 1945, at which time she left it at the above address. No specimens have been obtained for the year 1941.

1942

BURLETTA FISHER, as stated above, has advised she possessed the typewriter during 1942 and her statement is verified by her sister, MRY, who also resided at the same address. No specimens have been obtained for this year.

1943

The machine was in the possession of BURNETTA CATLETT FISHER at 1127 - 48th Place, N. E., and no specimens have been obtained for this year.

1944

According to information obtained from BURNETTA FISHER and her sister, MARY, the machine was also in BURNETTA's possession during this year. No specimens have been obtained.

1945

BURNETTA FISHER moved to Detroit, Michigan in 1945 and she states that the last time she saw the Woodstock Typewriter it was in the attic at 1127 - 48th Place, N. E., Washington, D. C. with other belongings that she left in storage.

In order to reflect the subsequent history of the typewriter, it is necessary to report personal items concerning the individuals involved, all of whom are colored. According to several sources, Dr. R. A. EASTER died in Mt. Alto Hospital, Washington, D. C. The records of this institution reflect that his death occurred February 25, 1945. Several individuals have advised that at his death his lawful wife, MARY EASTER, came to Washington, D. C. and took possession of his personal belongings. The articles that she did not desire to take with her were left in the custody of VERNON MARLOW, son of the woman who until her death had lived with Dr. EASTER.

RAYMOND CATLETT states that he understands that VERNON MARLOW himself took possession surrepticiously of a number of the articles left in his custody at the EASTER home, among them being a Woodstock Typewriter. JOHN MARLON, the next occupant of the EASTER residence after the Doctor's death, states that there was no typewriter in the house when he took possession and that it was practically bare.

VERNON MARLOW and his wife deny any knowledge of the Woodstock or any typewriter from the EASTER residence and specifically deny having possessed one at any time. This statement is contradicted by their daughter. VERNELLE MARLON, and EARNEST BELL, son of Mrs. MARLOW, both of whom recall seeing a typewriter at the VERNON MARLOW residence and believing it to have come from the EASTER home. The probability that VERNON MARLOW obtained possession of the typewriter illegally is offered as the explanation for the denial that it was ever in his possession.

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7.

IRA W. LOCKEY, Sr., 722 Kenilworth Avenue, N. E., advises that about 1945 he moved furniture for VERNCN MARLOW and observed an old typewriter in MARLOW'S back yard. He asked LOUISE MARLOW, wife of VERNCN, if he might have the typewriter in settlement of the moving bill. She agreed and LOCKEY took it to his home for the use of his daughter, MARGARET.

Irs. JALES MCQUIEN, nee MARGARET LOCKEY, 84 Marion Street, Brooklyn, New York, states that her father obtained a typewriter when she was residing with him in Washington, D. C. about 1945. She used the machine in her studies while attending high school. She was married to JANES MCQUEEN and took an apartment on Park Road, N. W., and used the machine at this latter address as well as at the home of her father.

EARNEST BELL, previously mentioned, has advised that he observed the typewriter at the home of IRA W. LOCKEY and was informed by LOCKEY that it was the same machine previously in the possession of VERNON MARLOW. There are no specimens of typing available for this year.

1946

Mrs. JAMES McQUEEN and her father, IRA V. LOCKEY, Sr., have advised that the machine was in their possession during 1946. IRA W. LOCKEY, Jr. has advised that he was discharged from the Army in 1946 and recalls seeing the machine at his father's home when he returned. There are no specimens available for this year.

1947

Mr. and Mrs. JAMES McQUEEN have advised that they used the Woodstock Typewriter during this year. Evidence of this statement is reflected by an application for Federal employment executed by Mr. McQUEEN under date of July 26, 1947, and which specimen (K-740) has been identified by the FBI Laboratory as having been written on the same machine that wrote the "CHAMBERS" documents. This specimen is an application for employment by STAFFORD JINENY McQUEEN, 1207 Park Road, N. W., apartment 101, Washington, D. C. This is the latest specimen obtained of typewriting on the Woodstock machine.

1948

Lir. and Lirs. JATES MCGUEEN have stated that they moved from Washington, D. C. about this year and that they left the typewriter in question with IRA W. LOCKEY, Sr. who also agrees with the comments of his daughter. No specimens for this year are available.

1949

IRA W. LOCKEY, Sr. advises that about February or March, 1949, his son, IRA, Jr., took the typewriter to the latter's home. IRA, Jr. agrees with his father and states that he took it to 229 - 63rd Street, N. E.,

Washington, D. C. for the use of his daughter. He and his father agree that in April, 1949, at the request of LOCHEY, Sr., young LOCKEY returned the typewriter to his father.

IRA W. LOCKEY, Sr. advises that he had been in touch with RAYIOND SYLVESTER CATLETT, known to him as MIKE, and CHARLES H. HOUSTON, a colored attorney, concerning the typewriter. At the request of HOUSTON, LOCKEY turned over the typewriter to EDJARD C. McLEAN in April, 1949. Mr. McLEAN is an attorney for AIGER HISS. IRA LOCKEY, Sr. is in possession of a receipt reading as follows:

The CATLETT family, namely, CLAUDIE CATLETT and her children, RAYMOND SYLVESTER CATLETT, PERRY N. CATLETT, Jr., JAMES CATLETT, and MARY CATLETT ROSE, have advised that an attorney for ALGER HISS displayed a Woodstock Typewriter to them and advised them that it was the machine given the CATLETT family by ALGER HISS and formerly in their possession. No specimens for 1949 have been obtained.

Reference is made to the testimony of ESTHER CHAMBERS on June 13, 1949 concerning description of a stone porch at the 3415 Volta Place, residence of ALGER HISS, and defense attorney STRYKER'S statement that the porch she referred to was not built until 1943.

The records of the Building Permit Branch, Building Inspection Division, District of Columbia, were checked for building permits issued for repairs, additions, etc. on the premises of 3415 Volta Place. The following permits were noted by S.A. JOHN J. MASSE on June 14, 1949.

> Permit 181259 for repair issued June 10, 1935. PEARL H. EDWARDS given permission to repair roof, floors, walls rebuild portions of the foundation and repair windows as per plans. Job completed October 3, 1935.

Permit 195206 issued September 11, 1936. Mrs. P. R. FLANAGAN given permission to erect 7 foot brick wall on own property. Completed September 26, 1936.

Permit 269426 for repair issued May 22, 1944. Col. R. ALEXANDER has permission to cut window in West wall. Job complete July 5, 1944.

Permit 290916 for an addition issued December 5, 1946. General E. H. LEAVEY permission to erect a one story brick addition to existing dwelling consisting of one room as per plans.

Permit 307901 issued June 11, 1948. General E. H. LEAVEY, has permission to waterproof brick foundations of wall.

Permit 32912 issued July 12, 1948 to E. H. LEAVEY. Plumbing and gasfitting permit to cut water line for Bendix washer.

TEUNIS F. COLLIER was the building contractor for the addition made under permit 290916 issued December 5, 1946. He was interviewed by S.A. JOHN B. VAN ETTEN on June 15, 1949 who with T. F. COLLIER inspected the premises at 3415 Volta Place.

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COLLIER advised that on June 13, 1949 JOHN F. DAVIS of the firm Schoene, Freehill, Kramer and Davis, 1625 K St., N.W., Washington, D.C. obtained from COLLIER'S office a copy of the permit 290916 on behalf of the defense for ALGER HISS. The construction under this permit, according to COLLIER, involved the excavation of earth from behind the retaining wall facing on the sidewalk and making a one story room the roof of which was laid with flagstone making an additional front porch or terrace. The old retaining wall was used and windows were placed therein.

Referring to the photographs enclosed, the two windows to the left of the gate locate the old retaining wall which forms one side of the room. The iron railing shown in photograph 5-B encloses two sides of the new flagstone terrace.

This structure was completed in 1947 according to COLLIER.

Prior to building this room the retaining wall was supporting soil which was as high as the wall and approximately level with the front door landing.

Referring to the rough sketch enclosed it is noted that a brick stairway and landing lead from the entrance to the front door. COLLIER advised that this stairway was not changed basically at the time the room was constructed.

Still making reference to the sketch, it is noted that a large flagstone terrace is located directly outside the living room. It was COLLIER'S opinion that this terrace has been in existance for a number of years.

JACK H. GILLIAT, realtor and former rental agent for the 3415 Volta Place premises advised that he believes that the present terrace at the rear of the house has been enlarged but that the terrace did exist prior to the time the house was rented to ALGER HISS. He stated he could not swear to that as a fact, but such was his recollection.

GILLIAT advised that one of ALGER HISS' attorneys had contacted him on Sunday, June 12 concerning the various terraces at this residence.

T. F. COLLIER expressed willingness to testify in the event it was necessary. He would testify that the retaining wall was not replaced, that the brick steps are basically the same and that there was earth behind the retaining wall at a level somewhere near that of the brick porch. COLLIER has had three different contracting jobs on the Volta Place house and is very familiar with it. It is believed he

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would be a good witness if his testimony should be desired.

Washington Field Office will continue its investigation to establish when the stone terrace at the rear was built and determine whether it was in existance at the time the HISSES resided there.

The enclosed photographs are borrowed from the Bureau and it is requested that the New York Office return them to the Washington Field Office. t



At 2:30 a.m. on June 17, 1949, J. Frank Connor of 2127 Sunset Farm, Congress, New York, telephonically contacted the Bureau. Connor sounded to be somewhat intoxicated; however, he furnished the following information. Alger Hiss approximately a year ago was attempting to hide from authorities for a period of time. He was apparently successful in this endeavor. He was assisted by a woman whom Connor called Berthol Morrison. F.L. Morrison has an apartment on Riverside Drive in New York, and it was in this apartment that Hiss stayed while he was hiding. Connor described Morrison as the former secretary to the former President Butler of Columbia University. She is in some manner related to a Mrs. Steward Showden of Wayne Avenue, Germantown, Pennsylvania. The significance of this relationship was not clear from Connors conversation.

Connor stated that his information was obtained from his stepson who is married into the Morrison family. Connor indicated his willingness to be interviewed by an agent if additional information is desired.

Action

It is recommended that this matter be routed to Mr. Whitson's Section for their information.

On December 28, 1948, a letter was forwarded to the Bureau by the Boston Office, entitled COMMUNIST PARTY CULTURAL ACTIVITIES, INTERNAL SECURITY - C. This letter stated in substance. (through a confidential)

Dartmouth College Library, Hanover, N.H.) that in the summer of 1948 ABRAHAM WELANKO, a key figure Communist Party functionary in New Hampshire, had contacted ALEXANDER LAING, assistant librarian at Dartmouth College, for the purpose of establishing an interchange of "cultural and social" information between VOKS and the Dartmouth College Library.

The letter further states although it has never been established that LAING is a member of the Communist apparatus in New Hampshire, he is widely known on the Dartmouth campus as a left winger and ND_____ has reported that LAING's name has been mentioned by persons in the Party as one friendly to the Party and Party members.

A mail cover placed against WELANKO in 1947 revealed that he received numerous registered articles from the Soviet Union during the summer of 1947.

The confidential source described above approached an Agent of the Boston Office last <u>summer and exhibited to him the correspondence between</u> <u>LAING and WELANKO</u>,

The Agent was requested also to give his opinion as to whether or not the library might be embarrassed by agreeing to this interchange. The Agent did not give any opinion on this matter but requested that if such an arrangement were undertaken, that he be furnished the address to which the material was to be sent in Russia.

On December 17, 1948, the confidential source mentioned above furnished a photostatic copy of a letter signed by BORIS G, BOLDYREV, Chief, American Department, VOKS. The letter indicated that the interchange had been initiated and that LAING would be in charge of preparing and shipping the material which was to be sent to VOKS. Photostatic copy of the letter mentioned herein was furnished to Special Agent ROBERT SCOTT McLEOD and forwarded to the Bureau with referenced letter of Dec. 28, 1948.

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent JOSEPH M. KELLY, dated December 23, 1948, New York City, in captioned case, wherein BORIS BYKOV, was Colonel BYKOV, BORRIS BYKOV and BORIS HERTZ is carried as a subject in the case. On page 36 of the same report, the results of an interview with CHAMBERS by Special Agents JOSEPH M. KELLY and T. G. SPENCER reflect that CHAMBERS has stated that he met BYKOV in the fall of 1936 and that it was his understanding that BYKOV was the individual in charge of the entire apparatus in which he was operating.

In view of the above statement made by CHAMBERS, it is possible that BORIS BYKOV may be identical with BORIS G. BOLDYREV, Chief, American Department, VOKS, who was reported to have signed the letter initiating the interchange of correspondence between Dartmouth College Library and VOKS in Moscow, Russia.

It may be possible to obtain a photograph of BORIS G. BOLDYREV, providing he was ever in the United States, and this photograph may then be exhibited to WHITTAKER CHAMBERS in an effort to determine whether BOLDYREV is identical with BYKOV.

This source advised that Hermann stated that he did not know hittaker Chambers, although it was possible that he may have met him at one time or another in mashington, D. C., or New York City. Herrmann admitted he had been a member of the John Leed Club but he had not been active and he had attended only one meeting of that club. He denied any knowledge of a note dated March 4, 1938, stating, "Karl - If you have given up . playing around with my girlfriend, she wishes you would take your stuff out of her closet, so she can use it for her clothes instead of yours. H." Herrmann denies that he had ever been a Communist or that he had ever belonged to a communist group in "ashington, ", G., including Harold Ware, Donald Hiss, Charles Kramer, Nictor Perlo, Henry Hill Collins, Jr., Lee Pressman and Nathan-itt. He was shown photographs of Lonald and Alger-Niss. Victor Perlo, Henry Mill Collins, Jr., Lee Pressman, Nathan Vitt, Priscilla Hiss. John Abt. Nathan Gregory Silvermaster and Harry fexter thits and of the foregoing he said he knew none of these individuals except Henry Mill Collins, Jr., and Lee Presstan.

Herrmann stated he dimly remembered having met Fressman, who during the middle thirties was active on behalf of the CIO, in Washington, D. C., and he felt he had also known Henry Hill Collins, Jr., in .ashington, T. C. He was unable to state just where he might have met Collins.

He stated he knew Harold are who, during about 1935, was working for a "left-wing" publication put out by Farm Besearch, Inc. Herrmann exclained he was at that time intertested in sortion affairs and was doing some articles which brought him into touch with people in "farm circles" in "ashbicall ED 12

ington. Herrmann wrote for the Farmer's National Weekly and also Scribner's. He stated that Harold Care was killed . in a traffic accident.

Herrmann stated that he resided in an apartment on New Hampshire Avenue in Tashington, D. C., from the summer of 1934 up to about February, 1935. He dimly recalls having known a Silverman family in Tashington and he believed that Mr. Silverman worked in the Bureau of Engraving or for the Treasury Department. Herrmann specifically denied any knowledge of a situation wherein J. Peters allegedly instructed Harold Fare and Herrmann to arrange to take a Mr. Silverman away from Mashington, D. C. Herrmann stated he had never known a J. Feters.

Herrmann was shown two photographs of Uhittaker Chambers and he stated that he did not clearly identify this person as any former acquaintance of his. He said that of course he recognized the photograph of Chambers as being that of a person whose pictures, during the past year, have frequently appeared in the newspapers.

You should incorporate the above facts in your next investigative report, taking the appropriate precaution to protect the source of information.

The records of the Dies Committee reflect the following information concerning Dr. Carl A. L. Binger who, according to communications from your office, is the princhistrist employed by the Misses and who was present in court observing Chambers during his testimony in this case.

The New York Times for April 14, 1948, page 31, column 6, revealed that Carl Binger arged psychiatrists to participate in world affairs. The Angast 17, 1948, issue of this newspaper reflects on page 23, column 7, that Carl Binger urged the use of mental and social scientists at foreign policy making levels.

Carl A. L. Binger was the signer of a January, 1943, message to the House of Representatives opposing the recentl of the Dies Committee, according to a leaflet issued by the Mational Pederation For Constitutional Liberties. The National Pederation for Constitutional Liberties has been chied as subversive by Attorney General Ton Clark on December 4, 1947, and September 21, 1948. This organization was also cited as subversive by Attorney General Francis Biddle in the Congressional Record of September 24, 1942, page 7687. (61-7582-1298 Section 4 pp.

I thought that you would be interested in the following information which appears in the files of the Bureau concerning Judge Samuel Hamilton Kaufman, who you will recall is presiding in the Hiss-Chambers Case in New York:

Samuel Hamilton Kaufman was given a recess appointment on June 22, 1948. He was confirmed by the United States Senate on January 31, 1949. He was appointed February 2, 1949. He took his oath of office as United States District Court Judge for the Southern District of New York and entered on duty on February 8, 1949. (Congressional Record, January 31, 1949, Page 739; Dept. of Justice Register for 1949)

The files of the Bureau reflect that Samuel H. Kaufman was investigated by the Bureau as an applicant for a Departmental legal position in 1934. He was subsequently investigated by this Bureau in 1947 and 1948 for the position of U.S. District Judge - Southern District of New York.

Kaufman was born on October 26, 1893, in New York City. He graduated from New York University Law School where his grades were very unsatisfactory and many failures were recorded. He was admitted to the New York Bar in the October term of 1917. From 1918 to 1923 he associated with Leo Oppenheimer in the practice of law. During this period he was also a Captain in the Infantry in World War I. From 1923 to 1930 he was a member of the firm of Oppenheimer, Kaufman, Haiblum and Kupfer. From 1931 to 1933 he associated in the practice of law with Emil Weitzner. He was employed as Special Assistant to the Attorney General handling Immigration and Naturalization frauds from April to December, 1935, at New York City. From 1933 to 1936 he was associated with Mr. Weitzner and Emanuel Celler. He was appointed as Special Counsel to the Federal Communications Commission on June 4, 1937, to handle a disbarment proceeding in Washington. He associated in the practice of law with Mr. Emil Weitzner from 1937 to 1941. He was senior partner in the firm of Kaufman and Cronan from 1941 to 1946. In January, 1946, he was employed as Associate Counsel to the Pearl Harbor Congressional Investigative Committee. From 1946 to 1948 he was senior partner in the firm of Kaufman, Gallop, Climenko, Gould and Lynton, 30 Broad Street, New York City. :1:

The Judiciary, Southern District of New York, regarded Kaufmanyas honorable. upright, able, successful, and experienced in bankruptcy and receivership matters. Fellow petitioners regarded Kaufman as a very able trial lawyer hot deeply interested in case or written law. He was reported to be practically shrewd, egocentric, ambitious, determined, ruthless, ungrateful, and sometimes irritable. BAS DESTROYED LL INFORM STAINED ASB: jpa;se ·101 28/

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He was further described as one who has entertained the Judiciary lavishly and has expected favorable decisions as a result. It was alleged that he could not be reached on a monetary basis but might grant favors for personal reasons. He is stated to be very wealthy inasmuch as he received a substantial income from an interest in ladies' apparel stores operated by his brothers. (77-7721-3 & 15)

Congressman Emanuel Celler, a former partner, described Kaufman as an honest and capable trial lawyer but extremely ambitious, egocentric, lacking judicial pose and temperament, and as desiring the judgeship for a temporary period only to increase his wealth through enhanced legal practice. Paul M. Segal, a Washington attorney, advised in April of 1948 that Kaufman was guilty of unethical practices and entirely unfit for a position of judge. (77-7721-32)

In April, 1948, Richard J. Cronan, former partner of Kaufman, classified Kaufman as ruthless, determined, and ungrateful. He advised that Kaufman would make a mediocre appointment and reduce the caliber of the United States Bench. He also stated that Kaufman has a serious heart ailment and is not able to perform his share of the legal work. In the same month, John L. F. Wood, New York City, advised that Kaufman represented one Alfred J. Miranda and Ignacio Miranda in action against the Brewster Aeronautical Corporation represented by Wood. Wood stated that the Mirandas have poor reputations as both served prison terms at Lewisburg, Pennsylvania, for violation of the Neutrality Act. The Honorable Harold Medina, Southern District of New York, recommended Kaufman as to ability and appearance but advised in April of 1948 that he believed Kaufman represented Serge . Rubinstein in several instances. George Alger, an attorney in New York City, advised that Kaufman had a poor reputation, was untrustworthy and represented. Rubinstein in many financial deals and also in Rubinstein's Selective Service case. He stated that he would hesitate to bring a case before Kaufman in a court of law. and that he had heard that Kaufman's former partners do not hold him in high esteem. Alger stated that Kaufman made use of unethical means and is in very poor health, suffering with a heart ailment. Kenneth M. Spence, an attorney in New York City, who has known Kaufman for many years, advised in April, 1948, that Kaufman was a smooth, ingenuous character in whom he had no confidence whatsoever. He stated that Kaufman is not a satisfactory person to preside as Justice in a U.S. District Court. He related that Kaufman approached him in 1928 or 1929 and offered hin \$5000, not as a retainer, but for the purpose of utilizing his close association and friendship with U.S. District Court Judge Thomas D. Thatcher in order for Thatcher to intercede with U.S. Attorney General Mitchell for the purpose of entering a nolle proseque to an indictment against a member of the Prince and Whiteley Brokage Firm, a client of Kaufman's. Spence classified Kaufman as a political lawyer. (77 - 77 / 21 - 33)

Dykeman, Chairman, Judiciary Committe, New York State Bar Association, advised that Kaufman was unethical and had admitted in court that he used mechanical devices to record telephone conversations. Dykeman informed that the administration of justice would be hindered instead of benefited by Kaufman's appointment.

(77-7721-33)

The New York Journal American for Tuesday, June 8, 1948, contained an article by Financial Editor, Leslie Gould, entitled, "Federal Bar Association Opposes Serge's Lawyer as Judge." This article stated that "President Truman's and Tammany Hall's efforts to name Samuel H. Kaufman, a lawyer who served Serge Rubinstein, the millionaire draft dodger, to the Federal Bench in New York have run into another hurdle." The article states that the Judiciary Committee of the Federal Bar Association of New York, New Jersey, and Connecticut had wired the Senate Judiciary Committee to withdraw its recommendation of April 13, 1949, to the President for the appointment of Samuel H. Kaufman to a judgeship in the Southern District of New York. In the same wire, the Federal Bar Association recommended that Kaufman's appointment not be confirmed in view of information recently obtained.

The January 28, 1949 issue of the "New York Star" contained an article by Arnold Blom entitled, "Senate Unit Backs 2 Nominees to Bench Opposed by the Bar." This article reflects that the Senate Judiciary Committee in Washington approved the appointments of Paul P. Rao and Samuel H. Kaufman for Federal Judges in New York City. The article also stated that "The New York County Lawyer's Association approved Kaufman but his nomination was opposed by the Judiciary Committee of the Association of the Bar of the City of New York. Later, after a closed hearing of a Senate Judiciary sub-Committee, its chairman, Senator William Langer (R.N.D.) expressed belief that the association's charges had not been substantiated."

Conduct of Judge Samuel H Kaufman in the Current Hiss-Chambers case

The "Evening Star" for Thursday, June 9, 1949, carried an article pertaining to this case by Newbold Noyes, Jr. and Robert K. Walsh, Star staff correspondents. This article stated, "Yesterday, as on previous days, Judge Kaufman frequently supported defense objections to Mr. Chambers' testimony and overruled the Government. Several times the precise little jurist questioned the witness on his own and more than once he shut off the prosection's line of questioning without waiting for an objection from Mr. Stryker.

"Mr. Murphy, a towering, heavy-set man with a walrus mustache, frequently clashed with the Bench."

When Mr. Chambers testified that he had had five sources of confidential

information in Washington, Judge Kaufman asked loudly, "Do you want us to understand that when you testified before the House Un-American Activities in 1948, and said in substance you had nothing to do with espionage, you'd forgotten all those sources of supply ***"

"Mr. Murphy was on his feet objecting that Mr. Chambers had not said that he had forgotten. 'I think the Court has distorted unintentionally, of course, the witness' testimony,' he completed."

The "Washington Times Herald" for June 11, 1949, carried an article by William Edwards captioned, "U.S. Protest Conduct of Hiss Judge." In this instance Mrs. Esther Chambers testified that Mr. and Mrs. Hiss called her "Liza" and her husband "Carl". At this point Judge Kaufman took over the questioning and when informed by Mrs. Chambers that the Hisses knew them as "Carl" and "Liza", he stated that Chambers had testified that the Hisses knew them under the name of Crosley. According to the article the Government angrily protested this statement by the Judge "as a misquotation of a previous witness". It was reported that a climax appeared to have been reached in the steadily growing quarrel between Assistant U.S. Attorney Thomas M. Murphy and Kaufman over the latters apparently hostile attitude toward Government witnesses.

"Lawyers in the courtroom said later they had anticipated an immediate motion for a mistrial based upon the Judge's error and its influence upon the Jury. * * *"

Willard Edwards reported in his column appearing in the "Washington Times Herald" for Tuesday, June 14, 1949, as follows:

"Federal Judge Samuel H. Kaufman consistently severe on Government witnesses since the trial started, helped add to Mrs. Chambers' uncertainity by shouting at her on one occasion, reprimanding her for attempting to answer with other than "yes" or "no" responses."

"Time" Magazine, for June 13, 1949, reports on pages 20 and 21 that Assistant U.S. Attorney Thomas Murphy rose to make his opening statement in the Hiss-Chambers Case "as undramatically as if he were reading a directors' report. He spoke dispassionately: the case of the U.S. v. Alger Hiss was a simple one -just a matter of two counts of perjury before a grand jury on December 15, 1948," Murphy sat down after having spoken only 23 minutes.

"Then Defense Attorney Lloyd Paul Stryker strode toward the jury box -and the atmosphere of the trial suddenly changed. At 64, after 40 years as a Pleader and advocate, frowning, crop-haired Lloyd Stryker was one of the most spectacular trial lawyers in the United States. His voice ranged from a soothing whisper to a thundering roar as he began turning out flamboyant courtroom oratory."

"The jury was fascinated. So was Judge Samuel Kaufman -- he moved quietly from the bench to the witness chair to watch at close range while the master worked...."

"Time" Magazine for June 20, 1949 reports on page 19 that "Last week like a leopard on the prowl, Stryker hunted through Chambers' spoken and already recorded words for inconsistencies. Sometimes Stryker had help in the hunt from no less a person than Federal Judge Sanuel Kaufman, onetime trial lawyer, conducting his first big case.

"Time" reports that Murphy "sighed with rage when little Judge Kaufman time and again overruled his objections, sustained many of Stryker's."

I shall keep you advised of further activities of Judge Kaufman in connection with this matter.

He testified Gandy that he was questioned by the Bureau and that there were five men and a lady present in FBI Headquarters when he was questioned there from 4:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., and he made a claim that an Agent told him at that time that the Agent would give him \$200 if he produced the typewriter. He identified the Agent who offered him \$200 as Agent Jones.

You inquired as to how many were present when Catlett was interviewed and also about the \$200 offer.

The Washington Field Office has advised that Catlett was brought to the Washington Field Office on May 13, 1949, by Special Agents James Frew and Lewis E. Glenn at 3:40 p.m. He waited while his two brothers were interviewed. At 5:07 p.m., the interview of Catlett was handled by Special Agents Courtland J. Jones and John E. Howard in the presence of stenographer Marguerite Hansen. During the latter part of the interview, Supervisor K. T. Delavigne was present. Special Agents Frew and Glenn did not sit in on the interview. The interview was concluded at 6:45 p.m.

All of the above-named employees state that Special Agent Jones did not offer Catlett \$200 or any other sum of money to procure the typewriter.

RAYMOND SYLVESTER CATLETT, aka. "Mike" IMPERSONATION

Purpose:

The purpose of this memorandum is to present a summary of the facts developed during the investigation of the case entitled "Jay David Ehittaker Chambers, was. et al., Perjury, Espionage - R, Internal Security - R" wherein it has been alleged by Francis Oneida Booth that Catlett stated he was working for the FBI in March, 1949.

HET TILL

Background:

You will recall that the Kashington Field Office has conducted an extensive and exhaustive investigation in Washington, D. C. to locate the Woodstock typewriter which had been in the possession of Alger and Friscilla Hiss and which machine, according to the FBI Laboratory was used to type the "Chambers Document".

During the course of this investigation, Claudie Catlett who worked as a maid for the Hiss' for approximately ten years beginning, she alleges, when the Hiss' lived at 2905 P Street, N. W., Washington, D. C,, was interviewed. The Hiss' lived at this address from May, 1935 to January, 1936. Claudie Catlett had no information concerning a Woodstock typewriter. The investigation reflected that Claudie Catlett had three sons, James Ralph Catlett, Perry Catlett, and Raymond Sylvester Catlett, Jr. These sons were interviewed by the Washington Field Office in January and February, 1949. However, they all possessed no knowledge regarding any Woodstock typewriter owned by the Hiss'.

On May 13, 1949, Claudie Catlett advised that the Hiss' gave an old typewriter to her sons. Investigation thereafter developed that after Raymond Sylvester Catlett was interviewed by Special Agents of the Washington Field Office on February 2, 1949 he went to Donald Hiss, brother of Alger Hiss. He informed Donald Hiss that he had been approached by Agents of the FBI regarding a Woodstock typewriter and he informed Donald Hiss that Alger and Priscilla Hiss had given him and his brother Ferry an old woodstock typewriter. Thereafter Raymond Sylvester Catlett was successful in locating the typewriter in the possession of one Ira Lockey.

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Raymond Catlett has admitted concealing his knowledge pertaining to the typewriter. Perry Catlett has also admitted concealing this information. It is to be noted that Raymond and Perry Catlett have advised that they were living at 2728 F Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. when they received the Loodstock typewriter from the Hiss'.

Raymond Catlett was a witness for the defense in the Hiss trial in New York on June 22 and 23, 1949.

Investigation by the Washington Field Office revealed that Francis Cneida Booth, nee Roulhac, advised that prior to January, 1957 she and her brother George were living with the Catlett family at an address she recalls as 1632 32nd Street, N. W. Her brother, George, was the boy friend of Clytic Catlett, also known as Claudie Catlett, In about January, 1937, she moved to another address which she recalls as 1402 6th Street, N. W. but her brother George continued living with the Catletts and moved with the Catletts from 32nd Street to 2728 P Street.

On January 24, 1949, Francis Oneida Booth executed a signed statement advising that in March, 1949 Mike Catlett came to her apartment late at night stating he was working for the FBI; that he had two men from the FBI with him, and that he wanted to talk to her about the old typewriter at 2728 P Street. He was accompanied by two white men but she is unable to recall their names. One of them had a wallet in his hand when he came in but she could not describe it and she stated that she relied on Mike's statement that they were from the FBI. These men questioned her concerning the typewriter and whether she had any specimens. Mike came back several days later and said he was still working for the FBI and advised her not to mention the visit to anyone. The signed statement obtained from Mrs. Booth has been forwarded to the New York Office for any use it may have in connection with the current Hiss trial. The Director has noted "If possible, I would like to see a prosecution for impersonation here".

Recommendation:

It is recommended that this matter be referred to Division Six for appropriate attention.

Mrs. FRANCES ELIZABETH HENSLER, presently residing at 1301 East 56th Street, Chicago, Illinois, identified the photograph of WILLIAM WARD PICMAN from five copies of photographs of various individuals as the individual mentioned in Chicago letter to the Director dated June 13, 1949. Mrs. HENSLER furnished a signed statement regarding the alleged proposition made to her by PTCMAN which reflects that she reported the incident to ALEXANDER HARRON, Chief of Personnel, Army Services, Washington, D. C., but failed to mention PICMAN's name at that time. The statement further reflects that Mrs. HENSLER contacted Senator CULCULLETTE of Iowa and President HARRY TRUMAN who at that time was Head of the Civil Service Committee in Washington, D. C., and told them that she believed certain individuals in Washington, D. C., were endeavoring to obtain confidential and restricted information from government employees who had access to this information through their positions. Mrs. HENSLER did not mention PICMAN's name to either GILLETTE or TRUMAN and she believes that because she was not specific in her statements to them that they thought it was war hysteria on her part and conducted no investigation concerning the matter.

At 10:15 a.m., Mr. Belmont called back. He stated he had talked to Mr. Donegan and Mr. Donegan would like to have Mr. Tamm interviewed, as he feels if anyone is to testify as to collaboration with Hiss it should be Mr. Tamm.

RECOMMENDATION:

If you agree, Judge Tamm will be interviewed relative to Hiss' statement and the results will be furnished to Mr. Donegan.

> By teletype, dated June 8, 1949 the New York Office requested the Baltimore Office to endeavor to locate the residence of FRANK BUCK on Old Court Road, near Pikesville, Maryland and ascertain details concerning the CHAMBERS family residence there.

<u>Mr. and Mrs. FRANK</u> E BUCK, Old Court Road, Baltimore 7, Maryland, advised on June 9, 1949 that for a period of approximately three to five months in the year 1937 or 1938 Mr. and Mrs. CHAMBERS and their two children, a boy and a girl, aged 3 to 4 years and $\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 years, respectively, rented a three room and bath apartment in their home.

This apartment was obtained by Mrs. CHAMBERS, who explained that she was a sculptress at the Park School in Baltimore, Maryland.

The BUCKS do not know the exact year or time of year that the CHAMBERS resided in their home as they have no records of any nature concerning this occupancy. However, Mrs. CHAMBERS stated at the time of occupying the apartment that the CHAMBERS family had until that time been living on the third floor of a house on Mt. Royal Terrace in Baltimore, and they wanted to reside in the country so as to have a place for the children to play.

DEPEnted Life (1801) The CHAMBERS during their three to five months occupancy of the apartment in the BUCK home were very quiet tenants and were seldom seen by the BUCKS. Mr. CHAMBERS was away from home frequently. Mrs. CHAMBERS explained this by saying that her husband was a writer who spent considerable time in New York. Mrs. CHAMBERS each morning would take her two children with her when she left for the day and explained to Mrs. BUCK that the children were cared for in a nursery school at the Park School where Mrs. CHAMBERS taught. At no time did Mr. or Mrs. BUCK ever see anyone visit the CHAMBERS. They explained, however, that there was a private entrance to the CHAMBERS' apartment and visitors may not have been seen by then. Mr.AED BUCK added that as the surrounding countryside is sparsely settled, the CHAMBERS were not acquainted with any of the neighbors of the BUCKS.

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RE: JAHAM

After residing at the BUCK home for about three to five months the CHAMBERS family moved to a location near Westminster, Maryland where Mrs. CHAMBERS had obtained a small place.

About six months ago the BUCKS realized from newspaper accounts and photographs concerning the HISS-CHAMBERS case that the WHITTAKER CHAMBERS, who at that time was appearing before the House UnAmerican Activities Committee, was the same individual who had formerly resided in their home, although they do not recall the first name of any member of the CHAMBERS family.

It is noted that the BUCK home is located on the Old Court Road at Windsor Mill Road about five miles from Pikesville, Maryland. The Windsor Mill Road runs directly into Walbrook (a section of Baltimore, Maryland), the distance between the BUCK home and Walbrook being approximately eight miles. The report of SA THOMAS G. SPENCER, dated May 11, 1949 at New York City re this case reported on page 183 a statement made by WHITTAKER CHAMBERS to the effect that the home on Old Court Road, where he formerly resided, was near Pikesville, Maryland. This report also set forth on page 221 a statement by ESTHER CHAMBERS that the home on Old Court Road was near Walbrook, Maryland. Mrs. CHAMBERS also stated that this home was a large rambling house owned by a Mr. FRANK BUCK and CHAMBERS commented that he took this particular house because it had a good view of the surrounding country, was located on a hill, and he was able to see anyone approaching the house in any direction. This observation by CHAMBERS is factual inasmuch as the BUCK home is located on a hill, which commands a good view of the surrounding countryside.

At 12:20 a.m. on June 25, 1949, Night Supervisor Joe Wohl of the New York Field Division called regarding a telephonic request he had just received from Mr. Thomas F. Murphy, Assistant U. S. Attorney, who is spending the weekend on the isolated Fire Island off New York City.

Mr. Wohl stated that Mr. Murphy had requested the Bureau to secure a ma of Washington, D. C., and then secure a Classified Telephone Directory of Washington, D. C. for 1938 or at least a Classified Telephone Directory covering the pertinent period from January, 1938, through September, 1938. Then Mr. Murphy requested the Bureau have an agent mark on the map by means of a "dot" all typewriter agencies and repair shops listed in Washington, D. C., and the Woodstock Agency and Repair Shop should be marked by means of a "star".

Mr. Murphy then requested the agent bring this material to New York City and be available to testify therefrom on Tuesday morning, June 28, 1949. Mr. Wohl stated that Mr. Murphy needed this evidence to discredit some testimony in the Hiss trial, but could not elaborate further on the instructions given in the request.

Mr. Wohl stated that Agents T. G. Spencer and J. M. Kelly of the New York Office could be contacted next Monday morning should the Bureau have any difficulty in securing the material in compliance with Mr. Murphy's request.

With reference to the teletype from the Washington Field Office to the New York Office advising that Henry Julian Wadle-igh r, planned to write a series of articles for the New York Post and was going to submit copies of the articles to the Bureau before publication, and to the Director's inquiry, "Do we want to see articles before publication in view of tutelage of Wechsler?" Special Agent Bert Zander of the Washington Field Office advised that Wadleigh as a matter of cooperation with the Bureau, and partly out of anxiety in letting us know what he is doing, has made a habit of contacting Agent Zander regarding everything he is doing. Zander stated that when Wadleigh told him he was going to see an agent of the Post and would then submit copies of the articles to the Bureau, Zander did not want to get into a discussion of the nature of the articles with Wadleigh since if we expressed any interest at all Wadleigh would hurry over to the Bureau. /Zander stated he told Wadleigh that unless he instructed him to the contrary, it was not necessary for him to send copies of the articles in to the Bureau. I told Zander that we did not want any part of this and should Wadleigh send in any of the copies they should immediately be returned to him without review and should Wadleigh bring up the topic Zander was to tell him not to send them in. Zander offered the opinion that since Wadleigh apparently has taken a shine to Tom Donegan, he might furnish the articles to Donegan so that they could be in the Department rather than in the FBI. Zander understands, as does Mr. Hottel and Mr. Newby, that we do not want any part in reviewing or even having Wadleigh's articles in the Bureau.

ReBulet to Los Angeles dated June 9, 1949, reflecting that in an interview with SIMON CASADY, Editor of the "Valley Evening Monitor", McAllen, Texas, in September, 1945, DAVID VERNON ZIMMERMAN, with aliases, stated that he visited Russia in 1934.

When DAVID VERNON ZIMMERMAN was interviewed on December 8, 1948, at his home, 309 South Broadway, South Nyack, New York, he was asked if he had ever made any trips outside of the United States. He said that he had never been outside of the United States at any time. He was then specifically asked if he had visited Russia in 1934 or at any time and he said that he had never been in Russia.

ZIMMERMAN was advised that information had been received that ZIMMERMAN had told an individual that he had visited Russia in 1934. He said that he had never made any such statement to anyone since he never had been in Russia and never had been outside of the <u>Hnited States</u>.

JESSE/ZIMMERMAN, the brother of this subject, also advised, on interview, that he believed that his brother had never been outside of the United States at any time. JESSE ZIMMERMAN said that in the year 1934 he recalled that DAVID ZIMMERMAN had been living in the home of his mother at 100 Jackson Place, Baltimore, Maryland, where JESSE ZIMMERMAN also resided and he said that he cannot recall DAVID ZIMMERMAN being away from home for any great length of time in that year. He stated that he does not think that DAVID ZIMMERMAN could have taken any long trips at that time.

In view of the above statement allegedly made by this subject to SIMON CASADY, it is requested that the Washington Field Office check the records of the Passport Division of the Department of State to determine if a passport was issued to DAVID VERNON ZIMMERMAN under that name or his known aliases. It is requested that this check be made

PURPOSE

To advise of information furnished me today by Mr. South Trimble, a member of the Loyalty Board of the Department of Commerce, regarding the above-captioned case.

BACKGROUND

Mr. South Trimble personally called at my office today at 10:45 a.m. and stated that he recently had attended a cocktail party at which a very prominent lady had advised him the following information:

This lady, whom he refused to identify, stated that the proprietor of a cooperative bookshop in Georgetown had advised her that when Mr. and Mrs. Hiss lived in Georgetown they were among the proprietor's best customers. Furthermore, that Mr. and Mrs. Hiss subscribed to the New York Times, PM and the Daily Worker. The proprietor, according to Mr. Trimble's source, stated that Mrs. Hiss was particularly disturbed when copies of the Daily Worker were not available.

Mr. Trimble could not furnish any additional information regarding the location of the cooperative bookshop, the name of the proprietor nor did he desire to furnish the name of the source of his information.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that this be called to the attention of the Espionage Section for whatever action they might deem appropriate.

This will confirm conversation on the afternoon of June 28, 1949, between Mr. H. B. FIETCHER of the Bureau and Special Agent MAURICE A. TAYLOR of this office, concerning the present whereabouts of H. JULIAN WADLEIGH, with whom further interview is desired to ascertain if he possesses any additional information of value, particularly with reference to failure to elicit certain admissions from ALGER HISS on cross-examination.

Mrs. H. JULIAN WADLEIGH was contacted by telephone and advised that her husband had been in New York City since last Friday night and it was her impression that he planned to maintain contact with the Department of Justice officials in New York. Mrs. WADLEIGH advised that he was using the name Mr. WALSH of the New York Post and is stopping at the George Mason Hotel in Brooklyn, New York. She added that he is presently writing six articles for Mr. WESCHLER of the New York Post and intended to confer with Department of Justice officials concerning these articles.

Mrs. WADLEIGH advised that she expected her husband to telephone her from New York tonight and thought he might return to Washington tomorrow or the following day. Mrs. WADLEIGH was requested to have her husband get in touch with Mr. A. H. BELMONT of the New York Office in the event he does communicate with her and she promised to do this.
