ØJAHAM. HISS TRIAL SUMMARY, PM SESSION, JUNE THIRTY. OF COURT STRYKER ANNOUNCED DEFENSE RESTS. FIRST REBUTTAL WITNESS WAS BURNETTAXFISHER WHO TESTIFIED HER BROTHER, PERRY CATLETT, GAVE HER TYPEWRITER WHICH SHE USED FREQUENTLY DOING HOMEWORK WHILE AT-TENDING HIGH SCHOOL, AND THAT SHE NEVER HAD MACHINE REPAIRED. ON VERY BRIEF CROSS MC LEAN BROUGHT OUT THAT WITNESS HAD INQUIRED OF HIM SEVERAL NIGHTS AGO IF DEFENSE HAD SUBPOENAED HER AND ALSO THAT FROM TIME SHE WAS INFANT SHE RESIDED AT EASTER HOME IN WASHINGTON. NEXT WITNESS WAS MARGARETHMC QUEEN WHO TESTIFIED HER FATHER, IRA LOCKEY, GAVE HER WOODSTOCK TYPEWRITER IN WASHINGTON WHICH SHE USED IN PRACTICING TYPING WORK FOR ABOUT TWO YEARS AND WHICH SHE NEVER STAFFORD JAMC QUEEN, HUSBAND OF MARGA-HAD REPAIRED. NO CROSS. RET, TESTIFIED SHE RECEIVED WOODSTOCK FROM HER FATHER, THAT HE OC-CASIONALLY USED IT AND IDENTIFIED HIS SIGNATURE ON A TYPED APPLI-CATION FOR GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT WHICH WAS THEN RECEIVED OVER OBJECTION. NO CROSS. HENRI PAHENRY, EMPLOYEE OF RANDALL HAGNER AND CO., WASHINGTON RECORDERS, 1THEN VEST BUILDING ON CONNECTICUT AVENUE NDEXED STREET ANDLAFTER HE IDENTIFIED END OF PAGE ONE Kisseloff-11471 57. 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IT, A PHOTO OF PREMISES RECEIVED INTO EVIDENCE. TESTIFIED DRUG STORE IN THAT BUILDING SINCE THIRTYTHREE AND THAT THERE HAS NEVER BEEN A TYPEWRITER CONCERN ON FIRST FLOOR THERE. TESTIFIED THERE WAS A **WOODSTOCK AGENCY LOCATED ON SECOND FLOOR AT THAT ADDRESS COMMENCING** SEPTEMBER FIFTEEN, THIRTYEIGHT AND REMAINING TWO YEARS. AFTER HE IDENTIFIED RENTAL APPLICATION CARD FOR WOODSTOCK CO. TENANCY IT WAS RECEIVED INTO EVIDENCE. TESTIFIED THERE WERE NO OTHER TYPEWRITER CONCERNS EVER IN THAT BUILDING TO HIS KNOWLEDGE. ON CROSS MC LEAN ATTEMPTED TO BRING OUT THAT WITNESS COULD NOT, FROM THE ABOVE CARD. TESTIFY POSITIVELY WHEN WOODSTOCK CO. MOVED IN BUT WITNESS INSISTED IT COULD NOT HAVE HAPPENED PRIOR TO SEPTEMBER FIFTEEN. THIRTYEIGHT. WITNESS COULD NOT ANSWER IF WOODSTOCK CO. PREVIOUSLY LOCATED AT FIF-TEEN TWENTYEIGHT K STREET ON GROUND FLOOR. SA COURTLAND J. JONES THEN IDENTIFIED MAP HE PREPARED SHOWING LOCATION OF VARIOUS TYPE-WRITER SHOPS IN GEORGETOWN AREA ON BASE OF INFORMATION IN PHONE DIREC-TORIES IN THIRTYSEVEN AND THIRTYEIGHT AND MAP RECEIVED INTO EVIDENCE. SAID ONLY MENTION OF MONEY WHEN HE TALKED TO MIKE CATLETT MAY THIRTEEN LAST WAS WHEN MIKE TOLD HIM HE HAD RECEIVED FORTY DOLLARS FROM DONALD HISS. ON CROSS STRYKER INTERROGATED JONES EXHAUSTIVELY RE SPECI-FIC INTERVIEWS HE HAD WITH VARIOUS MEMBERS OF CATLETT FAMILY AND JONES ADMITTED THAT WHEN HE FIRST QUESTIONED MIKE HE KNEW DEFENSE ALREADY END OF PAGE TWO

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HAD TYPEWRITER. STRYKER ATTEMPTED TO CREATE IMPRESSION THAT MIKE WAS BROUGHT INTO FBI OFFICE WITHOUT NOTICE, ETC. BUT JONES POINTED OUT THAT MIKE HAD BEEN ASKED TO COME TO OFFICE AND THERE WAS NO COM-PULSION ABOUT IT. TESTIFIED RAYMOND CATLETT WAS BROUGHT TO OFFICE. BY SAS FREW AND GLENN AND WAS QUESTIONED FROM FIVE PM TO SIX THIRTY PM AND THAT JAMES WAS QUESTIONED ABOUT FIFTEEN MINUTES. STRYKER THEN WENT INTO THE RELATIVE IGNORANCE OF CATLETTS AND JONES STATED HE REALIZED AFTER THEY TOLD HIM OF THEIR LACK OF EDUCATION THAT THEY WERE NOT EXTREMELY INTELLIGENT. STATED ONLY HIMSELF AND SA HOWARD AND STENOGRAPHER IN ROOM WHEN PERRY WAS QUESTIONED AND DENIED HE OR HOWARD SAID ANYTHING DEROGATORY WHATSOEVER ABOUT HISS. STRYKER THEN ATTEMPTED TO DEVELOP BUREAU POLICY RE FURNISHING PERSONS QUESTIONED WITH TRANSCRIPTS OF INTERVIEW BUT JONES POINTED OUT NONE WAS FURNISHED BECAUSE NONE WAS REQUESTED. TESTIFIED ABOUT QUESTIONING CLAUDIE IN OFFICE ABOUT AN HOUR AND SAID HE HAD NOT GIVEN HER COPY OF TRANSCRIPT BECAUSE SHE DID NOT ASK FOR IT. STATED MIKE WAS IN OFFICE FROM THREE FORTYFIVE PM TO SIX FORTYFIVE PM, THAT INTERVIEW PROPER COMMENCED AT FIVE PM AND THAT MIKE WAS NOT GIVEN. ANY FOOD BECAUSE HE DID NOT ASK FOR ANY AND JONES WAS UNABLE TO RECALL IF MIKE GIVEN ANY WATER BUT STATED WOULD HAVE BEEN GIVEN TO HIM IF HE HAD SO REQUESTED. STRYKER THEN TOUCHED ON INTERVIEW OF END OF PAGE THREE

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MIKE FOLLOWING SUNDAY NIGHT AND JONES RELATED HE AND ANOTHER AGENT WENT TO MIKE-S HOUSE ABOUT FIVE THIRTY PM TO INVITE HIM TO OFFICE AND AFTER MIKE STATED HE HAD NOT YET HAD DINNER THEY RETURNED ABOUT AN HOUR LATER AND BROUGHT HIM TO OFFICE. JONES STATED ABOUT THIRTY FIVE AGENTS ENGAGED IN TYPEWRITER SEARCH IN WASHINGTON BUT DENIED HE WAS ANGRY WHEN HE LEARNED MC LEAN HAD FOUND IT AND DENIED REAL PURPOSE OF INTERVIEWS OF CATLETTS WAS TO DESTROY THEM AS DEFENSE WITNESSES. STRYKER THEN HAD JONES TESTIFY HE IS NATIVE OF VIRGI-NIA AND THAT HE BELIEVES HE UNDERSTANDS COLORED PEOPLE. STRYKER APPARENTLY ATTEMPTING TO CREATE IMPRESSION THAT JONES, BEING A SOU-THERN AGENT, HAD PERHAPS TAKEN ADVANTAGE OF CATLETTS. JONES DENIED HE HAD ABANDONED HOPE OF MAKING PAT A GOVERNMENT WITNESS AFTER QUESTIONING HIM AND STATED HE NEVER, AT ANY TIME, ATTEMPTED TO MAKE PAT ANYTHING. STRYKER THEN DIRECTED ATTENTION OF JONES TO SIGNED STATEMENT HE TOOK FROM PAT AND PARTICULAR PORTION THEREOF WHERE PAT SAYS HE RECEIVED TYPEWRITER DURING THE PERIOD OF HISS MOVE TO VOLTA PLACE. JONES DENIED HE KNEW PAT HAD TOLD DEFENSE HE RECEIVED IT DURING THAT MOVE AND ADMITTED THAT IT WAS HARMFUL TO GOVERNMENT CASE WHEN PAT SAID HE GOT IT DURING THAT MOVE. JONES STATED TALKED TO PAT ABOUT ONE AND ONE HALF HOURS AND DECLARED POSITIVELY THAT HE AND OTHER AGENT ALWAYS SPOKE ONLY IN NORMAL TONE OF VOICE. STRYKER ATTEMPTED TO BRING OUT REASON FOR SUBSE-QUENT ASSERTION IN ABOVE SIGNED STATEMENT BY PAT THAT HE COULD HAVE RECEIVED MACHINE SEVERAL MONTHS AFTER HISSES MOVED TO VOLTA PLACE. JONES DECLARED THERE WAS NO REAL INCONSISTENCY BUT RATHER AN ELA-BORATION AND REITEREATED THAT IT WAS EXACTLY WHAT PAT HAD TOLD HIM.

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TESTIFIED FBI HAD LOOKED FOR WOODSTOCK SHOP EVER SINCE PAT TOLD HIM HE HAD TAKEN MACHINE TO A WOODSTOCK SHOP AT NORTHWEST CORNER OF CONNECTICUT AND K STREET, TESTIFIED PAT, AT FIRST, STATED IT WAS HIS RECOLLECTION THAT SHOP WAS LOCATED ON GROUND FLOOR. STRYKER ATTEM-PTED TO FIND OUT RESULTS OF FBI SEARCH FOR VARIOUS WOODSTOCK SHOPS IN THAT AREA BUT WITNESS DECLARED HE DID NOT KNOW DETAILS THEREOF. ON REDIRECT, WITNESS TESTIFIED DEFINITELY THAT IT WAS PERRY WHO FIRST SUGGESTED LOCATION OF THE SHOP AS NORTHWEST CORNER OF CON-NECTICUT AND K AND NOT THE AGENTS. MURPHY BROUGHT OUT FROM WITNESS. THAT PERRY READ STATEMENT BEFORE SIGNING IT AND SO INDICATED IN HIS OWN HANDWRITING THEREON. OBJECTION SUSTAINED TO QUESTION RE WHAT INFO FBI WAS RELYING ON IN THIS TYPEWRITER SEARCH. WITNESS STATED SEARCH COMMENCED DECEMBER LAST AND THAT CATLETTS FIRST DISCLOSED ALLEGED GIFT OF TYEPWRITER WHEN THEY WERE QUESTIONED MAY THIRTEEN LAST AND HAD NOT SO ADVISED AGENTS DURING EARLIER INTER-ON RECROSS, JONES STATED HE ASSISTED IN SEARCH FOR SPECI-VIEWS. MENS BUT DECLARED HE DID NOT KNOW IF SIX HUNDRED MEMBERS OF HISS CLASS AT HARVARD LAW WERE QUESTIONED BY FBI. STRYKER HAD JONES NAME SEVERAL CITIES WHERE PERSONS WERE QUESTIONED RE SPECIMENS Kisseloff-11475 END OF PAGE FIVE

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AND JONES ENUMERATED SEVEN OR EIGHT. LAST WITNESS WAS JOHN FOSTER DULLES WHO TESTIFIED HE FIRST MET HISS IN SAN FRANCISCO AND LATER IN LONDON, ASKED HIM IF HE EVER THOUGHT OF LEAVING GOVERNMENT SER-VICE. HISS TOLD HIM HE PLANNED TO LEAVE IN EARLY FUTURE. THEN TESTI-FIED HE TELEPHONED HISS AFTER LATTER ELECTED PRESIDENT OF CARNEGIE ENDOWMENT BUT BEFORE HISS ASSUMED OFFICE AND TOLD HISS HE HAD HEARD HISS HAD COMMUNIST AFFILIATIONS. FURTHER THAT HISS TOLD HIM HE KNEW OF SUCH REPORTS AND THAT HE HAD GONE TO FBI AND HAD SET THOSE RUMORS TO REST, OR SOME SUCH EXPRESSION. TESTIFIED HE AGAIN TALED TO HISS IN MARCH, FORTYEIGHT WHEN HISS TOLD HIM HE HAD THAT DAY TESTIFIED BEFORE GJ, SDNY, AND HAD BEEN ASKED ABOUT CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS. STRYKER-S OBJECTION OVERRULED AND COURT STATED HE WOULD ADMIT TESTI-MONY ON GROUND OF GOING TO CREDIBILITY OF HISS. DULLES CONTINUED HISS TOLD HIM HE DID NOT KNOW MOST OF THE PEOPLE ABOUT WHOM HE WAS ASKED BUT DID RECALL LEEPPRESSMAN WHOM HE TOLD DULLES HE HAD KNOWN IN SOME ORGANIZATION INTERESTED IN LABOR LAW AND PERHAPS ALSO IN EARLY DAYS OF LAW PRACTICE. DULLES STATED PRESSMAN WAS ONLY NAME RECALLED. DULLES TALKED TO HISS AGAIN ON AUGUST EIGHTEENTH, FORTY EIGHT AFTER HOUA DISCLOSURES, TOLD HISS THEY WERE EMBARRASSING TO BOTH CARNEGIE AND HISS. THAT HE HOPED TRUSTEES WOULD NOT PREJUDGE CASE BUT WOULD AWAIT JUDICIAL DECISION RE GUILT OR INNOCENCE OF HISS. TOLD HISS LATTER PROBABLY REALIZED HIS PERMANENT USEFULNESS TO CAR-NEGIE HAD BEEN IMPAIRED AND THAT HISS AGREED WITH THAT OBSERVATION. 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STATED BOTH HE AND HISS AGREED IT WAS NOT WISE FOR HISS TO RESIGN UNTIL HCUA HEARINGS COMPLETED. ALSO THAT HISS INDICATED HE WOULD RESIGN THAT SEPTEMBER. DULLES STATED HE THEN WENT TO EUROPE BUT LEARNED THAT RESIGNATION OF HISS WAS CONSIDERED AT DECEMBER, FORTYEIGHT MEETING OF TRUSTEES. ON CROSS BY STRYKER DULLES STATED HE WAS NOT CERTAIN OF THE EXACT WORDS USED BY HISS WHEN HE MENTIONED HAVING GONE TO FBI AND TESTIFIED HISS INDICATED IN CONVERSATIONS HE WANTED TO DO THE RIGHT THING. STATED HE KNEW HISS HAD BEEN CHECKED CAREFULLY BY CARNEGIE BEFORE HE WAS OFFERED PRESIDENCY AND THAT SUCH REPORTS WERE ALL GOOD. ON REDIRECT MURPHY DIRECTED ATTEN-TION OF DULLES TO MEMO WHICH DULLES STATED REGARDED HIS IMPRESSIONS OF HIS CONVERSATIONS WITH HISS, WHICH MEMO HE PREPARED FOR CONFIDEN-TIAL INFORMATION OF CARNEGIE TRUSTEES. STATED IT REPRESENTED A COMPOSITE OF THE VIEWS OF HIMSELF, JOHN W XDAVIS' AND ARTHUR BALLANTINE. MURPHY THEN READ ALOUD FROM SUCH MEMO, THAT PORTION WHEREIN DULLES SET OUT THAT HISS TOLD HIM ABOUT HISS DENYING CP SYMPATHY, ETC AND WHEREIN HISS TOLD DULLES HE HAD CASUALLY ASSOCIATED IN THE PRACTICE OF LAW AND IN GOVERNMENT WITH SOME PERSONS WHO HAD CP SYMPATHIES. MURPHY ALSO READ PORTION THEREOF WHERE IN DULLES STATES HE TOLD HISS HE SHOULD RESIGN AFTER HCUA HEARINGS. ON RECROSS STRYKER BROUGHT OUT THAT AT TRUSTEES MEETING FEB. LAST HISS HAD BEEN CONTINUED ON LEAVE TO MAY, FORTYNINE WHEN HIS TERM AS PRESIDENT ENDED AND IS STILL ENDOWMENT TRUSTEE. ADJOURNED UNTIL JULY FIRST AM.

Reference is made to Bureau letter dated June 21, 1949 advising that information had been received from Mr. BYRON SCOTT to the effect that according to Mr. EDWARD ERAZONE, president of the International Balsa Corporation, Costa Rica, one JULIAN WESTON was reliably reported to have something to do with the microfilm found in the CHAMBERS' pumpkin. The informant described WESTON as one who would sell anything to anyone no matter who he was selling out.

The Bureau requested this office to contact the State Department and examine any available files with respect to JULIAN WESTON in order to determine his reputation and past activities and further if he could have had any connection in the current HISS CHAMBERS investigation.

The records of the State Department reflect some correspondence concerning WESTON including confidential letters from the Bureau. A memo dated May 6, 1942 contained information from a confidential source within the government as follows:

त्याज्ञ सम्बत "WESTON is British but is regarded as a renegade and has a very unsavory record and reputation. WESTON has been a paid propaganda agent for Germans and has had a hand in several business deals with enemy firms. His principal associates are pro-Nazi and in May, 1941, he was in touch with three suspected Japanese agents in Costa Rica. On one occasion WESTON falsely described himself as a British agent."

A Bureau letter dated May 17, 1941 addressed to Mr. A. A. BURLE, Assistant Secretary of State, stated: "It also is reported that WESTON is a Naxi agent."

The Bireau advised the State Department on September 9, 1941 that "JULIAN WESTON is an agent for IGNO KOLINOWSKY and HANS HERBERT KOLTSCHMIDT, two confirmed pro-Nazis. He has access to all the radiograms which pass through Tropical Radio; owned by the United Fruit Company."

The State Department caused an investigation to be made on this Bureau letter and on September 30, 1941, the American Legation replied: "It is the opinion of the Legation that JULIAN WESTON does not have access-

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"to any of the radiograms of the Tropical Radio which is owned by the United Fruit Company. Mr. WESTON, is a British subject, and it is not believed that he is pro-Nazi. His general reputation is such however that it would not cause surprise if he should accept money from time to time from persons unfriendly to the British cause."

The Bureau memo dated June 24, 1942 entitled "FELIX ESPOSITO and other matters" concerning WESTON stated as follows:

"JULIAN A. WESTON, Englishman of doubtful reputation in San Jose, Costa Rica, is attempting to secure the position as manager in Costa Rica for the International Balsa Corporation, 96-100 Boyd Ave., Jersey City, New Jersey."

A memo of the Bureau dated December 30, 1941 to the State Department is as follows:

"JULIAN A, WESTON is an Englishman who bears an unsavory reputation. and is believed to possess pro-Naži sentiments. He is in communication with one HERMAN FETERSON, a German of the deported crew of the interned Axis vessel EISENACH who are now in Bismarck, North Dakota."

There is a further report from the Department of State which states as follows:

"While it is true that possibly activities of WESTON have in many instances been suspicious, to say the least, during the past year he has attempted to make an honest living, has industriously brought Balsa from the Barra, Colorado region and has in all cases of doubt consulted with the American Legation and subsequently taken the advice of the Legation in dealings with persons and firms in Costa Rica. Ina recent conversation with members of the staff of the Legation, WESTON reviewed his difficulties with the British Legation in San Jose and states that he has never been pro-Axis; that he did criticize the CHAMBERLAIN Government but that he is today a loyal Britisher, working for the defeat of the Axis powers While WESTON'S personal habits and conduct in the past have been unsatisfactory from his point of view, his activities have not been such as to warrant his inclusion on the 'Proclaimed and Statutory List'. In view of WESTON'S present good behavior it is recommended that his name not be included in the proclaimed list. It is also recommended. that his name be removed from the confidential list of 'unsatisfactory consignees'."

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Later the legation advised the State Department that the Military and Naval Attaches protested, the action of deleting WESTON'S name from the Confidential List of Unsatisfactory Consignees on the ground that "WESTON has associated himself with shady characters and with known German agents." The Legation reported that the Legation had received similar reports but had been unable to verify any of them. The Legation further reported that WESTON had been involved in difficulties with the British Government. As to this the Legation reported, "This is true, but the case has been discussed with the British Charge d'Affaires here and Mr. LYALL agrees that while WESTON'S public criticism of the CHAMBERLAIN Government and its representatives was in bad taste, it could not be considered subversive activity. WESTON freely admits that he, as a British citizen, criticized his Government, but also states that he has not criticized the CHURCHILL Government. It is also true that the Costa Rican authorities arrested WESTON for investigation of what were alleged to be subversive activities. However he was released by the authorities at the request of the British Charge d'Affaires after investigation of his home and effects did not reveal any information against him. WESTON told a member of this Legation that this investigation centered around references he had made to dynamiting a ship. He convinced the authorities that the reference was to the proposed dynamiting of the 'EISENACH' which is being salvaged at Runtarenas and that he had planned to photograph that if it was done. Since WESTON has frequently submitted photographs to American News Service, this appears to have been a normal procedure and my British colleague agrees that this was probably the case."

This report was signed by LESLIE E. REED, Charge d'Affaires.

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There is no information in the State Department files indicating that JULIAN is connected in the HISS CHAMBERS investigation in any way.

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IN COURT ROOM. WITNESS TESTIFIED HE HAD NOT SEEN THEM IN CHESTERTOWN IN SUMMER OF THIRTY SEVEN. WITNESS ADMITTED HE HAD NOT BEEN IN CHESTERTOWN EVERY DAY THAT SUMMER AND OCCASIONALLY SPENT ENTIRE DAY IN HIS APARTMENT. Attached is a teletype received from the Baltimore office, dated 7/2/49 at 7:45 P.M. which states that Mrs. RICHARD COLLINS, Chestertown, Md., has found a memo book indicating that she gave lunch to Mrs. AIGER HISS on August 24, 1936, and inquiring instructions as to whether to . attempt to obtain possession of the memo book.

· At 8:50 P.M. Special Agent HAROLD KENNEDY of the New York office called with reference to this teletype. He stated that the **BFEIFFER** report referred to in the teletype apparently referred to his report of July 1, 1949, rather than June 30, 1949, and that a review of that report reflects that Mrs. COLLINS said that she knew HISS as a child and that the last time she saw him was in the WICKES Apartment on one occasion, and that she hash't seen him since. KENNEDY stated that he has discussed this development with ASAC BEIMONT who feels that Mrs. COLLSINS may turn out to be a very important witness and desires that she be reinterviewed along the following lines:

1. Does the finding of this memo book now refresh her recollection as to the information set out in the PFEIFFER report - i.e. - was the last time she saw HISS in 1936, 1937 or 1938? L.W.

2. If she last sawhim in 1936, did he or Mrs. HISS live at the WICKES Apartment at the time of the luncheon on August 24, 1936.

Mr. IADD was contacted, and he stated that Baltimore should be telephonically requested to conduct the interview as indicated above, and in addition, requested to attempt to obtain the memo book. These instructions were furnished to Special Agent J. R. THAYER at 9:05 P.M.

RAFFA advised he went with the Railroad Retirement Board during August, of 1938, as a Technical Assistant to the Chairman, who was then MURRAY LATTIMER. At this time, SILVERMAN was Chief Economist and although RAFFA had never met him personally, he associated his name with the better known economists throughout the District of Columbia. From August, 1938, to January, 1941, RAFFA was directly under the supervision of Chairman LATTIMER and consequently, had no association with SILVERMAN, either from a social or professional standpoint. However, during June, 1941, the Board was somewhat revised and SILVERMAN became Chief of the Information and Research Bureau and RAFFA was designated Chief of the Information Branch, which came directly under the supervision of SILVERMAN. RAFFA explained that he remained in this capacity from June, 1941, until January, 1942, at which time he resigned from the Board. Consequently, RAFFA was under the direct supervision of SILVERMAN for only six months.

RAFFA further explained that inasmuch as he never associated with SILVERMAN on a social basis, he was in no position to know of any of SILVERMAN's contacts or acquaintances. He did, however, have one social visit with SILVERMAN and his wife shortly after he, RAFFA, was made Chief of the Information Branch. This occasion was upon an invitation from SILVERMAN to bring Mrs. RAFFA to the SILVERMAN residence for dinner and a social drink. According to RAFFA, when SILVERMAN was appointed Chief of the Bureau, it was his custom to invite individual members in his section to his home on separate invitations to become better acquainted with them.

Mr. RAFFA, during this time, had more or less a personal feeling of animosity towards SILVERMAN. This was purely of a personal nature and was based on SILVERMAN's overbearing manner and very dogmatic nature, consequently, RAFFA avoided SILVERMAN's company whenever possible. He did not know of SILVERMAN's social circles, but believed they were of the higher type, among political figures in the District. He could not associate the names of ALGER HISS, LAUCHLIN CURRIE, VICTOR PERIO, SILVERMASTER, ULLMAN, HARRY WHITE, or FOSTER ADAMS, as being acquainted with SILVERMAN. Furthermore, he, himself; had never heard of these individuals until their names were prominently publicized with the espionage conspiracy. Furthermore, there was never any political discussions between SILVERMAN and himself which denoted SILVERMAN as being Un-American and the charges of Miss BENTLEY came as a complete shock to RAFFA.

Reference is made to the report of JOHN B. O'DONOGHUE, dated May 25, 1949, at Cleveland, Ohio, in the matter entitled, "JAY DAVID WHITTAKER CHAMBERS", wherein the Washington Field Office was requested to ascertain the identity and last known whereabouts of the following

One point that strikes us is that the testimony of the 'confidential informant' (who is the only source for the suggestion that these two persons are identical) that BYKOV is a Latvian is possibly derived from DOSENBERG who says the same thing of BASOW, Richard, and adds that the latter is <u>not</u> Jewish. DOSENBERG is, of course, Latvian himself. (Is the 'confidential informant', also, perhaps ?) Horeover, we have the testimony of Else (BERNAUT in the MASSING case quoted in para. 6 below that, during Gen. BERZIN's time as head of S.M.I. (i.e., till 1936), 'if a Soviet agent was described as Latvian it was the equivalent of saying he was important and trusted, and also in the inner circles'. This was because the General himself was Latvian and had built up a group of his compatriots, headed by Alfred AILTON, with whom it will be noted BYKOV is said (but only by the 'confidential informant') to have worked in Rome.

"5. However, the descriptions of BYKOV (<u>not</u> by the 'confidential informant', who gives none) suggest a physical type common among South Russian and Central Asia Jews; there is KRIVITSKY's (perhaps contemptuous) remark that he 'came from the slums of ODESSA', and CHAMBERS' statement that he speaks German with a Yiddish accent (which is possibly why Mrs. KRIVITSKY, who had worked in Vienna, takes him

"for an Austrian). As to Sergei BASSOV, KRIVITSKY's statement in his book (p. 296) that this individual had originally been a sailor in the Crimea is supported by the F.B.I. record which states that the merchant-seaman BASSOV known to them was born at EISK (S.W. of NOGAISK, on the Sea of AZOV), i.e. in the Crimea area. Both cases, therefore, have leads to the ^Black Sea.

"6. In the memorandum on the interrogation of <u>Hedi</u> and <u>Paul/AASSING</u> sent us under cover of your letter No. 2356 of 17th October 1947, 'Peter' is clearly distinguished from Col. Boris EYKOV, the former name being the pseudonym of General Vassili ZUBILIN, then N.K.V.D. chief in the U.S.A., while EYKOV is an associate of Ignatz nEISS (KRIVITSKY's colleague and friend whose assassination in summer 1936 led to the latter's decision to defect). Page 14 of that memorandum shows that BYKOV had been recalled to MOSCOW and was in trouble for having failed to report the wavering of REISS. Now practically the whole of the entourage discussed in this memorandum was Jewish, and KRIVITSKY himself (whose real name was Samuel GINSBERG), though born in South Russia, was the son of a Polish Jewish emigre father. There is, therefore, some ground for supposing BYKOV to belong to this Jewish, rather than the 'Latvian', group.

"7. Incidentally, it is perhaps worth bearing in mind that, upon the fall of the Latvian General BERZIN in 1936, there was a great purge of the Latvian element, and his successor at the head of S.M.I. (who was in turn 'purged' in 1937, together with many of those appointed by him) was Jewish. It is possible that in 1936 the former S.M.I. chief for AUSTRIA, Richard BASSOW, whom DOZENBERG had met in Berlin in 1931, and whom he describes as Latvian, decided to transfer his allegiance to the R.S.H.A. (see para. 2, above).

"8. On the evidence at present available, however, it is not possible to identify BYKOV with BASSOV, S., or BASOW, R."

Regarding further inquiries that might be made in Germany, as suggested in paragraph 2 of Brigadier Roberts' report, it is suggested the Bureau may desire to make the necessary arrangements through G-2 in Washington, D. C.

Please be advised that on Friday, May 20, 1949, HENRY. JULIAN WADLEIGH telephonically advised that on May 18, 1949 when he was in New York City being interviewed by SAAG T. J. DONEGAN and USA MURPHY, two attorneys known to him as DAVIS and SHAPIRO representing <u>ALGEE HISS</u>, visited his home and attempted to elicit from his wife the date of WADLEIGH's departure to Turkey, which date is in 1938. WADLEIGH advised that his wife was unable to supply the attorneys with this information and did not wish to cooperate with them.

On Thursday, May 19, SHAPIRO telephonically contacted WADLEIGH and asked if he would supply this information. WADLEIGH replied that, under the advice of his attorneys, he would furnish no information whatsoever to SHAPIRO or DAVIS. SHAPIRO asked if he would make one-exception and give to him, SHAPIRO, the date of his (WADLEIGH's) departure for Turkey. WADLEIGH replied to SHAPIRO that he would make no exceptions and thus closed the conversation.

WADLEIGH advised on May 20, 1949 that he believes he sailed aboard the S.S. President Harding from New York City on March 10, 1938 for Turkey. He recalls that he furnished substantially the same information to Mr. MURPHY but advised that he does not think he furnished MURPHY with the name of the vessel. WADLEIGH observed; however, that it may have been that he returned from Turkey aboard the President Harding, but he is substantially certain that his outgoing voyage was made on a ship of the President Lines. He also said that his date of departure could have been several days earlier than the 10th, but he is fairly positive that it could not have been later than March 10.

The above data is furnished for the information of the Bureau, New York Office and SAAG DONEGAN.

On June 14, 1949, Mr. RICHARD & MURRAY, 2205 Fifth Avenue, San Rafael, California, telephone San Rafael 5466-J, telephonically advised this office that he had recently come to San Francisco from College Park, Maryland. While living in the latter city he purchased a Woodstock typewriter from a real estate salesman. Subsequent to his arrival here he had been informed by friends in the East that the Washington Field Office was interested in securing apecimens from this machine but did not report the matter sconer as he believed it to be a joke being played upon him by his friends. However, he added that newspaper reports have indicated to him that the FBI is really interested in Woodstock typewriters from the vicinity of Washington, D. C., and he, therefore, wished to make his typewriter available to this office. He indicated that he is working for the American President Lines in San Francisco.

On June 16, 1949, SA DAVID C. SPENCER obtained eleven pages of typewriting specimens from the typewriter in question at the San Rafael home of Mr. MURRAY, in the presence of Mrs. RICHARD C. MURRAY. This typewriter is described as a Woodstock typewriter, standard model, serial -No. N 179849.

Upon reinterview at his place of business, Mr. MURRAY, who is the Assistant General Purchasing Agent for the American President Lines, Pier 44, Embarcadero, San Francisco, advised that he purchased the typewriter in October, 1945 from ROBERT BRADSHAW, a real estate man at College Park, Maryland. At this time Mr. MURRAY was working in the same building. Mr. BRADSHAW's real estate company is known as the Prince Georges Realty Company, at that time at 7404 Baltimore Boulevard, College Park, Maryland. Mr. MURRAY stated Encls. that the real estate company has a new address now at Brentwood, Maryland, on Rhode Island Avenue. Subsequent to obtaining the Woodstock typewriter, Mr. MURRAY had some repair work done on the typewriter in Washington, D. C. This was done for him by Mr. E. L. MITCHELL, who is Assistant Treasurer, School of Foreign Service, Georgetown University, Washington, D. C. Mr. MURRAY explained that MITCHELL was able to have the repair work done for him for nothing and because of this fact, when a friend wrote to him that Agents of the Washington Field Office wished to interview him about his typewriter, he felt that they were playing a joke on him for getting something for nothing.

It was noted that the typewriter was made by the Woodstock Typewriter Company, Chicago, Illinois. This typewriter also had on it words to the effect that it was rebuilt by the Woodstock Typewriter Company, Woodstock, Illinois. On the lower front of the typewriter frame at the bottom there is another label as follows: "Typewriter and Adding Machine Company, 6th and D Streets, N. W., Washington, D. C., Republic 3145." Mr. MURRAY stated that he believed that at the time the typewriter was repaired by Mr. MITCHELL it was probably done by the Typewriter Adding Machine Company.

Mr. MURRAY stated that he moved from the Washington, D. C., area to San Francisco on December 7, 1948, and has had the typewriter in his possession ever since he purchased it with the exception of the time it was repaired. The letter from the friend in Washington indicating inquiry by the FBI was received in December, 1948 shortly after his arrival here.

The Laboratory is requested to compare the enclosed typewriter specimens with those of the questioned documents in the instant case.

the Air Force staff and as such was MULLIN's immediate subcritinate. In this capacity MULLIN wrote SILVERMAN's efficiency ratings. Immediate subordinate to SILVERMAN was one JOE SENTURIA, a civilian employee, as was SILVERMAN, and now an employee of Textron, Incorporated, at this firm's New York office. MULLIN felt that SENTURIA might be able to give more detailed information concerning SILVERMAN inasmuch as he worked closely with SILVERMAN.

MULLIN said there were approximately 60 or 70 persons employed in this branch of the Control Office and he recalled the following as being associated with SILVERMAN, in addition to CENTURIA:

OSCAR ALTMAN, an Air Force Lieutenant Colonel

MULLIN said SILVERMAN was an excellent employee and an accomplished statistician. He recalled SILVERMAN "prided himself as a liberal" and was quite temperamental. MULLIN stated SILVERMAN was "of an artistic nature." MULLIN recalled visiting SILVERMAN's apartment on only one occasion when he drove SILVER-MAN home from work. He stated he was not personally acquainted with SILVERMAN outside of their working hours. MULLIN also noted that prior to the publicity that SILVERMAN received as a result of CHAMBERS' testimony, he would have seriously doubted anyone who questioned SILVERMAN's loyalty. SILVERMAN had intimated he was on very close terms with HARRY WHITE, former Assistant Secretary of the Treasury and LAUGHLIN CURRIE of the State Department.

MULLIN stated it would have been very easy to remove data from the Control Office, although he had at no time suspected that such was done.

In again relating his recollection of the sale of a typewriter to FANSLER and MARTIN, GRADY pointed out that the sale must have been in the year 1927 for the reason that after GRADY left the employ of the Woodstock Typewriter Company in December, 1927 he never again was in the business of selling typewriters and furthermore it could not have been prior to 1927 for the reason that HARRY MARTIN was not in business for himself selling insurance until about the middle of 1927. GRADY is sure that he made the sale shortly after FANSLER and MARTIN became associated in the insurance business. He stated that while his recollection is that he dealt with MARTIN it could very well be that FANSLER signed the order, but he has no recollection regarding this.

On previous interview GRADY had said that he thought a stenographer by the name of ANN COYLE who worked for FANSLER and MARTIN had tried out the typewriter he sold to them prior to the sale. It was pointed out to him that ANN COYLE did not go to work for FANSLER and LARTIN until the fall of 1928 and that she could, therefore, have not tried out the typewriter before it was sold as he sold it in 1927. them in 1927 for a new one subsequent to 1929. If this had been done it was GRADY's belief the sale would have been made by JACK CARON who was manager of the Philadelphia Office of Woodstock when GRADY left in 1927 and for several years thereafter.

The matter of GRADY having applied the commission on the typewriter he sold to FANSLER and MARTIN upon an insurance policy was again taken up with him. He stated that it was now clear in his mind that the policy purchased by him from Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company in 1927 and upon which he applied his commission on a typewriter to the premium of the policy was the policy sold to him by J. O. BATTERSBY, H. B. STAVERS, and N. L. COATES in 1927 when these men associated themselves together in the sale of life insurance for the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company. He no longer contends that the sale of the typewriter to MARTIN in 1927 was tied in with a life insurance policy.

It was pointed out to GRADY again that in January of 1930 HARRY MARTIN sold him a life insurance policy in the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company at which time he gave his business as that of a salesman for a disinfecting company. It was suggested that perhaps he had sold a typewriter to MARTIN at this time relying upon his former connection with Woodstock and applied the commission upon the premium of the policy. He denied that this was possible, again stating that he never sold typewriters to anyone after December of 1927.

GRADY had no further recollection on the matter of the sale of a typewriter to FANSLER and MARTIN and even though he has thought about it considerably he could furnish no further information of value in attemptto connect the typewriter he sold FANSLER and MARTIN with the typewriter produced by ALGER HISS.

He no longer contends that the sale of the typewriter to MATTANN in 1927 was tied in with a life insurance policy.

It was pointed out to ULAT again that in January of 1920 NALLY MARTIM sold him a life insurance policy in the Northwestern Eutoal Life Insurance Company at which time he gave his business at that of a Salesmin for a disinfecting company. It was suggested that perhaps he had sold a typewriter to MINTIM at this time relying upon his former compection with Woodstock and applied the commission the presion of the policy. He deside that this was possible, again stating that he never sold typewriters to enyone after Recember of 1937.

GACT had no further recollection on the matter of the sale of a typewriter to FARCLEI and HAETIN and even though he has thought about it considerably he could furnish no further information of value in attemptto considerably he could furnish he sold FARGLEI and KINTIN with the typewriter produced by ALGER HISS.
