CLEVELAND HAD PHOTOSTATIC COPIES OF THESE DOCUMENTS MADE, OR THAT THE PHOTOSTATIC COPIES WERE MADE JUST PRIOR TO THEIR BEING INTRODUCED AT THE PRE TRIAL DEPOSITION. The attached letter was received by the writer in a Christmas card from Joe McConnon, who makes his residence at the Liberty Hotel, Miami, Florida. McConnon is presently employed as a private investigator and has been working for himself representing some of the insurance companies in Miami, Florida. He has been employed as an investigator for the past 15 years or so and was considered a good contact of the New York Office. He was a particular contact of SA J. J. Keating on criminal matters.

McConnon had made some negotiations with Amtorg officials in the late 1930's and developed information of interest in connection with Communist matters and was placed on the Bureau payroll as a confidential informant for some months. He later when war was declared became an investigator for the U. S. Coast Guard. He occasionally has information of interest and on two occasions in the past two years had dropped into the Bureau and indicated that he had information of interest concerning Communist matters. On both occasions he was referred to the office of J. C. Strickland who was then in charge of the Security Section.

I do not know how much credence can be placed in the last two paragraphs of his letter to the effect that he talked to Congressman Karl Mundt and his statement that he could have obtained microfilm copies of the messages during the war years but could get no one to back him up.

I have not acknowledged his letter and suggest you might consider having some Agent in Miami interview him.

C., prior to June, 1946, Mave been described by Mrs. MARGOT FANSLER MOORE, niece of Mrs. ALCER HISS, as close friends of ALGER and PRISCITIAN HISS. LOLA HORTON is known by confidential informants to have discussed maids with Mrs. HISS. Forwarding address for the HORTONs on file at the Washington, D. C., Post Office shows their last known address as Route 1, Brandon, Vermont, as of June 14, 1946.

Albany will interview the HORTONs to ascertain names and locations of any other acquaintances or maids of the HISS family.

Albany will also determine whether the HORTONs recall seeing any typewriters in the HISS home and specifically a Woodstock standard model of old make, probably ten years old or older.

Albany will obtain copies of any typewritten correspondence from the HISSES in the possession of the HORTONs for submission to the FBI Laboratory for comparison purposes with known specimens taken from HISS's typewriter.

At Leland, Michigan:

DOROTHY DETZER, presently employed as a Professional Lecturer by the Red Path Bureau and authoress of the book, "Appointment on the Hill", stated that she had spent over twenty years in Washingtom, D.C., where she had been interested in various pacifist organizations and was for a number of years the Executive Secretary of the Womens International League for Peace and Freedom. DOROTHY DETZER was employed by the Quakers in Austria during 1920 and 1922 and also did relief work for the Cuakers from 1922 to 1923 in Russia. She has a vast acquaintanceship among public officials and is known world-wide for her pacifist activities. She comes from an excellent family, one of her brothers being CARL DETZER, an editor of the Readers Digest and owner of the Leland Enterprise, newspaper, and another brother being the captain of the Port of New York.

Miss DETZER stated that between 1933 and 1939 there came to Washington, D.C., a group of younger than average people to take employment in the State Department and other Governmental agencies. She became quite well acquainted with this group through her work and social activities and regarded the group as above the average in intelligence. Among this group were NOEL FIELD, ALGER HISS, LAWRENCE DUGGAN, JEROME FRANK and GARDNER JACKSON. On the fringe of the group was JOHN ABT.

ABT was described as the husband of JESSICA SMITH, editor of <u>Soviet Russia Today</u> and the former wife of HAROLD "ARE, the son of Mother BLOOR. The ABTs were formerly close friends of DETZER, but broke their relations when DETZER disagreed with their political philosophy.

DETZER described FIELD, HISS and DUGGAN as "the most promising young men in the State Department" during this early period.

Miss DETZER first met ALGER HISS in the residence of NOEL FIELD and was very much impressed by him, referring to him as "young, charming, good looking, quiet and dignified". NOEL FIELD and ALGER HISS were close friends.

The group was keenly aware of the danger to world peace because of the coming to power of the Fascist regime in Germany and they had frequent political discussions. Because HISS was so quiet, sne never knew exactly where he stood politically, but stated that she believed he followed the political philosophy of NOEL FIELD. At this time she regarded FIELD as a liberal on negro and Jewish questions and tremendously interested in international organizations such as the League of Nations.

Through years of close association with NOEL FIELD, Miss DETZER stated that in her opinion she feels that NOEL FIELD is now a Communist. When she first knew him he was far to the left in his political opinions, but she does not feel that he was then a Communist. It was after NOEL FIELD took employment with the League of Nations in Geneva that he became quite outspoken in his admiration of the Communists and an extremely outspoken pro-Stalinist, which led her to believe that he is a Communist Party member.

Miss DETZER recalled that FIELD had, in his work with the League of Nations, been instrumental in saving many Communist refugees fleeing from Spain after FRANCO had come into power, and that he was very emotional when he recalled the bravery of these Communists. DOROTHY DETZER recalled that she had a heated argument with NOEL FIELD in Washington in 1946 at which time FIELD defended the Soviet Union.

DOROTHY DETZER was unable to recall specifically any official functions or political discussions in Washington at which HEDE MASSING and ALGER HISS were present, although there was one party in 1939 or 1940 at the home of ROBERT HORTON, a Scripps- Howard newspaper representative, at which MASSING and HISS may have been present. Miss DETZER also recalled that in the winter of 1936 and 1937 a party in honor of the arrival of HEDE MASSING in Washington, D.C. was given at the residence of KENDALL FOSS by his wife LIZA. Many prominent newspaper people attended this party and Miss DETZER feels that ALGER HISS also attended.

Miss DETZER stated that throughout the years she has kept up her acquaintanceship with ALGER HISS, but that she could recall visiting at his home only on one occasion at which time PRISCILL, HISS had given some party for charity at their Georgetown residence.

DETZER stated that at the time of the first United Nations Conference in San Francisco, she attended as an observer. During the period of this conference she had occasion to confer with Secretary of State STETTINIUS regarding child welfare work in foreign countries and some other matters. STETTINIUS at that time asked that she discuss these matters with ALGER HISS and called HISS into his office. Miss DETZER stated that HISS: was rather cool in his reception, greeting her formally, and that up to that time they had had a "DOROTHY and ALGER" acquaintanceship. She indicated that upon STETTINIUS' leaving the room HISS criticized her for going directly to the Secretary of State with matters that should have been presented to him originally. There was some slight disagreement at this time and their relationship became somewhat strained.

In recalling HEDE MASSING, Miss DETZER stated that in 1936 she was traveling through Europe and on arrival in Geneva, Switzerland, she telephonically contacted the residence of NOEL FIELD and was invited by Mrs. FIELD to have dinner with them that evening. NOEL FIELD picked up DOROTHY DETZER and drove her to the FIELD residence in the suburbs of Geneva. On arrival at the FIELD residence, she found that the FIELDs had house guests, namely HEDE GUMPERTZ and PAUL MASSING. During the evening DOROTHY DETZER discussed at length the Nye Munitions investigation and other matters in the United States in which GUMPERTZ, MASSING and the FIELDs showed a great interest.

At the end of the evening NOEL FIELD drove DOROTHY DETZER to her hotel in Geneva and PAUL MASSING accompanied them on the trip. During the drive MASSING asked that Miss DETZER furnish him with her address in Paris as he, MASSING, was leaving for Paris on the following day and would like to have dinner with her. On her arrival in Faris, Miss DETZER recalled that she was contacted by PAUL MASSING and that they did have dinner.

She recalled that PAUL MASSING had just recently escaped from Germany by underground methods with the aid of HEDE GUMPERTZ and that ne was extremely anti-Fascist. He, PAUL MASSING, had been in the custody of the Nazis because of his pro-Communist and anti-Nazi activities, and had suffered severe punishment in their hands. She recalled that during this dinner a waiter dropped a cup in back of PAUL MASSING, which caused him to scream and dive under the table, a source of embarrassment for both of them. This nervous condition was, according to DOROTHY DETZER, caused by the ill treatment and torture he received while interned.

On another occasion at another restaurant a person scraped a chair on arising, which caused MASSING to go through the same performance.

Shortly after her arrival in Paris HEDE GUMPERTZ contacted DOROTHY DETZER, stating that she was very much in love with FAUL MASSING, and that she desired to marry him, but that PAUL MASSING was so concerned with the Fascist Government in Germany that it was his desire to return and carry on more vigorously his anti-Fascist activities, but that in view of his nervous condition it would be suicide for him to return as he would be immediately apprehended. HEDE GUMPERTZ stated that it was her desire to take MASSING to the United States and asked that DOROTHY DETZER use her influence in securing a visa for PAUL MASSING.

On returning to the United States DOROTHY DETZER contacted one JACK SIMMONS, head of the Visa Department, and asked for a visa for PAUL MASSING. She was subjected to some questioning by SIMMONS who wanted proof that PAUL MASSING was not a Communist. On being unable to furnish such proof SIMMONS recommended that PAUL MASSING marry an American citizen,

DOROTHY DETZER then cabled PAUL MASSING that if he would marry HEDE GUMPERTZ a visa would be issued. Such marriage took place and a visa was issued, as a result of which HEDE MASSING and DOROTHY DETZER became very close friends and confidants.

DOROTHY DETZER stated that in 1946 she made application for employment with the United Nations in the Human Rights Division. DETZER stated that at this time all applications for employment with the United Nations had first to be cleared through the State Department. In making her application DOROTHY DETZER was of the opinion that she should show some liberal people as references and she, therefore, gave as her references the following people who are personally known to her:

> WALTER "HITE, Executive Secretary, NAACP Mrs. BETHUNE, President, National Congress of Negro Women ROGER BLLDWIN, Civil Liberties Union MORRIS ERNST, Lawyer for the Civil Liberties Union

She presented her application to a friend of hers in the State Department, one Mr. ORICK, who passed upon the application favorably and sent it through the regular channels. However, her application was never, acted upon and in making further inquiry through Mr. ORICK and others DOPOTHY DETZER was advised that her application was stopped when it reached the desk of ALGER HISS. This caused Miss DETZER some concern inasmuch as she had regarded ALGER HISS as an old friend and she could not understand why he should take such action.

On leaving the office of Mr. ORICK she met one G. HO'LAND SHAW, formerly of the State Department in the Personnel Division and now the President of some national organization in "ashington dealing with juvenile delinquency. She told SHAW of the difficulty she had had and of the action taken by HISS and SHAW at that time made the remark, "There are some who say ALGER is a Communist." This information came to DOROTHY DETZER as a surprise:

The following week in 1946 she went to New York where she visited with HEDE MASSING at which time she also related her difficulty and that

IISS had acted unfavorably upon her application: HEDE MASSING stated that this was understandable and that her application had been acted unfavorably upon by ALGER HISS in view of the fact that DETZEP had been so out-spoken in her anti-Communist and anti-Stalinist philosophy.

MASSING then in confidence related to DOROTHY DETZER her previous Commintern espionage activities. In this conversation she related that her job had been to contact officials in the State Department and other Governmental agencies and endeavor to develop them as informants for her Commintern apparatus. She stated that she had been successful in developing and "delivering" NOEL FIELD and at the same time mentioned ALGER HISS as being connected with this apparatus. DOROTHY DETZER cannot now exactly recall what part ALGER HISS played in this apparatus although she is certain his name was mentioned along with NOEL FIELD:

At the time of giving DOROTHY DETZER this information HEDE MASSING stated that she would not be endangered in having this information as she, HEDE MASSING, had already given it to the FBI.

DETZER stated that she has the utmost confidence in HEDE MASSING and believes her to be absolutely honest and that any information given by HEDE MASSING can be thoroughly relied upon. MASSING is not in any way a sensation seeking individual and shuns publicity. The MASSINGS, according to DETZER, have great fear for their lives since breaking with the pro-Stalinist operators in the Commintern.

On numerous occasions from 1936 to date MASSING has discussed common acquaintances in Washington and elsewhere and the name of ALGER HISS has come up on many of these occasions, which leads DOROTHY DETZER to believe that they had been previously acquainted. DOROTHY DETZER recalls specifically one of these conversations which took place during a walk on the farm of the MASSINGs in Bucks County, Pennsylvania, which was the first farm owned by the MASSINGs and bought eight or nine years ago in common with the mother of NOEL FIELD. One LOUIS FISCHER, a newspaper correspondent formerly attached to the magazine <u>The Nation</u>, accompanied them on this walk. DETZER recalls that at that time HEDE MASSING inquired regarding the activities of ALGER HISS and his present whereabouts.

Miss DETZER recalled that some time in the fall of 1948, following the publicity on the HISS-CHAMBERS affair, she was telephonically contacted by CLARK EICHELBERGER, Director of the United Nations Association,

which is closely affiliated with the Carnegie Foundation. EICHELBERGER commented on the hideous charges being made against ALGER HISS and asked her if she could recall a GEORGE CROSLEY. DETZER replied in the negative, stating that in her opinion there was never any GEORGE CROSLEY, and indicated co EICHELBERGER that she believed the charges being made against HISS were true. Her opinion astonished EICHELBERGER, who asked that she stop in to see him to discuss the matter the next time she was in New York and not to reveal to anyone that he had contacted her concerning this case.

The above was told to the agents in confidence as Miss DETZER still considers EICHELBERGER a close friend, and the name of DETZER should not be used in the event of a future contact with EICHELBERGER.

Will on instructions from the Bureau, contact G. HOWLAND SHAW, former State Department official, and endeavor to secure from him his knowledge of ALGER HISS' political philosophy, it being noted that he had told DOROTHY DETZER that "there are some that say ALGER is a Communist."

The file on Miss FANSLER at the Yale Alumni Office is captioned Mrs. Alger Hiss and contains nothing which could have been typewritten by either ALGER or Mrs. HISS.

Professor BRAND BLANSHARD, 274 St. Ronan Street, New Haven, a professor of philosophy at Yale University, was interviewed at his home on December 31, 1948. He stated that he had rented his cottage at Peacham, Vermont to Mr. and Mrs. ALGER HISS for the summer of 1948. He exhibited correspondence which he had concerning the renting of this property with Lr. and Mrs. ALGER HISS, all of which was handwritten. He further stated that neither he nor his wife had received any typewritten letters from Mr. or Lrs. HISS.

Rrofessor BLANSHARD stated he wished to advise that he became acquainted with Mr. and Mrs. HISS during the summer of 1947 at which time the HISSES were renting a cottage at Peacham, Vermont from Professor Bogart of the University of Illinois. He further advised he had no reason to be suspicious of Mr. or Mrs. HISS as they appeared to be above board and honest in all their dealings with him. He pointed out that at first he asked for \$100 for the season for his cottage but that the HISSES thought this amount too small and paid him a larger sum.

Mr. D. A. TEACHOUT, Manager of the Equipment and Supply Department, checked his records and advised that the Woodstock typewriter sent to his store number 235 in Washington, D. C., in November of 1941 had serial number RN-22269E and was believed to have been purchased from the Woodstock Branch Store in Detroit, Michigan, in about November of 1941. Mr. TEACHOUT explained that this was a rebuilt typewriter inasmuch as the Kresge Company because of War restrictions were not permitted to purchase any new typewriters.

In September of 1947, this typewriter was returned from Store 235 to the S. S. Kresge Company at Detroit, Michigan, and was on September 23, 1947, sold to Mr. R. E. DUNN of 13552 Santa Rosa, Detroit, Michigan. Mr. DUNN is a representative of the L. C. Smith Company with offices at 1402 Barlum Tower, Detroit.

Mr. H. R. GASCON, Service Manager of the Woodstock. Company, 615 Francis Palms Building, checked his records which indicated that a Woodstock typewriter with serial number RN-22269E was sold to the Kresge Company and shipped to Washington, D. C. in November of 1941. Mr. GASCON stated that the RN proceeding the serial number indicates that it is a rebuilt typewriter, and that the E at the end of the serial number indicates that the machine has Elite type.

The referenced teletype stated that if the machine was equipped with Elite type specimens were not to be taken. It further appears that this machine originated in Detroit and could not be the typewriter formerly in the possession of ALGER HISS; therefore, no further effort is being made to locate the typewriter.

CARL S. RAYMOND, Town Clerk, Town Hall, New Canaan, Connecticut, made available records which revealed that ELIZABETH L. HISS and JOHN A. SUTRO applied for a marriage license on October 3, 1931, said license being issued on October 12, 1931. The bride at that time gave her age as 20 and her birthplace as New Canaan, Gonnecticut. ELIZABETH L. HISS, the bride, indicated that it was her first marriage and her parents were listed as PHILLE HANSON HISS, JR. and CAROLINE DOW. The bride did not list any occupation. JOHN A. SUTRO, the groom, gave his age as 26, his occupation as attorney-at-law in San Francisco, California, and indicated that he was born in San Francisco. Mr. SUTRO reported that this also was his first marriage and furnished the identity of his parents as ALFRED SUTRO and NOSE NEVMARK.

The marriage records further revealed that the parties were married on October 16, 1931 at New Canaan by Rev. Dr. CLIFTON M. BREWER, 553 Whitney Avenue, New Haven, Connecticut, a lecturer at Yale University.

A thorough search was made in an effort to locate the birth record of the bride, ELIZABETH Li HISS, at New Canaan, it being noted that she listed New Canaan as her place of birth on her marriage license, with negative results. CARL S. RAYMOND, Town Clerk, explained that if the bride was born anywhere within the state of Connecticut, a copy should have been filed in New Canaan. It was reported, however, that it is quite possible that ELIZABETH L. HISS was actually born in a New York hospital, it being noted that she is of wealthy parents in which case the New York authorities would not forward a copy of her birth record to New Canaan even though her family actually resided in that particular town. Ar. RAYMOND mentioned that he knew the HISS family as residents of New Canaan for a number of years, stating that there were only two children born to PHILIP HANSON HISS, JR. and CAROLINE DOW HISS, namely, a son, PHILIP H. JR., III, and a daughter, ELIZABETH L. HISS. Mr. RAYOND further remarked that PHILIP, JR., III, is presently instituting divorce proceedings against his wife, MARJORIE B. HISS, at Bridgeport, Connecticut. It was reported that Mrs. MARJORIE B. HISS is currently living with a Mrs. MARVIN on Oneoke Ridge in New Canaan.

The 1948 city directory for New Canaan reflects CAROLINE D. HISS, widow of PHILIP H. HISS, JR., as currently residing off Brushy Ridge Road in New Canaan. PHILIP H. HISS, JR., III, and wife, MARJORIE B. also have their residence recorded as off Brushy Ridge Road. The occupation of PHILIP, JR., III, was recorded as a writer and photographer.

Chief OTTO SCHIIDT and Sergeant FRANK ANNUNZIATO, both of the New Canaan, Connecticut Police Department, advised that the HISS family are well known residents in the community and are considered well established financially. Sergeant ANNUNZIATO stated that PHILIP HANSON HISS, JR., the father of ELIZABETH L. and PHILIP H., JR., III, was a former doctor and is now deceased. It is further reported that there were only two children born to Hrs. CAROLINE DOW and her former husband. Sergeant ANNUNZIATO further remarked that he had heard a report at one time, the source of which he could not

recall, to the effect that the HISS family in New Canaan are distantly related to AIGER HISS, the nature of relationship not recalled. Sergeant ANNUNZIATO further remarked that he was recently conversing with Mrs. CAROLINE DOW HISS at which time she indicated that she was leaving for San Francisco to visit her daughter, now known as Mrs. JOHN A. SUTRO.

Chief OTTO SCHMIDT and Sergeant FRANK ANNUNZIATO both remarked that MARJORIE B. HISS, the wife of PHILIP HANSON HISS, JR., III, is considered morally loose in New Canaan. Sergeant ANNUNZIATO explained such remark by stating that HARJORIE B. HISS can frequently be observed visiting a local tavern in New Canaan drinking oftentimes to excess and picking up with selected escorts.

Under date of November 14, 1948 a press release appeared in the Bridgeport, Connecticut Sunday Herald reflecting that Mrs. M/RJORIE BOOTH HISS of New Canaan had requested \$15,000 yearly in Superior Court at Bridgeport for the support of her 14 year old daughter, VALERIE, and her 7 year old son, MICHAEL, A settlement was established at \$7200 a year by Judgé J, HOWARD ROBERTS, who took into consideration the fact that there was a \$2800 yearly income from a trust fund set up for her by PHILIP HANSON HISS, JR., III, when they were divorced in 1939. It is to be noted that subsequent to the first divorce of PHILIP, JR., III and his wife, M/RJORIE, they were again remarried and celebrated their second honeymoon by vacationing to the Bahamas on a \$60,000 yacht purchased by PHILIP, JR., III. It is to be further noted that MARJORIE 1. HISS, according to the press release, has a daughter MARJORIE whose \$2500 annual expenses at the Masters School are paid for by CAROLINE DOW HISS.

Mrs. JOHN GRAHAM in South Coventry, Connecticut, over the Christmas holidays during which time her son contracted measles, as had other members of the GRAHAM family and that, accordingly, SOYRING had remained at the residence of Mrs. GRAHAM.

The Boston office indicated that JOHN GRAHAM was employed at the Pratt & Whitney Aircraft Company. It was requested that the New Haven Division ascertain whether Mrs. SOYRING was, in fact, still in Connecticut and how long she intended to remain there.

The records of the Hartford Manufacturers' Association at Hartford, Connecticut, reveal that one JOHN ARNOLD GRAHAM, a resident at 69 Edmonds Street, Manchester, Connecticut, in 1940 had become employed by the Pratt and Whitney Aircraft Corporation. These records indicated that this individual was married, was born May 14, 1917, and had Social Security Number 004-16-6869.

Mr. LARRY HAYNES, Internal Security Section, Pratt & Whitney Aircraft Corporation, confirmed the fact that JOHN ARNOLD GRAHAM is an employee of that corporation. His personnel record reflected that he is presently residing at RFD 1, South Coventry, Connecticut, and that he is a field service representative of the Pratt & Whitney Aircraft Corporation.

Mr. HAYNES checked a personnel information form made out for Pratt & Whitney Aircraft Corporation by GRAHAM in 1943 and thereby ascertained that in that year JOHN ARNOLD GRAHAM listed as his sister-in-law one ELEANOR CROSEN NELSON SAYRIND, age 37, occupation secretary-treasurer, UFW-CIO in Washington, D. C.

Furnished with a suitable pretext, Mr. HAYNES personally interviewed JOHN ARNOLD GRAHAM at the Pratt and Whitney Aircraft Corporation at East Hartford, Connecticut, on January 11, 1948. By means of this interview he learned from GRAHAM that the latter's sister-in-law and her young son had, in fact, spent the Christmas holidays at his home in South Coventry, Connecticut. GRAHAM further informed HAYNES that during the period of his sister-in-law's visit, her young son had contracted measles with the result that GRAHAM's own three young children had likewise contracted measles. GRAHAM stated that the children were treated by Dr: EDEIN BASDEN, Deputy Public Health Officer for Coventry, Connecticut, and aurrounding areas. GRAHAM further advised HAYNES that his sister-inlaw and her son intended to remain at his house until some time about the middle of the week, January 16-22, 1949 when she and her son would leave.

At ll:25 a.m. today Special Agent Kenneth Delavine of the Washington Field Office telephonically advised that Jesse R. Rogers, an employee of the War Department, who was interviewed for approximately two hours yesterday by Agents of the Washington Field Office, reportedly died in his sleep last night.

Mr. Delavine stated Rogers was interviewed at his office in the War Department on the afternoon of January 12, 1949 by Agents Robert McCaslin and Paul Tierney. According to the Agents, Rogers was obviously not furnishing the information he had in his possession and to almost every pertinent question he would reply that he could not recall and ask the Agents whether they could furnish him with additional information. The Agents, of course, did not disclose any facts to Rogers and upon taking their leave, asked him to make an effort to recall the answers to the questions that he had asked him. He stated he would do so and arrangements were made to reinterview him today.

Mr. Delavine stated that discreet inquiries would be made to determine whether Rogers had committed suicide and the Bureau would be kept currently advised with respect to all developments concerning his death.

ASAC Belmont, New York, called in and stated that to properly protect the New York Office they had instituted a policy of requesting from Mr. Donegan, Mr. Whearty or other attorneys handling this matter before the Grand Jury to reduce to writing certain requests for investigation in an effort to stop indiscriminate requests.

I told Mr. Belmont that this procedure was satisfactory, that he should cooperate with the attorneys in the same manner as he had cooperated in any other criminal case. I told him if he thought the suggested procedure would stop unnecessary, indiscriminate and perhaps illogical requests, he could utilize the advice of the memorandum. He stated it was not being uniformly applied but wherever they felt it would be helpful in maintaining control of the investigation they were requesting it.
