RECUERT OF EXALCHART

The typesriting appearing on speciments listed above an Kil through Ki4 were exchanged with each other and it was concluded that Ki2 and Ki3 were typed with one machine. It was not possible to reach a definite conclusion as to whether Kil was typed with the machine which typed Ki2 and Ki3 due to the fact there are not enough letter and word combinations in common. It was concluded that Ki4 was written on a different machine than specimens Kil through Ki3.

It was concluded that epecimens Ell through Kik wore not the machines used to type 265 through 2669 and 2074 through 20131. 205 through 2069 were received in the Laberatory December 3, 1946 from the focurity Investigative Division of this Durcau. 2074 through 20131 were received in the Laberatory December 8, 1948 from the Security Investigative Division of this Durcau.

As has been previously reported Qc6 through Qc69 contain typewriting most closely matching the standards for Goodstock pica type spaced ton letters to one inch maintained in the Laboratory's files. ASAC Belmont at 2:00 P.M. today advised that the Grand Jury had continued meeting in New York this morning and adjourned about 1:30, and it was not yet possible to ascertain what transpired at the Grand Jury today. He stated he would advise when information was available. He stated that Special Agent Daniel F. X. Callahan of the Baltimore Office, who had taken the statement from Chambers, had appeared before the Grand Jury today.

He stated further that they reinterviewed Chambers and he hadfurnished them a signed statement. They attempted to ascertain from him the identity of Harold Wilson, named by Henry Julian Wadleigh as the courier or contact handling Wadleigh. Chambers stated that he did not know Harold Wilson but that he had been introduced to Madleigh by David arpenter, who has been identified by Chambers from photographs as being identical with David Zimmerman. It is known he presently resides at South Nyack near New York City. It is understood that he is employed at the Daily Worker. He will be interviewed in the morning prior to his departure for work. He stated that Chambers had furnished additional details which would indicate that the man known as David Carpenter was a very active figure in this case and, of course, he will be of more prominence if he is identified as the Harold Wilson. The photograph ' of Carpenter will be exhibited to Wadleigh tomorrow by the New York Office when Wadleigh appears to testify before the Grand Jury in response to his subpoena. Chambers stated that he did positively recall that he used the name Carl with reference to his contacts with Wadleigh.

At 2:20 P.M. Mr. Delavigne, Supervisor, Washington Field Office, advised that it does not appear that any hearings are presently being held by the HUAC but it is known that at 2:30 P.M. today some of the Committee are having a conference with Mr. Summer Welles of the State Department with reference to the classification and authenticity of the documents in the possession of the HUAC.

At 2:10 p.m. today, ASAC Belmont, New York, called in and reported developments in this matter and he reported the results of the interview with Hedinassing. She was being interviewed particularly with reference to the activities of Henry Julian Wadleigh, formerly 🔿 with the State Department, who furnished a statement last night admitting he had furnished documents from the State Department files which reached the hands of Whittaker Chambers. She advised that on the basis of the description and known information furnished to her she could not identify Wadleigh. She did say, however, that in the winter of 1934-35 she made a number of trips to Washington for the purpose of developing Noel Field of the State Department to work for her and furnish her information. He finally told her that someone else was approaching him for the same type of information. She indicated to him that this other person was wrong and she wanted to meet him. Subsequently, she was invited to a dinner to meet this person and she stated that when she arrived she determined that Mr. Field and his wife and Alger Hiss were the persons present. She took Alger Hiss off to one side and pointed out that he was invading her field and he insisted she was invading his field. They finally agreed that it did not make any difference who developed Field; that they were working for the same thing. Massing said she finally handled Noel Pield.

Last evening following my conversation with Mr. Ladd, I endeavored to contact Congressman Mundt. There was no answer at his office or his home and in an effort to locate him I endeavored to contact Stripling. Mrs. Stripling informed Miss Canay me that Stripling and Congressman Nixon had left hurriedly for New York yesterday afternoon and when she heard from Stripling, she would call me. She also stated that Mr. Mundt was presently en route to Washington and was in a travel status. After Mr. Ladd's call (later in the evening, I, of course, abandoned attempts to locate Congressman Mundt.

Earlyze this morning, Stripling called and said his wife said that I had called. I made the conversation very casual and told him that informally and personally I just wondered what the developments had been. He told me that he and Nixon had gone to New York last evening, that United States Attorney McGohey and Donegan met them at the station, that they had a long conversation with Nixon, that they endeavored to get the Committee to desist from holding public hearings, interviewing witnesses, or taking testimony. However, they had taken the testimony of Whittaker Chambers last evening and will present it to the Committee in Executive Session. Stripling doesn't know what the outcome will be.

I asked him if they had an opportunity to get all the microfilm transcribed, i.e. typed up. He stated they had made copies of most of it. I told him that while I was not making any formal request he might give some thought to informally or unofficially turning over a set of the transcripts to the Bureau for our information, guidance, and reference. He stated he had thought of this and thought it should be done and he would initiate such a move on his own as his own suggestion. I asked him about the development of the microfilm and told him that microfilm was very tricky and unless one had considerable experience, there is considerable likelihood of permanently marring and destroying the evidence. Stripling volunteered the advice he thought that it would be well to ask us to endeavor to develop the microfilm in our laboratory. I told him that while I had not talked to the Director; Tifelt reasonably certain if the Committee made such a request, the Director would be glad to make the laboratory facilities available for this. He stated that he would keep me posted;

They will hold Executive Sessions today. The first witness will be Summer Welles. I asked him what they expected from Welles. He stated they would have Welles testify as to the necessity or lack of necessity of maintaining the documents secret.

The conversation was very amiable and at no time did I make any request for a transcript of the microfilm nor for the laboratory to develop the microfilm. As the conversation developed in a casual manner, I did pick it up and carry it along.

Since dictating the above, Mr. Ladd has informed me of the Director's desire that I endeavor to contact Mundt and make a request for the transcript and offer the facilities of the laboratory to develop the microfilm. I endeavored to reach Mundt again and getting no answer, I called Stripling.

Stripling told me Mundt is due in around 12 or 12:30 today.

I told Stripling with reference to our conversation this morning, I now wished to make an official request on behalf of the Bureau for a transcript of the microfilm and to also offer the facilities of our laboratory in developing the microfilm. He stated that there would be no difficulty involved in making a transcript available, that he appreciated the personal offer of the laboratory. I also told him I would endeavor to get in touch with Congressman Mundt. He stated that would be a very good idea and there would be no difficulty involved and he also would talk to Mundt upon his arrival in Washington.

I have again tried Mundt's office. This time a clerk answered and I advised the clerk of my desire to talk to the Congressman immediately upon his return and left word for him to call. However, I will also follow up on the call.

Mr. Campbell indicated and conveyed to the Committee the impression that either we or the Department of Justice had Wadley. This upset several members of the Committee who launched into a tirade against the Department, although Stripling told me nothing was said about the Bureau and that they really gave Fay and Campbell a rough time. A couple of members of the Committee expressed themselves to the effect that since there were only 2 copies of the developed material available and one set had been supplied to the Grand Jury in New York and one to the State Department they were of the opinion no additional copies should be made and the Bureau should not be given a copy until the State Department had returned their set. Stripling stated he felt certain tomorrow morning we would get everything.

I told him I hoped he understood and the Committee understood with reference to the undeveloped negatives we merely were trying to be helpful to the Committee as well as to preserve the microfilm in that a great deal of technique was required in its development and if it was not properly developed it would be ruined and that we were anxious to preserve/scintilla of evidence. Stripling pointed out there was not too much undeveloped material; that the undeveloped material came primarily from the Bureau of Standards and pertained to Navy Department material. He further told me that Chambers had stated that his contacts in the Bureau of Standards had furnished details on the Navy's selfsealing gas tank which had been turned over to the Russians. He inquired about Henry Wadley. I told him definitely we did not have Wadley and that if we had any word as to where Wadley was I would check on the matter and would pass it on to him. Mr. Ladd tells me that Wadley is under subpoena and is probably in New York. He concurs in the view that if we do know where Wadley is we should inform Stripling. ADDENDUM

At 5:15 P.M., ASAC Belmont called in and stated that today at the Grand Jury proceedings in New York, SA Callahan read to the Jury the Hiss statement. Donald Appell of the HUAC Staff also briefly testified as to the recovery of the documents from the "pumpkin" at Chamber's residence. Alger Hiss also testified as to his background and associates but he made no startling disclosures or admissions of interest. Chambers also testified as to the contents of his statement but he added that there were two brothers involved, a George and a Wald (Walt or Ward) Pigman. They vorked in Washington, D. C. in the Bureau of Standards in 1937 and Wald gave to Chambers information from the Bureau of Standards. Chambers stated that he endeavored also to develop George Pigman but was unsuccessful. Chambers stated that David Corpenter was active with reference to Wald Pigman and he believed that Wald Pigman was a part of the Eleanor Melson group. The Washington Field Office was instructed at 5:30 P.M. to locate tonight George and Wald Pigman so that they can be interviewed tomorrow morning.

At 5:20 P.M. Mr. Delavigne of the Washington Field Office called over and stated that the HUAC met this afternoon at 2:30 in closed conference but finally the hearings were opened and Mr. Purifoy and Mr. Welles of the Department of State testified concerning the official character of the documents in the possession of the HUAC recovered from Chambers. The handwriting notations which appeared on some of these documents were testified to as being unimportant and if placed thereon by State Department personnel, it would be unusual. Mr. Delavigne stated it was also learned that the HUAC is making intensive efforts to identify the typewriting and it is asserted that they have secured some specimens typed on the typewriter allegedly in the possession of Hiss in the pertinent period around 1937. There is an inclination to find that the typewriting specimens compare favorably with the typewriting on some of the documents.

Intensive efforts are being presently made to locate typewriting specimens prepared on the typewriter which Hiss admits was in his possession during the years 1936-1938.

Congressman Karl fundt called late last evening around in trees 10:00 o'clock and stated they had just completed an Executive Session of the Committee; that the Committee was very happy to make available a set of the microfilm reproductions that have already been developed to the Bureau in order that we might make wish house copies. The material will, of course, have to be returned to the Committee. Secondly, the Committee will be very happy if the Bureau's Laboratory facilities could be made available in an attempt to develop the undeveloped negative microfilm.

He asked that I contact Mr., Stripling early this morning and work out the details with him. I talked to Stripling. He said if there was any real urgent need he would come down right now and get the things together; however, he would appreciate it if we would wait until 2:00 o'clock this afternoon as he was all tied up this morning and some of the material was being used. I told him it would not be necessary for us to have all the material at one time; that we could take what was not being used and get the balance later; however, I told him an Agent would contact him at 2:00 o'clock this afternoon at Room 225, Old House Office Building. At that time Stripling will make available the reproduced microfilm in order that we might make photostats or copies in any way we desire. The material that he makes available will, of course, have to be returned to the Committee. He will also make available undeveloped negatives in order that the photographic section might be working on He indicated it would not be necessary for them to have a them. representative accompany the film to the Bureau. I told him the Agent who contacted him would make an inventory of what he received and it would be returned.

Mr. Ladd has been advised and has taken care of the details of having an Agent in the Field Office contact Stripling.

At 9:05 a.m. today, ASAC Belmont, New York, called in and stated that Hedi massing, who furnished information concerning Alger Hiss and Noel Field, will appear before the Grand Jury in New York today. Every effort is being made to protect her identity to other than the Grand Jury.

Mr. Belmont advised that McLean, attorney for Hiss, has hired a private investigator by the name of Schmall to assist in locating a typewriter specimen from the Hiss typewriter which he admits was in his possession in the years 1936 to 1938, and which he states he subsequently sold to some second-hand dealer. He stated that he has ascertained that Schmall has been in touch with the Philadelphia Office and plans to contact a Mr. Martin of an insurance company with which the father-in-law of Hiss was associated. The father-in-law is now deceased and the typewriter that Hiss had from 1936 to 1938 was secured from him. The father-in-law utilized the typewriter in the insurance agency.

Schmall apparently is claiming that he is cooperating with Bureau Agents and though this is perhaps true, he represents Hiss and not the Bureau. Mr. Belmont stated that he advised the Philadelphia Office along the line indicated, pointing out to them that they should not work with Schmall and that Mr. Martin of the insurance company who has already been contacted by Bureau Agents should be advised that Schmall is not working for the Bureau but is actually working for Mr. Hiss; that any requests made by him are for the personal purposes of Mr. Hiss and not for the U. S. Government.

Subsequently, during the course of another telephone call, SAC Boardman, Philadelphia, brought up the question of Schmall and I advised him along the lines indicated, that he should not place himself in the position of having worked with Schmall.

- It is noted that the New York Office has already advised the attorney, McLean, that they wish to accept the cooperation of McLean only from him personally and not from Schmall. No difficulty is anticipated as to Schmall because every effort is being made to avoid any difficulty over his activities.

Reference is made to the attached teletype from New York dated December 7, 1948, and to the attached routing slip in which you inquired as to the identity of Hede Massing. You also inquired if we had interviewed Noel Field and if he is still in the government.

For your information Hedi Tune Wassing was formerly married to Gerhart Eisler, divorcing him in Germany in 1926 to become the wife of Julian Gumperz., / In 1928 she separated from Gumperz and is now the wife of Dr. Paul_ Wilhelm Massing. Both Paul and Hedi Massing served as agents of the Soviet. Intelligence Service during the 1930's. In March, 1947, both Paul and Hedi Massing were entensively interviewed by Bureau personnel and have since served as valuable informants. They have proven exceedingly cooperative and without remuneration have continued to furnish valuable information concerning the identities and activities of Soviet espionage agents active during the period from 1932 to 1936.

Noel Haviland Field was employed by the State Department from 1928 until approximately 1940 or 1941. From as early as 1926 until as late as March 27, 1941, Field had been reported from sources regarded ascreliable to have been connected with the Communist Party and Communist front groups. This information had been made available to the State Department on several occasions during that period. Subsequent to his State Department employment Field in 1941 or 1942 while in Europe became a representative of the Unitarian Service Committee, a branch of the American Unitarian Aid Society.

According to the latest available information Field is presently residing in Switzerland. Field has not been interviewed by the Bureau since he has been out of this country since approximately 1941 or 1942. Current efforts are being made to determine his whereabouts for possible interview in connection with this matter.

At 3:55 P.M. today ASAC Belmont called in and stated that they had contacted Henry Julian Wadleigh for the purpose of exhibiting to him a photograph of David Carpenter to determine whether Carpenter was identical with the Harold milson named by Wadleigh. Wadleigh stated that he had consulted an attorney and his attorney advised him not to talk. He remarked that he wished his attorney would permit him to talk. He did look at the photograph of David Carpenter but would not make a statement. His reaction was such as to indicate that David Carpenter is probably identical with Harold Wilson. When he was shown the photograph he just returned it with a smile and stated that he wished his attorney would let him talk.

This morning David Carpenter was approached for an interview. He responded to a few questions and then stated he wanted to see his attorney. At that time he was served with a subpoend to appear before the Grand Jury. He went directly to the Daily Worker's office in New York. The technical coverage of the New York Office reflected that Carpenter's wife phoned the Daily Worker while Carpenter was en route and told them to get Carpenter an attorney.

A photograph of Samuel JAPelovitz, indicated by the Baltimore Office investigation to be identical with Felix, based upon the description of Felix and the description of the residence of Felix, was exhibited to Chambers today and he stated he was not positive in his identification but is reasonably sure from the photograph that Pelovitz is identical with Felix. Based on this tentative identification, Mn. Donegan is issuing a subpoend for Pelovitz. Pelovitz is a known Communist and it is felt that if he is contacted for an interview he will not be cooperative and, in fact, will hide out. It was the recommendation of ASAC Belmont that the subpoend be issued and that the Baltimore Agents be authorized to serve the subpoend at the time they attempt the interview with Pelovitz to insure his appearance before the Grand Jury. I told Mr. Belmont we would advise him concerning this recommendation.

Today Chambers, before the Grand Jury, implicated pryingent Reno, employed in 1937 at the Aberdeen Proving Grounds. Harvland. Chambers stated that Reno furnished him information about a bombsight. Mr. Donegan wants him interviewed andplans to subpoend him. Mr. Belmont stated that in the matter titled "Whittaker Chambers, Internal Security - R," Bureau

file 100-25824, there appeared a letter dated January 29, 1945, from the Bureau to the New York Office, to which are attached certain notations of a Special Agent. In these notations there is a reference to a Vincent Reno, named by Chambers, employed at the Aberdeen Proving Grounds, and he is indicated by the notes as having something to do with aerial bombsights. There was a notation that he was openly a Communist Party organizer under the alias Lance Clark. He was a civilian employee of the Aberdeen Proving Grounds.

Chambers stated that Reno was a civilian employee at the Aberdeen Proving Grounds; that he met him in late 1937, was introduced . by J. Peters; that Reno knew the subject, David Carpenter; that Reno was a member of the Eleanor Nelson Apparatus; and that he had a brother, Phillip, also in the same apparatus. He met him for the purpose of securing information. Reno was a mathematician. He met Reno four or five times in Washington and Baltimore and at the first of these meetings he discussed his work with him. Reno told him that in the past he had been a Communist Party organizer in Montana under the name of Lance Clark. Chambers stated that on two occasions Reno actually gave him information about a bombsight. Reno was employed under the supervision of a Colonel Zornig and the information furnished by Reno was given to Colonel bykov. Chambers described Vincent Reno as age 27 or 28 in 1937; 5' 8" tall; build, slender; hair, sandy; eyelashes, sandy; eyes, blue; young appearance. Chambers also stated that he knew Phillip Reno - that he met him in an apartment on New Hampshire Avenue in Washington, D. C. Phillip Reno is named in the previously mentioned Bureau letter of January 29, 1945, and notations thereto reflect: "Social Security_?" underground trade unit group, political leader.

There is a reference to a Lance Clark, contained in a Baltimore report dated October 21, 1947, entitled "Communist Party, USA, Brief," wherein confidential informant of Baltimore No. 137 furnished information concerning a Lance Clark, true name Reno. Mr. Belmont stated that Mr. Donegan was expected to request subpoends for these two persons; that he was going to ask the Baltimore Office to determine the present address of Vincent Reno and he suggested that the Washington Field Office be contacted to develop the current address of Phillip Reno. I told him I would be in touch with the WFO and suggested that no actual interview be held with either Vincent or Phillip Reno until it was known that they would be subpoenaed before the Grand Jury. He suggested that as a matter of policy interviews not be conducted with persons not indicated for appearance before the Grand Jury. I told Mr. Belmont that this was a good over-all policy to follow and the Bureau desired that all persons be interviewed who were going to be brought up before the Grand Jury.

Before contacting the WFO at 4:45 P.M. ASAC Ially called in and stated that their records definitely indicated that Vincent Reno was identical with Francis Victor Peno, alias Vince Freno, alias Lance Clark, Bureau file 121-1765. We is on extended lick leave and the investigation of that case reflected that both Phillip and Francis Victor Reno resided at 4/28 South Bannock Street, Denver, Colorado. This information has been furnished by the Baltimore Office to Belmont, New York, and he will be in contact with Donegan to determine if he will issue subpoenas. If subpoenas are issued for these two persons ASAC Belmont plans upon receipt of this advice to contact the Denver Office to instruct the interview of both of the Reno brothers.

Mr. Lally stated further that their t<u>cchnical coverage</u> at Baltimore reflected that on June 24, 1948, PhilyFrankfeld, CP leader in Baltimore, had stated that Phil Reno had been expelled from the CP.

At 5:15 P.M. SAC Foster of Indianapolis called in and stated that the interview with George L. Pigman was unproductive. He stated that he did not know Chambers and all he knew about Chambers and Hiss is what he read in the newspapers. It is noted that on the basis of what Chambers said it is entirely possible that George L. Pigman would not recall him because Chambers said he was unsuccessful in his contacts with George Pigman.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that with reference to the matter of the interview with Samuel J. Pelovitz that the Baltimore Office be authorized to serve the subpoena requiring his appearance before the Grand Jury at the time of the interview.

In the absence of SAC Foster, I advised ASAC Roche of the Indianapolis Field Office at 10:45 A.M. today that the Bureau was interested in verifying the residence address of George L. Figman, which was now known to the Bureau as 602 West Maple Road, Indianapolis, Indiana. I instructed ASAC Roche that in addition to verifying the residence address of George L. Pigman, a discreet inquiry should be made to determine his business address, and that after this had been done the information should be furnished to the New York Office and the Bureau. I also told Mr. Roche that sometime today, depending upon the outcome of some investigation being handled by the New York Office, the New York Office would request the Indianapolis Field Office to thoroughly interview. Pigman. Suggestions as to some of the things to be asked Pigman during this interview would be furnished to the Indianapolis Office by New York.

At 10:55 A.M. I called SAC Johnson of Milwaukee and told him that the latest address that the Bureau had on William Ward Pigman, also known as Wald or Walt, is 702 East North Street, Appleton, Wisconsin. I requested that the Milwaukee Office verify this address and also ascertain discreetly the business address of William Ward Pigman. The same instructions issued to the Indianapolis Office were also imparted to the Milwaukee Field Office.

At 11:25 A.H., ASAC Roche of Indianapolis called and advised that George L. Pigman was now residing at 602 West Maple Road, Indianapolis. His business address is the Experimental Station, CAA, WeirCook Airport, Indianapolis, Indiana. Mr. Roche further advised that Pigman. is now at the airport and is expected to be there until about 5:00 or 5:30 P.M. He doesn't expect to go home for dinner but probably will be out for the evening, according to information available to the Indianapolis Office. Kisseloff-8566

ASAC R. J. Lally of the Baltimore Office called. He indicated that he had previously discussed the possible interview with Samuel J. Pelovitz with you. He said that they were awaiting Bureau instructions to determine whether or not they should interview Pelovitz.

I obtained the tickler of your memorandum to Mr. Ladd of December 8, 1948, recording a call from Mr. Belmont in New York at 3:55 p.m. and advised Mr. Lally that you had indicated in that memorandum that Mr. Belmont had recommended that the Baltimore Agents serve the subpoena on Pelovitz at the time they attempted to interview him, in order to be certain that the subpoena was served on him and at the same time insure his appearance before the Grand Jury. You recall that in that memorandum you indicated that you would advise Mr. Belmont concerning this recommendation.

While talking to Mr. Lally, another Agent in the Baltimore Office was talking to the New York Office, at which time the Baltimore Office was advised that Mr. Donegan did not anticipate issuing the subpoena until tomorrow morning. In view of this, it did not appear that it was necessary to advise the Baltimore Office whether or not the interview was authorized at this time. I indicated to Mr. Lally that so far as the interview was concerned tonight, they could forget about it and that the Bureau would advise them in the morning as to whether the interview was authorized.

This is to advise you of information received in confidence from LOUIS A. RUSSELL, Investigator for the House Committee on Un-American Activities, concerning the present activities of that Committee in the matter of WHITTAKER CHAMBERS and ALGER HISS.

RUSSELL indicated that the Committee has issued three subpoenaes, one for JULIAN NADLEIGH, whom RUSSELL advises, WHITTAKER CHAMBERS in an interview on December 6, 1948, had stated, as furnishing him information of a commercial nature in his espionage activities. The other subpoenaes, according to RUSSELL, were for EUNICE LINCOLN and ANNABELLE NEWCOMBE, both of whom were formerly secretaries for AIGER HISS at the Department of State. RUSSELL indicated that the Committee ¹nvestigators had been informed that JULIAN WADLEIGH was on vacation and had learned that ANNABELLE NEWCOMBE was in Paris, France with the State Department but would be returning within a day or two to this country.

RUSSELL also advised that the Committee had been in receipt of an anonymous report that one BERTRAL BENEDICT, who operates the "Editorial Research Reports", had been the individual who was making photostats for AIGER HISS in his espionage activities. RUSSELL advised that during the course of their investigation, the Committee Investigators had learned that AIGER HISS had sold a house to BERT BENEDICT and RUTH SARLES.

It was further learned from RUSSELL that the Committee was trying to locate WILLIAM WAREAPIGMAN, whom WHITTAKER CHAMBERS had advised the' Committee in interview as being his source of information at the Bureau of Standards. Kisseloff-8569

RUSSELL also advised that the House Committee had B. learned from a source which he did not disclose that FRANCIS SAYRE was leaving Washington, D: C. sometime on this date in order to avoid testifying before the Committee and was not expected to return until sometime after December 20, 1948.

In connection with the Committee's efforts to identify certain typewritten specimens which WHITTAKER CHAMBERS had turned over to the Committee with known typewritten specimens of ALGER HISS; RUSSELL advised that they had obtained one known specimen which had been turned over to the typewriting expert of the Veterans Administration and that he made a tentative identification but would not give a conclusive identification since one of the specimens was a photographic reproduction and the other a photostatic reproduction and this expert declined to make a positive identification unless the identification could be made on original documents or on specimens similarly reproduced.

In the event that additional information is obtained, it will be promptly forwarded to the Bureau.

Special Agent K. T. Delavigne of the Washington Field Office advised me at 12:30 p.m. today that Jack Neal of the State Department informed that with reference to the documents being checked at the State Department, it has been ascertained that Under Secretary of State, (through the Legal Department, requested and received the documents. They are now in his personal possession and will not be available to Mr. Neal until they are returned for files. This action, of course, delays the completion of the Washington Field Office inquiry as to these documents. Today, however, the Washington Field Office is conferring with Mr. Neal concerning the documents, photostats of which he previously furnished to the Bureau on a confidential basis.

It has been further ascertained that the House Un-American Activities Committee is now trying to locate George L. Pigman and William Ward Pigman, named by Chambers in his testimony before the Grand Jury yesterday. With reference to these two individuals the Bureau has identified them, is aware of their present addresses and proper instructions have been issued for their interviews. George Pigman is residing and working at Indianapolis, Indiana. William Ward Pigman is residing and working at Appleton, Wisconsin.

It has been ascertained also that the HUAC has issued subpoenas for the appearance of Eurice Hincoln (both names phonetic) and Annabélle Newcombe, both of whom allegedly were employed by the State Department in the past and served as secretaries to Alger Hiss. Newcombe is in Paris but is expected to return by air within the next day or two.

The HUAC is also endeavoring to subpoena former Assistant Secretary of State Sayre and allegedly he is making himself unavailable until about December 20 and is apparently avoiding service of a subpoena. KisselOUT-8571

Reference is made to telephone call of Inspector HOWARD B. FLETCHER on the evening of December 7, 1948, at which time the Washington Field Office was requested to identify and locate one GEORGE FIGMAN and his brother, WARDAPIGMAN, also known as WALD or WALT. Both of these individuals were employed at the Bureau of Standards in Washington, D. C. in 1937.

Attention is directed to the following Bureau file: 100-166300, which furnished information from the Chicago Office dated December 9, 1942, under the caption of "GEORGE LXPIGMAN, Arlington, Virginia, Internal Security - G'- Hatch Act". The Chicago Office advised that one WILLIAM B FELTES, 5322 West Drummond Place, Chicago, Illinois, who at that time was employed by the Communication Section of the Western Electric Company of Chicago, said his brother-in-law, Mr. GEORGE L. PIGMAN, Columbus Street, Arlington, Virginia, an aeronautical engineer employed by the Bureau of Standards, Department of Commerce, made a trip to Germany, returning just before the outbreak of the war in 1939. He brought several German cameras back with him and was believed to have a contraption in his basement which might be a short wave radio. According to the informant, who requested that this information be retained in strictest confidence, PIGMAN's wife allegedly stated to PIGMAN that he had better get rid of the literature he had in his basement or that he would lose his job. No other remarks of an un-American character were noted by the informant.

Further attention is called to Bureau File No. 121-13374, which shows that a preliminary loyalty investigation was instigated on one GEORGE LEROY FIGMAN, Chief of Structural Section, Experimental Section, Civil-Aeronautics Administration, Indianapolis, Indiana, under the caption of "Loyalty of Government Employees".

An examination of the city directories for Washington, D. C. and vicinity reflects that in 1933 one GEORGE L. PIGMAN, employed in the laboratory at the National Bureau of Standards, resided at 1255 New Hampshire Avenue, N. W. WILLIAM W. PIGMAN, a scientist aide at the Bureau of Standards, is listed as residing at the same address.

The city directory of 1935 reflects GEORGE L. PIGMAN, wife, VIRGINIA W., as being a Laboratory Assistant at the National Bureau of Standards and residing at 1922 N Street, N. W., Apartment 44; WILLIAM W. PIGMAN, wife, ALICE, of being a Scientist Aide at the National Bureau of Standards and residing at 2127 P Street, N. W. Apartment 308.

In the directory for 1936, GEORGE L. PIGMAN is listed as a mechanic at the National Buréau of Standards, residing at 1922 N Street, Apartment 44. WILLIAM W. PIGMAN, Scientist Aide at the Bureau of Standards, is listed as residing at 3001 Porter Street, N. W.

The 1937 directory lists GEORGE L. PIGMAN and WILLIAM W. PIGMAN, both employed at the National Bureau of Standards, as residing at the same addresses as they did in 1936.

The directory for 1938 reflects GEORGE L. PIGMAN employed at the Bureau of Standards as residing at 1922 N Street, N. W., Apartment 44, while WILLIAM W. PIGMAN, a chemist at the Bureau of Standards, as residing in Arlington; no street address listed.

The 1939 directory carries only GEORGE L. PIGMAN, engineer at the Bureau of Standards as residing in Arlington.

In the directory for 1944, GEORGE L. PIGMAN, engineer, Bureau of Standards, is shown as residing at 1907 N. Kenmore, Arlington, Virginia, while WARD W. PIGMAN, chemist, Bureau of Standards, resided at 2006 North Stafford, Arlington, Virginia.

The 1941 directory lists GEORGE L. PIGMAN, aeronautical engineer, Civil Aeronautics Administration, as residing at 1907 North Kanmore, Arlington. WILLIAM W. PIGMAN, chemist, Bureau of Standards, is listed as residing at 2006 North Stafford, Arlington.

The directory for 1943 lists GEORGE L. PIGMAN, engineer, Civil Aeronautics Administration, as residing at 1907 North Kenmore, Arlington, and also lists a second GEORGE L. PIGMAN with the National Bureau of Standards as residing at 229 North Columbus, Arlington. WILLIAM W. PIGMAN is listed as being with the Bureau of Standards and residing at 5002 Wakefield Road, Green Acres, Maryland.

Un appropriate pretext, Special Agent COURTLAND J. JONES; made telephonic inquiry of Mrs. JOHN J. O'CONNELL, 5000 Wakefield Road, Green Acres, Maryland. She advised that WARD PIGMAN, formerly resided at 5002 Wakefield Road and had moved to 702 East North Street, Appleton, Wisconsin. Mrs. O'CONNELL received a Christmas card from the PIGMANS in 1947 and in addition she visited in Washington, D. C. with Mrs. WARD PIGMAN in the summer of 1948, at which time she gave no indication of a change of address. Mrs. O'CONNELL said further that Mrs. WARD PIGMAN has a sister who is Mrs. LEWIS B. SIMS, 6513 Brennon Lane, Chevy Chase, Maryland.

Special Agent JAMES J. CANAVAN contacted Mr. JAMES KIRBY, 229 North Columbus Street, Arlington, Virginia, and he advised that he had taken title to those premises in approximately June 1946. He stated that he had purchased the house from one GEORGE L. PIGMAN. To the best of his recollection, PIGMAN was employed with the Civil Aeronautics Administration and had been transferred to Indianapolis, Indiana sometime previously but that due to his inability to obtain suitable living quarters there he had left his family residing at 229 North Columbus Street until he was able to procure a place for them to live.

Mr. KIRBY did not know exactly when Mr. PIGMAN had left Arlington but knew that it was sometime previous to his taking possession of the house. Mr. KIRBY also advised that PIGMAN's wife's name was VIRGINIA PIGMAN, but he was unable to offer any information as to whether PIGMAN had a brother named WALT. Mr. KIRBY was also unable to furnish any residence address for Mr. PIGMAN but advised that his nextdoor neighbors, a Mr. MARTIN who had resided there since 1941 and also a Mr. McQUEEN at 4808 Second Road North, Arlington, Virginia, were friendly with the PIGMANS and might possibly be in a position to offer some information as to their present whereabouts. Mr. KIRBY also without being specifically asked, volunteered the information that he believed GEORGE PIGMAN had formerly been employed at the Bureau of Standards.

Mr. JAMES MARTIN, 225 North Columbus Street, Arlington, Virginia, also confirmed the fact that GEORGE L. PIGMAN had previously resided at 229 North Columbus Street.

He further substantiated the information furnished by Mr. KIRBY to the effect that PIGMAN had been employed by the Civil Aeronautics Administration and had been transferred to Indianapolis approximately three or four years ago. Mr. MARTIN, however, was unable to furnish any additional information and did not know what Mr. PIGMAN's present residence address would be.

Mr. THOMAS W. McQUEEN, 4808 Second Road North, Arlington, Virginia, advised that he had been acquainted with the PIGMAN family when they had resided at 229 North Columbus Street. He also advised that GEORGE PIGMAN had been transferred to Indianapolis, Indiana and after consultation with his wife, Mr. McQUEEN advised Agent CANAVAN that the most recent address which they had for the PIGMANS is 602 West Maple Road, Indianapolis, Indiana.

Inquiry by Special Agent COURTLAND J. JONES at the Arlington Post Office reflects that in 1943 GEORGE L. PIGMAN submitted a change of address from 1907 North Kenmore, Arlington to 229 North Columbus Street, Arlington, Virginia. In 1946 he submitted a change of address to 602 West Maple Road, Indianapolis, Indiana.

An examination of the current Indianapolis telephone directory reflects a GEORGE L. PIGMAN as residing at the above address, telephone number Humboldt 4512.

Through confidential sources at the Bureau of Standards Special Agents ROBERT W. McCASLIN and JOE R. CRAIG ascertained that neither GEORGE L. PIGMAN or WILLIAM WARD PIGMAN or WALT or WALD PIGMAN were listed. Such sources determined, however, inactive files relative to former employees GEORGE LEROY PEGMAN and WILLIAM WARD PIGMAN had been removed to the National Archives.

Through the cooperation of an official of the National Archives, Inactive Bureau of Standards employment files pertinent to the above individuals were furnished and the following information noted therefrom:

GEORGE LEROY PIGMAN entered on duty at the Bureau of Standards August 1, 1930 as an Under Laboratory Apprentice, SP-2, subsequently promoted to Junior Material Engineer May 13, 1936 in the Cement and Concrete Division. On November 4, 1938 he was promoted to Assistant Materials-Engineer, Cement and Concrete Division.

PIGMAN, father, 1017/ South Lombard Avenue, Oak Park, Illinois. The file further noted that he attended George Washington University, having received a Master of Engineers Degree in 1935. The only address shown for GEORGE L. PIGMAN was 3102 Rodman Street, N. W. at the time of his application in 1930.

WILLIAM WARD PIGMAN was shown to have entered on duty with the Bureau of Standards May 28, 1930 as a Laboratory Apprentice, in which capacity he worked until March 13, 1931. Thereafter he was designated as a Scientific Aide March 13, 1931 to May 1, 1936; chemist May 1, 1936 to August 8, 1938; absent August 1939 to September 27, 1939 to attend the University of Leipzig, Germany, as Research Fellow for Labor Foundation, Wilmington, Delaware; return to Bureau of Standards as Organic Chemist September 27, 1939 in which capacity he was employed until his resignation August 22, 1944, at which time he indicated he was resigning to accept other employment with the Corn Products Refining Company, Research Laboratory, Argo, Illinois.

Such records reflect that WILLIAM WARD PIGMAN received a BS Degree in Chemistry at George Washington University in 1932 and a Ph. D. in Organic Chemistry from the University of Maryland in 1936. It was further noted that he had registered for Selective Service with Local Board No. 1, Arlington County, Virginia, being assigned Order No. 1522.

Reference is made to teletype from New York to Bureau dated December 7, 1948, wherein it was stated that certain specimens of typewriting would be forwarded to the Laboratory for examination.

On December 7, 1948, Mr. EDWARD O. McLEAN, 20 Exchange Place, New York City, attorney for Mr. ALGER HISS, personally called at this office and turned over to an agent the following specimens of typewriting:

L. A menu dated May 20, 1939, which Mr. McLEAN states was type-KI written by TIMOTHY HOBSON, son of Mrs. ALGER HISS.

2. A set of notes consisting of six pages and captioned "Appendix." KIL Mr. McLEAN stated he believed TIMOTHY HOBSON also typed these notes.

3. Also furnished was a carbon copy of a letter dated January 30, 1933, with the address 378 Central Park West, New York City. This letter is addressed to Mr. Walter L. Tibbetts, 1216 Atlantic National Bank Building, Boston, Mass. Mr. McLEAN does not know whether this specimen was typed by Mr. ALGER HISS or Mrs. HISS, but states that he found the letter in the papers of ALGER HISS. Mrs. HISS has been unable to state whether or not she had a typewriter in her possession while residing in New York City in 1933

With reference to the above specimens, it has been alleged by WHITTAKER CHAMBERS that the documents which he obtained from ALGER HISS were copied on a typewriter by Mrs: ALGER HISS.

Kisseloff-8587 Mrs. HISS has denied that she typed or copied any documents which Mr. HISS had in his possession, and states that she remembers receiving a typewriter from her father, Mr. THOMAS TANSLER, who was in the insurance business in Philadelphia. She does not know the exact date she received the typewriter, nor can she recall the make of the typewriter or how she disposed of it. agent for the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company in Philadelphia. Agents of the Philadelphia Office interviewed Mr. HARRY L. MARTIN, Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company, who stated that he was in partnership with Mr. FANSLER from 1927 to late 1930. Mr. MARTIN stated that at the time of the inception of the partnership a new Woodstock typewriter was purchased, and when the partnership was dissolved FANSLER, according to Mr. MARTIN, retired to an apartment in West Philadelphia, and he is convinced that FANSLER took the typewriter with him since he, MARTIN, did not take it in his continued association with Northwestern Mutual. Leads have been set forth by the Philadelphia Office to Milwaukee, at the suggestion of Mr. MARTIN, in an effort to obtain a specimen which was written on the Woodstock typewriter which Mr. FANSLER had in his possession.

Reference is made to Bureau teletype dated December 7, wherein it is indicated that the FBI Laboratory has concluded that 64 of the typewritten copies of documents which CHAMBERS had in his possession were typed on a machine which most closely matches the Woodstock pica type, the standards of which are in the FBI Laboratory files.

It is requested that the enclosed specimens submitted by Mr. McLEAN be examined by the Laboratory in an effort to determine the type and make of typewriter on which they were typed. It is Mr. McLEAN'S opinion that the carbon copy of the letter was typed on the HISS typewriter, provided they had it in their possession in 1933.

It is requested that this examination be conducted immediately and the results of the same be forwarded to the New York Office together with the specimens, in order that they may be returned to Mr. McLEAN, who has been advised that the results will not be furnished to him.

On this date, former SA Robert L. King personally contacted Supervisor William A. Branigan and furnished the following information:

King stated that from previous conversation with ône John Sutro, wh is a former lieutenant in the Office Naval Intelligence and presently a practicing attorney in San Francisco, he learned that Sutro is acquainted with Alger Hiss, having attended Harvard Law School with him:

King advised that from Sutro he secured the names of Richard Field of Harvard Law School and J. P. Tumulty, Jr., an attorney in Washington, who according to Sutro, were at one time close friends of Alger Hiss. In furnishing this information King informed that through his acquaintance with Congressman Richard Nixon, House Committee on Un-American Activities, he had been advised that the House Committee on Un-American Activities was endeavoring to locate typewriting specimens of Alger Hiss for comparison with documents purportedly turned over by Hiss to Chambers. King stated that the names of Richard Field and J. P. Tumulty, Jr., could be regarded as possibly having typewritth letters from Hiss, which might be used for comparison purposes. King informed that Nixon was aware of the names of Richard Field and J. P. Tumulty.

Richards. King stated that from his conversation with Congressman Mixon it had been indicated to him that the House Committee on Un-American Activities, and Congressman Nixon personally, were most anxious to turn the entire matter of the Alger Hiss - Whittaker Chambers controversy over to the Bureau because Nixon was personally of the belief that only the Bureau is capable of fully investigating the espionage angles of the case. King also informed that the House Committee was considering approaching President Truman to have the matter turned over to the Bureau for investigation.

At the same time, King stated that Congressman Nixon had exhibited to him on a personal and confidential basis the documents which the House Committee had obtained from Chambers. King informed that Nixon said that if the matter were not properly handled the House Committee intended to blast their disclosures in the public press because they felt that without a doubt those who were responsible for stealing the government's secrets should be held accountable. King stated that Nixon had informed him that the House Committee had succeeded in identifying certain

written notations on the documents as being in the handwriting of Alger Hiss. Throughout the conversation King stressed the fact that Congressman Nixon personally felt that the Bureau was the only agency capable of handling this matter and stressed that Nixon had indicated his personal belief that the case should be turned over to the Bureau exclusively.

The above information was furnished by King in strict confidence and he stated that if any approach is made to Field or Tumulty there should be no indication that John Sutro was the source for furnishing their names.

At 5:45 p.m., at the request of Assistant Attorney General Alexander M. Campbell, I conferred with him and Mr. Russo in Mr. Campbell's office. He explained that Henry Julian Madleigh, who appeared before the Grand Jury yesterday and the House Un-American Activities Committee today, was a nervous wreck and he thought he would probably break. Wadleigh is going back to appear before the Grand Jury tomorrow, leaving at 8:00 a.m.

There was some talk to the effect that Russo and Campbell would talk again to Wadleigh tonight because they thought he would break further. In my presence, Mr. Campbell talked to Mr. Ray Whearty and Mr. Donegan in New York on the telephone and he told them he was considering interviewing Wadleigh some more tonight, but it appeared that Mr. Donegan, particularly, opposed it. It was noted that Mr. Campbell told both Mr. Whearty and Mr. Donegan that this was a key witness and that he would make the second witness to prove the perjury case of Hiss. Mr. Campbell indicated also that just before Wadleigh had left his office about 5:30 p.m., he had made some kind of a statement to the effect that he was still giving information out of State Department files as late as 1943. This kind of information does not appear in any statement taken by Bureau Agents and Mr. Campbell did not follow it up. He indicated to Mr. Whearty and Mr. Donegan that he was fearful of following it up because apparently the attitude all afternoon had been that of letting him say what he wanted to when he wanted to and they weren't pushing him in any degree on anything. They obviously are attempting to secure his cooperation and his testimony before the Grand Jury.

Mr. Campbell stated that he regarded Wadleigh as very important and requested that a surveillance be placed on Wadleigh tonight to see who he contacts, if anybody, and that he be "put to bed", and that the surveillance be continued in the morning to be certain that he gets on the train to New York; that he be surveilled in New York until it is known for certain what he is going to do. (At 7:00 p.m., I reached Supervisor Delavigne of the Washington Field Office and instructed the appropriate surveillance.) Kisseloff-8598

Mr. Campbell also started to talk about an investigation designed to determine, locate and interview all associates of Hiss and a number of other subjects in this case, who were Government employees, to determine if any of the associates, supervisors, fellow workers, etc., could give any pertinent information. Mr. Campbell was called out at this point and I asked Mr. Russo to put a request for such an investigation in the form of a memorandum so that it could be properly considered by the Bureau. Supervisor Kenneth Delavigne of the Washington Field Office called at 4:40 P.M. in connection with his discussion earlier today regarding the endeavors on the part of the Washington Field Office to locate a typewriter or material emanating from a typewriter owned by Hiss during the period 1936-1940. /938.

Mr. Delavigne stated that in checking at the Credit Bureau it was learned that Hiss had accounts with at least six different stores in Washington, D. C. during this period. Further, it was determined that in 1935 he purchased a car from a dealer in Washington and in 1943 had some correspondence with the Riggs Bank regarding the purchase of some land. Mr. Delavigne also stated that there are indications that Hiss had some dealings with a furniture company in Baltimore.

To date there is nothing to show that any of the firms or institutions with which Hiss dealt would have any correspondence from him. However, the possibility does exist and will be probed into if you concur. Mr. Delavigne said he is withholding action along this line in accordance with your instruction of this morning.

been a member of long standing; A resort at Peacham, Vermont, which HISS and his wife have regularly visited for a number of years;

Department of Agriculture and State Department, both departments in which HISS has been employed in government service: HISS' Local Draft Board:

The Massachusetts Bar Association:

The United States Supreme Court:

The Riggs National Bank, which held a first mortgage on HISS' residence; and

The American Security and Trust Company, which held a second mortgage on the residence.

It has also been learned in confidence from the HCUA that attorneys for WHITTAKER CHAMBERS had furnished the HCUA with information that possibly MARION BACHRACH, the sister of JOHN ABT, and whom WHITTAKER CHAMBERS has described as being closely associated with ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS, may possibly have information concerning the typewriter. It will be noted in the teletype furnished the Bureau on December 9, 1948, that information has been received that MARION BACHRACH has been subpoenaed to appear before the HCUA on Friday, December 10, 1948, and to be questioned in connection with any knowledge she might have of the HISS typewriter. A copy of this teletype was also furnished the New York Office which covers the present residence of MARION BACHRACH.

Supervisor Ken Delavigne of the Washington Field Office called. He referred to his conversation with you concerning the requested surveillance on Wadleigh. Since he told Mr. Campbell that he was going right home the Agents went to his log cabin at Vienna, Virginia, but when they arrived there were no lights on in the place and there haven't been any signs of life there since. He wanted to know whether the surveillance should be continued.

In addition to the foregoing, he desired to know whether Special Agent Lambert Zander was to accompany Wadleigh on the train tomorrow at 8:00 or to leave at 1:00 A.M. this morning in order to arrive there by 10:00 A.M. tomorrow.

After talking to you, I returned Delavigne's call and said that they should continue the surveillance until midnight and if no one showed up they could pull it off, but they should have the Agents arrive there by 6:00 A.M. in the morning in order for them to catch him and tail him to New York City tomorrow. I told him that if Wadleigh returned home before the Agents left, they should stay there until he went to bed and then pick up the surveillance early enough in the morning (at least by 6:00) so as not to lose him.

I also advised him that Special Agent Zander should go to New York alone in time to be there by 10:00 A.M. as requested and not to accompany Wadleigh.

Chambers stated that Ward Pigman gave him material from the Bureau of Standards. He advised that his attempts to cultivate George/Pigman for the purposes of securing material from him were unsuccessful.

Bureau files contain no information concerning Ward Pigman. The following information is available in the files of the Bureau regarding George L. Pigman:

George L. Pigman, Arlington, Virginia, an Aeronautical Engineer employed by the Bureau of Standards, made a trip to Germany and returned to the United States b7D just before the outbreak of war in 1939. According to the informant, Pigman may have had a short wave radio in his basement, and that Pigman's wife told him on one occasion that he had better get rid of the radio futuration that he had in the basement or he would lose his job. (100-166300).

On October 7, 1948, the Indianapolis Office advised that Mr. A. L. Morse, Experimental Station, Civil Aeronautics Administration, stated that George Pigman, an employee, has views which coincide with another employee on whom a loyalty investigation had been conducted. It was reported that Pigman attended a Wallace meeting held in Indianapolis, Indiana, during April, 1948 and that Pigman had visited in Russia several years ago and traveled extensively in that country. (121-13374)

A preliminary inquiry was conducted by the Washington Field Office in October, 1948 to determine if a full field loyalty investigation should be conducted. Insufficient derogatory information was found and therefore no further investigation was made.

George Pigman is presently employed as Chief of the Structural Section, Experimental Section, Civil Aeronautics Administration, Indianapolis, Indiana.

Instructions have been issued to the Field to immediately interview George Pigman in Indianapolis, and his brother, Ward, who is working and residing in Appleton, Wisconsin. RECORDED - 95

Under date of December 7, 1948 Milwaukee forwarded to the Laboratory typewriting specimens which have been designated in the Laboratory as Kll through Kl4, all of which bore the letterhead of the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. These known typewriting specimens, Kll through Kl4, were concluded not to have been typed with any of the machines that were used to type Qc5 through Qc69 and Qc74 through Qc131.

It was noted that several different typewriters were used to type specimens Qc74 through Qc131, but an attempt was not made to ascertain the kinds of machines used inasmuch as the specimens are photostats of evidence, the originals of which are alleged to have been typed on State Department typewriters.

The photostatic copies of original evidence submitted, Qc74 through Qc131, are attached hereto. Photographic copies have not been made of this evidence.

The photostatic copies, Qc5 through Qc69, are retained temporarily in the Laboratory for comparison with evidence which was received from the New York Office today. Upon the completion of the examination Qc5 through Qc69 will be forwarded to the Security and Investigative Division attached to a copy of the report.

This memorandum and the attached photostatic copies should be forwarded to the Security and Investigative Division of this Bureau.

While he was present in my office he telephoned his wife and I learned that he had been before the House Un-American Activities Committee; that he had been most uncooperative in trying to answer questions on advice of his counsel, using the grounds that it would incriminate him. He told his wife over the phone that he could better protect himself by explaining that he could/Hiswer the questions because the matter had been the subject of an inquiry by a Grand Jury in New York before which he appeared yesterday.

I particularly asked him whether or not he could identify the Harold Wilson and he was reminded of the fact that a photograph of David Carpenter had been exhibited to him. He stated he could not answer the question because the legal advice he had had up to this time was that he should not answer questions of FBI Agents. He stated he could not really say why he could not answer the question as to the identity of Harold Wilson. It was suggested to him that he seek legal advice and if he desired his attorney could be present for any additional questions but we were interested in securing the answer to the question as to whether David Carpenter was identical with Harold Wilson. He stated he would seek additional legal advice, and it is believed that he will either call at my office or at the office of Hr. Russo for additional questioning.

Yesterday afternoon as I have previously pointed out I called Congressman Karl Mundt in view of the refusal of the Committee to turn over either the developed or undeveloped microfilm. He was not in. His girl said she would have him call me. He did not call last evening. I tried this morning and there was no answer in the office. I tried again a few minutes ago. His girl stated he was in Committee last night; that she had given him the message to call me; that he was in Committee this morning and that she would again tell him I had called.

I am wondering in view of the 2 specific contacts I have made with his office if I should take the initiative any further or whether I should wait until he calls me back and if he does not call me back whether we should just not try to get him as we certainly are on record now with having made the request, with having tried to straighten this out, coupled with the fact I had talked to Stripling after the meeting yesterday.

Unless the Director feels otherwise, I will not call him any further. I have gone over this with Mr. Ladd who concurs with this, although if Mundt does call me this afternoon I, of course, will tell him that apparently there has been a misunderstanding and remind him of his conversation day before yesterday when he called me to say they would turn over the developed material as well as that they were anxious to have our assistance in developing the undeveloped material.

Congressman Mundt called. He apologized for his delay in returning my call yesterday and for what occurred in the Committee yesterday afternoon. He stated that what set the Committee off was the attitude of Mr. Campbell, who came down before the Committee and told the Committee that they should refrain from calling any witnesses who had appeared before the grand jury or might appear before the grand jury. This was followed by a letter delivered by special messenger at 7:30 last evening, which Mundt termed the most tactless piece of arrogance he had ever seen, and the substance of which was that the Committee was requested to refrain from calling any witnesses who had testified or might testify before the grand jury in New York. In other words, Mundt stated that the request boiled down to simple terms was to tell the Committee not to call any witnesses at all.

Mundt stated that as far as the Bureau Dis concerned he understands our position and the attitude of the Committee yesterday in not turning over the material was directed/at the Bureau but at the Department. Mundt stated that we should sit tight for the timebeing, that our request was a matter of record, that the burden was on the Committee of turning the material over to us.

I pointed out to him that of course the recent developments merely confirmed what the Bureau had reported to appropriate authorities years ago and that this might be a good point for him to get across. He stated that he would certainly try to keep this in mind.

In accordance with reference teletype Mr. R. E. PERRY, Secretary of the Worthwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, was contacted for additional typewritten specimens which may have come from the Woodstock typewriter owned by FANSLER AND MARTIN in Philadelphia. A search of his files in connection with the policy of HERBERT F. GRESSLEY, #1931338, and the policies of FRANK E. BARGER, numbers 1970390, 1970391 and 1987861, revealed four original typewritten letters from the office of FANSLER and MARTIN which may be from the Woodstock typewriter in question. The originals of these letters have been forwarded to the Laboratory under separate cover letter, a copy of which letter is attached hereto which includes the description of the letters. Photostatic copies of these letters are enclosed herewith to Philadelphia for investigative use.

Mr. PERRY has advised that he knows of no further places to search for original typewriter specimens during the pertinent period which now appears to be from about the middle of 1929 to the fall of 1930. The letter mentioned in reference teletype dated February 19, 1930 could not be located. However, as of this time he has not yet received the personal letter from Mr. HARRY L. MARTIN referred to in reference teletype. When it is received he will immediately advise this office whether he is able to find further specimens based upon the information in MARTIN's letter.

Mr. Belmont stated that he would be in touch with Mr. Donegan about the results of this interview and also to determine the necessity for continued surveillance, having the results of the interview in mind.
