Mystery Wilness Silent On Leak to Russ

WASHINGTON, Dec. 9—(P)—The Truman administration tonight asked—in vain—that House investigators step aside in the spy hunt and leave it to the Justice Department "for reasons of internal security."

The House Committee on Un-American Activities, already smarting under President Truman's remark that it is only hunting headlines, promptly rejected the request.

"An utterly unreasonable attack upon the prerogative of the United States Congress," snapped the committee in turning down a request from the Justice Department that it

1. Stop interviewing witnesses, in the search for "leaks" of official documents to Russian agents, who have been called before the Federal Grand Jury in New York, or who might be called:

2. Refrain from issuing "any information which it has regarding said investigation."

New Witness Put on Stand

Only today the committee put on the stand a wifness who also was under subpena to appear before the Grand Jury. He was Henry Julian Wadleigh, a former State Department employe, who refused to answer committee questions as to whether he slipped secret papers to a Russian agent while he worked for the government. Wadleigh refused to answer nearly all questions posed to him, on grounds it might tend to incriminate or degrade him.

Wadleigh, Alger Hiss, a former State Department employe, and a third man from Wisconsin were named by Whittaker Chambers as sources he used a decade ago in getting secret U.S. documents while Chambers was a courier for the Reds.

For weeks the committee and the Justice Department have been at odds over who is freading on whose toes in the double-barreled investigation. Tonight's exchange heightened the feelings, which had been stirred up by Mr. Truman's news conference statement this morning that the House probe is still, in his opinion, only a red herring and the committee should leave the case to the Justice Department.

"Premature and ill-advised publicity," said an accompanying statement from Attorney General Clark, "can and will seriously impair the administration of justice, without any corresponding benefit to the country."

Clark said that, "unlike the committee, the Department of Justice recognizes its responsibility to proceed within the frame-work of the Constitution."

Ti mentioning "reasons of internal security" as cause for quieting the House Committee, the Department letter said that directly involved is "the successful prosecution of any case which might be developed."

TURNED DOWN COLD

Acting Chairman Mundt, Republican of South Dakota, in reply turned the department down cold and said the committee will continue its investigation in the hope "major culprits" will be disclosed, apprehended and punished.

In today's committee hearing, Witness Wadleigh refused to say even whether he knew his accuser, Chambers.

"I refuse to answer that question on grounds the answer might tend to incriminate or degrade me," said Wadleigh, who used to work on foreign trade atters for the State DepartPresident Truman, in raising the fred herring" charge today was repeating one he made durating the political campaign—that the House spy hearing was designed to divert attention from shortcomings of the 80th Congress.

SPEAKS SHARPLY

If the Committee had been in dead earnest, Mr. Truman said, it would have taken the matter to the Attorney General for prosecution. He added rather sharply that he has no intention of getting into a controversy with what he called this dead committee. As now set up, the Committee has a Republican majority. The Democrats take control of Congress in January and all Committees will have a Democratic majority.

But if Mr. Truman wanted no controversy with the Committee, its Republican members were quick to jump at it.

Rep. Nixon, Republican of Califordia, called the President's

statement "a flagrant flaunting of the national interests?" His said Mr. Truman is "helping to keep the facts about the stealing of America's top secrets by the Communists from the American people."

CHALLENGE ISSUED

Mundt called the President's a titude inconceivable, and added:

"If he considers the investigation a red herring, I challenge him to authorize us to hublish the documents in toto in the press. The State Department says they are so startling that to release them even now would imperil the national security."

At bottom is a conflict over whether the House Committee or the Eederal Grand Jury now sitting in New York is the proper vehicle for sifting charges that many secret documents were fillched from State Department files in 1937-38. A cache of microfilms of these documents were found in a pumpkin on Chambers' farm, last Thursday, after the Committee issued a subpena to obtain any official papers Chympers might have.

XPECT INDIOTMENT

Mxon said last night that th grand jury, operating under the Justice Department, will indict Chambers for perjury and that this will make it impossible to get at persons who worked with him "because the chief witness will be an indicted perjurer." Nixon called the whole proceeding part of administration efforts "to silence this committee."

The committee's chief investi-gator, Robert E. Stripling, appeared before the Grand Jury today, by request. Also on hand to testify were Alger. Hiss, for State Department employe who Chambers said was a member of a "Communist apparatus," and his brother, Donald Hiss. Both the Hiss brothers have der nied Chambers' charges against them and Alger Hiss has sued Chambers for \$75,000 in a libel Case.

In today's open hearing of the Committee, Nixon read what he sald were parts of testimony taken from Chambers by a subcom-mittee in New York last Monday. It ran thusly:

WASHINGTON, Dec. 9—(INS) -William Ward Pigman, of Appleton, Wis, a former employe of the U.S. Bureau of Standards, has been ordered by the House Committee on Un-American Achorrow as its third and last "mystery" witness in the Hiss-Chambers spy probe.

A committee spokesman told INS tonight Pigman was named by ex-Communist Whittaker Chambers, in executive hearings, as another government employe who provided him with secret. data a decade ago. During Pigman's employment at the Bureau of Standards, it was doing considerable research in radar and the proximity fuse.

Pigman was found in Appleton by committee investigators. by committee investigators. He is a research chemist and instructor in organic chemistry at the Institute of Paper Chemistry

The committee, summoning Pigman by wire, asked him to abpear here at 1 p. m. (CST) tomorrow for an open hearing. If he ignores the wire, he will be sub-

William Ward Pigman, 38, Appleton chemist, who has been summoned to appear today be-Witness Worked in tore the House un-American Activities Committee, denied last night he had ever given information of a secret nature to anyone.

When asked whether he had ever done so, Pigman declared emphatically:

"I have never given such in-

formation. to anyone."

Asked whether he would answer the summons, Pigman said:

"The situation is complicated and I don't care to answer." Pigman was with the Bureau Standards at Washington,

D. C., from 1930 to 1938 and from 1939 to 1944 doing research in sugar. He was asked:

While an employe of the bureau did you ever relay any information of a secret character or any confidential information to an agent of the Communist Party?"

Pigman said "No."

Again, he was asked: "Did you at any time ever give secret or confidential information to any Communist sympathizers ?" *

"My answer is no," he said. Pigman said he was anxious to co-operate with the committee "In any way possible." He would however, whether would answer the summons appear before the committee

Sentinel Washington Bureau -WASHINGTON, Dec. 9-Three government officials accused in connection with the Russian spy ring received gifts of a Russian rug aplece, Whittaker Chambers, confessed former Red spy, has testified.

Re teletype from Philadelphia to Milwaukee and Cleveland dated December 10, 1948, at 1:12 p.m., and letters from Milwaukee to the Laboratory and the Director of this date.

Subsequent to the preparation of referenced letters and receipt of referenced teletype, Mr. R. E. PERRY, Secretary of the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company, received a letter from Mr. HARRY L. MARTIN of Philadelphia, making further suggestions as to possible sources of typewriter specimens in this case. As a result thereof, Mr. PERRY was able to locate four more letters which are described in detail in the letter attached hereto directed to the Laboratory.

These letters came from the claims file of THOMAS L. FANSLER in the Claims Department of the company. Mr. JOSEPH T. GALLAGHER, Superintendent of that department, has made them available for use in this case and they have been forwarded to the Laboratory. Mr. GALLAGHER has attached his name to the back of each one, together with the date. The other initials appearing on the back thereof are those of investigating Agents. Photostatic copies of these letters are enclosed with the copy for Philadelphia for their investigative use.

It will be noted that the document designated K-12 is a letter signed by PRISCILL HISS, the wife of ALGER HISS, and dated June 8, 1940, at Washington, D. C. This has been included only because the possibility exists that MRS. HISS or someone else for her may have typed this letter on questioned typewriter. It is also noted, however, that the letter is somewhat in form style which MRS. HISS appears to have filled in in pen and ink.

MARTIN in his letter furnished three additional policy holders, the files of which were examined by Agents with negative results. In addition, he suggested there might be correspondence in the personal correspondence file of the deceased president and the deceased Superintendent of Agencies who were close personal friends of FANSIER. Part of the personal correspondence of these two men has been preserved and Mr. JOHN L. HUGHES, Assistant Superintendent of Agencies, caused a search to be made with negative results.

The other suggestion by MARTIN was to review all the policy files on policies written by FANSLER. Mr. PERRY advised that this would be impossible as no separate file is kept for each agent writing insurance. The only possible way this could be done would be to institute a review of all policies ever written by the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company subsequent to 1927.

Thus, unless Mr. MARTIN can furnish the names and/or policy numbers of additional policies, Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company officials contacted feel that they have exhausted the practicable sources of typewriter specimens in this case.

Mr. JOHN L. HUGHES, Assistant Superintendent of Agencies, found a record in the files of his office indicating that one THOMAS FRANCIS KORADY made an application for a position as agent with the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company dated December 9, 1930. This application revealed that he resided at Garrett Road and Lincoln Avenue, Landsdowne, Pennsylvania. His business address was West Disinfecting Company, 49th and Grays Avenue, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He was born January 20, 1901, at Woonsocket, Rhode Island. He was married and had one child. He stated his previous employment was that of "salesman of typewriters". He have the following references:

ALEX R. GAUL, 4740 Pine Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania JAMES MULRINE, 4912 Locust Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania CLARENCE PEPPER, Dencla Building, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

Previous addresses were given as 309 South 40th Street, Philadelphia, and Wingate Hall, 50th and Spruce Streets, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He was discharged by the company in April, 1932.

During the time of GRADY's employment as an Agent, he took out five life insurance policies, all giving the Carrett Road address or the address of the General Agent of the company in Philadelphia. The last of these policies lapsed in 1933, and therefore the company has no more recent addresses than given above.

For the information of the Bureau and office of origin, at least three letters in the handwriting of PRISCILLA HISS addressed to Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company were found in the claims file of her father, THOMAS L. FANSLER. They are available for use in this case at any time.

Call Appleton Man in Red Spy Inquiry

Chemist Pigman Summoned to Washington After Chambers Tells of 'Leak' Source

An Appleton chemist, William Ward Pigman, has been called to Washington to be questioned Fri-

day by the house committee on un - American activities in connection with its espionage probe. The committee sent Pigman a telegraphic summons late Thursday after declining to identify an Appleton man it said had been named by Whittaker Chambers, former Communist courier, as

one of three sources of United States secrets which he obtained for transmission to Russian agents.

The chemist reportedly left Appleton late Thursday in answer to the summons. His wife, Alice, said there that he was "on his way to Washington."

In New York, where a federal grand jury is investigating espionage, a government source said that Pigman had been summoned to testify before the grand jury.

Pigman, 38, is a former employe of the national bureau of standards, which tests some of the government's most secret weapons and military devices. He is a research worker and instructor in organic chemistry at the Institute of Paper Chemistry in Appleton. He worked for the bureau of standards in Washington on two occasions, from 1930 to 1938 and 1941 to 1944. He worked for the Corn Products Co. of Argo, Ill., in 1944 and 1945, and Joined the paper institute in 1946.

A native of Chicago, Pigman received degrees from George Washington university and the University of Maryland. He studied at the University of Leipzig from 1938 to 1940.

A poll of readers of the Chemical Bulletin has rated him one of the 10 outstanding chemists working in carbohydrate chemistry.

In Washington, the house committee said that Pigman had been summoned to appear at 1 p.m. (central-standard time) Friday. Robert E. Stripling, chief committee investigator, told a reporter the committee had a reply but he declined to say whether Pigman would appear as a witness.

Representative Mundt (Rep., S. D.), acting chairman of the committee, said that if Pigman was

willing to co-operate, he would be questioned at length behind closed doors. If not, Mundt said, there would be public hearings at which the witness could refuse to answer questions.

Chambers has named Alger Hiss and Henry Julian Wadleigh; both formerly in the state department, as two of the suppliers of secrets.

Wadleigh Refuses to Answer

Hiss, now head of the Carnegie Foundation for International Peach has denied all.

Wadleigh, now unemployed and living at near-by Vienna, Va., was a witness Thursday. He chose not to answer most questions thrown his way.

Answers, he said, might tend to incriminate him.

Wadleigh did say that he had access to "some kinds" of confidential information while he was a state department economist from 1936 to 1943,

Representative Nixon (Rep. Calif.) told him that the statute of limitations would prevent his prosecution for handing over secret papers to Russian agents if he had stopped doing so before 1939.

But 'that assurance didn't convince Wadleigh he ought to talk. He said his lawyer had told him the statute of limitations isn't "iron clad."

To Mundt's question, "What in terpretations do you expect the American people to place on your refusal" to testify, Wadleigh replied:

"I cannot speculate on what interpretations, rightly or wrongly, may be made. I have to let my statements:stand."

It was brought out that Wadleigh already had been questioned by FBI agents and had appeared before a New York grand jury investigating espionage.

Will Politics Save the Spies?

The way things are shaping up in Washington, there is grave danger that every spy who stole secrets from the United States—and there must have been a number of them—will go scot free. A split among government forces, and a split among the people lets criminals get away:

It happens often in cases involving political offenses—vote frauds and the like. A charge is made and the evidence seems pretty clear. But the rascal immediately cries persecution and the people line up politically in two groups. The man who has betrayed democracy simply walks out while the groups fight each other. It is an old method of escape that too often succeeds.

Isn't this what is happening in the spy cases? The congressional committee and the department of justice are at loggerheads. They are interfering with each other, with the worse offender the department of justice. It does not seem to us that Atty. Gen. Clark is very keen about getting to the bottom of this spy business.

President Truman, who could be of great help to the nation now, continues his stubborn attitude of unfriendliness to the congressional committee. He persists in calling the investigation a red herring. What is being brought up is red, all right, but it looks a lot bigger than a herring. It is something that involves the very safety of this country. If the president were helpful, we would be more hopeful.

Mr. Truman in his latest comment skill-fully tries to make the investigation a political issue. He refers to the investigators as a "dead committee" and says that the people hold with him on the red herring business. Is that true? Were the people voting on whether congress should investigate spies?

It seems to us that the effect of this comment will be to split the people. Talk to some of his supporters and you find that they are lining up now, in just this way.


What is the sense in this? Will we form two political lines and let the spies walk between them—unharmed? Is that what this country wants?



Dean Schedler of the Department of Justice called at 10:50 p.m., December 9, 1948. He said that he had just received a call from the AP and from the caller he learned that the HUAC had just located a "third key witness" in Appleton, Wisconsin. He wanted to know if we knew who it was. I asked him if he had the man's name and he said that he did not get it. I then asked him if it was Pigman. He then wanted to know who Pigman was and at the same time turned to Alexander Campbell who was present and asked if he ever heard of the name. Campbell apparently indicated that he had a vague recollection of it.

Schedler then inquired into the identity of Pigman. I informed him that a William Ward Pigman of Appleton, Wisconsin had apparently been subpoenaed to appear before the Grand Jury in New York City on December 10, 1948, however, it did not appear that he would arrive there until Saturday, since he was not leaving Appleton until tomorrow night. Mr. Schedler then said that if the HUAC had him that "we will have to head him off". He said that he would confer with Mr. Campbell and would call me back, but he had not called at the time I left for home.

You recall that I advised you concerning the above matter.



SAC Johnson, Milwaukee, called. He stated that Westbrooke Steele, Director of the American Paper Institute at Appleton, Wisconsin, called Special Agent LeGrand tonight and informed him that !. he had received an inquiry from the Associated Press concerning William Ward Pigman. They asked him if he knew that Pigman had been called to appear before the House Un-American Activities Committee. Steele said that he hadn't. Thereafter, Johnson listened to the 10:00 p.m. news broadcast and heard the commentator say that the HUAC had indicated that a telegram had been sent to an unidentified man in Appleton, Wisconsin directing him to appear before it and stating that if the person didn't appear that a subpoena would be issued for him. After hearing this, SAC Johnson called Steele and asked him if he knew anything about the telegram. Steele didn't know then. He later called Johnson and said that he had learned that Pigman had been called out of a meeting this evening and the telegram was delivered to him.

SAC Johnson didn't know whether Pigman was going to New York in response to the Grand Jury Subpoena which had been served on him this afternoon by the marshal or to Washington, D. C., in response to the HUAC's instructions. He wanted to know what to do. I told him to do nothing and that unless I called him back shortly thereafter to refrain from taking any action.

You will recall that I advised you of the foregoing. Since Mr. Johnson said that he was sending the above in by teletype which was also going to New York I called Night Supervisor Albert G. McGrath and advised him of the instructions given to Johnson.

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TOLSON

December 10, 1948

I talked to Russell Turner in Fulton Lewis office. Fulton seldom comes to the office anymore and makes his broadcast from a studio in his home in Maryland. Russell told me Fulton is devoting about 70% of his time to making a church organ which he is giving to his church and which will be dedicated on his Christmas Eve program. Fulton has scoured the country for the parts and Turner stated he has done quite a job on it.

In the course of the conversation the Hiss-Chambers case He was wondering if there were any angles on it. I told him that, of course, speaking strictly for his own information and guidance and not for quotation, as both he and Fulton very well knew, the Bureau had been investigating this entire matter over a period of years and that we did not have the authority or the power to take action; that we should not have this authority or power, but that our reports had been communicated to higher authorities and, of course, it was up to them to take the action; that everything we had secured on Hiss had been communicated to the State Department as well as other individuals in the Washington Communist underground, but this had been going on for a period of years. He wanted to know if we were doing anything special at the moment and I told him that since \tilde{h} nost recent developments with the production of the microfilm by Chambers, the Grand Jury in New York had intensified its activities and we were running out a lot of leads and the like; that so far as we were concerned the microfilm merely tended to corroborate what he had told us. years ago and what we had reported years ago; that we had endeavored to secure corroboration from Chambers when he was first interviewed several years ago and on subsequent occasions; that he had never told us about the microfilm and in fact had stated he did not have any of the documents. I further told Turner that in connection with the Washington underground that we, of course, were fully cognizant of the deficiencies of the law, the difficulties of presenting evidence and corroborating information which we had and which we believed to be true; that the Director's position had been that it was inadvisable to go to

the Grand Jury until we knew we had a case; however, notwithstanding this, the case was presented to a Grand Jury; and that from that time on the Director has advocated that if the Grand Jury were unable to secure corroboration, they should issue a report on their findings so that the American public would know what has been going on and would know what the FBI has been doing, because we ourselves could not make our reports known to the public. I told him this might be an excellent idea for Fulton to undertake. Turner got very much excited about this and stated he was sure Fulton would like pothing better than to undertake a campaign such as this to bring our full disclosures of what the FBI has done.

I further told him we are in a very awkward and difficult position; that obviously we could not talk about the case or about what we had done because the action to be taken was not within our province. He said he thoroughly understood this. I emphasized this is the point Fulton should endeavor to get across as much as he can. He said Fulton has already commented along these lines but that it would not be amiss to do it again which he will do.

SA Doneland New York Office telephonically advised at 7:15 PM That the following teletype had been received by the New York Office from the Denver Office and no copy designated for the bureau.

" Remytel 12-10 last Franklin Wilkeno voluntarily appeared at this office today stating that he would give additional information which he had not given on interview 12-10 last. In substance Reno admitted that he gave restricted documents to one Carl or Krauss whome he thinks might have been Chambers but is in no position to know for certain. He further explained that one VBernie" accompanied him from Baltimore to Philadelphia where "Bernie" introduced him to "Carl" probably easy June 1937. "Carl" requested "intelligence information" from Reno whom he knew would be soon employed at The Aberdeen Proving Grounds. Reno agreed knowing that it was Soviet Union espionage work. Thereafter, Reno, met Carl on an estimated 4 to 7 times in Wash, D.C., generally on a designated street by prearranged appointments. On one or two occassions Philip Reno brother of Franklin acted as an intermediary between Carl and Franklin Reno. Franklin Reno did not desire to give signed statement but indicated he will cooperate. Report follows. Reno expects to arrive in NY by plane night of 12 -12 next and will contact US attorney Monday morning next. "

At 7:50 PM ASAC Belmont at NY telephonically advised in connection with with the above information that he had instructed the Denver Office to inform Franklin V. Reno to report to the New York Office Monday morning and that they would escort him to the U.S. Attorney's Office. Belmont stated that representatives of the press were present in large numbers in the Federal Building and that he didn't want to take any chances. Mr. Belmont also advised that he recommended against giving the information contained in the above teletype to Mr Campbell in the Criminal Division. He stated that he had been informed by Mr. Donegan that an article In a New York paper today indicated that Campbell may have discussed// f. MACKEX Julian Wadleigh's testimony before the Grand Jury with the press. Belmont stated that Donegan said that the furnishing of the above infomation to him was sufficient and it was not necessary that it be given to KME Mr Campbell.

You will recall that I advised you of the above.

SA Halsey Smith (WFO) telephonically advised that Julian Wadleigh, whom you will recall was one of the persons named by Chambers who had furnished him with confidential information, was calling the field office and desired to furnish information in connection with the captioned case. SA Smith advised he was not familiar with the facts in this particular case.

I advised Smith to transfer the call to the bureau and I would talk to Wadleigh. Smith called back in a couple of seconds and advised that Wadleigh had been cut off or hung up. I then makindxSupervixorx DelawaignexinxthexWFO told Smith to call Supervisor Delawaigne (WFO) and see that Wadleigh was immediately recontacted.

First Assistant, Criminal Division, Justice Department, contacted writer

by telephone. He advised that he has been assisting Mr. Campbell and Mr.

Donegan before the Federal Grand Jury in New York City. He is in Washington today (Sunday, 12/12/48) only and will be at his office - extension 180, Justice Building.

Continuing, Mr. Whearty related that at noon on Saturday, December 11, 1948, Henry J. Wadleigh advised Mr. Alex Campbell of the Department that he had loaned Hiss a portable (again no information as to make or date) which was later sold by him, Wadleigh, to Mrs. Pittman B. Potter of Washington, D. C. (It is noted by writer that the current Washington telephone directory lists a Pitman B. Potter, address: Avenel, Silver Spring, Maryland; telephone, Sligo 8197).

Mr. Whearty requested that Mrs. Potter be immediately located and interviewed relative to the acquisition of the portable typewriter and that specimens be taken from the machine if available. In the event it is no longer in her possession its disposition should be determined and if she is in possession of any documents prepared on this machine it is the Department's desire that same be secured.

In addition to the foregoing, Mr. Whearty advised that Mr. Campbell was very desirous of determing the exact date on which Chambers, in company with Mr. Isaac Levine, visited Mr. Adolf A. Berle, then with the State Department. Whearty

suggested that the date was probably in 1939. Whearty volunteered in this connection that this appearance by Chambers before Berle may constitute a withdrawal from the conspiracy on his, Chambers, part.

The essence of the above was relayed to Mr. Fletcher who instructed the writer to determine the date from Supervisor Floyd Jones and to request Supervisor Delavigne of Washington Field to immediately cause Mrs. Potter to be interviewed along the lines suggested by the Department.

Supervisor Floyd Jones advises that the date of the Chambers-Berle interview was September 2, 1939. This date was furnished by Mr. Berle to SAC Carson on September 3, 1948, it being noted that Mr. Berle at that time corrected information previously given to the House Un-American Activities Committee to the effect that the meeting was in the last week of August, 1939. Berle also stated that Mr. Levine was present, as against his earlier statement to the HCUA that Levine was not present. (Bureau file 100-25824-50 p.5)

Mr. Delavigne of Washington Field was contacted at noon, December 12, 1948, and requested to cause the interview of Mrs. Potter as outlined above. He advised that this case is assigned to Special Agent Zander of Washington Field and that Zander would be instructed to proceed immediately.

NOTE:

Mr. Whearty requested that the date of the Berle-Chambers interview be made known to Mr. Campbell and Mr. Donegan in New York prior to the opening of the Monday, December 13, 1948, session of the Federal Grand Jury (at 10:00 a:m.). He also expressed the desire that as much of the information as could be elicited from Mrs. Potter be forwarded to the gentlemen named at the earliest possible moment. He also requested that a memorandum be sent to the Department in this matter.

Addendum at 4:20 p.m. December 12, 1948

Supervisor Delavigne of Washington Field relayed to the writer instructions of Mr. Fletcher that the interview of Mrs. Potter be deferred. Mr. Delavigne advised that he had already arranged with Special Agent Zander of Washington Field in this connection.

I thought you would be interested in the results of Interviews conducted by this Bureau on December 10 and 11, 1948 with Franklin Theno, aka Francis V. Reno:

Reno was interviewed on December 10, 1948, at which time he denied any dealings with Chambers, J. Reters, or anyone else in connection with furnishing information while he was employed at the Aberdeen Proving Grounds. He was served with a subpoena calling for his appearance before the Grand Jury, New York City at 9:00 a.m., December 15, 1948.

On December 11, 1948, Reno voluntarily appeared at the Denver Field Office of this Pureau stating that he desired to give additional information which he had not given when interviewed on December 1C. In substance he admitted that he gave restricted documents to one "Carl" or "Krauss", whose he thought might have been Chambers, but he advised that he did not know for certain. Reno advised further that one "Bernie" accompanied him from Baltimore to Philadelphia where Dernie" introduced him to "Carl", probably in the early part of June, 1937. He advised that "Carl" requested "intelligence information" from him and that "Carl" know that he, (Reno) would soon be employed at the Aberdeen Proving Grounds. Reno stated that he agreed to this request knowing that it was Soviet Union espionage work. Thereafter Reno advised that he met "Carl" on an estimated four to seven times in Washington, D. C., generally on a designated street by prearranged appointments. Heno also stated that on one or two occasions his brother, Philip Reno, acted as an intermediary between he and "Carl". Tranklip Reno did not desire to give a signed statement but he indicated that he would easperate.

The above information has been furnished to Mr. Thomas J. Donegan, Special Assistant to the Attorney General, New York City.

You may recall that Timothy Hobson is the son of Priscilla His by her first marriage. Investigation has disclosed that Timothy Hobson attended the Landon School, Bethesda, Maryland, during the fall term of 1936.

Kr. Paul L. Benfield, headmaster of the above school; made available on December 12, 1948 three pages of typewritten material entitled "Description of Personal Characteristics of Timothy Nobson", bearing the date September 9, 1936. He also made available a handwritten letter deted September 1, 1936, bearing the signature of Priscilla Hisa which referred to an application for admission to the Landon School of Timothy Hobson for the fall term of the school year 1936. He also made available a carbon copy of a letter directed by him as headmaster of the school to Alger Hiss, 1245 30th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., dated September 3, 1936. This letter acknowledged the application for registration of Tirothy Hobson. The letter in part read as follows:

"If you can find the time I would appreciate you sending me a written statement of your ideas of the boy. Our masters study these before school opens and find them a great help in the early stages of acquaintanceship."

In addition, Mr. Banfield made available a handwritten letter bearing the date September 9, 1936, signed by Alger Hiss which is quoted as follows:

"My dear Mr. Banfield, enclosed is the description of Tim's personality. I should like to bring him out during the afternoon of September 19 and to have a look at the school and to meet you, if you will be available then. An examination has been made by the FBI Laboratory and a comparison has bach made between the three pages of typewritten material entitled "Description of Personal Characteristics of Timothy Hobson bearing the date September 9, 1936 and the 65 pages of documents turned over by Whittaker Chambers during the course. of a civil hearing in Baltimore, Maryland on November 17, 1948. In this regard, he indicated he feels that only the Federal Bureau of Investigation is entitled to this information. Agents were required to sign a receipt indicating that this material would be used only in investigations concerning the national security of this country.

There are attached six photostatic copies of State Department documents which the Un-American Activities Committee intend releasing to the press very soon. These documents are some of those appearing in the microfilm recovered from Whittaker Chambers. The Committee submitted copies to the State Department requesting clearance so that they may be published.

Mr. Samuel D. Boykin informed Mr. Roach that the State Department was willing to clear these documents for publication providing Mr. Peyton Ford, of the Department of Justice, concurred. According to Mr. Boykin, the decision is now before Mr. Ford. Mr. Boykin is of the opinion that Ford will clear the Committee's request and that these documents will appear in the press soon. Boykin desired that the Bureau receive copies so that we may be informed as to what may be expected to appear in the press.

Mr. Roach has checked these particular documents with Mr. Jack Neal, of the State Department, and it has been determined that they were previously supplied to us last week. While in discussion with Mr. Boykin on this matter, he informed Mr. Roach that the Attorney General had made a request of the State Department for all of the original State Department documents in this case. Mr. Boykin did not know the reason for the Attorney General's request but stated undoubtedly the State Department would comply with it.

Mr. Boykin also mentioned that the comments of the President branding the entire procedure as a "red herring" were causing considerable embarrassment to the State Department in view of the fact that Congressman Nixon, of the Committee, had recently displayed the documents to and had briefed Undersecretary Lovett on the entire matter as known to the Committee, with the request that Mr. Lovette bring the true facts of the case to the attention of the President. This, according to Boykin, Lovett promised to do.

He stated that he wanted you to know that the New York Office was doing a grand job and he stated that he thought that they were making very real progress and were going to end up with an indictment in the Espionage case.

He inquired as to whether the Committee had produced the microfilm as Congressman Nixon had agreed he would.

I informed him of the developments as contained in my memorandum earlier today. He stated that from his standpoint this was very unsatisfactory; that Congressman Nixon had promised to produce all of the microfilm. He stated that he was going to wait a little while and if the film was not produced soon, he would go ahead with the action which he had started even though it might be the citing of Congressman Nixon for contempt.

Mr. JOHN L. HUGHES, Assistant Director, Agency Department, Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, made a further search in the policy files of THOMAS FXGRADY for the purpose of locating additional correspondence from the office of FANSLER and MARTIN during the pertinent period. On this date he furnished a letter on the letterhead of the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company from the office of FANSLER and MARTIN at Philadelphia, Pa., dated January 29, 1930. This letter has been forwarded under separate cover letter to the Laboratory and identified therein as K-13, a copy of which has, been furnished interested offices.

K-13 was attached to the application for insurance of THOMAS F. GRADY dated January 29, 1930, and described in referenced teletype. It is apparently typed on the typewriter in the office of FANSLER and MARTIN as of January 29, 1930. It is noted that the stenographer's initials are AC, probably being the initials of ANNE COYLE.

At this time investigation has indicated that THOMAS F. GRADY was employed by the West Disinfecting Company in Philadelphia.

Mr. HUGHES has advised today that he was mildly criticized by his superiors for furnishing the correspondence to the FBI in this case from their files without a subpoena. He stated that he personally did not think it was necessary and he had not been taken to take foresterding

In view of the criticism directed against HUGHES, he was advised that all original correspondence furnished by Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company in this case would be returned to the files of that company prior to any trial or public hearing on the case, and that in the event these documents were needed for such purpose a subpoena would be issued to proper person in the Northwestern Company, directing them to bring the correspondence with them.

In view of the fact that the correspondence turnished to date has come from several sources, no attempt will be made at this time to identify the persons who should be subpoenced. If Milwaukee

A foreign credit report from Zanesville, Ohio dated September 4, 1936, reflected that CHAMBERS then had a daughter 20 years old and two sons aged 14 and 16 years. Prior to his employment with the United States Treasury in Washington, D. C. JAY L. CHAMBERS had been employed by the FERA in Columbus, Ohio for one and onehalf years and prior to that, had been head of the Department of Economics and Business Administration for five years at Muskingum College. His reputation was excellent.

The records of the Bureau of Federal Supply, Treasury Department, reflect that JAY L. CHAMBERS, 6414 Western Avenue, Chevy Chase, Maryland, was employed in the Main Treasury Building in Accounts and Deposits, from 1935 to January, 1945, when he went over to the Commerce Department as an Accountant and Consultant. ASAC A. H. Belmont of New York called. He said that they had interviewed Franklin Victor Reno on numerous occasions in this case and he had furnished to them considerable information concerning his activities while at the Aberdeen Proving Ground, Aberdeen, Maryland. Mr. Belmont said that they were well aware of Reno's arthritic condition and in view of this handled him very gingerly. They even transported him to and from his hotel at the times they interviewed him.

Today they recontacted him while he was at his hotel on call of the Grand Jury and displayed to him two pictures. It seems that during the time the Agents were interviewing Reno he indicated that he was contemplating committing suicide. The Agents immediately reported this matter and about 2:20 P. M. Reno called Supervisor Al Touhy and advised Mr. Touhy that he was considerably disturbed about the publicity that has arisen as a result of this case. He said that if he could stop the publicity, he would plead guilty and would supply additional information which he has not furnished before. Mr. Belmont said that it was quite apparent that Reno was mentally disturbed and considerably upset.

Immediately upon receiving the call from Reno, they contacted the Department of Justice attorneys and informed them of the suicidal statements made by Reno and his willingness to plead guilty. Attheir insistence, Mr. Stryne, one of the Departmental attorneys, came to the office and talked to Reno. Reno settled down but had nothing to say which had not been said before. After the interview was completed, Mr. Stryne sent Reno back to his hotel and told him to remain there until tomorrow morning at which time he was to be interviewed by Mr. Donegan who apparently wants to see him concerning this case. Mr. Belmont said that it appears that it is the Department attorneys intention to interview Reno in the morning and then dismiss him so that he can return home.

I indicated to Mr. Belmont that in view of Reno's state—

? I ments they should have nothing further to do with him and that he should be handled by the attorneys. Mr. Belmont stated that they had not contemplated contacting him at any time in the future; however, he wanted the Burgan to know that Reno's remaining in New York at this time was at the expressed direction of the attorneys who were in complete charge of him.
