Please be advised that investigation indicates that ROBERT V. HORTON was the Director of Information, United States Maritime Commission, from March 1944 until May 31, 1946. He resided at 3135 - 0 Street, N. W., and his legal residence was Orwell, Vermont.

HORTON has been previously interviewed by the Albany ^Division inasmuch as it was determined that he was a former neighbor of ALGER HISS.

On the same day of her conference with CHANGEY, ROSSMAN met her "contact," who severely chastised her for having approached CHANGEY at CP Headquarters. -DEFERRED RE CORDING Reference is made to report of Special Agent JESSE F. FARR at Baltimore, Maryland, dated January 28, 1949, in which was set forth data concerning HYMAN GARSHEN LANDAU. and ESTHER PAUL LANDAU. It is to be noted that the LANDAUS had more than the ordinary contact with FRANK RENO while he was at the Ballistics Research Laboratories. It was observed, as is stated in the report, that upon interview both of the LANDAUS were extremely cautious in their replies to questions asked them by Agents. Mrs. LANDAU, as reflected in the report, was acquainted with FRANK RENO's brother, PHIL RENO, and she did some typing on the introduction to the book by RENO, EDWARD J. McSHANE and JOHN KELLY.

It is thought possible that under the pressure of a Grand Jury Hearing and being under oath, the LANDAUS may give additional information concerning their association with FRANKLIN VICTOR RENO. Descriptive data concerning the LANDAUS reflects that they might be presently involved in espionage and it is possible that RENO may have had some connection with them. This is being called to the attention of the Bureau and the New York Division so that it may be decided whether or not it would appear advisable to subpoena the LANDAUS.

A review of the army service record on file at the Adjutant General's Office, Demobilized Personnel Records Branch, World War II Unit, Department of the Army, for VALERIAN LADA-MOCARSKI, Army Serial No. 0-430521, reflected that he was commissioned from civilian life as a temporary Major in the Army of the United States on November 5, 1941. Under Secretary of War, The Honorable ROBERT P. PATTERSON, was personally interested in such appointment. LADA-MOCARSKI was called immediately to active service in the Office of the Under Secretary of War.

On October 26, 1942 WILLIAM J. DONOVAN, Director, Office of Strategic Services, requested that LADA-MOCARSKI be detached from his present assignment and loaned for duty with that agency. He was placed on detached service with the Office of Strategic Services on October 31, 1942 and was transferred to such agency on February 19, 1943. In December, 1944 he was serving as Chief of the German Section, Secret Intelligence Branch, European Theatre of Operations. On December 9, 1944 Director DONOVAN recommended that Colonel LADA-MOCARSKI be relieved from duty with the army in order that he might undertake an important mission for the Office of Strategic Services requiring that he be in a civilian status and to take him into a neutral country where his designation would be Assistant Financial Attache in the United States Legation. Thereafter he was honorably discharged as a colonel from the Army of the United States on January 13, 1945 for service with the Office of Strategic Services in a civilian capacity. Subsequent correspondence from LADA-MOCARSKI indicated that he resigned such civilian employment on September 30, 1945 to return to private life.

A review of the personnel file for VALERIAN LADA-MOCARSKI, Civilian Personnel Records Branch, Adjutant General's Office, Department of the Army, St. Louis, indicates that he was employed on May 5, 1941 as a Financial Adviser at \$4600 per annum with the Office of the Secretary of War, Office Under Secretary of War, Administrative Branch, Tax Amortization. This employment was terminated on November 5, 1941 by furlough because of active military duty.

AT BLUFFTON, SOUTH CAROLINA

Captain ROBERT K. AUTREY advised that he had at no time met ALGER HISS but was aware that HISS had resided at 2905 "P" Street, Northwest, Washington, D. C., from 1935 to 1936, which residence was owned by Captain AUTREY from 1929 to 1941. Captain AWTREY stated that he had bought this house in 1929 and had resided there until 1932. He did not return to Washington, D. C. for other than a visit from 1932 until 1940. This residence was rented by the Sandoz Realty Company, who acted as agent for Captain ANTREY. Captain ANTREY stated further that he believed one HUGO FRANKENBERGER. Commander, United States Navy, retired; who has been employed by Sandoz Realty Company for a number of years, had handled the renting of his house to both Commander BAXTER BRUCE and ALGER HISS. Captain AWTREY was unable to state definitely whether or not HISS had been acquainted with Commander BRUCE, but he believed in that both of these individuals were well acquainted with FRANKENBERGER, they undoubtedly had been acquainted.

Captain A.TREY was of the opinion that the premises at 2905 "P" Street were vacant from March 1, 1935 to May 1, 1935, the period following BRUCE's tenancy and prior to the tenancy of HISS. Captain A.TREY advised that the only individual residing with ALGER HISS and his wife, PRISCILLA, to his knowledge, was the mother of ALGER HISS, and that this information had been passed on to him through FRANKENBERGER. Captain AVTREY has never received any correspondence from either ALGER HISS or his wife, PRISCILLA, but advised that he had at one time in his possession statements from the Sandoz Realty Company which reflected the monthly settlement of accounts between payment of rent by PRISCILLA HISS and deduction of commission by Sandoz Realty Company prior to forwarding him the balance.

Photographs of Mr. and Mrs. WHITTAKER CHAMBERS were viewed by Captain ANTREY and he did not believe that he had ever seen either individual and certainly was not acquainted with either of them.

Captain AVTREY stated that in addition to HUGO FRANKENBERGER, one Miss London, sister of Captain JACK LONDON, United States Navy, had acted as agent for the Sandoz Realty Company and dealt with tenants residing at 2905 "P" Street.

Captain AWTREY had been contacted by a representative of the House Committee on Un-American activities telephonically sometime last summer and advised that he had informed them at that time of the fact that he was unacquainted with both HISS and CHAMBERS.

Mr. MALONE mentioned the fact that most residents in the area of Georgetown usually banded together in small cliques and, accordingly, very few people are known in any neighborhood except to their few selected friends.

VOLKMAN, a widow, age fifty-seven, currently employed as a housekeeper for ARTHUR AARON, 21 Perk Hill Avenue, Norwalk, Connecticut, advised she formerly resided at 1533 34th Street, N.W., Washington, DC for approximately thirty-eight years. Mrs. VOLKMAN stated that she was employed as a housekeeper by Mr. LAURENCE MALONE who lived at 1535 34th Street, N.W., which is next door to her own residence. Mrs. VOLKMAN advised that she moved from Washington, DC to Norwalk, Conn. during September, 1948. The identity of ALGER HISS, a former resident of Volta Place, was unknown to Mrs. VOXXMAN and she stated she was unable to identify the photographs of MITTAKER CHAMBERS. It is to be observed that Lrs. VOLKMAN is a very quiet, backward individual and is not the type who reads the daily papers or listens to the radio. She indicated that the name of ALGER HISS was completely foreign to her and that it registered no impression whatsoever at the time it was brought to her attention.

Rebulet January 13, 1949, requesting this office to obtain from the State Department the personnel file, administrative file, and any other files relating to the employment of ALGEP HISS, such as annual and sick leave, etc.

Mr. JCSEPH S. SAGUNA, Division of ⁴inance, Department of State, made available photostatic copies of the State Department records pertaining to the sick and annual leave taken by ALGER HISS during the period of his employment with that Department. Mr. SAGONA stated that due to a regulation of the General Accounting Office, he was not able to make the original of these records available. He also stated that after a diligent search, these were all of the leave records of ALGER HISS that could be located, although it is noted that apparently many of the individual leave slips which HISS should have submitted are missing. Mr. SAGONA explained in this regard that the individual slips are often placed in a box and stored away without any label being placed on the box, so that in many instances it would be impossible to locate a leave slip for a particular individual without checking all of the unlabeled boxes.

There is therefore being submitted herewith a positive and negative photostatic copy of the State Department leave records regarding AIGER HISS.

Referring to the New York teletype dated January 15, 1949, requesting, this office to check leave records for ALGER HISS at the State Department during the period August 10 to August 15, 1937, it is pointed out that the only records located indicate that HISS took a total of 23 days, three hours annual leave and no sick leave during the calendar year 1937. Mr. SAGONA was specifically requested to attempt to locate any leave records covering this period but he maintained that no records thereating the dates when the leave was taken could be found.

DETAILS: All of the following information relates to FELIX A. INSLERMAN.

BACKGROUND .

As set out in the referenced report of Special Agent FRANCIS D. O'BRIEN, dated December 30, 1948 at New York, FELIX A. INSLERMAN was interviewed by Special Agent O'BRIEN and the writer on December 23, 1948, at which time a permissive search was conducted. The material removed from his residence at this time was taken to the FBI Laboratory on December 27, 1948 by the writer. The permit to search, as well as the receipt for articles taken is in the possession of the New York Office.

On December 30, 1948, at the request of the New York Office, the writer, together with Special Agent JOHN D. MAHONEY, went to the residence of FELIX A. INSLERMAN, R.D. #2, Cambridge, New York, for the purpose of ascertaining if the INSLERMANS would turn over all cameras and attachments thereto to this Bureau. At that time, the residence was occupied solely by a neighbor, Mrs. MARY WADE, who advised that on December 26, 1948, FELIX INSLERMAN had left his residence to go to New York City. Mrs. WADE stated that at noon, December 27, 1948, FELIX INSLERMAN telephoned his wife, ELIZABETH, and, as a result of this telephone call, <u>ELIZABETH INSLERMAN</u>, together with their small son, ROBERT, and their under-privileged child guest for the holidays, JOAN MORRONE, had departed to join FELIX INSLERMAN in New York City. All travel was by train, and the INSLERMANS' car remained at their residence.

Mrs. WADE advised that she did not know where the INSLERMANS were in New York City at that time, inasmuch as Mrs. INSLERMAN had promised to telephone her on Friday, December 31, 1948, to either tell her when she would return home or to let her know where she could be reached in New York City. Mrs. WADE stated that she was being paid to remain at their residence, inasmuch as the livestock, which they owned, had to be fed regularly and the INSLERMANS did not want the fires going out during the cold weather.

Through Mrs. WADE's cooperation, it was ascertained that the cameras owned by the INSLERMANS were in the residence on this date. Pursuant to instructions, Mrs. WADE was then advised that the FBI was desirous of getting in touch with

the INSLERMANS immediately, and she was requested to so advise the INSLERMANS when they telephoned on December 31, 1948, and, if they did not care to give the address where they could be reached in New York, Mrs. WADE was to furnish them with the name of Assistant Special Agent in Charge A. H. BELMONT of the New York Office, together with the telephone number. She was also requested to immediately call this office as soon as she heard from the INSLERMANS.

On January 3, 1949, upon request of the New York Office, the writer, together with Special Agent JOHN D. MAHONEY, again went to the residence of the INSLERMANS, inasmuch as all telephone service between Albany and their residence had been disrupted over the New Year's day week-end by a severe ice and snow storm in this area. On this date, Mrs. WADE advised that ELIZABETH INSLERMAN had telephoned her late in the evening of December 31, 1948, at which time she, Mrs. WADE, relayed the message as above stated.

Mrs. WADE stated that Mrs. INSIERMAN was very upset and refused to tell Mrs. WADE of their whereabouts, but stated she would telephone the FBI Office.

Mrs. WADE at this time also made available the name and address of ELIZABETH INSLERMAN's parents - <u>Mn</u>, and <u>Mrs. J. W. RYNDERS</u>, 909 Summit Avenue, New York 52, New York, as well as the name of the under-privileged child who had been their guest, namely, JOAN MORRONE, 626 Clinton Street, Brooklyn 31, New York, Apartment 3-D.

EMPLOYMENT

The pertinent information regarding the present employment of INSLERMAN at the General Electric Company has previously been submitted in the report of Special Agent HAROLD B. ROSS, dated December 21, 1948 at Albany.

Additional pertinent facts, not available at the time the above report was submitted, are as follows:

INSLERMAN did not return to work on December 24, 1948, and notified his superiors that he would be off for a few days, due to the illness of his child. On December 29, 1948, Major J. P. TRAYLOR, Rochester Ordnance District, U. S. Army,

advised the General Electric Company that the prior clearance for INSLERMAN for work on the Hermes Project had been ordered suspended indefinitely. At a subsequent date, INSLERMAN obtained a two months leave of absence from his employers, the General Electric Company.

It should be noted that the Hermes Project, on which INSLERMAN had been employed, is a project operated by the General Electric Company for the U. S. Army, and deals exclusively with construction and operation, etc. of guided missiles. This project is extremely confidential and all personnel employed on the Hermes Project are cleared by the U. S. Army. In addition to operating the building known as the "Race Track Plant" of the General Electric Company at Campbell Avenue, Schenectady, the project also is conducted in a huge forest outside of Saratoga Springs, New York, known as Malta or Luther's Forest. At this location are huge pits wherein experiments are conducted and rockets are test-fired. The immediate section in which INSLERMAN has been employed is in the field of Weight Analysis. The organizational set-up of the section, wherein INSLERMAN is employed, is as follows:

The above list of names was made available by Dr. R. W. PORTER, who has complete charge of the Guided Missiles Section.

Mr. JOSEPH ROBERT HARKNESS was interviewed by Special Agent HAROLD B. ROSS on December 30, 1948. HARKNESS advised that he has been INSLERMAN's supervisor for approximately the last two years. He stated he was not overly friendly with INSLERMAN, but that he had been a guest of INSLERMAN and his wife on one occasion at INSLERMAN's home. He advised that INSLERMAN was not too friendly with any of the other employees on the Hermes Project, but that on the occasion of his visit to INSLERMAN's farm, there had likewise been present:

He advised that he believed INSLERMAN was most friendly with these four individuals, and was the most friendly with RABOLLI. HARKNESS advised that at the time INSLERMAN applied for his position with the General Electric Company, he had interviewed INSLERMAN. He described INSLERMAN as not too brilliant but a very good worker and was considered a plodder on whom most of the dirty work on the project was shifted.

HARKNESS stated that INSLERMAN was probably in a better position than anyone else on the Project to know the entire make-up of a guided missile. To explain this, HARKNESS advised Special Agent ROSS that one of INSLERMAN's duties was to work out the weight distribution of the missiles, to determine the center of gravity. He said that this brings INSLERMAN into contact with each specific part of the missile, and also gives INSLERMAN the knowledge of the type of metal that each part is made of and its complete description.

HARKNESS said that another of INSIERMAN's duties is equipment mounting, and through this duty, he learns of the location and capacity of all electrical equipment in the missile, such as the gyroscope, etc.

HARKNESS said that INSLERIAN is in an excellent position to evaluate all the information that comes to him, because he is an Electrical Engineer.

In addition, HARKNESS related to Special Agent ROSS that shortly after the 1948 elections, INSLERMAN had related to him that he had voted for HENRY WALLACE, and further that although he knew WALLACE would not be elected, he was registering a protest vote against the present administration, because he believed the present policies would lead this country to war with Russia. HARKNESS said that INSLERMAN did not offer any comment on Russia.

HARKNESS likewise advised that INSLERMAN is not too regular in his attendance at work and that he takes days off now and then, with the excuse that he has some work to do on his farm. Specifically, HARKNESS advised Special Agent ROSS that INSLERMAN was absent from work on a Friday and Honday in December, and believed the dates to be December 10 and 13, 1948, and the supposed reason for this absence was that INSLERMAN had to go to New York City to see about adopting another child. HARKNESS had no additional information regarding this supposed adoption.

HARKNESS also advised that he had never considered INSLERMAN a pro-Russian but that he had received the idea, through conversations with INSLERMAN, that he, INSLERMAN, was a Pacifist.

HARKNESS also stated that in view of INSLERMAN's position, he would be allowed at any time to take any secret, confidential or restricted documents home with him in the evening for work.

Major J. P. TRAYLOR advised Special Agent HAROLD B. ROSS on January 6, 1949, that INSLERMAN had never signed any documents or papers to the effect that he was employed on secret, restricted or confidential work. INSLERMAN did complete a Personnel Security Questionnaire, but this Questionnaire does not carry any statement that his work is of a confidential nature. The Personnel Security Questionnaire signed by FELIX A. INSLERMAN, dated December 10, 1947, was forwarded to the New York Office by separate letter dated January 6, 1949. Under item 33 of the reverse side of this Questionnaire, there is the following statement:

"Remark:

The company contemplates the use of Mr. INSLERMAN's services on work, the nature of which is classified as secret. It is therefore requested that he be cleared for this classification. "

Mr. A. M. DEMONT, Aeronautics and Systems Division, General Electric Company, stated to Special Agent HAROLD B. ROSS that all employees for the Hermes Project, when hired, are orally advised they will be working on restricted data which should not be divulged to unauthorized individuals, but that they are not required to sign any statement to this effect. DEMONT advised that each drawing or blueprint handled by INSLERMAN in the course of his day's work bears the following statement:

"Notice: This document contains information affecting the national defense of the United States within the meaning of the Espionage Act 50, U.S.C. 31 and 32, as amended. Its transmission or the revelation of its contents in any manner to any unauthorized person is prohibited by law."

The drawing, blueprint or document is then followed by one of three words, either confidential, secret or restricted.

It also has been observed that on the premises where INSIERMAN was employed, above the time cards, were framed copies of the Espionage Act, as above set out.

FINANCIAL

At the time of INSLERMAN's interview by Special Agent FRANCIS D. O'BRIEN and the writer, INSLERMAN advised he banked with the Schenectady Trust Company and the Schenectady Savings Bank, Schenectady, New York. He stated that he had approximately \$1,000.00 or \$1,500.00 in savings; that he had no outstanding obligations, and that his farm and car were paid for. He stated he has a nominal amount of insurance, and that his wife had small stock holdings. He advised his annual income was \$5,200.00 (which was verified). He stated it had been his life-time policy never to go into debt, and that he had always paid cash for things he has purchased. He denied that either he or his wife possessed any safe deposit boxes or that they had any accounts with any other banks at any location. He stated that at the present time he was making no money from his photographic hobby.

On December 30, 1948, Special Agent GERARD J. O'BRIEN, through the cooperation of Mr. H. GLADSTONE MC KEON, Secretary of the Schenectady Trust Company, 320 State Street, Schenectady, New York, ascertained that FELIX A. INSLERMAN and his wife, <u>ELIZABETH INSLERMAN</u>, opened a checking account on October 2, 1946. The amount of deposit made at that time could not be ascertained, but the last monthly statement shows a balance of slightly below \$250.00. An examination of the cancelled checks on file at that time showed ordinary payments for telephone utility service and certain household expenses. The signature card, as filed by the bank, gave no further background regarding INSLERMAN or his family, or previous banking

connections. There were no outstanding loans against his name at that bank, nor had he ever made application for a loan. The bank does not keep a recordak of checks, and there would be in the date files of the Schenectady Trust Company a transcript of INSLERMAN's statements since the time he opened his account. The only checks photographed by this bank are out-of-town checks presented by INSLERMAN for clearance. These are not in a catalog or indexed. Request has been made of this bank to furnish transcripts of statements.

Special Agent GERARD J. O'BRIEN, through the cooperation of Mr. HARRY D. RYDER, Treasurer of the Schenectady Savings Bank, Schenectady, New York, was advised that FELIX A. INSLERIAN opened a savings account on December 27, 1946, with a cash deposit of \$4,000.00. The account was in the name of FELIX A. INSLERMAN or ELIZABETH INSLERMAN. Numerous withdrawals have been made to date, leaving the present balance \$1,348.08. The signature card on file at the bank showed INSLERMAN's father as AUGUST JOHN, and his mother as ANNA PAULINE, and also listed his birth date as July 11, 1910. ELIZABETH INSLERMAN had listed her birth date to be February 18, 1915 at New York City, and her father as JAN W. <u>RENDERS</u> and her mother as BETTY BLEST RYNDERS. The records of the bank also showed a trustee account for ROBERT A. INSLERMAN, opened October 8, 1946. The balance in this account, as of this date, was \$149.48 (son), and there were no loans or mortgages by INSLERMAN at this bank.

In connection with the farm where INSLERMAN now resides, at the time of his interview, he stated they purchased the farm in 1946, when they were residing on Long Island. It was commented upon at that time that this was rather unusual, inasmuch as he was not then an employee nor had he applied for work with the General Electric Company in Schenectady. INSLERMAN stated that to be correct, but he became acquainted with the property through a friend of his and his wife, one TED HORNING of Argyle, New York, which village is near Cambridge, New York.

The records of the Town Clerk at Hudson Falls, New York, together with an interview of HARRY HARRINGTON, a resident of Cambridge, New York, disclosed the following information:

On July 1, 1935, HARRINGTON sold the property, consisting of 85 acres and the house and buildings thereto, to one NORMA KNOLL, 22 Hamilton Avenue, Arlington, New Jersey. This was recorded on July 8, 1935, Book 211, page 386. There were

\$2.50 worth of revenue stamps attached. On September 29, 1941, the property was conveyed by CHARLES C. KNOLL, Executor of the Last Will and Testament of NORMA E. KNOLL, to DOROTHY G. HOEY and ARTHUR C. HOEY, JR., her husband, 395 Burlington Road, Borough of Paramus, County of Bergen, New Jersey. This deed was recorded November 8, 1941, and was listed in Book 227, page 395, consideration at this time being \$4,400.00. The record also shows that NORMA E. KNOLL died a resident of Hudson County, New Jersey, on August 18, 1941. Her will was probated in the Hudson County Surrogate's Court, August 29, 1941. CHARLES C. KNOLL was appointed Executor. DOROTHY G. HOEY and ARTHUR C. HOEY, JR. conveyed the property to FELIX A. INSLERMAN and <u>ELIZABETH_INSLERMAN</u>, his wife, on December 29, 1942. The INSLERMANS then resided at the Township of Babylon, Suffolk County, Long Island, New York. This deed was not recorded until July 29, 1947, and is in Book 259, page 543. This carried \$1.10 worth of revenue stamps, which would indicate that INSLERMAN paid \$1,100.00. It was ascertained that the house and buildings are presently insured for \$2,000.00 by Mr. CLAYTON EROWNELL of Cambridge, New York.

At the time of the interview of INSLERMAN, it was ascertained that he purchased a new Chevrolet in 1947. Through the cooperation of Mr. JOSEPH A. HARADAN, President of the Mohawk Chevrolet Company, Schenectady, New York, on December 30, 1948, Special Agent JOHN D. MAHONEY ascertained that FELIX INSLERMAN had traded a 1941 Chevrolet Town Sedan, Serial No. 14A-603-25305, Motor No. AA-712295, and had been allowed \$430.55 as a trade-in allowance for a 1947 Fleetmaster Chevrolet Town Sedan. The transaction was consummated January 6, 1948. Mr. HARADAN stated that a check in the amount of \$1,030.75, the difference in the price, had been given to the Mohawk Chevrolet Company by INSLERMAN. According to their records, the check was deposited the next day, but there was no record available as to what bank this check had been drawn on.

At the time of the purchase, INSLERMAN had 1947 New York registration plates 8A 5300. A check of the records of the New York State Motor Vehicle Bureau, Albany, New York, by Special Agent JOHN D. MAHONEY verified that 1947 New York Registration 8A 5300 had been issued to FELIX INSLERMAN, R.D. #2, Cambridge, New York. These records show that in 1946, INSLERMAN had New York Registration plates 4G 4629. The applications for these plates are in New York City.

At the time of INSLERMAN's interview, it was ascertained that he purchased a new 1948 Allis Chalmers Tractor for \$1,100.00, for which he had paid cash. At the time Agents were at his farm, it was ascertained that he likewise possesses the following kitchen conveniences: one deep freezer and one electric dish washer.

PHOTOGRAPHY

At the time of the interview, INSLERMAN advised that since he has been working at the General Electric Company, he has not had much time for his hobby of photography, nor has he done any photographic work for profit, except an occasional picture of neighbors' children, etc. He estimated that he probably spent no more than \$10.00 during any one month for any photographic supplies. He stated he bought most of his supplies at Lyon's, Schenectady, or at Montgomery Ward.

Special Agents EDWARD M. NALLY, JR. and GLEN D. RANKIN on December 31, 1948 contacted the following photographic supply stores at Schenectady.

Gene Black, 77 State Street. George's Film Service, 724¹/₂ State Street. Lyon's Camera and Pen Store, 236 State Street. Koch's Photo Lab, 117 Clinton Street. The Photo Lab, 269 State Street. Hontgomery Ward Order Office, 202 State Street. Bern's Camera Store, 113 Broadway.

The coverage was completely negative and none of the business firms knew of INSLERMAN by name or description.

TELEPHONE TOLL CALLS

Through the cooperation of the New York Telephone Company at Albany, New York, Special Agent EDWARD J. LEAHY on December 30, 1948 reviewed telephone toll tickets covering the INSLERMANS' telephone, Cambridge 120-F-23, which telephone is listed for Mrs. ELIZABETH A. INSLERMAN. These calls were reviewed from October 1, 1948 to December 30, 1948. The only possible call of significance was on December 10, 1948 to Gramarcy 5-1454, to one LUCY, GRAFF. (Identification of this person was ascertained by the New York Office, by teletype, but was negative in connection with instant investigation.)

Arrangements have been made to review prior toll tickets, which are on file at the office of the New York Telephone Company at Saratoga Springs, New York.

MAIL

Mr. KENT, Postmaster, Village of Cambridge, New York, and the rural mail carrier who delivers mail to R.D. #2, Cambridge, were interviewed, with negative results.

On December 30, 1948 a mail cover was placed with the Postmaster. As a result of this cover, one piece of mail of possible significance has been reported as follows:

January 4, 1949 - INSLERMAN received a letter from W. BULLOCK, Russell Sage College, Troy, New York.

The identity of this person will be ascertained.

SEAR OH WARRANT

On January 7, 1949, Special Agent FRANCIS D. O'BRIEN of the New York Office and the writer conferred with Mr. IRVING J. HIGBEE, United States Attorney for the Northern District of New York, at his office in Syracuse, New York. As a result of this conference, the following affidavit was drawn up:

Sections 31, 32 and 34, Title 50, United States Code and Section 88, Title 18, United States Code (1946 Edition), in that within the Southern District of New York and elsewhere divers persons, including Jay David Thittaker Chambers, have sought and obtained and have conspired to secure and obtain information relating to the national defense, with intent and reason to believe that such information was to be used to the benefit of a foreign power and to the injury of the United States, and have conspired to defraud the United States of the honest, impartial and loyal services of certain of its employees by procuring them to remove and make available to unauthorized persons official documents of the United States Government.

3. In my official capacity, as a result of official investigations conducted by me and official reports and other official material read and reviewed by me, I am satisfied and believe that the above mentioned crimes arose out of the following: Beginning about 1936 and continuing to about April, 1938, one Jay David Whittaker Chambers procured certain employees of the Government of the United States to remove official documents and information from the possession of various departments of the Government and to make them available to himself and other unauthorized persons for ultimate delivery to a foreign power; as delivered

to Chambers this material consisted of original documents or written or typewritten copies or summaries thereof; it was Chambers' practice and that of the other unauthorized persons to deliver such material to certain photographers, including said Felix A. inslerman, for photographic reproduction on microfilm, and upon completion of such photographing to return the official documents to the said Government employees for restoration in the Government's files; certain of this microfilm, which is of 35 millimeter size, has been produced by Chambers; the equipment used for the purpose of such photographic reproduction included at least one Leica camera; there is some indication that these practices were continued for an undetermined period subsequent to April, 1938.

Inslerman and did then and there observe certain photographic equipment and accessories including but not limited to a certain Leica camera bearing serial number 234730 of which the said Inslerman stated he was the owner;

on this same occasion the said Inslerman referred to an enlarger which he had used in photographic work; on this occasion, the said Inslerman also made some reference to other cameras which he owned and that he had made a hobby of photographic work and had photographic equipment which he used in the pursuit of his said hobby. In a previous conversation held on the same day, the said Inslerman stated he purchased the Leica camera in Washington, D.C. in 1936 and had since had it in his possession; he further stated that he lived on Callow Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland, during 1937 and part of 1938; during this said visit at the farm, said deponent and other agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, with the consent of the said Felix A. Inslerman, took about thirty-six rolls of film, some of which was 35 millimeter microfilm.

51 In a conversation held in my presence in New York City on January 6th; 1949, Inslerman indicated that he also had in his possession on his farm at Cambridge, New York, other cameras; in the same conversation, Inslerman further indicated that he had the Leica camera which I had observed, at his Cambridge farm on December 23rd, 1948 brought to New York and it was then in his possession and that he intended to return to his farm at Cambridge, as soon as the Grand Jury sitting in New York adjourned for the day (January 6th; 1949) and that he would at all times, have such Leica

camera in his possession and would remain at the farm until early the following week. I have been informed from other official sources that the other cameras referred to above, including an Ernemann-Bob which he had had in his possession since 1936, would take standard film.

6. As a result of the information received by me in the course of the performance of my official duties in connection with this case, I am reasonably satisfied and have cause to believe that the Leica camera, bearing serial number 234730 above referred to, was properly designed and intended for use and which was used as a means of committing the offenses above described and that it was possessed and controlled and designed and intended for use and used in violation of the Espionage Act (Act of June 15, 1917, as amended). On the basis of such official information in my possession, I have further reasonable cause to believe that the said Ernemann-Bob camera may have been so used.

7. Deponent further says that on the 5th day of January, 1949 at the offices of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, United States Court House, New York City, he had a conversation with the said Jay David Whittaker Chambers, whom deponent knows has given information to the United States Government concerning the matters set forth in the second and third paragraphs of this

affidavit, and the same Chambers told deponent that he had furnished government documents to be photographed to a man by the name of Felix who lived on Callow Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland and who did photographic work and had a Leica camera; that said Chambers further stated in this same conversation that on January 3rd, 1949 he saw the said person whom he knew as Felix in the United States Court House in New York City and that he then learned that he was known as Felix A. Inslerman; deponent further says that he himself saw the said Felix A. Inslerman in the United States Court House in New York City on the 3rd of January, 1949.

8. Deponent further says that John J. O'Toole, Jr., is a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and is a civil officer of the United States authorized to enforce and assist in enforcing laws of the United States and is a proper person to execute the search warrant asked for herein.

WHEREFORE it is prayed that a search warrant may be issued authorizing the said John J. O'Toole, Jr., a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, together with such other Special Agent or Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation as may be assigned to assist him, to enter with proper assistance in the daytime, the premises occupied by Felix A. Inslerman and his family, near the Village of Cambridge in the County of Washington,

On January 8, 1949 at 10:13 A.M., the writer executed the search warrant at the residence of FELIX A. INSLERMAN, Cambridge, New York. He was assisted by Special Agents JOHN D. MAHONEY and PAUL R. BIBLER. At the time of the search, the following items were seized: (Turned over by the INSLERMANS.)

- 1. One Ernemann-Bob 2 Camera, 840366 DRP.
- 2. One Leica Camera #234730 and front lens number 1:35 F = 50 mm Leitz Elmar and carrying case plus sunshade and film contained therein.

The original search warrant had been exhibited to both Mr. and Mrs. FELIX A. MINITERIAN and a copy of the search warrant was left with them. Likewise, a receipt for the above property was executed and a copy of this receipt was left with FELIX A. INSLERIAN.

The return on the search warrant was sworn to before United States Commissioner BENDER SOLOMON, 74 Chapel Street, Albany, New York, by the writer on January 10, 1949.

The original warrant was returned and the original receipt for the property seized has been sent to the issuing Commissioner, A. VAN W. HANCOCK at Syracuse, New York.

A copy of the warrant, the affidavit, the return made on the warrant, and the receipt for property are being retained in the files of the Albany Office.

The property seized, while in the custody of the writer, was taken to Albany, New York, where it was personally turned over to Special Agent CHESTER M. PONTZ of this office, who transmitted it in person to the FBI Laboratory in Washington, D.C. on the morning of January 9, 1949.

At the time the Agents arrived at the INSLERMAN residence, shortly after 10:00 A.M., January 8, 1949, they were greeted at the door by Mrs. ELIZABETH INSLERMAN, who stated, when informed of the purpose of their visit, that she did not care what they had - she absolutely refused us permission to enter her residence. She stated this was her opinion, as well as the opinion of their attorney, LOUIS BENDER, who had so instructed her. The original of the warrant

was then given to her to read. She refused to even glance at it. She was advised again of our intent to search the property, and upon her refusal to cooperate in any manner whatsoever, the Agents entered the premises. Mrs. INSLERMAN again demanded we leave immediately and, when informed that we did not intend to do so, she requested that at least we sit in her living room until her husband returned, since he was just down the road a bit, and until she called her attorney in New York City.

At this time, FELIX INSLERMAN returned and was advised of the purpose of our visit, and was likewise given the original search warrant, and he refused to look at it. Offering cooperation, the Agents then awaited Mrs. INSLERMAN's telephone call to Attorney LOUIS BENDER in New York City. From the conversation on behalf of Mrs. INSLERMAN, it was quite apparent that BENDER reassured her the warrant was absolutely illegal; that the Agents had no business being upon their premises, and BENDER apparently was urging her and her husband to immediately eject the Agents from the premises. From Mrs. INSLERMAN's conversation, it was obvious that she was telling him that was impossible. It was the opinion of the Agents that BENDER was seeking to have the issue of violence arise out of the execution of the warrant.

Upon BENDER's request and Mrs. INSLERMAN's insistence, the writer went to the telephone, at which time Attorney BENDER informed him that he regarded the entire warrant as illegal, and that we should immediately vacate the premises, and further, he would move to dismiss the search warrant at the very first opportunity. The writer made no comment.

Mrs. INSLERMAN then, upon the request of her attorney, read the search warrant to him over the telephone. At the conclusion of her conversation, she advised they did not intend to cooperate with the Agents making the search, and invited the Agents to just go ahead and look.

After some time was consumed in the search, Mrs. INSLERMAN offered to make a "deal" with the Agents. She advised that if we stood outside of her door, she would then present to us the items called for in the warrant. The so-called "deal" was refused on the grounds that once we were outside the door, it would probably be shut. She then advised that since we would not cooperate to this extent, she would not either, and once again the search continued.

At approximately 11:30 A.M., Attorney LOUIS BENDER again telephoned her. From Hrs. INSLERMAN's conversation, it appeared that her parents were furious over having their residence searched, and apparently Mr. BENDER advised her that the easiest way to have the search concluded was to have her turn over the cameras in their possession.

She then made available first the <u>leica Camera</u>, which was in a pillow on the, bed and wrapped in tissue, and <u>FELIX INSLERMAN</u> turned over the <u>Ernemann-Bob</u> <u>Camera</u>, which was upstairs at an undisclosed location. Proper receipts were executed and the Agents departed from the INSLERMANS' residence, a minute or so after 12 noon.

During the entire time, FELIX INSLERMAN had no comments to make, outside of securing the full names of the three Agents who conducted the search.

MISCELLANEOUS

In the report of Special Agent FRANK G. JOHNSTONE, dated December 23, 1948 at Baltimore, it was indicated that one MARY KNETTLES had been a close associate of FRANKLIN VICTOR RENO and STEMASKLOF. In teletype from Albany to Baltimore, December 30, 1948, it was stated that MARY KNETTLES was now reported to be living in Baltimore, where she is employed in the office of the U.S. Geological Survey, working under a Dr. ROMAN.

At the time the search warrant was executed at the residence of INSLERMAN, it was noted that personal correspondence from one BUD and JOE to the INSLERMANS had been written on stationery of the U.S. Geological Survey. The letters were purely personal in nature and were believed to have originated at Baltimore. It was ascertained that BUD and JOE refers to a couple, their last name being MASON. Since it is possible that the BUD and JOE of the U.S. Geological Survey in Baltimore may be associated with MARY KNETTLES, and hence in connection with VICTOR RENO, a teletype was sent to Baltimore on January 10, 1949, advising of the above. It may be possible to establish an association between the INSLERMANS and other persons connected with the Apparatus.

At the time of the original interview with INSLERMAN, it was ascertained that the only living member of his family is a brother, HANS, who now resides on East Borne Avenue, Long Branch, New Jersey, and who is a civilian employee of the U.S. Army and engaged as a Radio Engineer at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey. A teletype requesting background check on <u>HANS</u> INSLERMAN was sent to Newark on January 10, 1949, and the Washington Field Office was requested to verify HANS INSLERMAN's employment.

In connection with the purchase of the farm by INSLERMAN from DOROTHY G. HOEY and ARTHUR C. HOEY; JR., 397 Burlington Road, Borough of Paramus, Hudson County, New Jersey, it should be noted that at the time of the initial interview of INSLERMAN, he stated that his mother died when he was 7 years of age, and his father sent him to some friends, who owned a farm in Brunswick, New Jersey. These people raised him. INSLERMAN could not recall the name of these persons who had raised him, but did state that both of them had been born in Estonia. It is possible that the HOEYS could have been the persons who raised him or may have been associated with the persons who raised him.

It was also ascertained from INSLERMAN that since he has been working at the General Electric Company, during the bad weather months, when driving is difficult, he rents a room from a Mrs. JOHN ANKER, 496 Hulett Street, Schenectady, New York. He stated it had been his custom for the past 2 years to rent a room from her and to stay there Honday through Friday and return to his farm over the week-end.

On December 30, 1948 Special Agent HAROID B. ROSS interviewed Mrs. JOHN ANKER and verified that INSLERMAN had taken a room at her residence from December, 1946 to May, 1947 and from December, 1947 to March, 1948, for which he paid \$4.00 a week. She stated he only stayed there occasionally when road conditions made it impossible for him to travel to his farm in Cambridge. She stated that, to the best of her knowledge, he had never received any mail, telephone calls or visitors while residing at her home. She described him as a very quiet person who never volunteered any information. She advised that he had come to live at her home because she had left her telephone number at the Y.M.C.A. She knew nothing at all concerning his background and advised that he kept no material in his room but occasionally he carried a brief case and sometimes she had observed papers with mathematical calculations thereon on his dresser, but could give no further information.

A check of toll calls on the residence of Mrs. ANKER failed to produce any calls as traceable to FELIX INSLERMAN.

The following interview is related to the FRANKLIN VICTOR RENO aspect of this case.

Colonel H. H. ZORNIG, U.S. Army Retired, was interviewed December 28, 1948 by Special Agent JOHN D. MAHONEY and the writer. ZORNIG is employed by the Atomic Energy Commission, Peek Street Plant of the General Electric Company, Schenectady, New York.

ZORNIG said he had known FRANKLIN VICTOR RENO since about 1936 or 1937, when RENO was employed at the Aberdeen Proving Grounds. ZORNIG said that he, ZORNIG, was in charge of the entire project and RENO was hired as an Exterior Ballistics Man . ZORNIG advised that RENO had been certified to be qualified for appointment on this project, through the Civil Service List, and as far as ZORNIG could recall, RENO came to him from the University of Virginia.

ZORNIG described RENO as an excellent mathematician who was something of a prima donna type, and referred to RENO as a Bolshevist. Under questioning, ZORNIG said he did not mean this in the sense that RENO was a Communist or a Communist Party member, but rather he used the term to describe one who is anti-social, which was what RENO was. ZORNIG stated he had never been aware of any occasions where RENO would take out any of the confidential material, but related that at that time there was no restricted or confidential material available to him.

Colonel ZORNIG stated he left the Aberdeen Proving Grounds in 1941 and at that time RENO was still employed there. ZORNIG claimed he knew very little about RENO's outside activities, and stated that Dr. LOUIS S. DEDERICK, who was RENO's direct supervisor, would have had much more contact with RENO and could probably furnish better information as to his social and related activity. He advised that for a time, RENO worked directly under Dr. DEDERICK and roomed at the Doctor's home at Baltimore, Maryland.

Colonel ZORNIG said that never at any time had there been a question in his mind regarding RENO's loyalty, and remarked that at that time the highly confidential projects were not underway at Aberdeen. Colonel ZORNIG stated

that the only restricted and confidential project at that time was the Norden Bomb Sight, but, to the best of his recollection, RENO never had any occasion to work on the inside mechanism of the Bomb Sight and thus would have **no** reason to have access to any of the information about the Sight.

ZORNIG also said he did not know of any security regulations violated by RENO, and concluded by stating that even if RENO had been a member of the Communist Party at that time, there would have been very little he, ZORNIG, could have done about it, since the Civil Service Commission had certified RENO for employment on the project and at that time membership in the Communist Party was not a bar to said employment.

DETAILS: All of the following information relates to FELIX A. INSLERMAN.

BACKGROUND .

As, set out in the referenced report of Special Agent FRANCIS D. O'BRIEN, dated December 30, 1948 at New York, FELIX A. INSLERMAN was interviewed by Special Agent O'BRIEN and the writer on December 23, 1948, at which time a permissive search was conducted. The material removed from his residence at this time was taken to the FBI Laboratory on December 27, 1948 by the writer. The permit to search, as well as the receipt for articles taken is in the possession of the New York Office.

On December 30, 1948, at the request of the New York Office, the writer, together with Special Agent JOHN D. MAHONEY, went to the residence of FELIX A. INSLERMAN, R.D. #2, Cambridge, New York, for the purpose of ascertaining if the INSLERMANS would turn over all cameras and attachments thereto to this Bureau. At that time, the residence was occupied solely by a neighbor, Mrs. MARY WADE, who advised that on December 26, 1948, FELIX INSLERMAN had left his residence to go to New York City. Mrs. WADE stated that at noon, December 27, 1948, FELIX INSLERMAN telephoned his wife, ELIZABETH, and, as a result of this telephone call, ELIZABETH INSLERMAN, together with their small son, ROBERT, and their under-privileged child guest for the holidays, JOAN MORRONE, had departed to join FELIX INSLERMAN in New York City. All travel was by train, and the INSLERMANS' car remained at their residence.

Mrs. WADE advised that she did not know where the INSLERMANS were in New York City at that time, inasmuch as Mrs. INSLERMAN had promised to telephone her on Friday, December 31, 1948, to either tell her when she would return home or to let her know where she could be reached in New York City. Mrs. WADE stated that she was being paid to remain at their residence, inasmuch as the livestock, which they owned, had to be fed regularly and the INSLERMANS did not want the fires going out during the cold weather.

Through Mrs. WADE's cooperation, it was ascertained that the cameras owned by the INSLERMANS were in the residence on this date. Pursuant to instructions, Mrs. WADE was then advised that the FBI was desirous of getting in touch with

the INSLERMANS immediately, and she was requested to so advise the INSLERMANS when they telephoned on December 31, 1948, and, if they did not care to give the address where they could be reached in New York, Mrs. WADE was to furnish them with the name of Assistant Special Agent in Charge A. H. BELMONT of the New York Office, together with the telephone number. She was also requested to immediately call this office as soon as she heard from the INSLERMANS.

On January 3, 1949, upon request of the New York Office, the writer, together with Special Agent JOHN D. MAHONEY, again went to the residence of the INSLERMANS, inasmuch as all telephone service between Albany and their residence had been disrupted over the New Year's day week-end by a severe ice and snow storm in this area. On this date, Mrs. WADE advised that ELIZABETH INSLERMAN had telephoned her late in the evening of December 31, 1948, at which time she, Mrs. WADE, relayed the message as above stated.

Mrs. WADE stated that Mrs. INSLERMAN was very upset and refused to tell Mrs.. WADE of their whereabouts, but stated she would telephone the FBI Office.

Mrs. WADE at this time also made available the name and address of ELIZABETH INSLERMAN'S parents - Mr. and Mrs. J. W. RYNDERS, 909 Summit Avenue, New York 52, New York, as well as the name of the under-privileged child who had been their guest, namely, JOAN MORRONE, 626 Clinton Street, Brooklyn 31, New York, Apartment 3-D.

EMPLOYMENT:

The pertinent information regarding the present employment of INSLERMAN at the General Electric Company has previously been submitted in the report of Special Agent HAROLD B. ROSS, dated December 21, 1948 at Albany.

Additional pertinent facts, not available at the time the above report was submitted, are as follows:

INSLERMAN did not return to work on December 24, 1948, and notified his superiors that he would be off for a few days, due to the illness of his child. On December 29, 1948, Major J. P. TRAYLOR, Rochester Ordnance District, U. S. Army,

advised the General Electric Company that the prior clearance for INSLERMAN for work on the Hermes Project had been ordered suspended indefinitely. At a subsequent date, INSLERMAN obtained a two months leave of absence from his employers, the General Electric Company.

It should be noted that the Hermes Project, on which INSLERMAN had been employed, is a project operated by the General Electric Company for the U. S. Army, and deals exclusively with construction and operation, etc. of guided missiles. This project is extremely confidential and all personnel employed on the Hermes Project are cleared by the U. S. Army. In addition to operating the building known as the "Race Track Plant" of the General Electric Company at Campbell Avenue, Schenectady, the project also is conducted in a huge forest cutside of Saratoga Springs, New York, known as Malta or Luther's Forest. At this location are huge pits wherein experiments are conducted and rockets are test-fired. The immediate section in which INSLERMAN has been employed is in the field of Weight Analysis. The organizational set-up of the section, wherein INSLERMAN is employed, is as follows:

The above list of names was made available by Dr. R. W. PORTER, who has complete charge of the Guided Missiles Section.

Mr. JOSEPH ROBERT HARKNESS was interviewed by Special Agent HAROLD B. ROSS on December 30, 1948. HARKNESS advised that he has been INSLERMAN's supervisor for approximately the last two years. He stated he was not overly friendly with INSLERMAN, but that he had been a guest of INSLERMAN and his wife on one occasion at INSLERMAN's home. He advised that INSLERMAN was not too friendly with any of the other employees on the Hermes Project, but that on the occasion of his visit to INSLERMAN's farm, there had likewise been present:

He advised that he believed INSLERIAN was most friendly with these four individuals, and was the most friendly with RABOLLI. HARKNESS advised that at the time INSLERMAN applied for his position with the General Electric Company, he had interviewed INSLERMAN. He described INSLERMAN as not too brilliant but a very good worker and was considered a plodder on whom most of the dirty work on the project was shifted.

HARKNESS stated that INSLERMAN was probably in a better position than anyone else on the Project to know the entire make-up of a guided missile. To explain this, HARKNESS advised Special Agent ROSS that one of INSLERMAN's duties was to work out the weight distribution of the missiles, to determine the center of gravity. He said that this brings INSLERMAN into contact with each specific part of the missile, and also gives INSLERMAN the knowledge of the type of metal that each part is made of and its complete description.

HARKNESS said that another of INSLERMAN's duties is equipment mounting, and through this duty, he learns of the location and capacity of all electrical equipment in the missile, such as the gyroscope, etc.

HARKNESS said that INSLERMAN is in an excellent position to evaluate all the information that comes to him, because he is an Electrical Engineer.

In addition, HARKNESS related to Special Agent ROSS that shortly after the 1948 elections, INSLERMAN had related to him that he had voted for HENRY WALLACE, and further that although he knew WALLACE would not be elected, he was registering a protest vote against the present administration, because he believed the present policies would lead this country to war with Russia. HARKNESS said that INSLERMAN did not offer any comment on Russia.

HARKNESS likewise advised that INSLERMAN is not too regular in his attendance at work and that he takes days off now and then, with the excuse that he has some work to do on his farm. Specifically, HARKNESS advised Special Agent ROSS that INSLERMAN was absent from work on a Friday and Honday in December, and believed the dates to be December 10 and 13, 1948, and the supposed reason for this absence was that INSLERMAN had to go to New York City to see about adopting another child. HARKNESS had no additional information regarding this supposed adoption.

HARKNESS also advised that he had never considered INSLERMAN a pro-Russian but that he had received the idea, through conversations with INSLERMAN, that he, INSLERMAN, was a Pacifist.

HARKNESS also stated that in view of INSLERMAN's position, he would be allowed at any time to take any secret, confidential or restricted documents home with him in the evening for work.

Major J. P. TRAYLOR advised Special Agent HAROLD B. ROSS on January 6, 1949, that INSLERMAN had never signed any documents or papers to the effect that he was employed on secret, restricted or confidential work. INSLERMAN did. complete a Personnel Security Questionnaire, but this Questionnaire does not carry any statement that his work is of a confidential nature. The Personnel Security Questionnaire signed by FELIX A. INSLERMAN, dated December 10, 1947, was forwarded to the New York Office by separate letter dated January 6, 1949. Under item 33 of the reverse side of this Questionnaire, there is the following statement:

"Remark: The company contemplates the use of Mr. INSLERMAN's services on work, the nature of which is classified as secret. It is therefore requested that he be cleared for this classification. "

Mr. A. M. DEMONT, Aeronautics and Systems Division, General Electric Company, stated to Special Agent HAROLD B. ROSS that all employees for the Hermes Project, when hired, are orally advised they will be working on restricted data which should not be divulged to unauthorized individuals, but that they are not required to sign any statement to this effect. DEMONT advised that each drawing or blueprint handled by INSLERMAN in the course of his day's work bears the following statement:

"Notice: This document contains information affecting the national . defense of the United States within the meaning of the Espionage Act 50, U.S.C. 31 and 32, as amended. Its transmission or the revelation of its contents in any manner to any unauthorized person is prohibited by law."

The drawing, blueprint or document is then followed by one of three words, either confidential, secret or restricted.

It also has been observed that on the premises where INSIERMAN was employed, above the time cards, were framed copies of the Espionage Act, as above set out.

FINANCIAL.

At the time of INSLERMAN's interview by Special Agent FRANCIS D. O'BRIEN and the writer, INSLERMAN advised he banked with the Schenectady Trust Company and the Schenectady Savings Bank, Schenectady, New York. He stated that he had approximately \$1,000.00 or \$1,500.00 in savings; that he had no outstanding obligations, and that his farm and car were paid for. He stated he has a nominal amount of insurance, and that his wife had small stock holdings. He advised his annual income was \$5,200.00 (which was verified). He stated it had been his life-time policy never to go into debt, and that he had always paid cash for things he has purchased. He denied that either he or his wife possessed any safe deposit boxes or that they had any accounts with any other banks at any location. He stated that at the present time he was making no money from his photographic hobby.

On December 30, 1948, Special Agent GERARD J. O'BRIEN, through the cooperation of Mr. H. GIADSTONE MC KEON, Secretary of the Schenectady Trust Company, 320 State Street, Schenectady, New York, ascertained that FELIX A. INSLERMAN and his wife, ELIZABETH INSIERIAN, opened a checking account on October 2, 1946. The amount of deposit made at that time could not be ascertained, but the last monthly statement shows a balance of slightly below \$250.00. An examination of the cancelled checks on file at that time showed ordinary payments for telephone utility service and certain household expenses. The signature card, as filed by the bank, gave no further background regarding INSLERMAN or his family, or previous banking Kisseloff-7698

connections. There were no outstanding loans against his name at that bank, nor had he ever made application for a loan. The bank does not keep a recordak of checks, and there would be in the date files of the Schenectady Trust Company a transcript of INSLERMAN's statements since the time he opened his account. The only checks photographed by this bank are out-of-town checks presented by INSLERMAN for clearance. These are not in a catalog or indexed. Request has been made of this bank to furnish transcripts of statements.

Special Agent GERARD J. O'BRIEN, through the cooperation of Mr. HARRY D. RYDER, Treasurer of the Schenectady Savings Bank, Schenectady, New York, was advised that FELIX A. INSLERMAN opened a savings account on December 27, 1946, with a cash deposit of \$4,000.00. The account was in the name of FELIX A. INSLERMAN or ELIZABETH INSLERMAN. Numerous withdrawals have been made to date, leaving the present balance \$1,348.08. The signature card on file at the bank showed INSLERMAN's father as AUGUST JOHN, and his mother as ANNA PAULINE, and also listed his birth date as July 11, 1910. ELIZABETH INSLERMAN had listed her birth date to be February 18, 1915 at New York City, and her father as JAN W. RYNDERS and her mother as BETTY BLESI RYNDERS. The records of the bank also showed a trustee account for ROBERT A. INSLERMAN, opened October 8, 1946. The balance in this account, as of this date, was \$149.48 (son), and there were no loans or mortgages by INSLERMAN at this bank.

In connection with the farm where INSLERMAN now resides, at the time of his interview, he stated they purchased the farm in 1946, when they were residing on Long Island. It was commented upon at that time that this was rather unusual, inasmuch as he was not then an employee nor had he applied for work with the General Electric Company in Schenectady. INSLERMAN stated that to be correct, but he became acquainted with the property through a friend of his and his wife, one TED HORNING of Argyle, New York, which village is near Cambridge, New York.

The records of the Town Clerk at Hudson Falls, New York, together with an interview of HARRY HARRINGTON, a resident of Cambridge, New York, disclosed the following information:

On July 1, 1935, HARRINGTON sold the property, consisting of 85 acres and the house and buildings thereto, to one NORMA KNOLL, 22 Hamilton Avenue, Arlington, New Jersey. This was recorded on July 8, 1935, Book 211, page 386. There were

\$2.50 worth of revenue stamps attached. On September 29, 1941, the property was conveyed by CHARLES C. KNOLL, Executor of the Last Will and Testament of NORMA. E. KNOLL, to DOROTHY G. HOEY and ARTHUR C. HOEY, JR., her husband, 395 Burlington Road, Borough of Paramus, County of Bergen, New Jersey. This deed was recorded November 8, 1941, and was listed in Book 227, page 395, consideration at this time being \$4,400.00. The record also shows that NORMA E. KNOLL died a resident of Hudson County, New Jersey, on August 18, 1941. Her will was probated in the Hudson County Surrogate's Court, August 29, 1941. CHARLES C. KNOLL was appointed Executor. DOROTHY G. HOEY and ARTHUR C. HOEY, JR. conveyed the property to FELIX A. INSLERMAN and ELIZABETH INSLERMAN, his wife, on December 29, 1942. The INSLERMANS then resided at the Township of Babylon, Suffolk County, Long Island, New York. This deed was not recorded until July 29, 1947, and is in Book 259, page 543. This carried \$1.10 worth of revenue stamps, which would indicate that INSLERMAN paid \$1,100.00. It was ascertained that the house and buildings are presently insured for \$2,000.00 by Mr. CLAYTON EROWNELL of Cambridge; New York.

At the time of the interview of INSLERMAN, it was ascertained that he purchased a new Chevrolet in 1947. Through the cooperation of Mr. JOSEPH A. HARADAN, President of the Mohawk Chevrolet Company, Schenectady, New York, on December 30, 1948, Special Agent JOHN D. MAHONEY ascertained that FELIX INSLERMAN had traded a 1941 Chevrolet Town Sedan, Serial No. 14A-603-25305, Motor No. AA-712295, and had been allowed \$430.55 as a trade-in allowance for a 1947 Fleetmaster Chevrolet Town Sedan. The transaction was consummated January 6, 1948. Mr. HARADAN stated that a check in the amount of \$1,030.75, the difference in the price, had been given to the Mohawk Chevrolet Company by INSLERMAN. According to their records, the check was deposited the next day, but there was no record available as to what bank this check had been drawn on.

At the time of the purchase, INSLERMAN had 1947 New York registration plates 8A 5300. A check of the records of the New York State Motor Vehicle Bureau, Albany, New York, by Special Agent JOHN D. MAHONEY verified that 1947 New York Registration 8A 5300 had been issued to FELIX INSLERMAN, R.D. #2, Cambridge, New York. These records show that in 1946, INSLERMAN had New York Registration plates 4G 4629. The applications for these plates are in New York City.

At the time of INSLERMAN's interview, it was ascertained that he purchased a new 1948 Allis Chalmers Tractor for \$1,100.00, for which he had paid cash. At the time Agents were at his farm, it was ascertained that he likewise possesses the following kitchen conveniences: one deep freezer and one electric dish washer.

PHOTOGRAPHY

At the time of the interview, INSLERMAN advised that since he has been working at the General Electric Company, he has not had much time for his hobby of photography, nor has he done any photographic work for profit, except an occasional picture of neighbors' children, etc. He estimated that he probably spent no more than \$10.00 during any one month for any photographic supplies. He stated he bought most of his supplies at Lyon's, Schenectady, or at Montgomery Ward.

Special Agents EDWARD M. NALLY, JR. and GLEN D. RANKIN on December 31, 1948 contacted the following photographic supply stores at Schenectady.

Gene Black, 77 State Street.

Ceorge's Film Service, 7242 State Street.

Lyon's Camera and Pen Store, 236 State Street.

Koch's Photo Lab, 117 Clinton Street.

The Photo Lab, 269 State Street.

Montgomery Ward Order Office, 202 State Street.

Bern's Camera Store, 113 Broadway.

The coverage was completely negative and none of the business firms knew of INSLERMAN by name or description.

TELEPHONE TOLL CALLS

Through the cooperation of the New York Telephone Company at Albany, New York, Special Agent EDWARD J. LEAHY on December 30, 1948 reviewed telephone toll tickets covering the INSLERMANS' telephone, Cambridge 120-F-23, which telephone is listed for Mrs. ELIZABETH A: INSLERMAN. These calls were reviewed from October 1, 1948 to December 30, 1948. The only possible call of significance was on December 10, 1948 to Gramarcy 5-1454, to one LUCY GRAFF. (Identification of this person was ascertained by the New York Office, by teletype, but was negative in connection with instant investigation.)

Arrangements have been made to review prior toll tickets, which are on file at the office of the New York Telephone Company at Saratoga Springs, New York.

MAIL

Mr. KENT, Postmaster, Village of Cambridge, New York, and the rural mail carrier who delivers mail to R.D. #2, Cambridge, were interviewed, with negative results.

On December 30, 1948 a mail cover was placed with the Postmaster. As a result of this cover, one piece of mail of possible significance has been reported as follows:

January 4, 1949 - INSLERMAN received a letter from W. BULLOCK, Russell Sage College, Troy, New York.

The identity of this person will be ascertained.

SEAR OH WARRANT

On January 7, 1949, Special Agent FRANCIS D. O'BRIEN of the New York Office and the writer conferred with Mr. IRVING J. HIGBEE, United States Attorney for the Northern District of New York, at his office in Syracuse, New York. As a result of this conference, the following affidavit was drawn up:

2. In my official capacity, as a result of official investigations conducted by me and official reports and other official material read and reviewed by me, I am satisfied and believe that crimes have been committed, namely, violations of

" Sections 31, 32 and 34, Title 50, United States Code and Section 88, Title 18, United States Code (1946 Edition), in that within the Southern District of New York and elsewhere divers persons, including Jay David Thittaker Chambers, have sought and obtained and have conspired to secure and obtain information relating to the national defense, with intent and reason to believe that such information was to be used to the benefit of a foreign power and to the injury of the United States, and have conspired to defraud the United States of the honest, impartial and loyal services of certain of its employees by procuring them to remove and make available to unauthorized persons official documents of the United States Government.

3. In my official capacity, as a result of official investigations conducted by me and official meports and other official material read and reviewed by me, I am satisfied and believe that the above mentioned crimes arose out of the following: Beginning about 1936 and continuing to about April, 1938, one Jay David Whittaker Chambers procured certain employees of the Government of the United States to remove official documents and information from the possession of various departments of the Government and to make them available to himself and other unauthorized persons for ultimate delivery to a foreign power; as delivered

to Chambers this material consisted of original documents or written or typewritten copies or summaries thereof; it was Chambers' practice and that of the other unauthorized persons to deliver such material to certain photographers, including said Felix A. Inslerman, for photographic reproduction on microfilm, and upon completion of such photographing to return the official documents to the said Government employees for restoration in the Government's files; certain of this microfilm, which is of 35 millimeter size, has been produced by Chambers; the equipment used for the purpose of such photographic reproduction included at least one Leica camera; there is some indication that these practices were continued for an undetermined period subsequent to April, 1938.

4. In connection with the investigation of such criminal offenses, on December 23rd, 1948, near the Village of Cambridge in the Northern District of New York in company with other Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, acting under written consent duly executed by the said Felix A. Inslerman and in his company and presence, I entered the residence on a farm occupied by said Felix A. Inslerman and did then and there observe certain photographic equipment and accessories including but not limited to a certain Leica camera bearing serial number 234730 of which the said Inslerman stated he was the owner;

on this same occasion the said Inslerman referred to an enlarger which he had used in photographic work; on this occasion, the said Inslerman also made some reference to other cameras which he owned and that he had made a hobby of photographic work and had photographic equipment which he used in the pursuit of his said hobby. In a previous conversation held on the same day, the said Inslerman stated he purchased the Leica camera in Washington, D.C. in 1936 and had since had it in his possession; he further stated that he lived on Callow Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland, during 1937 and part of 1938; during this said visit at the farm, said deponent and other agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, with the consent of the said Felix A. Inslerman, took about thirty-six rolls of film; some of which was 35 millimeter microfilm.

5. In a conversation held in my presence in New York City on January 6th, 1949, Inslerman indicated that he also had in his possession on his farm at Cambridge, New York, other cameras; in the same conversation, Inslerman further indicated that he had the Leica camera which I had observed, at his Cambridge farm on December 23rd, 1948 brought to New York and it was then in his possession and that he intended to return to his farm at Cambridge, as soon as the Grand Jury sitting in New York adjourned for the day (January 6th, 1949) and that he would at all times, have such Leica

camera in his possession and would remain at the farm until early the following week. I have been informed from other official sources that the other cameras referred to above, including an Ernemann-Bob which he had had in his possession since 1936, would take standard film.

6. As a result of the information received by me in the course of the performance of my official duties in connection with this case, I am reasonably satisfied and have cause to believe that the Leica camera, bearing serial number 234730 above referred to, was properly designed and intended for use and which was used as a means of committing the offenses above described and that it was possessed and controlled and designed and intended for use and used in violation of the Espionage Act (Act of June 15, 1917, as amended). On the basis of such official information in my possession, I have further reasonable cause to believe that the said Ernemann-Bob camera may have been so used.

7. Deponent further says that on the 5th day of January, 1949 at the offices of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, United States Court House, New York City, he had a conversation with the said Jay David Whittaker Chambers, whom deponent knows has given information to the United States Government concerning the matters set forth in the second and third paragraphs of this

affidavit, and the same Chambers told deponent that he had furnished government documents to be photographed to a man by the name of Felix who lived on Callow Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland and who did photographic work and had a Leica camera; that said Chambers further stated in this same conversation that on January 3rd, 1949 he saw the said person whom he knew as Felix in the United States Court House in New York City and that he then learned that he was known as Felix A. Inslerman; deponent further says that he himself saw the said Felix A. Inslerman in the United States Court House in New York City on the 3rd of January, 1949.

8. Deponent further says that John J. O'Toole, Jr., is a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and is a civil officer of the United States authorized to enforce and assist in enforcing laws of the United States and is a proper person to execute the search warrant asked for herein.

WHEREFORE it is prayed that a search warrant may be issued authorizing the said John J. O'Toole, Jr., a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, together with such other Special Agent or Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation as may be assigned to assist him, to enter with proper assistance in the daytime, the premises occupied by Felix A. Inslerman and his family, near the Village of Cambridge in the County of Washington,

On January 8, 1949 at 10:13 A.M., the writer executed the search warrant at the residence of FELIX A. INSIERMAN, Cambridge, New York. He was assisted by Special Agents JOHN D. MAHONEY and PAUL R. BIBLER. At the time of the search, the following items were seized: (Turned over by the INSIERMANS.)

- 2. One Leica Camera #234730 and front lens number 1:35 F = 50 mm Leitz Elmar and carrying case plus sunshade and film contained therein.

The original search warrant had been exhibited to both Mr. and Mrs. FELIX A. INSLERMAN and a copy of the search warrant was left with them. Likewise, a receipt for the above property was executed and a copy of this receipt was left with FELIX A. INSLERMAN.

The return on the search warrant was sworn to before United States Commissioner BENDER SOLOMON, 74 Chapel Street, Albany, New York, by the writer on January 10, 1949.

The original warrant was returned and the original receipt for the property seized has been sent to the issuing Commissioner, A. VAN W. HANCOCK at Syracuse, New York.

A copy of the warrant, the affidavit, the return made on the warrant, and the receipt for property are being retained in the files of the Albany Office.

The property seized, while in the custody of the writer, was taken to Albany, New York, where it was personally turned over to Special Agent CHESTER M. PONTZ of this office, who transmitted it in person to the FBI Laboratory in Washington, D.C. on the morning of January 9, 1949.

At the time the Agents arrived at the INSLERMAN residence, shortly after 10:00 A.M., January 8, 1949, they were greeted at the door by Mrs. ELIZABETH INSLERMAN, who stated, when informed of the purpose of their visit, that she did not care what they had - she absolutely refused us permission to enter her residence. She stated this was her opinion, as well as the opinion of their attorney, LOUIS BENDER, who had so instructed her. The original of the warrant

was then given to her to read. She refused to even glance at it. She was advised again of our intent to search the property, and upon her refusal to cooperate in any manner whatsoever, the Agents entered the premises. Mrs. INSLERMAN again demanded we leave immediately and, when informed that we did not intend to do so, she requested that at least we sit in her living room until her husband returned, since he was just down the road a bit, and until she called her attorney in New York City.

At this time, FELIX INSLERMAN returned and was advised of the purpose of our visit, and was likewise given the original search warrant, and he refused to look at it. Offering cooperation, the Agents then awaited Mrs. INSLERMAN's telephone call to Attorney LOUIS BENDER in New York City. From the conversation on behalf of Mrs. INSLERMAN, it was quite apparent that BENDER reassured her the warrant was absolutely illegal; that the Agents had no business being upon their premises, and BENDER apparently was urging her and her husband to immediately eject the Agents from the premises. From Mrs. INSLERMAN's conversation, it was obvious that she was telling him that was impossible. It was the opinion of the Agents that BENDER was seeking to have the issue of violence arise out of the execution of the warrant.

Upon BENDER's request and Mrs. INSLERMAN's insistence, the writer went to the telephone, at which time Attorney BENDER informed him that he regarded the entire warrant as illegal, and that we should immediately vacate the premises, and further, he would move to dismiss the search warrant at the very first opportunity. The writer made no comment.

Mrs. INSLERMAN then, upon the request of her attorney, read the search warrant to him over the telephone. At the conclusion of her conversation, she advised they did not intend to cooperate with the Agents making the search, and invited the Agents to just go ahead and look.

After some time was consumed in the search, Mrs. INSLERMAN offered to make a "deal" with the Agents. She advised that if we stood outside of her door, she would then present to us the items called for in the warrant. The so-called "deal" was refused on the grounds that once we were outside the door, it would probably be shut. She then advised that since we would not cooperate to this extent, she would not either, and once again the search continued.

At approximately 11:30 A.M., Attorney LOUIS BENDER again telephoned her. From Mrs. INSLERMAN's conversation, it appeared that her parents were furious over having their residence searched, and apparently Mr. BENDER advised her that the easiest way to have the search concluded was to have her turn over the cameras in their possession.

She then made available first the Leica Camera, which was in a pillow on the bed and wrapped in tissue, and FELIX INSLERMAN turned over the Ernemann-Bob Camera, which was upstairs at an undisclosed location. Proper receipts were executed and the Agents departed from the INSLERMANS' residence, a minute or so after 12 noon.

During the entire time, FELIX INSLERMAN had no comments to make, outside of securing the full names of the three Agents who conducted the search.

MISCELLANEOUS

In the report of Special Agent FRANK G. JOHNSTONE, dated December 23, 1948 at Baltimore, it was indicated that one MARY KNETTLES had been a close associate of FRANKLIN VICTOR RENO and STEN ASKLOF. In teletype from Albany to Baltimore, December 30, 1948, it was stated that MARY KNETTLES was now reported to be living in Baltimore, where she is employed in the office of the U.S. Geological Survey, working under a Dr. ROMAN.

At the time the search warrant was executed at the residence of INSLERMAN, it was noted that personal correspondence from one BUD and JOE to the INSLERMANS had been written on stationery of the U.S. Geological Survey. The letters were purely personal in nature and were believed to have originated at Baltimore. It was ascertained that BUD and JOE refers to a couple, their last name being MASON. Since it is possible that the BUD and JOE of the U.S. Geological Survey in Baltimore may be associated with MARY KNETTLES, and hence in connection with VICTOR RENO, a teletype was sent to Baltimore on January 10, 1949, advising of the above. It may be possible to establish an association between the INSLERMANS and other persons connected with the Apparatus.

At the time of the original interview with INSLERMAN, it was ascertained that the only living member of his family is a brother, HANS, who now resides on East Borne Avenue, Long Branch, New Jersey, and who is a civilian employee of the U.S. Army and engaged as a Radio Engineer at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey. A teletype requesting background check on HANS INSLERMAN was sent to Newark on January 10, 1949, and the Washington Field Office was requested to verify HANS INSLERMAN's employment.

In connection with the purchase of the farm by INSLERMAN from DOROTHY G. HOEY and ARTHUR C. HOEY; JR., 397 Burlington Road, Borough of Paramus, Hudson County, New Jersey, it should be noted that at the time of the initial interview of INSLERMAN, he stated that his mother died when he was 7 years of age, and his father sent him to some friends, who owned a farm in Brunswick, New Jersey. These people raised him. INSLERMAN could not recall the name of these persons who had raised him, but did state that both of them had been born in Estonia. It is possible that the HOEYS could have been the persons who raised him or may have been associated with the persons who raised him.

It was also ascertained from INSLERMAN that since he has been working at the General Electric Company, during the bad weather months, when driving is difficult, he rents a room from a Mrs. JOHN ANKER, 496 Hulett Street, Schenectady, New York. He stated it had been his custom for the past 2 years to rent a room from her and to stay there Monday through Friday and return to his farm over the week-end.

On December 30, 1948 Special Agent HAROLD B. ROSS interviewed Mrs. JOHN ANKER and verified that INSLERMAN had taken a room at her residence from December, 1946 to May, 1947 and from December, 1947 to March, 1948, for which he paid \$4.00 a week. She stated he only stayed there occasionally when road conditions made it impossible for him to travel to his farm in Cambridge. She stated that, to the best of her knowledge, he had never received any mail, telephone calls or visitors while residing at her home. She described him as a very quiet person who never volunteered any information. She advised that he had come to live at her home because she had left her telephone number at the Y.M.C.A. She knew nothing at all concerning his background and advised that he kept no material in his room but occasionally he carried a brief case and sometimes she had observed papers with mathematical calculations thereon on his dresser, but could give no further information.

A check of toll calls on the residence of Mrs. ANKER failed to produce any calls as traceable to FELIX INSLERMAN.

The following interview is related to the FRANKLIN VICTOR RENO aspect of this case.

Colonel H. H. ZORNIG, U.S. Army Retired, was interviewed December 28, 1948 by Special Agent JOHN D. MAHONEY and the writer. ZORNIG is employed by the Atomic Energy Commission, Peek Street Plant of the General Electric Company, Schenectady, New York.

ZORNIG said he had known FRANKLIN VICTOR RENO since about 1936 or 1937, when RENO was employed at the Aberdeen Proving Grounds. ZORNIG said that he, ZORNIG, was in charge of the entire project and RENO was hired as an Exterior Ballistics Man. ZORNIG advised that RENO had been certified to be qualified for appointment on this project, through the Civil Service List, and as far as ZORNIG could recall, RENO came to him from the University of Virginia.

ZORNIG described RENO as an excellent mathematician who was something of a prima donna type, and referred to RENO as a Bolshevist. Under questioning, ZORNIG said he did not mean this in the sense that RENO was a Communist or a Communist Party member, but rather he used the term to describe one who is anti-social, which was what RENO was. ZORNIG stated he had never been aware of any occasions where RENO would take out any of the confidential material, but related that at that time there was no restricted or confidential material available to him.

Colonel ZORNIG stated he left the Aberdeen Proving Grounds in 1941 and at that time RENO was still employed there. ZORNIG claimed he knew very little about RENO's outside activities, and stated that Dr. LOUIS S. DEDERICK, who was RENO's direct supervisor, would have had much more contact with RENO and could probably furnish better information as to his social and related activity. He advised that for a time, RENO worked directly under Dr. DEDERICK and roomed at the Doctor's home at Baltimore, Maryland.

Colonel ZORNIG said that never at any time had there been a question in his mind regarding RENO's loyalty, and remarked that at that time the highly confidential projects were not underway at Aberdeen. Colonel ZORNIG stated

that the only restricted and confidential project at that time was the Norden Bomb Sight, but, to the best of his recollection, RENO never had any occasion to work on the inside mechanism of the Bomb Sight and thus would have no reason to have access to any of the information about the Sight.

ZORNIG also said he did not know of any security regulations violated by RENO, and concluded by stating that even if RENO had been a member of the Communist Party at that time, there would have been very little he, ZORNIG, could have done about it, since the Civil Service Commission had certified RENO for employment on the project and at that time membership in the Communist Party was not a bar to said employment.

Will also ascertain if it was INSLERMAN's custom to remove classified material for work at home in the evening.

Will ascertain the dates INSLERMAN has been absent from work, and seek to establish the reasons therefor, bearing in mind he may have still been engaged in clandestine photographic work and could have utilized these absences in furtherance of the program.

At the Schenectady Trust Company, 320 State Street, will secure transcript of INSLERMAN's bank statements, since the opening of his account, October 2, 1946.

AT SARATOGA SPRINGS, NEW YORK

At the Malta Test Station for guided missiles, will determine the number of times INSLERMAN has been at the Station, and attempt to ascertain his actions and activities while there.

Will review the telephone calls from INSLERMAN's residence telephone.

Will continue to receive and identify pertinent leads afforded through mail coverage on INSLERIAN's residence.

AT ARGYLE, NEW YORK

Will interview Mr. TED HORNING who INSIERMAN has described as the person instrumental in interesting him in the purchase of the farm at Cambridge.

AT ALBANY, NEW YORK

Will examine the New York State income tax returns of INSLERMAN.

BALTIMORE DIVISION

AT BALTIMORE, MARYLAND

Will identify "BUD" and "JOE", believed to be a couple named MASON, apparently employed at the office of the U.S. Geological Survey, and attempt to establish the connection between them and MARY KNETTLES, an employee of the U.S. Geological Survey in Baltimore. (Lead set out by teletype dated January 10, 1949.)

NEWARK DIVISION

AT LONG BRANCH, NEW JERSEY .

Will conduct background investigation on FELIX INSLERMAN's brother, HANS INSLERMAN, 237 East Borne Avenue, reported to be a civilian employee - radio engineer - at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey. (Lead set out by teletypes January 10 and 11, 1949.)

The lead to interview DOROTHY G. HOEY and ARTHUR C. HOEY, JR., who sold the farm at Cambridge to FELIX INSLERIAN, is being left to the discretion of the New York Office. (Lead set out by teletype dated December 31, 1948.)

WASHINGTON FIELD OFFICE

AT WASHINGTON, D.C.

Will verify the employment of HANS INSLERMAN, 237 East Borne Avenue, Long Branch, New Jersey, reported to be a Civil Service employee of the U.S. Army, operating as a radio engineer at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey. (Lead set out by teletype dated January 10, 1949.)
