ASAC Belmont, New York, called. He said that he was in conference with the Department attorneys concerning this case. They June wanted to know if the Laboratory was able to determine the age of the typing on the 65 Chambers documents and if so if they could testify to this fact. also wanted to know if the 65 documents had been processed for the latent fingerprints of Mr. and Mrs. Alger, Hiss.

I called Supervisor R. C. Feehan and he informed me that they could not tell the age of the typing. He referred me to the Laboratory report of 12-13-48 which was sent to the Attorney General concerning this matter. He also informed me that no attempt had been made to process the documents for latent fingerprints in view of the fact that a large number of people had handled them previously.

Mr. Belmont called me again at 11:15 p.m. I informed him of the above. While advising Mr. Belmont concerning this matter, I referred him to the fact that the Laboratory examination had revealed that Specimens Q3 and 5 contained watermarks. The watermark on Q3 was too fragmentary to identify, but the one on Q5 was identified as a watermark which has been used since at least March 1, 1929 on Government bond paper. He wanted to find out if it was still in use and if not when it was discontinued. He said that the Department attorneys were especially anxious to secure any information that could be secured which would contradict Hiss' testimony to the effect that someone got the Woodstock typewriter after he got rid of it and typed the 65 documents. He said that any additional specimens known to have been typed on this Woodstock while in Hiss' possession would be vital. In this connection, he said that the later the known specimens were dated the better they would be as it would show that Hiss was in possession of the typewriter at a later date. He said that any examination of these documents would have to be completed no later than 12-15-48 at the earliest possible time since if this Grand Jury is going to return an indictment they must do so on 12-15-48.

Mr. Belmont said that while the current Grand Jury may stay in session until 12-16-48 there is some question about its legality up to that time and if the indictment was returned on 12-169-48 it may not be legal; therefore, they are not taking any chances. 174-1333-283 RECORDED - 33

Mr. Belmont said that right now they are considering returning an indictment against Alger Hiss for perjury. They considered the 94 btaining of an indictment against Mrs. Hiss, but they felt they did not have sufficient evidence against her. He informed me there is no consideration being given to returning an indictment against Chambers now. He did say, however, that it is

anticipated that the new Grand Jury will be called into session immediately and will vigorously press this case.

Mr. Belmont stated that additional consideration is being given to the returning of a presentment by this Grand Jury; however, he said that on a strictly confidential basis he learned that this is very much opposed by the Department of Justice representatives on the scene as they feel it would be fatal to the case, but that the Attorney General and Mr. Peyton Ford are very much in favor of it.

Mr. Belmont desired that you call him tomorrow morning as soon as possible and inform him of the status of the Laboratory examination of any additional specimens which are believed to have been typed on the Hiss Woodstock typewriter. He also wanted to have any outstanding leads to locate such specimens handled promptly in order to beat the deadline. In addition, he would like to have the results of the Laboratory examination of the microfilm as soon as possible. Further, he wants a copy of the Laboratory reports sent to the New York Office if possible.

You will recall that I advised you of the foregoing.

There are enclosed herewith two carbon copies of letters received from <u>HARRY</u> L.MARTIN, former partner of THOMAS FANSLER, deceased brother-in-law of ALGER HISS. One letter is dated January 14, 1929 and addressed to Mr. R. E. PERRY, Assistant Secretary. The second letter is dated February 19, 1930 and addressed to Mr. FRANK E. BARGER, care of General Baking Company. This letter is apparently incomplete. However, the remaining portion of the letter has not been located by Mr. MARTIN.

It is possible that these letters, particularly the one dated February 19, 1930, were prepared on the Woodstock typewriter then owned by the FANSIER-MARTIN partnership.

It is requested that a comparison be made of the questioned specimens submitted herewith with the known specimens presently in the Laboratory's possession, which specimens were originally furnished by WHITTAKER CHAMBERS and alleged to have been received by him from ALGER HISS.

Reference is made to Milwaukee letter dated December 7th, captioned as above.

Subsequent investigation at Philadelphia has reflected that letters dated July 23, 1927 and November 4, 1927 were probably prepared on the Royal typewriter which was then the only typewriter in the possession of FANSLER-MARTIN partnership. The Woodstock typewriter in question was obtained by the partnership at a later date, probably sometime in 1929, at which time the Royal typewriter on which the referenced letters may have been typed was disposed of.

Reference is made to the original letter dated August 4, 1929 received from Milwaukee, wherein the initials HIM:AS appear. Mr. MARTIN has advised that this letter was probably dictated at the General Agency Office of the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company at Philadelphia, since he had access to two stenographers at the General Agency Office. It would appear, therefore, that the letter dated August 4, 1927 could not have been prepared on the Woodstock typewriter subsequently owned by the aforementioned partnership inasmuch as that partnership, which was a special agency for the Worthwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company, never had a stenographer whose date and that were AS.

On December 16, 1948, Mr. Keith Lewis, Washington representative of the Eastman Kodak Company, was contacted for the purpose of determining the approximate age of the film referred to in referenced memorandum as Film C, Grand Jury Exhibit 48. This film was one that allegedly was exposed and developed some years ago and contained 22 exposures.

Mr. Lewis advised that he had been called before the House Un-American Activities Committee on December 6, 1948, at which time he contacted his Rochester office and was advised that the film was made in 1946; however, this was later corrected by the Rochester office to be 1937. Mr. Lewis advised that the original date of 1946 was simply an error and that the film had positively been identified as having been manifactured by the Eastman Kodak Company in 1937. He further stated that the film was believed to be Kodak microfile film but there was no way of definitely ascertaining this.

One of the rolls of film was identified as having been manufactured by the Dupont Company and the Baltimore Office of this Bureau, utilizing The available identifying data on the film, determined from the Dupont Company what the particular roll of film was manufactured either in December, 1936, Sor in June, 1944. It was stated that a positive determination of the date Sould not be made without an examination of the negative itself. The following is being furnished for your information.

On December 14, 1948, a reporter for the "Atlanta Constitution" newspaper, Atlanta, Georgia, submitted to his paper the following story. The story was allegedly obtained by this reporter from one Russell Ingram of Cartersville, Georgia when Ingram visited the press room of the "Atlanta Constitution" on December 13, 1948, after he had allegedly furnished a similar story to the Atlanta Police Department.

"I was sitting in my room at the Kimball House early today (December 13, 1948) reading the paper when I saw a face that I will never forget. It was a picture of the Hiss brothers and I recognized one of them as being a man who paid me \$200 to deliver some sealed papers from one house to another in Washington in 1938. I did not know what the man's name was, nor did I know what was in the envelope at that time. I still do not know what the papers were about. I thought, however, that the papers concerned the marital troubles that one of these men was having. The man whom I recognized today and who was identified in the paper as Hiss did not actually give me the money but he was with a small man who did pay me. After delivering the papers I was detained in the second house for more than three hours during which time I was questioned extensively as to whether I knew the man from whom I originally received the papers. I was shapped across the face several times during the period of my detention. Later I was accosted on the street by the same man, Hiss, who paid me \$300 to deliver another sealed envelope to an address on 25th Street in New York. I made a second trip to New York later. I had not recalled this incident at any time until today when I saw the picture in the paper. There is no doubt, however, that he is the same man."

At the time the "Atlanta Constitution" reporter submitted this story he also advised that Ingram had told this story to the FBI a few moments earlier and that the FBI had shown an interest in the case and had told Ingram that they would meet him at his hotel at 9:00 AM on December 14, 1948. A representative of the "Atlanta Constitution" who brought the above information to the attention of the Atlanta Office of this Bureau expressed therepinion that the above incident was an attempt to pain publicity and that the newspaper was not planning a story on the information at that time.

Horace A. Ingram, of Cartersville, Georgia, who was determined to be identical to the above Russell Ingram, was interviewed at the Kimball Hotel in Atlanta, Georgia on December 14, 1948 by the Atlanta Office of this Bureau. Ingram stated that in 1937 or 1938, exact day and month unknown, he was approached by two men on Pennsylvania Avenue, Washington, D. C. One of the men gave him \$20 to deliver two letters in brown manila envelopes in Lashington, D. C. that same day. He advised that on the same day these two individuals gave him \$200 to deliver the same type of sealed, brown manila envelope to an address in New York City. Ingram stated that he delivered all three envelopes and that when he delivered the envelope in New York City on the night of the same day, he delivered it to one of the men who was present at the time he was requested to deliver the letters in Washington, D. C.

Ingram stated that he received no other money from anyone and had delivered no other letters for anyone other than these two unknown individuals. He advised that he made only one trip to New York and delivered a total of only three letters, two in Tashington, D. C. and one in New York City. Ingram stated further that he recognized the picture in a newspaper as being that of the man who asked him to deliver these letters and who was identified in the newspaper as Alger Hiss.

At the time of this interview Ingram denied telling anyone about this story since the day it happened, with the exception of the Agent who interviewed him on December 15, 1948. Ingram was unable to supply the names of anyone who could corroborate his story. Ingram informed the interviewing Agent that he had been intoxicated for a week and was observed by this Agent drinking before the interview. Ingram admitted being arrested numerous times for intoxication, but for no other offenses.

This matter is being followed and you will be informed of future developments.

RESULTS OF STANIBATION:

It was concluded that the machine which typed K31 was not used to type any of the questioned evidence which has been received in connection with this case.

It was concluded that the typewriting specimens X28 through K30 were not typed on the machines which typed specimens Q5, Qc74 through Qe131. Although a definite conclusion could not be reached as to whether X28 through K30 were typed on the machine which typed Q6 through Q68 and Q69 due to the years intervening between the questioned and known typewritings there were typewriting characteristics noted in the known specimens that are not in common with certain typewriting characteristics appearing in the questioned apocimens.

An article date lined Mashington, D. C. appeared in the December 17th, last, issue of the New York Journal American stating that John Foster Lulles had received a letter dated December 23, 1946 concerning Alger Hiss. According to this newspaper article, the letter was sent by Larry S. Davidow, a Detroit lawyer. Davidow protested the appointment of Hiss for the position with the Carnegie Endowment for International reace on the basis that Davidow possessed information that Hiss has a provable Communist record and that three Washington friends of Lavidow would gladly disclose this information to Dulles. The article also stated that on December 26, 1946 by letter Dulles declined Lavidow's offer.

Larry S. Davidow was interviewed by Special Agents of the Detroit Office on December 18th, last at which time he advised that he met Dulles in 1943 which fact he later mentioned to Ben Handel, Chief Investigator, House Committee on Un-American Activities. In November, 1946 Mandel wrote Davidow that Alger Hiss was being considered by Dulles for the position of President for the Carnegie Foundation and that he knew people in Washington who could establish Hiss as a Communist. Mandel never revealed the identity of these people.

In December, 1946, Davidow states that he wrote Mr. Dulles that Hiss could be established as a Communist on this. Dulles replied in the same month that he knew Hiss personally and could vouch for his patriotism. Davidow informed that he had furnished Dulles' correspondence to Fulton Lewis. Jr. who used it in a broadcast last week.

Davidow feels that Isaac Don Levine, Editor of "Plain Talk", New York City and Ben Stolberg, author, New York City, might know people who can establish Hiss! Communist connection.

Arrangements are being made at this time to interview Levine and Stolberg and Ben Mandel for any information they may possess in this regard. They will be interviewed as soon as possible.

You will recall that Whittaker Chambers has stated that Franklin Victor Heno, known to him as Vincent Reno, furnished him information which he had obtained from the Aberdeen Proving Grounds.

Franklin Victor Reno has admitted in a signed statement that he furnished Whittaker Chambers, when he knew as "Carl" with restricted information which he obtained from the Aberdeen Proving Grounds, Aberdeen, Maryland, in the latter part of 1937 and early 1938.

On December 15, 1948, Heno was interviewed in the presence of his brother, Philip Reno, in New York City. He stated that during his employment at the Aberdeen Proving Grounds, he commenced writing a book, tentatively entitled, "Exterior Ballistics Up To 1945" in collaboration with Professor Edward J. MeShane, now stationed at the University of Virginia, and John L. Kelley. new at the University of Colorade.

Rono advised that he met Kelley in the summer or fall of 1942, when the latter commensed research at Aberdeen, and worked with him and McShane, when he also met in 1942 at Aberdeen, on ballistics in the same office at the proving grounds. Kelley ceased his employment at Aberdeen in November 1945, and since that time Rono has been corresponding with Kelley and KoShane for the purpose of completing the book. None admitted that from time to time he ferwarded restricted material obtained from the Aberdeen Research Laboratory Library to McShane and Kelley in order that they might complete various phases of their mathematical calculations and other material for the book. The manuscript for the book was submitted to Reno's supervisor, R. P. H. Kent, for elearance purposes in order that the matter appearing therein might be consored prior to eventual publication. Beno said he is working at the present time on an introduction for the book which deals in general with the science of motion of projectiles.

Reno admitted that from time to time he charged out various restricted. Mr. Tolsomaterial for research purposes during big employment at Aberdeen. Reno recalled that he maintained voluminous noiss and research books among his personal effects at his Aberdeen office, as well as at his address which was, Care of Mr. F. J. Eston, Maldwin Manor, Aberdeen, Maryland. He believes that a quantity of this was procured from the Research Mallistics Laboratory, at Aberdeen, Maryland. Most of the material pertained to ballistics and his own notes and studies of various projects worked on by him at the Laboratory.

Remo resalled that after his discharge from the University Hospital in Faltimore, Maryland, on or about July 3, 1948, he went to his former dormitory room at Aberdeen and prosured his clothes, together with two books, one entitled, "Mathematics of Exterior Mallistics" by G. A. Dies, and the other entitled, "Table of Intervals", a book on applied mathematics, meither of which were obtained from the Aberdeen Laboratory. He ministed that this was the only data he took prior to his departure for his residence in Denvar, Colorado.

Remo likewise recalled that among his books and papers were various photostate entitled, "Anthematical Theory of Air combat" by L. B. C. Cummingham. He advised he was interested in the study of air combat and for this reason had the material in his possession, having produred mane from the Hessearch Laboratory. He advised it was a common practice for persons at the Hessearch Material School of state possession of books and documents from the library without following the usual charge out practices. He further reiterated that he has never engaged in espionence activity since discontinuing his connections with Whittaker Chambers in 1937 or 1938.

Philip Reno corroborated his brother's statement that their only visit to Aberdeen was in July 1948 at which time his brother took his clothes, several suitesses and the documentary material mentioned above.

On December 16, 1948, Louis F. Badens was interviewed in New York City concerning Alger Hiss. Budens advised that he had never met Alger Hiss but understood that he was a member of the Communist Party connected with the Mashington underground group. He stated he could not place the dates when he first heard of Hiss as a Communist Party member. He said that he can recall two instances when Hiss was mentioned in a discussion by Party members. The first discussion took place at the National Headquarters of the Communist Party during the time of the Hitler-Stalin "act. Roy Hudson, Robert Finer and Budens were present, as well as possibly some others, and they were discussing an attack on the "Daily Worker". Budens stated that someone mentioned that Nathan Titt and Lee Pressman could not be too helpful because they were under attack at that time. Budens stated that Alger Hiss was then mentioned by someone as a person who would be helpful and was referred to as a "good coursde".

Budenz said the second discussion took place in Jack Stachel's office sometime in 1945, at which time Bagene Denais, Jack Stachel, Budenz. and possibly Charles Krumbein were present. The subject being discussed at that time was the "Amerasia" case. Dennis stated that Lieutenant Woth, who you will recall was a subject in the "Amerasia" case, had suggested that Alger Hiss should be used to quash the case.

Budens advised that he had furnished the above information to the House Committee on Un-American Activities in executive session.

Budens advised that he did not know, whither or not Priscilla Hiss, wife of Alger Hiss, or Donald Hiss, was a member of the Communist Party.

In addition to the above information,"Budens advised during a previous interview on August 26, 1948, that during the Hitler-Stalin Fact, Eugene Dennis contacted him at the Baily Jorker" and stated that he had a technical difficulty and wanted to know if Budens felt that one Howard Hunter in Washington would help him. Dennis advised that he did not wish to contact Alger Hiss since Hiss was under a "cloud" at the time. Endens understood that Dennis meant that his technical difficulty was that he had

FX Main On December 14, 1948, the House Un-American Activities Committee turned over to the FBI Laboratory five 35 mm. negative films for copy and examination. These negatives were stated to be those previously referred to as the "pumpkin" microfilms. The negatives submitted were identified as follows:

- (A) Grand Jury Exhibit #49.
- (B) Grand Jury Exhibit #51.
- . (C) Grand Jury Exhibit #48.
 - (D) Grand Jury Fishibit #47.
 - (E) Grand Jury Exhibit #50.

With reference to negatives A and E, these are alleged to have been exposed many years ago but developed only within the last few weeks. Each contained approximately 30 exposures. Both of these negatives were fogged in many places and the emulsion on the film was badly deteriorated. This condition was apparently caused by the length of time between the exposure of the negative and its development. It is considered unusual that the latent image was even visible after the alleged lapse of time of approximately ten years. The fogging condition was typical of film which is developed a great length of time after its intended expiration date. One set of enlarged prints was made from each ef these negatives. Many of the prints were illegible. However, 35 photographs were at least partially legible and in addition to the print made directly from the negative, three additional prints were made of each photograph.

Film E was submitted with films A and B but was entirely black. Efforts were made to restore it and make it at least partially visible, but these efforts were unsuccessful.

Film C was a film allegedly both exposed and developed some years ago. This negative contained 22 exposures. It was a Kodak negative bearing identifying symbols as follows:

It was in good condition and one set of enlarged prints was made from the negative. Three additional copies of each photograph were later made from the first set of prints.

Film D was also alleged to have been both exposed and developed some years ago. This negative contained 36 exposures. It was observed to bear the motation "Dupont 428 mitrate" along the edge of the negative at 12 inch intervals. It also here frommarkers 19 mm. apart. This negative was also in good condition and four enlarged prints were made directly from the negative.

Thermogentives prepared as a result of rephotographing the first prints made from films A, B and C are being rotained in the Laboratory. There is, of course, no negative for film D since all prints were made direct from the original film.

A comparison was made between the material turned over to the Grand Jury and the documents developed from the film made available to the FBI Laboratory and no additional documents were developed from the film, however, the Committee made available to the Grand Jury a number of documents which were illegible. Some of these documents were developed so that they are now readable. A study is being made of these particular documents in an effort to more definitely identify the nature of them so they can be possibly identified with the originals in one of the Government agencies.

Mr. Belmont wanted to know the results of the Bureau's examination of the microfilm received by us from the HUAC. I determined from Supervisor F. L. Jones that the microfilm was only received this morning and the examination had not been completed. Mr. Belmont desired to be advised of the results as soon as possible.

Now we have public testimony for the first time that Chambers not only said in 1939 that a Communist ring existed; but that its members were looting the files of the State department.

Did the FBI have knowledge of Chambers' specific charges all this time? President Truman was vague about the matter the other day. He challenged a press conference assertion that the FBI did have knowledge of this charge, but conceded that the FBI did have knowledge of this charge, but conceded that the FBI has interrogated Chambers in the past and also investigated Alger Hiss, how accused by Chambers as one of the former State department officials who pilfered secret documents to be photographed for Soviet' agents.

There is a tendency here to assume that there was a high level "fix" (at worst) or plain disinterest (at least) in the story supposedly told by Chambers in 1939. This doesn't make sense. It is inconceivable that the Chambers story of Communist espionage could have been brushed off as "Red baiting" during the tense period that followed the announcement of the Hitler-Stalin pact.

Yet the evidence hints at the impossible. The testimony is that Chambers said that secret government files were being pilfered, and that he could furnish documentary proof of his charge. But the documents did not turn up until nine years later, when Chambers led investigators of the House committee to the hollow pumpkin on his farm.

Question: If Chambers did. tell his story nine years ago, how did he manage to keep from the FBT the knowledge that he had the documentary evidence which has turned up at this late date?

We'll probably never get the answer to this one, because only the FBI could tell the story. And any answer would make the Department of Justice look a little bit silly.

On December 17, 1948, Mr. T. J. Donegan requested the Mem York Office of this Bureau to interview Mr. Francis B. Sayre and Miss Annabelle Newcomb, his searchary, Lemediately upon their arrival in the United States. Mr. Sayre is United States representative to the United Maticas Trade Council and was formerly Assistant Secretary of State and immediate supervisor of Alger Hiss in 1938. He was returning from Faris where he had been on United Mationsbusiness.

The SS New Amsterdam docked at Hoboken, New Jersey, at 7:00 A.H., December 19, 1948. Special Agents of the New York Office, accompanied by Deputy United States Marshal Themas Parsan, boarded the weesel in company of customs agents. -Marshal Farsan served the subpoent on Francis B. Sayre in his cabin 5277 at 7:10 A.M. Marshal Farsan subsequently served a subpoent on Annabelle Memorab in her cabin \$221 at 7:30 A.M.

Mr. Sayre was interviewed by the Special Agents of the New York Office and he advised that while on routs to the United States he had received a cablegram from the House Committee on un-American Activities requesting his presence as a witness before that Committee on the morning of December 22. He stated that he observed the subpoens served by Marshal Farsan called for his presence before the Grand Arry in New York City on the morning of December 20, next. He commented that his plain were to proceed to Washington, D. Er. Sayre related that he was willing to cooperate to the fullest extent with the authorities but felt that in such a matter as this he would have to give it serious consideration and study before he would be in a position to anymer any questions concerning instant matter. He inquired as to whether there was a possible chance of his appearance at the Grand Jury in New York being delayed a day or two until such time as he feels sufficiently femiliar with the facts in this case to answer any questions which may be presented to him. Mr. Sayre was informed by the Special Agents that this was a matter for the consideration of Mr. T. J. Honegen, Special Assistant to the Attorney General, who was handling the matter before the Grand Jury, but if Mr. Sayre would contact the Department of Justice in Washington, D. C., 1t was felt that the decision could be reached as to when Mr. Honegen desired his appearance.

Mr. Sayre stated that his residence is 4853 Reckwood Sarksay, Mashington, D. C., telephone Ordway 3434; that he planned to be in his office in the State Department carly Konday morning and could be reached there through telephone number Republic 5600, extension 3860.

Miss Ansabella Memorab, 4707 Connecticut Avenum, Morthwest, Apartment 113, telephone Emerson 6800, was interviewed briefly by the Special Agents. She related that she was very upset by all of the publicity given to this case and particularly to Mr. Hiss. Mr. Conegan also suggested that if Mr. Sayre's recollection had not been refreshed that he be interviewed in New York by Special Agents when he doswers his subpoons in that city. Mr. Donegan requested that the same procedure be followed in connection with Annabelle Newcood.

had been made by Mr. Sayre with the Department of Justice to have his appearance before the Grand Jury in New York City postponed from December 20 to Tuesday, December 21, at 10:00 A.M. He advised that immediately following his appearance in the office of Mr. Gross he intends to proceed to New York City. No suggested that he be contacted at the office of Mr. Gross late Monday morning, December 20, if an interview was desired at that time. He indicated that an interview prior to his appointment on Monday morning would not be convenient. Mr. Sayre further advised that representatives of the Department of Justice have suggested to him that he not furnish any information to anybody prior to their interview with him Menday morning. He added that he did not feel that this applied to representatives of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Niss Annabelle Newcomb was contacted during the evening of December 19 relative to an interview. Nowever, she requested that because of fatigue she not be interviewed on this date. An appointment was made to interview her at 12:00 noon on Monday. December 20.

INTERVIEW OF MISS ANNABELLE NEWCONS, DECEMBER 20, 1948

' Special Agents of the Washington Field Office interviewed Miss Annabelle Newcomb on the above date. She advised that she first became aware of Alger Hiss at the time he was appointed assistant to Mr. Sayre. She knew nothing of him prior to that time. She alleged, in regard to typewriters, that while she was in Mr. Sayre's Office in the State Department she had never used a Woodsteck Typewriter. She was unable to recall that Alger Hiss had ever made any unusual requests of her stenographic shility for completing any material and she was unable to state any occasion that Algor Miss or any other person had taken any material from Mr. Sayre's Office but explained that she would not necessarily know if such action had taken place.

She was questioned concerning her personal knowledge, as well as any knowledge, she might have of any association between Alger Hiss and Whittaker Chambers and persons named by Chambers as appearing in the espionage conspiracy and she advised that she knew of no such association and had no personal knowledge or recollection of any of them other than that obtained from recent newspaper accounts.

Reference is made to my memorandum to you dated December 20, 1948, concerning the obtaining of the film in instant case from the House Un-American Activities Committee for the purpose of having it examined by the DuPont Company and the Eastman Kodak Company in order to ascertain the identity and competency of witnesses to establish the date of manufacture of this film.

Arrangements have been made for a Bureau Agent accompanied by William Wheeler, investigator for the House Committee, to contact the Eastman Kodak Company, Rochester, New York, and the DuPont Plant at Parlin, New Jersey, for the purpose of determining the date of the manufacture of the five rolls of film in question. It is understood that four of these rolls of film were manufactured by Eastman, the other roll being manufactured by DuPont.

You will be promptly advised as soon as the necessary information concerning this film is ascertained. The Bureau Agent and Mr. Wheeler are today in Rochester, New York, in connection with this matter.

Reference is made to my memorandum to you dated December 21, 1948, concerning the examination of film by the DuPont and Bastman Kodak Companies.

Information has been received that the roll of film in this case designated as the Grand Jury Exhibit #47 has been examined by the DuPont Company in Parlin, New Jersey. George P. Hunter, Chief Supervisor, Finishing Area, DuPont Photograph Products Department at Parlin, New Jersey, after examining this roll of film has stated that he is willing to testify that it was manufactured either in December, 1936, or June, 1944. In this regard, it has been ascertained that the imprinted code number 428, which appears on this roll, was used by the DuPont people for film manufactured in December, 1936, and again used for film produced in June, 1944.

Walter Demoy Baldsiefen, Group Leader in charge of Emulsion Research, DuPont Photograph Products Department at Parlin, New Jersey, after examining the film has stated he will testify that it is a coarse grained film and that the bulk of film made by BuPont after 1939 is of the fine grain type, approximately 95% being of the latter type. Mr. Baldsiefen will further testify that fine grain film should have been used for this purpose (the copying of documents), to 1939.

The additional four rolls of film in this case have been examined by experts at the Eastman Company at Rochester. New York. The roll of film designated as Grand Jury Exhibit #49 has been identified as having been manufactured during the first half of 1937. The roll of film designated as Grand Jury Exhibit #48 has been identified as having been manufactured in the last half of 1937. The film designated as Grand Jury Exhibit #50, an exposed coll cannot be it is probably of Eastman manufacture. In accordance with your instruction, I secured the name of () Special Agent Robert K. McQueen of the Washington Field Office as the Bureau Agent who would go with the House investigator to make the necessary inquiries of the Eastman Kodak Company and the DuPont Company. I furnished this name immediately to Kr. Nichols. He called back in a few minutes and stated that William Wheeler, investigator for the House Committee, was going out on this matter and that he could be reached at Branch 1343 on the Capitol Code Exchange; that Wheeler wanted to go tonight.

I talked to Special Agent McQueen and to Supervisor Delavigne of the Washington Field Office. I advised them that Special Agent McQueen was to accompany Wheeler to the Eastman Kodak Company, Rochester, New York, and to the DuPont plant at Parlin, New Jersey, for the purpose of determining the date of the manufacture of the various rolls of film, five in number. Four were understood to be of Eastman production; the other of DuPont. I explained that inquiries at Washington had reflected that the Eastman film was manufactured in 1937, the DuPont film either in December, 1936, or in June, 1944. The purpose of the trip now was to get a positive statement as to the date of manufacture and the name of competent witnesses to testify as to the date of manufacture.

While Special Agent McQueen and Supervisor Delavigne were present, I talked with SAC Maynor of Buffalo, New York, and advised him that Special Agent McQueen and Wheeler would be in Rochester in the morning; that they wanted to contact the Eastman Company; and requested that he make arrangements to facilitate the contact. He advised that they should contact Resident Agent Charles Harkins, who would make the necessary arrangements.

I also instructed Special Agent McQueen that when they were ready to proceed to Parlin, New Jersey, he telephone his office in Washington and advise of his probable arrival there, so that arrangements could be made at the DuPont Company to facilitate the check there. When I receive word as to their probable arrival in Parlin, New Jersey, I will telephone the Baltimore Office in order that they can make the necessary arrangements. It will be recalled that the Baltimore Office previously advised that this contact should be made with the DuPont Company in Wilmington, 744-

Re telephone conversations of November 24, last, between MR. WHITSON and SAC McFARIIN regarding captioned case.

Enclosed are photostatic copies of sixty-five pages of typewritten material together with photostatic copies of five pages of handwritten material. Same were obtained on Nov. 24, last from MR. RICHARD F. CLEVEIAND, Baltimore Trust Bldg., Baltimore, Md., attorney for MR. WHITTAKER CHAMBERS, by Agents DANIEL F. X. CALLAHAN and FRANK G. JOHNSTONE. The Agents executed a receipt for this material but it need not be returned to MR. CLEVEIAND. The enclosures are photostatic copies of documents presented by MR. CHAMBERS during his pretrial deposition in connection with the pending libel suit filed by HISS against CHAMBERS. The deposition was made during the afternoon of Nov. 17, 1948, in the office of MR. WILLIAM L. MARBURY, Maryland Trust Bldg., Baltimore, principal attorney for MR. HISS.

The original documents are presently in New York City being examined by a private document examiner named HILTON, employed by ELBRIDGE W. STEIN, whose address is available in the New York telephone directory. The original documents are to be returned to MR. CLEVEIAND at Baltimore on Friday morning, November 26, 1948, at which time they will be lent to the Baltimore Office. The originals will then be transmitted to the Bureau. The original documents were taken to New York City by MR. HAROLD R. MEDINA, JR., of the law firm Cravath, Swain and Moore of New York City, 15 Broad Street, NYC, attorneys for TIME magazine and associated private with MR. CLEVEIAND in representing CHAMBERS in said libel action.

The enclosed photostatic copies are the only ones available at present, however, MR. CLEVELAND, MR. MARBURY, and the law firm of Cravath, Swain and Moore possess a set of photostatic copies.

As explained telephonically to MR. WHITSON, the deposition made to date by MR. and MRS. CHAMBERS occurred on November 4, 5, 16, and the forenoon of the 17th, last. The injection of the documents by CHAMBERS, which he alleges he obtained from HISS, has lengthened the proceedings inasmuch as MR. MARBURY states he has many more questions bearing directly on the documents to ask CHAMBERS.

Approximately 100 pages of the deposition taken on the afternoon of Nov. 17, 1948, all bearing directly on the enclosed documents, have not been transcribed to date by MR. T. EDWARD McDONALD, shorthand reporter, 150 Equitable Bldg.,

following request of MR. ALEXANDER CAMPBELL, Special Assistant to the Attorney General. MR. McDONALD was supposed to have received instructions on Monday, Nov. 22, 1948, pertaining to the transcription of this portion of the testimony but to date he has received no instructions from MR. CAMPBELL in this regard.

The testimony for the three and one-half days to noon, Nov. 17, 1948, has been transcribed and distributed as follows: Original and three copies to MR. MARBURY, two copies to MR. CLEVEIAND, and one copy retained by MR. McDONALD. MR. McDONALD's copy is available to the Bureau at a price as yet unknown. Extra copies of the transcript of testimony from noon, Nov. 17, 1948, on can undoubtedly be obtained on request from MR. McDONALD, but such an order should probably be placed before transcription commences.

One of MR. MARBURY's copies of the transcript has been sent to an unknown law firm in New York City associated with MR. MARBURY in representing HISS in the libel suit. The original and the other two copies of the transcript are still in MR. MARBURY's possession.

One of MR. CIEVEIAND's copies of the transcript has been sent to Cravath, Swain and Moore, while the second copy is still in his possession.

No opportunity has been had to date by this Office to review the testimony taken during the first three and one-half days of the deposition. The Bureau is requested to advise if two transcripts of the complete deposition of MR. and MRS. CHAMBERS is desired or only two copies of that portion relating directly to the documents.

The Baltimore Office requests that it be furnished with a complete set of Schotostatic copies of the enclosures in anticipation of an early interview with MR. HISS. Arrangements were made with MR. MARBURY to have MR. HISS available for interview in the Baltimore Office on Nov. 26, 27 or 29, 1948, but such arrangements have been canceled in view of the Bureau's desire to have CHAMBERS' testimony regarding the documents available prior to interviewing HISS.

The Bureau is also requested to advise whether it is desired that HISS be interviewed regarding the entire deposition or only regarding that portion relating to the documents. In this connection, MR. MARBURY has stated that

the three and one-half days testimony to noon, Nov. 17, 1948, deals primarily with a "rehash" of CHAMBERS' testimony before the HCUA as well as CHAMBERS' background and life-long activities in detail. MR. MARBURY is convinced that CHAMBERS is and has been a "bad actor" and stated that the three and onehalf days testimony and his investigation developed a lot of "dirt" in CHAMBERS' past. MR. MARBURY was particularly impressed with the fact that CHAMBERS never produced the documents for patriotic reasons but only to "save his skin" in a libel suit.

MR. MARBURY stated that on Nov. 18, 1948, he went to New York City and showed a photostatic copy of the documents to HISS. HISS admitted that the sixty-five letter-sized typewritten documents appear to be authentic copies of State Department documents and that four of the five smaller sheets appear to be in his handwriting. HISS denied having given any of this material to CHAMBERS and wondered who stole same from the State Department and from his desk in the State Department and gave it to CHAMBERS.

According to MR. CLEVELAND, CHAMBERS claims he kept these documents for safekeeping from sometime in 1938 to Nov. 14, 1948. In case something happened to him, CHAMBERS left instructions to turn these documents over to proper authorities. These instructions were in a sealed envelope in the possession of a man named LEVINE, full name and address unknown, a nephew of MRS. CHAMBERS and a lawyer in Brooklyn, New York. CHAMBERS told MR. CLEVEIAND that until he opened the envelope on Nov. 14, 1948, he did not recall its exact contents or that the documents were so extensive. CHAMBERS also advised MR. CLEVELAND that previous documents of a similar character received by him from HISS in 1937 and 1938 were turned over to COLONEL BUKHOFF (phonetic). However, the documents now involved were retained by CHAMBERS and not turned over to BUKHOFF because CHAMBERS, at that time in 1938, intended to break with the Communist Party. CHAI/BERS' conscientious reluctance to "go all out for HISS," for whom MR. CLEVELAND claims CHAMBERS still has a sincere affection and admiration, caused CHAMBERS' delay in producing these documents sooner in this libel proceeding and in the previous HCUA investigation.

No further action will be taken by the Baltimore Office after the transmittal of the original documents described herein unless advised otherwise by the Bureau.

Those Stolen Papers of The State Department

TT IS NOW PROVED beyond doubt that on the eve of the Second World War important papers were stolen from the State department in Washington. This makes it imperative that all powers of the government be focused on finding out just how such a thing could have happened and on providing rigid safeguards against its possible recurrence. The affair no longer can be minimized as a mere "sensation" or brushed aside as a "political Red herring." It involves laxities and treacheries that touch the vitals of our national security.

There were published yestenday 21 of the 200 documents that Whittaker Chambers, confessed former agent of a-Soviet spy ring, says he obtained from certain employes of the government in the late 1930's, notably from Alger Hiss who was then an official in the State department. At the time they were stolen these papers were diplomatic and military secrets of the first order, and some of them are still considered too confidential for "publication.

Mr. Chambers now declares that they were in his possession, or in the keeping of someone friendly to him, for the past 10 years. But it was only a fortnight ago that he surrendered them to an investigator of the House committee on un-Américan activities. . He had made no mention of them when he first confessed and, renounced his Communist affiliations to the FBI, nor in his subsequent testimony before a federal grand jury in New York, nor at the hearings of the House committee last summer when he pressed his charges against Alger Hiss.

It would seem only natural that a man wishing to atone for past disloyalties and to wash his hands of the whole sordid business would have turned in this documentary evidence at the beginning of his reform, for it was the most important factor in the entire case. But Chambers withheld it until a defamation-of-character suit filed against him by Alger Hiss was coming to trial. Hiss himself, though he has repeatedly denied Chambers' charges, has a good bit of explaining to do. Some of the stolen State department memoranda are pronounced by experts to be in his own handwriting.

As the case now stands there are many knots to untangle, responsibilities to be determined and mysteries to be cleared up. This is a task on which the Department of Justice should bend its utmost efforts. Nothing short of a complete ferreting-out of all the dark corners will satisfy public opinion and serve to safeguard our national security.

To Gry 'Red Herring' Isn't Enough

It is too late in the day for President Truman to dismiss the evidence of Communist spying in the Government as a "red herring." Back during the campaign, when the Un-American Activities Committee was conducting hearings along the lines of a jamboree there was some semblance of justification for the charge.

But the facts today are that microfilms of some 200 documents, many of them still super-secret and the release of which would imperil public safety, have been recovered. There is as yet no indication of how many other documents found their way to potential enemy countries. While it certainly should be true, as Acting Sec. Robert A. Loveft testified, that security regulations in the State Department have been tightened considerably in the period elapsing since the documents were stolen, that fact has no bearing whatever on the need for vigorous investigation of the espionage now known to have taken place, and full prosecution of the guilty.

President Truman is quoted as saying that so far as the stolen documents are concerned, Atty. Gen. Clark will take the necessary steps to see that the law is enforced. But the truth is that the Attorney General has not shown too much interest in the case. And the Justice Department, including the Federal Bureau of Investigation, might well be accused of derelic-

tion of duty in its failure so far to follow up leads in America furnished by the atomic spy trials in Canada some two years ago.

The lethargy with which the Justice Department has dealt with the espionage case suggests the eagerness with which Toombs County officers tackled the slaying of Robert Mallard.

Grand Jury hearings have been resumed in New York, but so far they have been notable chiefly for the lack of enthusiasm by the Justice Department. It is reported that Atty. Gen. Clark was informed of existence of the stolen documents in mid-November, immediately after Whittaker Chambers' testimony in court proceedings at Baltimore. But no action was taken until the House Committee seized the microfilms two weeks later.

During the campaign politics inevitably played a great part in the Committee hearings and in the Administration's response to its findings. But the campaign is over now. And the evidence that has been uncovered lately plainly indicates someone, maybe several persons, unfriendly to the United States, had access to the secret files of the State Department. The documents which were stolen could be highly damaging to this country, even now. The charge of "red herring" cannot obviate these facts.

	On December 16 I received a long distance call Wr. Harbo

from Mr. Alex Campbell of New York City. He informed me that a new Grand Jury had been soorn in and that they would start to present witnesses to this Grand Jury on Friday, December 17. He inquired as to the date and time the Bureau received the microfilm from the Committee. I informed Mr. Campbell that this had been the subject of a memorandum to the Attorney General on December 14 and that copies had been directed to him, that I would have to check this memorandum to verify the time of the receipt of each of the films. Mr. Campbell stated that he had that memorandum in front of him and that that answered his questions.

Mr. Campbell further informed me that Alger Hiss had been arraigned, had plead not guilty and that the trial had been set for January 24.

He also informed me that he had held a press conference in New York and that he had taken occasion to praise the work of the FBI. I expressed appreciation to him for this.

Later in the evening of December 16, Dean Schedler of the Department called and mentioned the fact that there was some discussion that a flash light had ruined one of the negatives. He inquired if I knew anything about this. I informed him that I did not. I informed him that one of the committee investigators named Wheeler had stated that when the film was found it was in a can which was dented and which had permitted light to reach the film prior to its recovery by the committee. He asked if Mr. Campbellhad talked to me about the film. I advised him that he had and that I had referred Campbell to the memorandum.

With reference to Assistant Director Harbo's memorandum of December 16, 1948, which is attached, I instructed SAC McFarlin, Baltimore, on December 16, 1948, to ascertain whether or not it would be possible to determine the age of a developed negative from a photograph of the pertinent portions of that negative.

At 11:20 a.m. today, SAC McFarlin called back and stated that from the available data it can be said that the film was manufactured in either December, 1936 or in June, 1944, that a positive determination of this date could not be made from a photograph and could only be made from the negative itself. The correct person to contact to determine the exact age of this roll of film is A. H. Burkhardt of the Parlin Plant, Photo Products Department, Dupont Company, Parlin, New Jersey. Prior to contacting him the appropriate arrangements should be made through the Baltimore Office. At this time, further check cannot be made because the negative is not in the possession of the Bureau but is in the possession of the HUAC.

At 7:20 PM on December 16, the Attorney General called and stated that he had heard Fulton Lewis on the radio making a statement attributed to a high Justice official who was unnamed, accusing the House Investigator of having turned his flash light on some of the film in this case and therefore having fogged it. I told the Attorney General that I knew nothing about any flash light that i had not heard any such statement, that the only information I had () investigator for the House Committee, at the time that he delivered the film was found was dented and the cover did not fit.

The Attorney General asked if the Bureau could have developed it clearer had they received it originally. I advised him it could not be so stated, that it would be impossible after the films were developed to determine whether it could have been developed clearer had the Bureau had it originally.

The Attorney General inquired if I knew of anything the Committee had done that had caused a delay or hurt our investigation. I told him I knew of no such action on the part of the House Committee. He asked me to think the matter over and he would call me on the morning of December 17. He made the remark incidentally that he had just gotten back from New York City but that he had not gone to the Court House.

On the morning of December 17 at 9:30 AM, the Attorney General called me and inquired as to the number of exposures on each of the films. I called his attention to the memorandum addressed to him of December 15 and read from this memorandum the information concerning the number of exposures and the number of photographs developed from each roll of film.

The Attorney General then inquired as to the date on which the FBI first obtained information from Mr. Campbell concerning the documents in connection with the deposition in Baltimore and also on what date the Bureau had obtained these documents. I advised him that I would check this and call him back, that if he was not in I would leave word with his secretary. At 10:00 AM I called and advised Mrs. Grace Stêwart that the Bureau first heard of the documents in connection with this deposition on the afternoon of November 23 by memorandum of that date from the Criminal Division instructing that contact

be made with Hiss' and Chambers' attorneys in Baltimore. I further informed Mrs. Stewart that on November, 24 the Bureau obtained from these attorneys in Baltimore phos/tatic copies of these documents, that it was not possible to obtain the original documents on that occasion because, according to the attorneys, they were in New York being examined by a private document examiner, that subsequently on November 29 the Bureau obtained the original document.

While the Attorney General was talking to me he stated that he has taken the position that the Committee's questioning of Reno, etc. flushes other possible witnesses and is therefore harmful to the Department's investigation. I very carefully made no commitment or acknowledgement to this so that this statement could not be attributed to me or the Bureau as being critical of the Committee.

The Attorney General then asked "Have you received instructions not to cooperate with the Committee". I advised the Attorney General that I had seen nor received no such instructions, that our policy in connection with this entire matter has been to refer any inquiries from the committee to the Attorney General as is our policy in connection with all congressional committees.

The Attorney General then referred to the newspaper article in the "Washington Post" for December 17 which quotes Congressman Nixon as having said that he had called the FBI and had been advised by the FBI that they had no documents. I made no comment on this and the Attorney General did not follow this matter up.

I have checked with Mr. Nichols who states that the night prior to Congressman Nixon's leaving for Panama the Congressman had called him but that he, Nichols, had not made any such comment. He advised that there is a memorandum in the file reflecting his conversation with Nixon.

Donegan has advised the New York Office that he will have a marshal serve a subpoena and that should Sayre arrive in this country by boat he desires that Agents of this Bureau accompany the marshal down the Bay where the ship can be boarded, the subpoena served by the marshal, and Sayre interviewed immediately.

The problem at the moment, therefore, is to determine when and how Sayre will be returning to the United States. In addition, Donegan has requested that Sayre's legal address be ascertained, which address will be used in connection with the subpoena. Tuohy requested that the Bureau ascertain these facts from the State Department in Washington or give the New York Office clearance to make inquiries at UN Headquarters and other logical places in New York in order to obtain the desired information. Mr. Tuohy stated it was planned to have a Grand Jury subpoena served on Mr. Sayre by meeting the boat out in the harbor prior to the time it docked.

At 5:45 P.H. December 17, 1948, I received a telephone call from Supervisor Delavigne of the Washington Field Office making inquiry as to the interview with Francis Sayre. I asked him why he inquired as I understood this interview would personally be handled in New York. He stated he had received the instruction from New York Office. I told him I would check to determine what developments had taken place and would further advise him.

I talked with Special Agent Tuohy and SAG Belmont of the New York Office and Mr. Tuohy explained that since Sayre and Annabell, Newcomb were leaving New York at 11:30 A.M. for Washington, it was believed that it would be best to interview these two people in Washington rather than New York, having in mind the fact that the HCUA investigation and newspaper reporters would probably be so conducting themselves as to make an interview at New York impractical. I pointed out to Mr. Tuohy that there was no guarantee that Mr. Sayre and Miss Newcomb would get on the train at 11:30 and that unless the New York Office took steps to determine when that they were coming to Washington it was impossible for the Washington Field Office to logically and practically handle this matter. Hexplained that Mr. Donegan was principally interested in the service of the subpoenas which will call for the appearance of Miss Newcomb and Mr. Sayre before the Grand Jury at 11:00 A.M., Monday, December 20.

Mr. Donegan has suggested that the interviews be made in Washington. I told him to recontact Mr. Dence as to point out that if the Agents do not keep track of Mr. Sayre and Miss Newcomb in New York, that the matter could not be practically handled at Washington without advance information as to their arrival and actual destination in Washington.

At 6:C5 P.M. Mr. Tuohy called back and stated that Mr. Donegan held to the position that he felt that the interviews at New York could not be properly handled under the circumstances, having in mind publicity. Er. Donegan also stated it would be impractical without actually contacting Mr. Sayre and Miss Newcomb to determine when and where they could be interviewed. He stated that what he wanted done principally was to effect service of the subpoena. This will be handled by the U.S. Marshal. The Marshal will board the SS New Amsterdam before it docks for the purpose of serving the subpoenas. Mr. Donegan instructed that the Agents interview Mr. Sayre and Miss Newcomb in New York if it can be done gracefully but they are not to insist on the interview and, of course, should not attempt interview if the circumstances such as the presence of newspaper reporters and the investigation make it impractical, if not impossible. Mr. Tuohy stated that they would therefore attempt the interview but would not press the matter and that the Washington Field Office need not concern itself with this interview unless further information is received from New York Office. In any event Mr. Sayre and Miss Newcomb will be interviewed by New York Office when they respond to subpoenas and prior to the time they go before the Grand Jury. I immediately called Mr. Delavigne and advised him that no action would be required by Washington Field Office in absence of additional information from New York. INDERED - 130 34 DEC ---Sman th A.G. Later McDowell gave a newspaper interview at the Federal Building stating that the witnesses had furnished valuable leads for investigation in New York and Washington. Further, according to the New York Post, McDowell was seen leaving the Federal Building with George Hewitt.
