At 10:45 A.L., December 19, 1948, Special Agent Tom Spencer telephonically advised from New York the following regarding Francis B. Sayre.

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UNITED ST

Special Agents Frank O'Brien and Spencer went over to the New Amsterdam which docked this A.M. at Hoboken, New Jersey. They were accompanied by Deputy U. S. Marshal Farson. Farson had subpoenas for Mr. Sayre and also Liss Annabelle (Newcomb.

Mr. Sayre was served with a subpoena at 7:10 A.M. and Miss Newcomb was served at 7:20 A.M. today by the Deputy Marshal. These subpoenas called for their appearance before the Federal Grand Jury at New York City at either 10:00 or 11:00 A.M. Monday, December 20, 1948.

According to Spencer, Mr. Sayre, who is extremely cooperative, has been out of the country since August and he is leaving on the 11:30 A.M. train today for Washington. While he was aboard the ship on the high seas he received a radiogram from the House Un-American Activities Committee requesting his presence before that Committee in Washington on Wednesday, December 22. Mr. Sayre told the Agents that he would like to appear before that Committee and have the Grand Jury appearance extended after that date, adding, however, that he is not ignoring the Grand Jury subpoena but hoping for a delay. The Agents told him that this was something that they could do nothing about.

About that time in the conversation with Mr. Sayre by the Agents, an individual named Robert Clark, who is Agent in Charge of the State Department's New York Office, had a message for Mr. Sayre from the State Department indicating, that Mr. Sayre was to contact the Justice Department the first thing tomorrow morning.

Agent Spencer called Mr. Donegan, who advised that he knows nothing about any conversation by an official of the Justice Department with an official of the State Department so far as Mr. Sayre is concerned. Agent Spencer pointed out that from the conversation that took place between Clark and Sayre it looks like someone in Justice called the State Department and requested that Clark relay the message to Sayre requesting that he contact the Justice Department the first thing Monday morning. Spencer pointed out that it is not known what the contact of Mr. Sayre with the Justice Department is about.

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Agent Spencer stated that Mr. Donegan wants the Washington Field Office to contact Sayre later today (Sayre's train gets in about 3:00 P.M.) to determine if Sayre has refreshed his recollection enough to talk to Special Agents. If Mr. Sayre has not, then the Agents in New York will interview Sayre at the time he answers the Federal Grand Jury subpoena in New York, according to Agent Spencer, who pointed out that all this information is contained in a teletype to the Bureau and Washington Field Office which is being sent out immediately.

Agent Spencer also stated that this telephone call was made to the Bureau because of the extreme importance of the case and the fact that there has been some news flashes over the radio, something about the marshal serving Sayre with a subpoena aboard ship.

At your request the writer telephoned back to Agent Spencer at 11:00 A.M. He advised that full information on the addresses of Sayre and Newcomb together with their telephone numbers is contained in the teletype being sent to the Bureau and Washington Field Office.

He stated Sayre's address is:

4853 Rockwood Parkway Telephone - Ordway 3434 His State Department Phone - Republic 5600, Extension 3860.

He stated that the address of Annabelle Newcomb is:

4707 Connecticut Avenue, Northwest, Apartment 113 Telephone - Emerson 6800.

Agent Spencer reiterated that Mr. Donegan had made a request that Washington Field Office, early this evening after "they have caught their breath," contact Mr. Sayre and Miss Newcomb either by phone or in person and ask if their recollections have been sufficiently refreshed so that they can be interviewed by Agents; if they say no, it will not be necessary for Washington Field Office to do anything further as Agents in New York City will interview both of them at the time they answer the Grand Jury subpoena.

ACTION TAKEN: As instructed, the writer telephonically contacted Special Agent Maurice Taylor, on duty at Washington Field Office, at 12:20 P.M. Special Agent Taylor is also the Agent to whom this case is assigned. He received the two copies for Washington Field Office of the New York teletype to the Bureau and Washington Field Office referred to by Agent Spencer. He was advised of the request of Mr. Donegan as set out above. He was also advised of your instructions that he talk with Supervisor Delavigne, Washington Field Office, concerning this matter and to have Mr. Delavigne telephone you, at ORdway 4421.

Addendum:

Special Agent, WFO, telephonically advised of your request that he be given the contents of Detroit wire, dated 12-18-48, concerning Larry S. Davidow. This was done. Agent Taylor also requested that the letter of February 11, 1946, from the Washington Field Office to the Bureau setting forth information on Mandel in connection with the investigation of George Schwartzwalder be made available so that an Agent from the WFO could peruse it in connection with an interview with Mandel. Reference is made to WFO teletype dated December 19, 1948, which relates to the efforts to interview Francis B. Sayre and Annabelle Newcomb. The information contained in this teletype was furnished also to me by Mr. Delavigne of the VFO at 7:30 P.M. December 19, 1948.

At 9:30 A. M. today I talked again with Mr. Delavigne and he inquired as to whether they should make an effort to interview Mr. Sayre having in mind that he had stated that he planned to go to New York immediately after his conference with the State Department this morning. I told him if it could be conveniently done the interview with Sayre should be had. However, if this were not possible, his address in New York City should be ascertained for whatever value it might have. He stated that they would conduct the interview with Annabelle Newcomb at once.

SROOG pointed out to HALL "On this film angle, which to me is pretty het, I've got stuff that makes it seem hotter here in New York" 2-SROOG pointed out that according to United Press a high Justice Department official had stated that the House Committee on Un-American Activities had almost ruined one roll of undeveloped microfilmby putting a flash light on it when it was taken out of the pumpkin; further that according to NIXON (Congressman NIXON) there were two such rolls of undeveloped film. "Now we want to know if the second roll was developed and I would suggest that you go over to the Department of Justice tomorrow and find out if they developed the second roll." Continuing, SROOG advised HALL that if the answer was in the affirmative "which we presume it is, then the story is real hot for us". HALL pointed out to SROOG that the House Committee on Un-omerican Activities had admitted that one roll of the film was worthless and that the other was developed, but developed in such a way that it was almost illegible "because it was old". SROOG then stated, according to this Informant, "Well, that was the angle we were working on, according to what we know about microfilm it was just impossible to get anything out of it and we got a pretty big expert who gave us that; it's still a case, I think! At this time SROOG advised HALL that there was just one more thing "We'd" like to find out "without tipping them off as to what we're shooting at, just how it was, what kind of marks therewere, by which they identified the date of manufacture of films. We have reason to believe that that's not straight, see. Now, they say it's code marks but they don't identify what kind. As far as we know, the only marks that are put on microfilm by Kodak are emulsion marks and according to our expert, Kodak has only been putting the emulsion marks on microfilm for the last three or four years, get the pitch? Of course, he may be wrong on that. If I could find out whether they were actually emulsion marks, then it would be worth a trip to Rochester to dig, but we're trying to get that." This is to record that Reno himself says it was not information dealing with the Norden bombsight. Reno's statement appears to be accurate because he is talking about bombsight information given away in 1937 or 1938 and the Norden bombsight was a development which occurred during the war.

Reference is made to memorandum dealing with the mystery Mig witnesses appearing before the HUAC, New York, on December 17, 1948. It will be recalled that the information in the possession of the Bureau was to the effect that these two persons were George Mewitt and MaxiYerg both of whom are well known to the Bureau as informants and sources of information on Communist matters. With reference to the publicity which appeared on December 19, 1948, to the effect that one of these mystery witnesses was going to appear before the Committee on Monday and had been guaranteed FBI protection, it was determined by Mr. Nichols from Mr. Stripling of the HUAC that this person would be George Hewitt. George Hewitt in the recent past has requested FBI protection but, of course, it was not given to him. He has appeared in a number of deportation cases involving Communists and he was recently charged with perjury in the State of Washington in connection with his appearance before the Un-American Activities Committee of the State of Washington.

Upon receipt of your call about 6:00 p.m., December 19, 1948, at which time you advised that George Hewitt had told the INS that Max Yergan after testifying before the HUAC in New York had stated that he had attended meetings with Alger Hiss, I phoned the New York Office and reached Supervisor Tuohy, furnished him the known information and requested that Max Yergan be interviewed that night if possible or today as soon as possible. Mr. Tuohy advised there was a blizzard raging in New York but they would do what they could.

	On December 18 the Attorney General called me and real remington

inquired concerning the identification of the microfilm which had been obtained from the House Committee. I advised him that information was received indicating that the Eastman film had been developed in 1937. With reference to the Dupont film, the factory stated without seeing the film, they could not determine definitely whether it was manufactured in 1936 or 1954.

The Attorney General suggested that the Bureau contact some of the Committee to see if it was possible for the Bureau to obtain the film for the purpose of taking it to the Dupont and Eastman factories in order that competent witnesses might be developed to testify as to the date of the manufacture of the film. The Attorney General stated that it would be all right if the Committee desired one of their investigators to accompany the Bureau Agent at the time the film was taken to the factory.

Mr. Nichols is making the contact with the Committee concerning this matter. He advised me on Sunday that Congressman Mundt stated that after the subpoend had been served on Nixon by the Federal Grand Jury that the Committee had voted that this film could not leave the possession of the Committee and that it would first be necessary to get the vote of the committee.

I attempted to reach the Attorney General and advise him of the above and being unable to do so, I telephonically contacted Peyton Ford and told him. I further told him that the Committee would meet Monday, December 20 and would take up this question, following which they would advise the Bureau.

For record purposes, Cabell Phillips of the New York Times called and stated it appeared that the Bureau and the Department were subject to possible criticism; that, in fact, the Committee on Un-American Activities was saying that the Department and the Bureau had the documents turned over by file Candy <u>Thittaker Chambers</u> at the deposition hearing for approximately two weeks before the microfilm was found and apparently did nothing.

I told Phillips after checking that while I had checked into the matter, nevertheless, since we had made no comment on the case, it, would not be possible to make any comment now, and I suggested that it was a matter for Departmental comment. I did tell him off-the-record for his confidential information that the Bureau, of course, does not have the power of subpoena as that is up to the United States Attorneys and the Department of Justice as he very well knows; that we had not received the documents in question until November 24th and then a specific line of investigation was outlined which we were following.

A search of these prints revealed that he had no prior criminal record in our files and that the only non-criminal record was a civil service print taken on May 6, 1942, which was submitted by the Department of State,

On the reverse side of the civil service fingerprint card, under the heading, "places of residence" appeared:

"The following is based on recollection: September 1936 to January 1938 - 1245 - 30th Street N. W. Washington, D. C.; January 1938 to present-3415 - Volta Place N. W. Washington, D. C."

In answer to the question, "Have you ever been arrested for any reason whatsoever?", Hiss had indicated "Yes" and in the space provided he indicated: Date of Arrest - 1929 or 1930; Age - 25, Charge - Speeding; Court and Location - Traffic Court, Washington, D. C.; Judge - Hicks (I believe), Disposition - Fige.

On December 21, 1948, an answer was sent to the New York Office advising only that Hiss had no criminal record.

FLANAGAN, 1255 Penn Street, N. E., Washington, D. C., the owner of the premises at 3415 Volta Place, N. W., which Mr. HISS desired to leave. This latter letter transmits a lease signed by HISS in accordance with the contents of the above mentioned letter from HISS to Mr. GILLIAT.

It is requested that the typewritten letter dated August 28, 1941 be compared with the the specimens of typing as obtained in the material furnished by WHITTAKER CHAMBERS to the United States District Court at Baltimore, Maryland. MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TOLSON

MR. LADD

WhiTTAKER Chambers Augenties The Attorney General called me to advise that Secretary of Defense Forrestal had called him and stated that he talked to Admiral Sidney W. Souers of the National Security Council about the intelligence picture and he, Forrestal, thought it would be helpful if he and Souers and myself got together on the situation. I commented to the Attorney General that I thought they were soft-scaping us and I thought it would be best to delay this at the presentin view of the necessity of my being out of town for a few weeks very shortly.

We then discussed generally the Hiss-Chambers situation and I advised the Attorney General that over the week-end I had reviewed the material in our files on this case and felt we were entirely clear in this matter and had done everything that we possibly could. I advised the Attorney General that we had gotten a break today in that we had learned that Hiss had written some letters to a private school in an effort to get his stepson in this school and that the letters had been turned over to us. These letters were written back in 1936 and after a comparison of these letters with the Chambers letter it was found they were written. on the same typewriter. I advised the Attorney General that these letters were turned over to us with the condition that the school did not want this information to get to the Committee on Un-American Activities. The Principal of the school who referred this material to us was advised he could be assured this condition would be conplied with. The Attorney General then stated that any statements given on this matter should come from his office and that no information of any kind was to be given out. I assured him that his instructions would be complied with, and in fact these very instructions had been previously issued by me as I felt any information should come directly from the Attorney General.

You will recall that you desired to be advised of the names of any present State Repartment employees which might come up during the course of the investigation in this matter. The following is submitted for your information.

Thittaker Chambors stated in a pretrial deposition at Baltimore, L'aryland on November 5, 1947, that one of the activities of Alger Hiss was to attempt to draw new people of culture into the Chambers apparatus. Chambers said that as a result Hiss approached Noel Fleid, Lawrence Durgan, one Yest, first name believed to be John, and one Trueblood, all State Department employees. He said that Hiss' efforts concerning Field ceased when it was ascertained that Field was a member of another apparatus. His efforts concerning Durgan were likewise discontinued when Durgan was found to be a clese friend of Noel Field. Chambers stated that no results were realized by Hiss in his efforts concerning Yest and Trueblood. However, Hiss entertained them and was entertained at their homes. Hiss allegedly discussed various questions, such as the Spanish Civil War, with Yest and Trueblood, and found them to be unsympathetic to the Communist cause, thereafter ceasing his efforts toward them. These efforts on the part of Hiss apparently were rade during the last part of 1936 or the early part of 1937.

Noel Field is presently out of the country and is unavailable for interview. Lawrence Duggan was interviewed on December 10, 1948 and could not recall the recruitment effort by Hiss.

Edward G. Trueblood is presently enployed as founsellor, U. S. Imbascy, at Santiago, Chile. He was located in ashington, D. C. with the State Repartment from 1934 to 1937. The Files of this Eureau reflect that 19 sm Elizabeth Reutley alleged that Maurice Velecrin furnished her ecries of Com reports pertaining to fouth Inerican affairs. Investigation in the free ory case has disclosed that shorily after Halperin entered on duty with the office of Strategic Services in the early 1940's, he was sent on a trip to Serico and apparently while there became acquainted with Trueblood, who at that tires was connected with the Incrican Chasey in Price City. Trueblood had been in contact with Ralperin in Lashington, D. C. and othered his services if at any time he could be of assistance to Malperin. Charles W. Yost is presently employed as Counsellor, U. S. Legation, Vienna, Austria. He was located with the State Department at Washington, D. C. from 1935 to 1945. During the summer of 1940 it was reliably reported that Yost had been in contact with the German Embassy in Washington, D. C., apparently on official business, except for one occasion, namely, fugust 14, 1940, when he thanked Ulrich Von Giemanth, Second Secretary, for assistance in getting two relatives out of Foland. The State Department files reflect that Yost has a folish wife, which possibly may explain his contact with the German Embassy.

State Department files contain no evidence of suspicion directed toward either Trueblood or Yost, except a minor criticism of Trueblood by his superiors when he was assigned to a Couth American diplomatic post to the effect that he had "somewhat extreme political views." Trueblood was criticized in 1939 at Santiago for tending to consort exclusively with radicals. No other Trueblood was employed by the State Department during the pertinent period.

Chambers stated in a pretrial deposition on November 17, 1948, that he attended a meeting of a Communist Forty coll headed by Henry follins at the home of Elchard Post in Alexandria, Mirginia. Shortly thereafter he separated Fost from the apparatus headed by Collins and took Fost into his own apparatus. Thereafter Post obtained a position in the State Department and became a Foreign Service Officer. Chambers stated he maintained intermittent contact with Post, but Post never furnished any information while he was a member of this underground apparatus. Chambers said that shortly after Post joined this group, he, Chambers, disassociated himself with it and has no knowledge of Fost's subsequent activities.

The Fost mentioned by Chambers is bolieved to be identical with Richard Howell Post, Foreign Service Officer, Department of State. Post is being interviewed in connection with the above allegations.

You will recall that Whittaker Chambers has informed that one "Felix" was a photographer for his underground Communist Party apparatus who photographed documents in his apartment in Baltimore, Maryland.

On December 19, 1948, Whittaker Chambers accompanied agents of the Baltimore Office to the vicinity of Konig Street, Baltimore, Maryland where he had previously stated that "Felix" lived in 1937 or 1938. After touring the neighborhood, Chambers named as first choice the 2100 block of Callow Avenue, second, the 2100 block of Brockfield, and third, the 2100 block of Linden Avenue, Baltimore, as the likely residence of "Felix". Investigation developed that from April, 1937 through April, 1938, Felix August Inslerman lived at 2113 Callow Avenue. Selective Service records for this individual reflected that his employment included airplane designer, draftsman, electrician, professional engineer, inspector, and photographer. The records further reflected that Inslerman was employed in the Glenn L. Martin Aircraft Company, Baltimore, as group engineer in 1942 and thereafter was employed at Republic Aviation Company, at Farmingdale, Long Island, New York, as an engineer.

A photograph of Inslerman was obtained and was exhibited to Whittaker Chambers on December 21, 1948 and Chambers positively identified Inslerman as the photographer known to him as "Felix".

Inslerman is presently employed at the General Electric Company, Schenectady, New York, on a project known as the "Hermes Project", which is under U. S. Aray control. He is working on the hydraulic tail assembly of missiles and rockets. This work is regarded as extremely confidential and with TI DY important.

The lerman was interviewed by agents of this Bureau on Padember 23, 1948, and furnished a signed statement denying any affiliations with or knowledge of the allegations made concerning him by Chambers. He consented to a maiver of search to search his residence at RFD #2, Cambridge, New York. This search resulted in the agents finding a box of miscellaneous interfal including r. Tolson r. The following is a joint investigation of Special Agents DANIEL F. X. CALLAHAN, FLOYD L. JONES and the writer.

Mr. RICHARD F. CLEVELAND, 2500 O'Sullivan Building, Baltimore, attorney for Mr. JAY DAVID .HITTAKER CHALBERS, advised on November 24, 1948, that in connection with the libel suit presently pending in United States District Court for the District of Maryland between Mr. CHALBERS and ALGER HISS, a pre-trial examination was conducted by the attorneys for Mr. HISS, headed by Mr. WILLIAH L. MARBURY, 1000 Maryland Trust Building, Baltimore. This pre-trial examination involved depositions taken from both Mr. and Mrs. CHAMBERS, in Mr. MARBURY's office in Baltimore on November 4, 5, 16 and 17, 1948.

During the deposition of Mr. CHALBERS on the afternoon of November 17, 1948, Mr. CHALBERS produced 65 letter-sized typewritten documents and four small note-sized handwritten documents. Lr. CHAMBERS claimed that during 1937-1938 he had obtained these documents from Mr. ALGER HISS. Mr. CHALBERS further claimed that these documents were copies of official documents in the files of the United States State Department or summaries of such documents, obtained by Mr. HISS during the above-mentioned period as an employee of the State Department. Mr. CHAMBERS also stated in his deposition that these documents were turned over to him by lr. HISS for transmittal to a Russian named Colonel BYKOV, and that Mr. HISS knew of such intended disposition of the documents. Further, in his deposition, Mr. CHAMBERS stated that Mr. HISS, during 1937-1938, was a member of a Communist apparatus in Washington, D.C. Mr. CHAMBERS also declared in the above deposition that he had introduced Mr. HISS to Colonel BYKOV under the name of PETER sometime in 1937, at which time Mr. HISS entered into an oral agreement with Colonel BYKOV to supply BYKOV with documents from the State Department.

Nr. CLEVELAND stated that upon completion of this portion of the deposition regarding the introduction of the above documents, the pre-trial examination was suspended, since by mutual agreement the attorneys on both sides wanted to refer the matter to the Attorney General of the United States.

The following signed statements were obtained from Mr. CHANBERS on December 3, 1948, and from Mr. HISS on December 4, 1948.

"Baltimore, Maryland December 3, 1948

"I, JAY DAVID WHITTAKER CHAMBERS, make the following statement to FLOYD L. JONES and DANIEL F. X. CALLAHAN, whom I know to be Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. I understand that any statement that I make can be used against me in a court of law. No threats or promises have been made to me in connection with this statement. I have been advised that I have a right of counsel, but I have waived same after consulting with my counsel in connection with the making of this statement.

"I am presently a defendant in a civil action brought against me by ALGER HISS in Federal Court in Baltimore, Maryland. In connection with a pre-trial deposition being taken at the request of counsel for Mr. HISS, on November 17, 1948, I produced in evidence 65 typewritten documents and 4 small pieces of white paper on which appeared handwriting that, according to my recollection, is the handwriting of ALGER HISS. The 65 pages of documents were copies or condensations of State Department documents which were turned over to me by ALGER HISS during the latter part of 1937 and early 1938. These documents have been in the possession of NATHAN-MEVINE, my wife's nephew, who now resides on Sterling Place in Brocklyn, New York. He is a lawyer and has an office on 42nd Street near Broadway, believed to be in the Newsweek Building. When I gave him these documents shortly after I broke with the Party in 1938, he was living in his mother's house at 260 Rochester Avenue, Brooklyn, New York. When I gave them to him, I asked him to hide them for me and, if anything happened to me, that he should open them and make them public. He didn't know the contents of these documents or where they came from. They were in a brown manila envelope. I got them from him on Sunday, November 14, 1948. at his mother's house in Brooklyn. They were hidden in a dumb waiter shaft in his mother's house. There were also contained in this envelope three cans of undeveloped film and two strips of developed film which I will mention later. I went to LEVINE's house to get the small pieces of paper containing HISS' handwriting and had forgotten about the documents and the film until they were turned over to me.

"Also included in this brown envelope were four yellow-lined sheets of paper in the handwriting of HARRY DEXTER, (HITE. I had mentioned this handwriting in my deposition on November 17, 1948. The reason I did not introduce the three cans of film at the deposition was because it was undeveloped. I did not introduce the two strips of developed negative film was because I wanted to keep all the film together and possibly have the film developed and made readable

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at a later date.

"I did not introduce the handwritten pages turned over to me by HARRY DEXTER WHITE on advice of counsel because they thought it was irrelevant. The handwriting of HARRY DEXTER WHITE described above has been in the possession of my attorneys since November 17, 1948, the date of the pre-trial deposition. The three cans of undeveloped film as well as the two strips of developed negative film were turned over by me to two investigators of the House Committee on Un-American Activities at my home in Westminster, Maryland, on Thursday night, December 2, 1948, in response to a subpoena presented by them to me on that date.

"I have no other documents whatever of this nature now.

"As far as I can recall, the undeveloped film in the cans described above contained photographs of original documents that came out of the State Department and the Bureau of Standards. The bulk of the documents from the State Department were turned over to me by ALGER HISS. Others were turned over to me possibly by JULIAN WADLEIGH. I assume that these were classified Confidential and Strictly Confidential, the same as some of the documents that I presented on November 17, 1948.

"The documents that were presented by me at the deposition were copies or condensations of State Department documents. These copies were turned over to me by ALGER HISS during the latter part of 1937 and the first part of 1938 as indicated by the dates on the documents. These documents were given to me for delivery to a Colonel BYKOV, who had previously been introduced to ALGER HISS, at which time ALGER HISS agreed to furnish documents from the State Department to me for delivery to Colonel BYKOV. ALGER HISS was well aware that Colonel BYKOV was the head of a Soviet underground organization. It is possible that some of the 65 documents that I presented at the deposition were photographed and copies of the photographs were turned over to Colonel BYKOV. I didn't destroy the documents because I was preparing to break with the Party in about April, 1938.

"Some of the documents supplied by HISS were copied on a typewriter in ALGER HISS' home by him or his wife, and then turned over to me. In other instances, original documents from the State Department were turned over to me by ALGER HISS and taken by me in most instances to

photographers to be copied, the original documents then being returned to ALGER HISS the same night to be returned by him to the State Department. One of these photographers was an individual named, FELIX, whose last name I do not know, the name FELIX being a pseudonym to the best of my belief. FELIX was a member of my Communist apparatus and resided in an apartment, either on or in the vicinity of Konig Street, in Baltimore, Maryland. FELIX was placed in the Communist apparatus for the purpose of photographing documents of this nature. The usual procedure when I obtained these documents from ALGER HISS was for me to meet FELIX at some pre-arranged point in either Baltimore or Washington, at which time I would turn the documents to be photographed over to him. The documents would be returned to me the same night and I would in turn deliver them back to ALGIR HISS the same night. At a later date, FELIX would turn to we the developed or undeveloped film, which I in turn would deliver to Colonel BYKOV. ALGER HISS was aware of the fact that the documents were being photographed for delivery to Colonel BYKOV.

"Another photographer was utilized occasionally for the same purpose described above, namely, DAVID CARPENTER, who was a Baltimorean. He did his photography at the house of a man, a Communist, who was employed by Ludwig Bauman Company. This house was located in southeast Washington, the exact location of which I don't remember. DAVID CARPENTER was a Communist and a member of my Communist apparatus. I followed the same procedure in the handling of documents to be photographed by DAVID CARPENTER as described above in the case of FELIX.

"Concerning the four pieces of yellow paper on which appears handwritten notes of HARRY DEXTER WHITE, these are examples of material that HARRY WHITE made available to me from the Treasury Department for delivery to Colonel BYKOV. I met HARRY WHITE always in Washington and he insisted upon having the meetings near his home. Many of them were in front of a theater in the vicinity of Ordway and Connecticut Avenue, N.W., located on the righthand side of Connecticut Avenue, going north. At other times, I would meet him and we would drive around in his automobile. Some of the material that he gave me, I remember, were Office of Naval Intelligence reports signed by a Captain PULISTON. I don't exactly remember what they were about. He also furnished me reports about activities in the Far East. However, the supply of his material was thin. I remember one time he described to me a meeting between the Russian

Ambassador, OUMANSKY, and Secretary of the Treasury MORGANTHAU. He reported on how OUMANSKY acted at this meeting. This was one way the Russians had of checking on their representatives. This particular report was given to me orally and I passed it on to Colonel BYKOV, as well as other material that WHITE furnished to me.

"I was introduced to Colonel BYKOV by J. PETERS in New York City. I believe in front of St. Patrick's Cathedral, during the end of 1936 or the first part of 1937. He was introduced to me under the name 'PETER', a Russian underground worker, and I was told by J. PETERS that I was to help him. Later on, WALTER KRYVITSKY told me that 'PETER' was actually Colonel BYKOV, and that he was with the Fourth Section of the Red Army Intelligence. I think that Colonel BYKOV had recently arrived in this country. J. PETERS appeared considerably disturbed, due to the fact that Colonel BYKOV wanted to work his way into the American Communist Party underground apparatus in Washington, D.C., because it apparently meant that PETERS would eventually lose control of this apparatus in Washington, D.C. However, J. PETERS could not do anything about this. Colonel BYKOV wanted to know something about the personnel in the apparatus and questioned me very closely about them. He wanted to meet some of them.

"The first person that he met in the apparatus was ALGER HISS. In the spring of 1937, I arranged a meeting between ALGER HISS and Colonel BYKOV. HISS went to New York where I met him at a place somewhere near the Brooklyn Bridge. We then proceeded to a movie house quite a distance out in Brooklyn. HISS and I waited on a bench in the mezzanine of the theater, and BYKOV emerged from the audience and I introduced him to ALGER HISS.

"I arranged for similar meetings in Brocklyn, New York, between Colonel BYKOV and HENRY SOLLINS, the Treasurer of the original Communist underground apparatus in Washington, D.C. and an employee of the Department of Agriculture. I also arranged meetings between Colonel BYKOV and HARRY DEXTER WHITE and GEORGE, SILVERMAN in Washington, D.C. I believe that Colonel BYKOV met each of these people only on one occasion. He wanted to size them up as individuals, to discuss with them their work for him and the prospects of further developing their work, and also, possibly, to check on me.

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"At the time of the meeting with HISS, after leaving the theater Colonel BYKOV raised the question of procuring documents from the State Department, and ALGER HISS agreed. Following the meeting, ALGER HISS began to supply a consistent flow of material from the State Department, such as the type of documents that I presented at the pre-trial deposition on November 17, 1948. I want to say that as far as I can remember, I have never discussed the existence of the documents that I presented at the pre-trial deposition with anyone. Neither have I told any Governmental agency or Government body concerning the existence of these documents. I have never discussed with anyone the procuring of any documents from Government agencies for transmittal to Colonel BYKOV.

"In testifying to various Government agencies over the last ten years, I have had two purposes in mind. The first was to stop the Communist conspiracy. The second was to try to preserve the human elements involved. In this sense, I was shielding these people. For these reasons, I have not previously mentioned the procuring and passing of any documents.

"I have read the above statement consisting of this and seven other pages in typewriting, double-spaced, and to the best of my knowledge and recollection, I declare it is the truth.

"I, Mr. ALGER HISS, residence, 22 Last 8th Street, New York City, in the presence of my attorney, Mr. WILLIN L. MARBURY, give the following voluntary signed statement to WATTL F. X. CALLAHAN and WRATH G. JCHISTONE, who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the Federal Fureau of Investigation. I have been advised that I need make no statement and that anything I say may be used against me.

"At the request of my attorneys, Mr. WHIFTANER CHARENES, defendant in a libel suit filed by me in the United States District Court for Maryland at Ealtimore, was called for an examination before trial. This examination took place in Mr. MARBURY's office, 1000 Maryland Trust Building, Baltimore, Maryland, on November 4, 5, 16 and 17, 1940, but a portion of the time stated was consumed in taking depositions from Mrs. WHITTAKER CHARGERS.

"On the afternoon of Hovember 17, 1948, in the course of the pretrial examination, Mr. CHA 3333 introduced 65 letter-sized pages of typewritten material and four small sheets of paper bearing handwritten material. For simplification, hereafter in this statement the 65 pages will be referred to as the large documents and the four smaller pages, as the small documents.

"In introducing these documents, Mr. CHAMBERS stated that they had been received by him from me for transmittal to a Russian named Colonel BYMOV. Photostatic copies of the documents introduced by Mr. CHAMBERS at the pre-trial examination were first exhibited to me by Mr. MARBURY in New York City on November 16, 1948. The agents have exhibited to me similar photostatic copies of these documents, which I am satisfied are photostatic copies of the same documents introduced by Mr. CHAMBERS under the above circumstances. I have read portions of the court reporter's transcription of the deposition of Mr. CHAMBERS and I know from the portion of that transcription which I have read that on November 5, 1940, Mr. CHAMBERS was asked whether he had ever obtained any documents from me for transmittal to the Communist Party and he replied that he had not.

", ith reference to the large documents, I would say from a cursory examination of them that they appear to be authentic copies of United States State Department documents or summaries of such documents. From the date standpoint, these documents appear to be restricted to a period extending from about January to March, 1938. At that time I was Assistant to the

"Assistant Secretary of State, the Honorable FRANCIS & SAID. Documents similar to these normally passed over my desk for perusal prior to being referred to Hr. SAXE. I do not have any independent recollection of having seen any of these documents or the documents summarized while I was in the employ of the State Department. By and large, these do not appear to be documents of a very highly confidential nature and would not have been treated in the State Department with any special precautions at that time, according to security regulations in effect then.

"With reference to the smaller documents, three of the four pages appear to be in my handwriting. The fourth page, consisting of five handwritten lines, may or may not be in my handwriting, but it does not look to me as if it were.

"I have learned from talking with Mr. MARBURY and from reading the above-mentioned deposition that Mr. CHAMBERS claimed these documents and others like them were obtained by me from the State Department, and that I took them to my home, where typewritten copies of the larger documents were made on a typewriter in my home by either my wife or me. CHALEERS claimed that I then returned the documents to the State Department files. The agents have told me that Mr. CHAMEERS claims that on some occasions I turned over the actual State Department documents to him, upon which he would have photographic copies made in a manner unknown to me, and then would return the original documents to me for replacement in the files of the State Department.

"I deny that any of the above claims of Mr. CHAMBIRS is true. I also deny that I ever gave the originals of the small documents to Mr. CHAMBIRS at any time for any purpose whatsoever.

"From Mr. MARBURY and the deposition, I have also learned that CHARBERS claims he introduced me to a Russian named RATER, whom he claims later to have discovered was Colonel EYMOV. CHARBERS claims that this meeting took place on the mezzanine floor of a movie theater in Brooklyn, New Tork. CHARBERS claims that after the meeting, the three of us took a long walk and that during the conversation while walking, Colonel EYMOV asked no if I could obtain documents for him from the files of the State Department. CHARBERS claims that I agreed to cooperate in this regard with this Colonel EYMOV and that as a result of this oral agreement, I later produced the documents mentioned above. I deny that any of these claims of CHARBERS is true. I have never met and had never heard of any Russian named FETER or Colonel BYHOV until I was told of the testimony given by Mr. CHARBERS. Ba. 65-1642

"During the period from about June 1, 1936, to about January, 1938. I resided with my family at 1245 - 30th Street, N.J., and subsequent thereto, until sometime in 1943, at 3415 Volta Place, N.J., both Mashington, D.C. During the period from 1936 to sometime after 193d, we had a typewriter in our home in Mashington. This was an old-fashioned machine, possibly an Underwood, but I am not at all certain regarding the make. Mrs. HISS, who is not a typist, used this machine somewhat as an amateur typist, but I never recall having used it. Possibly samples of Mrs. MISS' typing on this machine are in existence, but I have not located any to date, but will endeavor to do so. Mrs. HISS disposed of this typewriter to either a second-hand typewriter concern or a second-hand dealer in Jashington, D. C., sometime subsequent to 1935, exact date or place unknown. The whereabouts of this typewriter is presently unknown to me. Prior to this typewriter coming into the possession of my immediate family, it was the property of Mr. THOMAS FANSLER, Mrs. MISS' father, who was in the insurance business in Philadelphia. Mr. FARSLER lived the later years of his life on "alnut Street in Philadelphia, but is now deceased, having died in the early 1940's.

Wontil I met Mr. CHATBERS face to face at a hearing of a subcourristee of the House Committee on Un-American Activities on August 17, 1946, in the Motel Commodore, New York City, I did not know whether I had ever previously met CHNETRS although I thought that newspaper pictures of him looked somewhat familiar. When I first appeared before the Mouse Committee on Un-American activities on August 5, 1948, I stated that to the best of my knowledge I had never met CHAMBERS. At that time it had not occurred to me that he might be GEORGE CROSLEY. On August 16, 1948, before a sub-committee of the House Committee on Un-American activities in Washington, D. C., stated that CHAPEERS might be a person previously known to me as GEORGY OROSLEY. Upon confrontation on August 17, I realized that CMAMBERS is identical with a man I had previously known as GACRAE CROSLEY. I first met CHAMBERS as GEORGE CROSLEY when I was employed as Legal Assistant to the United States Senate Lunitions Committee, commonly known as the Nye Committee, about Lecember, 1934, or January, 1935. CHANBERS came to me in my office in the Senate Office Building in Washington, D. C., and stated that he was a free-lance magazine writer and desired information for a series of articles on the munitions investigation. At that time I was on loan to the United States Senate Munitions Committee by the Agricultural Adjustment Administration of the United States Department of Agriculture, where I was regularly employed as Assistant General Counsel. At that time CHANDIRS gave me the impression that he as making periodic trips to Washington from New York City, where, I assumed, he lived.

"Between the turn of the year 1934-35 and the Spring or Summer, 1936, CHAMBERS contacted me perhaps six or eight times, always for the purpose of obtaining information for his magazine articles or discussing the problems of the munitions investigation. CHAMBERS was merely one of the number of newspaper men, writers and students who came to see the employees of the Munitions Committee about the Committee's activities. I deny that I ever saw or heard from CHALBERS from the Spring or Summer of 1936 until we confronted one another at the abovementioned hearing in the Commodore Hotel in New York City.

"During the period when CHAMBLES periodically contacted me in Washington, he occasionally borrowed small sums of money from me, totalling twenty to thirty dollars, four or five dollars at a time. He appeared to be hard-pressed financially. Also during this period, under an oral agreement, I sub-let my apartment at 2831 28th Street, NW, Washington, D.C., to MR. and MRS. CHAMBERS and child. Prior to subletting this apartment to CHAIBERS, at sixty dollars a month, I and my family moved into a three-story house at 2905 P Street, NW, Washington, Before taking occupancy of the abovementioned apartment, CHALIBERS D. C. and his family spent two or three days on the third floor of my home on P Street. My recollection is that Mr. CHAMBERS informed me that some of his furniture or other possessions had not arrived on time; that his family and he could not, therefore, move into the 28th Street apartment immediately. We put them up as a favor to sub-tenants. As far as I know, CHAMBERS and his family lived in the apartment on 28th Street until the expiration of my lease on July 1, 1935. During sub-tenancy of my apartment on 28th Street by CHAMBERS, I continued to pay the rent and CHAMBERS has never reimbursed me nor has he repaid the small loans. He did on one occasion give me a rug which he said he had received from some patron of his and while they were staying at my house on P Street, his wife painted a portrait of my young stepson, TIMOTHY HOBSON, who was then eight years old. I have no clear recollection of the date of my last contact with CHAMBERS, which probably occurred in the Spring or Summer of 1936, while I was employed as an attorney by the Department of Justice in Washington, D. C. However, I do recall the contact quite well and on this occasion I told Mr. CHAMBERS that I did not think he would ever repay the loans he had made and that I thought we should discontinue any further contacts. I also want to state that CHAMBERS never paid me any funds, for any During the period mentioned above when CHAMBERS was contacting purpose. me, most of the contacts were made by him at my office or for lunch, with the possible exceptions that he may have contacted me on several occasions at my residences.

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"In connection with the sublease of the apartment, Ι occasionally lent Mr. CHAMBERS the use of my 1929 model Ford roadster. This Ford was dark blue in color, had a rumble seat and a small trunk in the rear, and bore District of Columbia plates. Sometime in the Summer of 1935, I acquired a 1935 Plymouth, two-door sedan, a demonstrator model. Sometime after acquiring the Plymouth, I told Lr. CHAMBERS he could have the Ford roadster. which I had been told had a trade-in value of twenty-five dollars when I bought the Plymouth. If Hr. CHALBERS used the Ford in the Fall of 1935 or the Winter of 1935-36, it must have been only occasionally because I recall it sitting on the streets of Georgetown during a number of months of that Winter. Sometime before I left P Street, about May or June, 1936, CHAMBERS took permanent possession of the car under circumstances I do not now exactly recall. At that time or earlier I had turned over to him the certificate of title. I did not have the Ford after that date and have never seen it since. I have no recollection of the occasion on which I signed the certificate of title. The certificate of title for the Ford bears what appeared to be my signature witnessed under date of July 23, 1936, by MARVIN SMITH, a notary public, who was also employed in the same office where I was in the Department of Justice. I can only assume that the certificate was brought to me in my office in the Department of Justice by someone who said that I had disposed of the car without completing the legal technicalities and that I signed under those circumstances and asked MARVIN SMITH to witness my signature.

"As far as I can remember, the above represents a history of all my contacts and dealings with Mr. CHAMBERS to date which appear to me to be pertinent.

"I have made an effort personally, through counsel and private investigators, to locate other persons who knew CHAMBERS as GEORGE CROSLEY during the period from the turn of the year 1934-1935 to the spring or summer of 1936, but without success. I have discovered one person who claims that CHAMBERS at one time submitted a manuscript to him for publication under the name GEORGE CROSLEY, but that was during a much earlier period, approximately in 1926. Both Mr. and Mrs. CHAMBERS state that during this time, they were living in Baltimore under the name of LLOYD CANIWELL, as I have learned from the deposition. This search, of course, excepts Mrs. HISS and TIMOTHY HOBSON, my stepson, who

"was only eight years old during the above mentioned period. This search included inquiry among known fellow employees of the United States Senate Munitions Committee, and persons that either my wife or I introduced CHAMBERS or his wife to under the name of CROSLEY. This search to confirm my statement that CHAMBERS was going under the name of GEORGE CROSLEY during the above mentioned period will continue and if successful, the Government will be advised.

"I deny that I am now or ever have been a member of the Communist Party or that I have ever attended any Communist Party meetings. Likewise, I deny that I have ever been a member of a Communist Party espionage apparatus or underground group in Washington, D.C. or anywhere else, at any time.

"I never saw Mr. CHAMBERS at any time in the State Department. I know of no opportunity had by Mr. CHAMBERS, either in my office in the State Department or in my residence or any other place, to obtain any documents pertaining to State Department business, during the period 1937-1938 or any other time. I do not know whether CHAMBERS personally obtained these documents from the State Department or whether he had some confederate who cooperated with him in obtaining these documents.

"I assert that Mr. CHAMBERS' entire story, with respect to the matters covered above that relate to me, is a complete fabrication except as otherwise indicated in this statement by me.

"I do not know what motive Mr. CHAMBERS could have for making these accusations against me, but I think that a thorough examination of Mr. CHAMBERS' life and personal background might throw some light on this problem.

"The foregoing represents an accurate account of statements I have made today to Mr. JOHNSTONE and Mr. CALLAHAN. It was dictated in my presence and that of my counsel, Mr. MARBURY, and I assisted at various places in the phrasing of that dictation. I have read the entire statement and have signed it below this paragraph and have initialled each page at the bottom thereof."

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DETAILS:

AT WASHING TON. D. C.

On the instant of Monday, December 6, 1948, HENRY JULIAN WADLEIGH was interviewed at his office with the Italian Technical Delegation of the Italian Embassy, 740 11st Street, NW, Room 800, Washington, D.C., by Special Agent MAURICE A. TAYLOR and the writer.

WADLEIGH outlined his early history and background briefly and then furnished chronology of his employment as set forth hereinafter in statement form. In connection with his employment he advised that he had worked for the United States Government from approximately 1930 until 1946. He was first employed by the Federal Farm Board in Washington, D.C., after completing his education as a graduate student of the University of Chicago. From the Federal Farm Board he was transferred to the Department of Agriculture in 1932 and remained there until 1936. His immediate superior was LYNN EDMINSTER.

In 1936 EDMINSTER and WADLEIGH both left the Department of Agriculture and secured employment with the State Department. WADLEIGH explained that this change was occasioned by a controversy between EDMINSTER and his superiors which grew out of the presentation of a matter which had been prepared by WADLEIGH under the instructions of EDMINSTER. He stated that EDMINSTER had been ordered to dismiss WADLEIGH but had chosen to resign himself as WADLEIGH had been acting under his instructions. WADLEIGH denied that he had sought employment in the State Department under the instructions of any individual or that his purpose and objective had been to place himself where he would be able to furnish information to any outside or underground organization. He insisted he had accompanied EDMINSTER under the circumstances indicated.

WADLEIGH stated from 1936 until late 1939 or early 1940 he had served in the State Department, working in the Trade Agreements Division. Thereafter he was designated to work as an assistant to LEO PASVOLSKY, Special Assistant to the Secretary and who was economic advisor of trade agreements. He advised that this work was later incorporated into the Division of Special Research of which he became assistant chief. In January 1943 a new Division of Economic Studies was formed and WADLEIGH became assistant chief of this unit.

In July 1943 WADLEIGH stated he was transferred to an office under the direct supervision of Under-Secretary DEAN ACHESON and was engaged in the preparation of programs for Italy. He stated in December of 1943 he made a trip to Italy for the State Department and upon his return was assigned to the Foreign Economic Administration.

From December 1944 until May 1946 WADLEIGH stated he was again employed in the Department of Agriculture and in May 1946 he secured employ ment with UNERA where he remained until about the time of the discontinuance of UNERA's activities after which he obtained his present position of food advisor to the Italian Technical Delegation of the Italian Embassy.

Thereafter WADLEIGH was questioned concerning his acquaintance and/or association with ALGER HISS, LEANDER BELL LOVELL, LAURENCE DUGGAN and ELINOR NELSON, whose names were furnished in the past by WHITTAKER CHAMBERS in various interviews. Finally WADLEIGH was questioned concerning WHITTAKER CHAMBERS, himself, and upon mention of the names of ALGER HISS and WHITTAKER CHAMBERS he indicated he realized the nature of the inquiry and what the interview was all about. WADLEIGH denied ever having met WHITTAKER CHAMBERS and stated categorically that he had never furnished any documents or other information obtained in connection with his employment in the State Department to CHAMBERS or any other unauthorized source. He also denied membership in the Communist Party or association with any Communist Party members as such.

Concerning the other individuals mentioned above, WADLEIGH advised he was acquainted with ALGER HISS whom he knew by his first name as a colleague or associate in the State Department. He explained that the Division of Trade Agreements where he worked between 1936 and 1939-40 was under the supervision of Mr. FRANCIS B. SAYRE, Assistant to the Secretary, who was then immediate superior of HISS, and in view of this connection he had occasion to talk with HISS on official business and to exchange information with him. He stated he had never known HISS socially except for a single luncheon engagement as he recalled.

WADLEIGH advised that he had followed the newspaper accounts of the WHITTAKER CHAMBERS exposures and was genuinely amazed when the name of AIGER HISS came to light. He described HISS as an individual whom he believed to be a genuine liberal but with a definite conservative approach. He stated that even after reading the early accounts in the paper he was disposed not to believe that HISS had been guilty of underground or espionage involvement.

With reference to LEANDER B. LOVELL, WADLEIGH stated that this individual, whom he knew as LEE LOVELL, was employed in the Trade Agreements Division when WADLEIGH first came to the State Department. He recalled that LOVELL had been active in organizing the union at the State Department, which he believed was the predecessor of UFWA, and that LOVELL had actively solicited his membership and dues subsequently. He stated he feels he may have joined the union and paid dues on one or two occasions but he did not attend meetings and gradually discontinued association with the union. He stated he knew of no underground activity on the part of LOVELL and was not aware that LOVELL was a Communist if this were true. He stated he doubted that LOVELL was engaged in any underground activity because of his continued active work with the union and WADLEIGH felt this would have been improbable if he were connected with the Communist Party underground.

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WADLEIGH denied knowing RICHARD HOWELL POST and indicated that the name was entirely unfamiliar to him.

WADLEIGH stated he was acquainted with ELINCR MELSON, stating that he had met her about 1930, first socially and later had worked with her in the Socialist Party in the early 1930's at which time both were members of this party. He stated that about 1933 he dropped his membership in the Socialist Party and discontinued his associations there. Thereafter he occasionally saw ELINOR NELSON and had luncheon engagements with her on a few occasions. He believes he last saw her shortly before the war.

With reference to LAURENCE DUGGAN, also called LARRY DUGGAN, " WADLEIGH advised that during the early years, probably in the early 1930's, he had met DUGGAN socially but was not intimately acquainted with him and had no connection with him in his work at the State Department. He stated that DUGGAN gradually rose in his career at the State Department until DUGGAN was head of the Latin-American Division. As DUGGAN did so their acquaintance waned until they discontinued seeing each other.

WADLETGH denied flatly having any association or acquaintance with HEDDA GOMPERTZ and continued to make this denial throughout the interview. In this connection WADLEIGH denied that he was a member of any Communist group or a member of the Party, stating during the latter part of the interview that although he had considerable sympathy for the Communist viewpoint and was strongly leftist in his own sentiments he never quite felt like joining the Party.

Following the mentioning of the names of ALGER HISS and WHITTAKER CHAMBERS, WADLEIGH indicated considerable nervousness although he continued to deny any association with CHAMBERS or any underground activity. Upon conclusion of the interview in WADLEIGH's office he was asked if he objected to furnishing a signed statement imbodying his denials, and he expressed a willingness to do so. When agents began preparation of a typewritten statement, however, on the spot Mr. WADLEIGH suddenly arose from his chair and stated, "I'm not going to sign that statement." Almost immediately thereafter, however, he announced rather dramatically that he was willing to give a statement and make a complete confession. He was then invited to the Washington Field Office and thereafter accompanied Agents to that office where the following signed statement was dictated by WADLEIGH:

> "Mashington, D.C. December 6, 1948

"I, HENRY JULIAN WADLEIGH, make the following statement to MAURICE A. TAYLOR and LAMBERT G. ZANDER, whom I know to be Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, U.S. Department of

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Justice. I understand that any statement that I make can be used against me in a court of law. No threats or promises have been made to me in connection with this statement. I have been advised that I have a right to counsel.

"I was born in Greenfield, Massachusetts, February 4, 1904. When I was three years old I traveled abroad with my parents and lived in Europe until I was 25. I got my education in Europe until that time, going to college at Oxford, England, and to the London School of Economics.

"When I returned to the United States in 1929 I spent one year as a graduate student at the University of Chicago and after that was employed by the Federal Farm Board in Washington, D. C. That was in June or July 1930. In 1932 I was transferred to the Department of Agriculture where I worked on problems connected with foreign trade and agricultural products. In 1936 I was transferred to the State Department. The transfer resulted from a disagreement on policy between my immediate superior, Mr. LYNN R. ELMINSTER, and his superior. I drafted a memorandum on the instructions of EDMINSTER which caused EDMINISTER's superior to order EDMINSTER to terminate my employment. EDMINSTER obtained a position for himself and also for me at the State Department.

"In the State Department I worked in the Division of Trade Agreements from March 1936 until, I think, 1939 or 1940, under HARRY HAWKINS. In the winter of 1939-40, approximately, I was transferred to work with Mr. LEO PASVOLSKY who was then Special Assistant to the Secretary and remained under his supervision until 1943 when I tent to Italy on a State Department mission. I returned at the end of 1944 and was employed at the Department of Agriculture. In May 1946 I resigned from the Department of Agriculture and was employed in UNREA. After the termination of my employment with UNREA, I obtained employment in the Italian Technical Delegation of the Italian Embassy.

"In 1935 or 1936 I made the acquaintance of a man who described himself as MAROLD WILSON. My first meeting with him arose out of a chance conversation on a railroad coach going from New York to Washington. 'HAROLD' described himself as a free lance writer but was rather mysterious about his activities. The continuation of my acquaintance with 'HAROLD' was due mainly to the fact that he called me at my office to make lunch dates from time to time.

"Around that time my sympathies were strongly leftist. I had previously been a Socialist in the sense that I was an admirer

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of the British Labor Party, of the German Socialist Democratic Party and for a while was a member of the Socialist Party in the United States. The failure of the Social Democrats in Germany to offer effective resistance against HITLER, the growing power of the Nazis in Germany, of the ruling group in Japan, and the Fascists in Italy seemed to me thoroughly alarming and so far as I could see the Communists and Soviet Union were offering the only effective opposition. The British were giving all the breaks to the <u>Nazis</u>, Japanese and Fascists. Our government was not very actively involved in any way at that time. I expressed these views to 'HAROID' quite frequently. Gradually I came to realize that he, himself, was a Communist. I was genuinely impressed with the man's sincerity. On one occasion I said to him that I wished I could do something active to fight against the rise of Fascist and reactionary powers.

"It was at this point that 'HAROLD' invited me to supply information on economic conditions in Germany and Japan which he said he knew from the nature of my work I would be able to supply. Incidentally, I learned later that 'HAROLD' had made quite extensive inquiries about me from unnamed sources to verify my reliability. I never did the same in regard to him but I never subsequently had any reason to believe that my judgment was incorrect as to his sincerity in the cause for which he worked.

"There developed a relationship in which I regularly handed to 'HAROLD' after work once a week documents which came to my desk in the course of my work. I selected those items that contained significant economic information on Germany and Japan and other items of special interest. After some time-I have no exact recollection of the date--'HAROLD' took me to Baltimore and introduced me to the man whom I now know to be WHITTAKER CHAMBERS and who at that time gave me the name of CARL CARLSON. I was given to understand the purpose of this meeting was to enable an operator, presumably 'HAROLD's' immediate superior, to make my acquaintance. No documents or information were supplied at the Baltimore meeting.

"We had another meeting with 'CARL' in Philadelphia. These were dinner meetings. In both instances these meetings took place in a restaurant.

"Later 'CARL' met me for lunch in Washington quite frequently, particularly during the latter part of 1937. In the early part of 1938 I saw practically nothing of either 'HAROLD' or 'CARL.'

"At this point I would like to emphasize that I was given no specific information as to the residence or activities of either 'HAROLD' or 'CARL' apart from their contacts with me. I inferred

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they had contacts with other people of the same kind as myself because of their knowledge of events and personalities in the State Department but I was given to understand the names of these other people would not be revealed to me. I usually waited to be told when I should meet them. I had no means of communicating with 'CARL' on my own initiative. In order to communicate with HAROID I was given a telephone number. A woman answered the phone every time I called. I was instructed simply to ask for 'HAROID.' I was invariably told 'HAROID' would call back. I was permitted to write down the number but not the exchange. It may have been Metropolitan. I subsequently destroyed the note and can not recall the number.

"As to procedure: On evenings when I was scheduled to meet 'HAROID,' I would go through the documents on my desk, make an appropriate selection, and take it out in a briefcase which I would hand to 'HAROID' when meeting him. I would meet 'HAROID' the next day on my way to work and bring the documents back. I was given to understand by 'HAROID' that he photographed the documents using a Leica camera. I believe that on one or more occasions I may have handed the papers to 'CARL.'

"In March 1938 I went on a trip to Turkey to negotiate a trade agreement. While I was there I did not pursue any collaborationist activities of any kind.

"When I returned from Turkey, 'CARL' met me for lunch and informed me he had, as he put it, 'deserted'. Naturally I was alarmed.

"Shortly afterwards, 'HAROLD' met me and I told him about my conversation with 'CARL.' 'HAROLD' told me I would have to lay low for a considerable period.

"I next saw 'HAROLD' either in late 1939 or early 1940 when he called me up without my having asked for him to call, and suggested that we meet. We met in Rosslyn, Virginia, and drove in the country for about two hrs. I talked mostly about my personal affairs but expressed some misgivings about the Nazi-Soviet pact which had been concluded some months earlier. At the end of the interview he asked me if I wanted him to see me again and I expressed myself in such lukewarm terms that I never received a call from him again. I have never seen him since.

"Since then I have had no contacts of any kind with any Communist organization or espionage organization.

. .

"My lukewarmness at my last meeting with 'HAROLD' was due to the obvious fact that in making its pact with HITTER, the Soviet Union had abdicated its leadership of anti-Fascist forces in the world. After that I could not wish to get myself involved in any connection which would require blank check acceptance of the Party line. I was very grateful for the coincidence which made it possible for me to slip out of the apparatus in such a painless manner.

"During my employment in the Trade Agreements Division, State Department, one of my colleagues was ALGER HISS who was then assistant to FRANCIS B. SAYRE, Assistant to the Secretary of State. I was sufficiently acquainted with HISS to know him by his first name. My duties brought me into fairly frequent contact with him and I had occasion to discuss matters of official business. Our personal contacts outside the office were confined to one lunch date. He never came to my house and I never went to his.

"I am not acquainted with RICHARD HOWELL POST who I understand was employed in the State Department and I have never met him.

"I have never known any individual bearing the name COLONEL BYKOV or MORRIS BYKOV.

"At the time I entered the employ of the State Department one LEANDER B. LOVELL, whom I knew as LEE LOVELL, was engaged in organizing a union which I may have joined and may have paid dues into on one or more occasions although I never attended meetings and participated. I became rather well acquainted with LOVELL, but I have no information that he was engaged in any espionage and underground activities and consider it most unlikely in view of the man's character and in view of his union activities.

"Previous to my employment at the State Department I became acquainted socially with <u>LAWRENCE</u> DUGGAN who later became head of the Latin-American Division of the State Department. I saw Mr. DUGGAN occasionally but had very little contact with him. I have no reason to believe that he was involved in any underground or espionage activities.

"Sometime about 1930 I met <u>ELEANOR</u> NELSON socially and had some contacts with her for a few years thereafter. Both of us were in the Socialist Party in the early 1930's.

"The name of HEDDA, GOMPERTZ is entirely unfamiliar to me.

"I mention these names only because they have been suggested to me by Mr. TAYLOR. It would never have occurred to me to mention them in this connection.

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"During the period of my work with 'HAROLD' and 'CARL' I was a Communist collaborator but I have never formally joined the Communist Party or paid any dues.

"I have read this statement consisting of this and six other typewritten pages and it is true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief.

The original signed statement is being retained in the files of the Washington Field Office.

Upon completion of the statement, WADLEIGH was again questioned regarding certain details contained therein. He insisted that he had first met HAROLD WILSON by coincidence on a railroad train as set forth above and flatly denied that his name had been furnished to HAROLD WILSON or that the meeting had been arranged in advance. He declared that he never learned the true identity of HAROLD WILSON although he believed that this was not his real name and was unable to furnish any immediate information of value in identifying WILSON.

He referred to HAROLD as being a zealot and completely sincere, and made a somewhat unfavorable comparison between HAROLD and CHAMBERS in this connection, indicating that CHAMBERS had impressed him as the type of individual who would change his position whereas he would never expect HAROLD to do so. He also described HAROLD as being very cautious, advising he had never seen HAROLD driving an automobile where he might have observed the license although WHITTAKER CHAMBERS did use a car on one occasion. He said also he had never seen HAROLD in the presence of any other persons although HAROLD had observed him in the company of other persons on one or more occasions and at such times neither would recognize the other. He recalled that the numerous meetings he had with HAROLD for lunch or in connection with the passing of information and documents had invariably been arranged for different places and they covered an area from Georgetown all the way to Lincoln Park, NE, Washington, with the result that he was unable to fix any focal point from which HAROLD may have operated.

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WADLEIGH was under the impression that HAROLD was a trusted Communist Party underground worker and felt that he had engaged in Party work previously. In this connection he mentioned HAROLD was aware that Communist leader WILLIAM Z. FOSTER suffered from angina pectoris and indicated other personal knowledge of Communist Party leaders which implied personal acquaintance. He stated he had a vague recollection that HAROLD originally came from Virginia and that his speech was not necessarily inconsistent with this. He also thought HAROLD was Jewish and vaguely recalled HAROLD's stating on an occasion that his parents were Hungarians.

Photographs of a number of the individuals known to have been associated in the underground group with WHITTAKER CHAMBERS were displayed to WADLEIGH, including pictures of CHARLES KRAMER, JOHN ABT, NATHAN WITT, J. PETERS, LEP PRESSMAN, HENRY COLLINS and VICTOR PERLO. However, he was unable to identify any of these individuals as HAROLD WILSON or as anyone known to him. A number of photographs of individuals in the GREGORY case were also displayed to WADLEIGH with negative results.

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DETAILS:

AT MASHINI TON. D. C.

On the instant of Monday, December 6, 1945, HERRY JULIAN WADLEIGH was interviewed at his office with the Italian Technical Delegation of the Italian Embassy, 740 list Street, NW, Room 200, Washington, D.C., by Special Agent MAURICE A. TAYLOR and the writer.

MADLEIGH outlined his early history and background briefly and then furnished chronology of his employment as set forth hereinafter in statement form. In connection with his employment he advised that he had worked for the United States Government from approximately 1930 until 1946. He was first employed by the Federal Farm Board in Washington, B.C., after completing his education as a graduate student of the University of Chicago. From the Federal Farm Board he was transferred to the Department of Agriculture in 1932 and remained there until 1936. His immediate superior was LXMM EDMINSTER.

In 1936 EDMINSTER and WADLEICH both left the Department of Agriculture and secured employment with the State Department. WADLEICH explained that this shange was occasioned by a controversy between EDMINSTER and his superiors which grew out of the presentation of a matter which had been prepared by WADLEICH under the instructions of EDMINSTER. He stated that EDMINSTER had been ordered to dismiss WADLEICH but had chosen to resign himself as WADLEICH had been acting under his instructions. WADLEICH denied that he had sought employment in the State Department under the instructions of any individual or that his purpose and objective had been to place himself where he would be able to furnish information to any outside or underground organization. He insisted he had accompanied EDMINSTER under the siroumstances indicated.

WADLKICH stated from 1935 until late 1939 or early 1940 he had served in the State Department, working in the Trade Agreements Division. Thereafter he was designated to work as an assistant to LSO PASYOLSKY, Special Assistant to the Secretary and who was sconomic advisor of trade agreements. Me advised that this work was later incorporated into the Division of Special Research of which he became assistant chief. In January 1943 a new Division of Loonomic Studies was formed and WADLAICH became assistant chief of this unit.

In July 1943 WADLEIGH stated he was transferred to an office under the direct supervision of Under-Secretary DEAN ACHESCH and was engaged in the preparation of programs for I taly. He stated in December of 1943 he made a trip to I taly for the State Department and upon his return was assigned to the Foreign Economic Administration.

From December 1944 until May 1946 WADLEIGH stated he was again employed in the Department of Agriculture and in May 1946 he secured employment with UMARA where he remained until about the time of the discontinuance of UMMRA's activities after which he obtained his present position of feed sevisor to the Italian Technical Delegation of the Italian Embassy.

Thereafter WADLEICH was quashiened concerning his acquaintance and/or association with ALGER HISS, LEANDER BELL LOVELL, LAURENCE DUCCAS and ELANCE MELSON, whose names were furnished inthe past by WHITTAKER CHAMBERS is various interviews. WADLEICH advised that he had followed the news paper accounts of the NHITTANER CHANDERS exposures and was genuinely assed when the name of ALGER HIGS came to light. He described HIGS as an individual whom he believed to be a genuine liberal but with a definite conservative approach. He stated that even after reading the early accounts in the paper he was disposed not to believe that HISS had been ghilty of underground or espionage involvement.

With reference to LEANDER S. LOVELL, MADLEIGH stated that this individual, when he knew as LEE LOVELL, was employed in the Trade Agreements Division when MADLEIGH first came to the State Department. He recalled that LOVELL had been active in organizing the union at the State Department, which he believed was the predecessor of UFWA, and that LOVELL had actively solidited his membership and dues subsequently. He stated he feels he may have joined the union and paid dues on one or two escasions but he did not attend meetings and gradually discontinued association with the union. He stated he knew of no underground activity on the part of LOVELL and was not sware that LOVELL was a Communist if this were true. He stated he doubted that LOVELL was anguged in any underground activity because of his continued active work with the union and WADLEIGHT felt this would have been improbable if he were connected with the Communist Farty underground.

WADLEIGH denied boowing BIORAKD KOWELL POST and indicated that the name was entirely unfamiliar to him.

WADLEIGH stated he was acquainted with MILHOR MELSON, stating that he had not har about 1930, first socially and later had worked with her in the Socialist Party in the sarly 1930's at which time both were members of this party. He stated that about 1933 he dropped his membership in the Socialist Party and discontinued his associations there. Thereafter he occasionally as ELIMOR MELSON and had lunchest engagements with her on a few occasions. He believes he last saw her shortly before the war.

I believe that on one or more occasions I may have handed the papers to 'GARL.'

"In March 1938 I went on a trip to Turkey to negotiate a trade agreement. While I was there I did not pursue any collaborationist activities of any kind.

"Then I returned from Turkey, 'GARL' met me for lunch and inferied me he had, as he put it, 'deserted'. Naturally I was alarmed.

"Shortly afterwards, 'MARDLD' met me and I bold him about my conversation with 'CARL.' 'HAROLD' told me I would have to lay low for a considerable period.

"I next saw 'BANGLO' sither in late 1939 or early 1940 when he called no up without my having asked for him to call, and suggested that we neet. We met in Messlym, Virginia, and drove in the country for about two hrw. I talked mostly about my personal affairs but expressed come misgivings about the Maxi-Seviet pact which had been concluded some months earlier. At the end of the interview he asked as if I wanted him to see me again and I expressed myself in such lukewarm terms that I never received a call from him again. I have never some him since.

"I am not acquainted with AIGHARD HOWKLL FORT who I understand was employed in the State Department and I have never not him.

"I have never known any individual bearing the name COLONEL BIECT or MONNIS SINCE.

"At the time I sitered the amploy of the State Department one LHANNER B. LOVELL, many I know as LEE LOVELL, was engaged in ergendising a union which I may have joined and may have paid does into an one or more accessions although I meter attended meetings and participated. I because rather well accessing with LOVEL, but I have no information that he was engaged in any espionage and underground detivities and consider it past unlikely in view of the man's character and in view of his which is tivities.

"Frevious to my employment at the Mate Department I became securinted socially with <u>LAURENCE</u> DEMOLA who later pecase head of the Latin-American Division of the State Department. I saw Mr. DURIAN securionally but had very little contact with him. I have no reason to believe that he was involved in any underground or exploring activities.

"Sometime about 1930 I met ELEANDH MELSON scalally and had some contacts with her for a few parts thereafter. Both of us were in the Socialist Party in the early 1930's.

"The mane of HERE COMPERTS is entirely unfamiliar to me.

"I montion these names only because they have been suggested to me by Mr. Tallon. It would never have accurred to me to mention them in this connection.

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"During the pariod of my work with 'HARDLD' and 'CARL' I was a Communist collaborator but I have never formally joined the Communist Party or paid any does.

"I have read this statement consisting of this and six other typewritten pages and it is true and serrect to the best of my knowledge and bullef.

The original signed statement is being retained in the files of the Washington Field Office.

Upon sompletion of the statement, MADLEIGH was again questioned regarding certain details contained therein. Me indicted that he had first not MAROLD WILSON by opincidence on a reilread train as set forth above and flatly denied that his name had been furnished to HAROLD WILSON or that the masting had been avranged in advance. He declared that he never learned the true identity of HAROLD WILSON although he believed that this was not his real name and was unable to furnish any immediate information of value in identifying WILSON.

He referred to MAROLD as being a sealet and completely sincere, and made a somewhat unfavorable comparison between RAMOLD and CHANNERS in this connection, indicating that CHANNERS had impressed him as the type of individual who would change his position whereas he would never expect HAROLD to do so. He also described MAROLD as being very cautious, divising he had never seen HAROLD driving an automobile where he aight have observed the license mithough WHITTAKER CHANNERS did use a car on one eccasion. He said also he had never seen HAROLD in the presence of any other persons although MAROLD had observed him in the company of other persons an one or wore eccasions and at such times maither would recognize the other. He recalled that the numerous meetings he had with MAROLD for lunch or in connection with the passing of information and documents hed invariably been arranged for different places and they covered an area from George town all the way to Lincoln Fark, WE, Washington, with the result blat he was unable to fix any focal point from which HAROLD may have operated.

At New York City will reinterview WHITTAKER CHANDERS for the purpose of verifying the story related by HENRY JULIAN WADLEIGH and for the particular purpose of identifying the individual known to WADLEIGH as HANOLD WILSON. WADLEIGH was positive that CHAMBERS know the identity of this individual and assumed that CHAMBERS had furnished HABOLD's identity to Bureau Agents. It is noted WADLEIGH considered CHAMBERS as the superior of WILSON and WILSON had taken WADLEIGH to Philadelphia and Baltimore for the purpose of making the acquaintance of CHAMBERS whom WADLEIGH knew as CARL CARLSON.

There is set forth below a summary of the activities which have occurred over this past weekend in the captioned case. For clarity sake the information pertaining to the particular subject is set forth under his name.

FRANKLIN VICTOR RENO, was

You will recall that Franklin Victor Reno was named by Chambers as one of the individuals who furnished him with confidential Government information.

Reno was interviewed on December 10, 1948, at which time he denied any dealings with Chambers, J. Peters, or anyone else in connection with furnishing information while he was employed at the Aberdeen Proving Grounds. He was served with a subpoena calling for his appearance before the Grand Jury, New York City at 9:00 a.m., December 15, 1948.

On December 11, 1948, Reno voluntarily appeared at the Denver Field Office of this Eureau stating that he desired to give additional information which he had not given when interviewed on December 10th. In substance he admitted that he gave restricted documents to one "Carl" or "Krauss," whom he thought might have been Chambers, but he advised that he did not know for certain. Reno advised further that one "Bernie" accompanied him from Baltimore to Philadelphia where "Bernie" introduced him to "Carl," probably in the early part of June, 1937. He advised that "Carl" requested "intelligence information" from him and that "Carl" knew that he, (Reno) would soon be employed at the Aberdeen Proving Grounds. Reno stated that he agreed to this request knowing that it was Soviet Union espionage work. Thereafter Reno advised that he met "Carl" on an estimated four to seven times in Washington, D. C., generally on a designated street by prearranged appointments. Reno also stated that on one or two occasions his brother, Philip Reno, acted as an intermediary between her and "Carl." Franklin Keno did not desire to give a signed statement but he indicated that he would cooperate.

The above information has been furnished to Mr. Thomas J. Donegan, Special Assistant to the Attorney General, New York City and to Assistant Attorney General Alexander M. Campbell.

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Memo for The Director

PHILIP RENO

You will recall that this individual is the brother of Franklin Reno and was also named by Chambers as having furnished him with confidential information.

Philip Reno was interviewed at Albuquerque, New Mexico on December 10, 1948, and served with a subpoena to appear before the Grand Jury in New York City. He denied any acquaintance, knowledge of, or association with Chambers or any other member of the Communist apparatus while employed in Washington, D. C. He also denied any knowledge that his brother, Franklin Victor Reno was acquainted with the subject or associated with any Communist apparatus. ^{He} admitted Communist Party membership in Colorado from 1944 until he was expelled from the Communist Party about nine months ago.

HENRY JULIEN WADLEIGH

This individual was also named by Chambers as having furnished him with confidential Government information.

Wadleigh arrived in New York City from Washington, D. C. on December 10, 1948, to testify before the Grand Jury. He conferred briefly with T. J. Donegan and later with his Attorney, Raymond Wise, 80 Broad Street, New York City. Wise contacted Agents of the New York Office and stated that he had advised Wadleigh to make complete disclosures to the FBI and to answer all questions at the Grand Jury Hearing.

Wadleigh was interviewed by Agents of the New York Office. He stated that he became acquainted with Eleanor Nelson Soyring (who is a known Communist and who has been previously mentioned by Whittaker Chambers). He stated that he suggested to Nelson that he would like to assist the Communist Party cause and that Nelson subsequently introduced him to one Harold Wilson, whom Wadleigh has identified from a photograph as David Carpenter. In regard to Carpenter, you will recall that he was named by Chambers as the individual who photographed confidential documents for him in Washington, D. C. Wadleigh continued by stating that shortly after entering his employment with the State Department, he began to furnish Carpenter with documents concerning the economic situation in Germany and Japan and that he continued this activity from the winter of 1935 or 1936 to the early part of 1938. During this period oftime he stated that he was introduced by Carpenter to "Karl," whom he now knows as Whittaker Chambers.

Wadleigh declared that in late 1937 he was introduced by Chambers to a man whom Chambers referred to as "the boss of the outfit," and whose general description fits that of Colonel Bykov, with the exception that this person had either all or most of the right arm missing. Wadleigh related that in early 1939, Chambers advised him that he had broken with the organization. A month or so later, according to Wadleigh, Chambers borrowed \$20.00 from Wadleigh and at this time informed him that the "boss of the outfit" was a fugitive and was wanted by the Russians.

On the evening of December 11, 1948, upon his return from New York City, Wadleigh telephonically advised the Washington Field Office that he had failed in one instance to make a completely responsive answer to a question asked before the New York Grand Jury and that he would now like to have the complete answer made a matter of record. Wadleigh stated that he had in his possession a rug which was presented to him as a New Years gift in 1937 or 1938 by Whittaker Chambers.

The above information concerning the gift of a rug to Wadleigh by Chambers has been furnished to Mr. Russo of the Department.

U ALGER HISS

On December 10, 1948, Alger Hiss was confronted with Hede Massing in a twenty minute meeting during which Massing detailed her recollection of her meeting with him at a dinner party in Noel Field's home. Hiss subsequently advised that he was positive that he had never seen Massing before; that he definitely never had any conversation with her at any time or place and claimed to be amazed by her statements with respect to him.

ELEANOR NELSON SOYRING

You will recall that <u>Eleanor Nelson Soyring is a known Communist</u> who formerly resided in Washington, D. C. and who was previously mentioned by Whittaker Chambers under her maiden name of <u>Eleanor Nelson</u>.

On December 10, 1948, she refused to grant an interview to Bureau Agents and accepted service of a subpoena to testify before the Grand Jury, New York City. Following this contact she immediately went to the office of Maurice Braverman, Communist Party functionary and Attorney in Baltimore, Maryland. On the same date it was indicated that she intended to consult the legal firm of Fressman, Witt and Cammer in New York City.

* * * *

On Sunday, December 12, 1948, the Washington Field Office obtained three pages of typewriting from the Head Master of the Landon School, Mr. Paul L. Banfield, Bethesda, Maryland, which was entitled "Description of Personal Characteristics of Timothy Hobson," bearing the date September 9, 2936. For your information, Timothy Hobson is the son of Mrs. Alger Hiss by her first marriage. He enrolled at the aforementioned school during the fall term, 1936. Mr. Banfield also produced a handwritten letter dated September 1, 1936 bearing the signature of Priscilla Hiss, wife of Alger Hiss referring to an application for admission to the Landon School of Timothy Hobson for the fall term of the school year, 1936. Mr. Banfield also produced a carbon copy of a letter addressed to Alger Hiss dated September 3, 1936 from Mr. Banfield acknowledging the application for registration of Timothy Hobson. He also made available a handwritten letter bearing the date September 9, 1936 containing the signature of Alger Hiss. This letter stated that the description of Timothy Hobson's personality was enclosed. The letter was signed by Alger Hiss.

The three typewritten pages were compared with the typewritten material which Whittaker Chambers turned over at the pre-trial deposition hearing at Baltimore, Maryland on November 17, 1948. The FBI Laboratory has concluded that the typewriting appearing on the three typewritten pages made available by Mr. Banfield dated September 9, 1936 is identical with the typewriting appearing on the documents made available by Chambers at the deposition hearing in Baltimore. Information concerning the identification of the typewriting has been furnished to Mr. Campbell of the Department by memorandum under today's date.

On December 10, 1948, the Department furnished the Bureau the original documents which Whittaker Chambers produced at the pre-trial deposition in the civil suit brought against him by Alger Hiss at Baltimore, Maryland. The Bureau was requested to immediately examine the documents to ascertain the age, source of origin, typing, watermarks, and any other feathers of identification. The FBT Laboratory is presently conducting the requested examination.

The Department also requested that an investigation be made at the State Department with respect to these documents to determine if the originals are still in the State Department and if so, to determine the state of the original documents to see if any possible characteristics of identification are present such as initials, the location of documents in the files, et cetera. It was further requested to determine the personnel and names of the parties who may have had access to the documents and whose hands the documents passed through. The Department also requested that a check be made to determine the personnel and the names of all persons, departmentalwise, who were associated with Hiss, Chambers, Wadleigh, William and George Pigman, Francischeno and Philip Reno. It is anticipated that all of such personnel will be subpoenaed before a Grand Jury in New York which will commence on December 16, 1948.
