FBI FOIPA Addendum

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum includes information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes additional standard responses that apply to all requests for records on individuals. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records. For questions regarding Parts 1, 2, or 3, visit the www.fbi.gov/foia website under "Contact Us." Previously mentioned appeal and dispute resolution services are also available at the web address.

Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C. § 552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c) (2006 & Supp. IV (2010))]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia website.
- (ii) **National Security/Intelligence Records.** The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of national security and foreign intelligence records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and PA exemption (j)(2) as applicable to requests for records about individuals [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2); 50 U.S.C § 3024(i)(1)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC § 3024(i)(1)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that national security or foreign intelligence records do or do not exist.

- (ii) **FBI Records.** Founded in 1908, the FBI carries out a dual law enforcement and national security mission. As part of this dual mission, the FBI creates and maintains records on various subjects; however, the FBI does not maintain records on every person, subject, or entity.
- (iii) **Requests for Criminal History Records or Rap Sheets.** The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks – often referred to as a criminal history record or rap sheets. These criminal history records are not the same as material in an investigative "FBI file." An Identity History Summary Check is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. - (iv) **The National Name Check Program (NNCP).** The mission of NNCP is to analyze and report information in response to name check requests received from federal agencies, for the purpose of protecting the United States from foreign and domestic threats to national security. Please be advised that this is a service provided to other federal agencies. Private citizens cannot request a name check.

- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

Jason Wayne McVean is being sought for the May 29, 1998 murder of Officer Dale D. Claxton of the Cortez, Colorado Police Department. On that day, the officer spotted a large water truck which was reported stolen from a neighboring area the previous day. Prior to the officer initiating a traffic stop, the driver of the water truck pulled the truck over to the shoulder of the road. The passenger jumped out and ambushed Officer Claxton, striking him numerous times with bullets from an automatic assault rifle. Two suspects, Alan Lamont Pilon and Robert Matthew Mason, were accompanying McVean. All three were dressed in camouflage clothing and were armed with automatic weapons. Investigation determined that all three subjects has a strong interest in weapons, explosives, and survival skills. The three reportedly had anti-government and anti-law enforcement sentiments.

The three fled the shooting and then carjacked a flatbed truck. During the pursuit of this truck, the subjects shot at numerous law enforcement officers, wounding two Montezuma County, Colorado Sheriff's Deputies and striking numerous other law enforcement vehicles. The subjects fled at a high rate of speed into Utah, where they fired at a National Park Service Superintendent. The carjacked truck was found abandoned later that day in a remote canyon area of southeast Utah.

A manhunt ensued, without locating the fugitives. On June 4, 1998, just east of Bluff, Utah, a social worker driving a state vehicle was fired upon at close range by a male wearing camouflage clothing. A San Juan County, Utah Sheriff's Deputy responding to that location was shot twice from a distance of more than 200 yards.

Also, in 1998, Washington, along with two other individuals, allegedly robbed a bank in Dardanelle, Arkansas. The accomplices were soon captured, but Washington was able to flee. He was later arrested in connection with this robbery. However, in November of 1998 while in jail awaiting trial on state robbery charges in Arkansas, Washington escaped.

A few years later, in April of 2002, Washington was arrested in Kirkwood, Missouri, for auto theft and other crimes. He received a ten-year state sentence for the crimes committed in Missouri. On February 27, 2002, Atlanta Police discovered the dismembered body parts of the male victim placed in plastic bags in a shallow grave. His head was found in another location. McKibbins was then indicted for murder by a Fulton County Grand Jury on February 28, 2002.

Atlanta – Special Agent in Charge (SAC) Gregory Jones, FBI Atlanta, is pleased to announce the arrest this morning of FBI Top Ten Fugitive Michael Jason Registe.

Registe, wanted for the July, 2007 double murders of Columbus State University students Bryan Kilgore and Randy Newton Jr. at Columbus, Georgia, was arrested by St. Maarten Police officials in conjunction with the Antilles Director of Public Prosecution and through coordination with the FBI's Legal Attaché, Bridgetown, Barbados.

Numerous tips were received by the FBI after the airing of an America's Most Wanted television segment featuring Registe. That ultimately led local St. Maarten authorities to the Belvedere section of Dutch St. Maarten where Registe was arrested at approximately 11:10 a.m. this morning, August 27, 2008, while at a guest house. SWAT entry was made and Registe was taken into custody without further incident.

Registe will now face extradition hearings at St. Maarten for his removal back to Columbus, Georgia. This process could take from two weeks to several months.

The public is reminded that all persons are considered innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

MAN WANTED FOR MULTIPLE MURDERS IN LOS ANGELES ADDED TO THE FBI'S LIST OF TEN MOST WANTED FUGITIVES

A Los Angeles man wanted by multiple agencies in connection with at least four murders and various other crimes has been added to the FBI's list of Ten Most Wanted Fugitives, it was announced today by Keith Bolcar, Acting Assistant Director in Charge of the FBI in Los Angeles, and officials with the LAPD, the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, the Los Angeles County District Attorney and the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation.

Jose Luis Saenz first came to the attention of law enforcement when LAPD detectives identified him as the suspect in the 1998 murder of two men in the Hollenbeck area of Los Angeles. Less than two weeks later, Saenz is believed to have kidnapped, raped and murdered his girlfriend, who was also the mother of his child.

Saenz was charged with three counts of murder, kidnapping and rape for the 1998 alleged crimes, and an arrest warrant was issued by the Los Angeles County Court on August 12, 1998. When detectives with the Los Angeles Police Department determined Saenz had fled the state of California, the FBI joined the investigation and obtained a federal arrest warrant on January 23, 2002. Saenz was charged in a criminal complaint filed in United States District Court in Los Angeles with Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution, in violation of 18 United States Code, Section 1073. The Los Angeles County District Attorney's office is also in the process of preparing a Provisional Arrest Warrant in case Saenz is located in Mexico. Investigators believe Saenz travels to Mexico frequently and may be residing there currently.

Saenz is known by several aliases, to include the following:

"Joe Saenz has demonstrated a brazen willingness to commit murder and whatever additional violent crime necessary to continue his criminal behavior," said Keith Bolcar, Acting Assistant Director in Charge of the FBI's Los Angeles Field Office. "He has shown that he respects no laws, in this country or in others, and will likely kill again if not captured. Saenz is wanted by multiple law enforcement agencies, and now his face will be featured all over the world."

The latest murder for which Saenz is wanted occurred in October 2008 when Oscar Torres was killed in his Whittier home. Detectives with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department believe Saenz murdered Torres in connection with a drug debt. Saenz is also wanted for shooting and wounding a second man on the same evening. The Torres murder was captured on the victim's home surveillance videotape system and Saenz was identified as the killer.

"The FBI's 10 most wanted list brings worldwide attention and resources to achieve the capture of dangerous individuals," said Chief William Bratton with the Los Angeles Police Department. "Men who are alleged to kill willingly and so often are certainly among the most dangerous and deserving of capture. We are thankful that the FBI has added Saenz to their Top Ten Most Wanted list."

Saenz has been described by gang associates and others as a major enforcer and hit-man for a Mexican drug cartel who is believed to be involved in importing cocaine into Los Angeles. In addition to the murders for which he is charged, Saenz is wanted for question for additional crimes, including kidnapping and murder. Saenz is considered a career criminal and is a known repeat offender. Saenz is also wanted for being in violation of his parole for a 1995 narcotic possession conviction. In addition, he has an extensive criminal history, including motor vehicle theft, assault with a deadly weapon, vandalism and possession of narcotics.

Saenz should be considered armed and extremely dangerous. According to individuals interviewed throughout the investigation, Saenz has

expressed a willingness to kill law enforcement officers if confronted with arrest.

"This is another example of the strong partnership that exists between all of law enforcement to bring criminals to justice," said Sheriff Lee Baca. "This individual, Jose Saenz, will be brought to justice. We will find him and prosecute him to the full extent, under the law. Make no mistake about it."

Saenz is a United States citizen and is believed to be living in Mexico. Investigators believe he travels freely to the United States by utilizing fraudulently obtained identification.

Saenz is described as a white or Hispanic male, born on [] in Los Angeles. Saenz has brown hair and brown eyes, is approximately 5'11" to 6'00" in height and, when last seen, weighed approximately 180 lbs. Saenz is known to have a tattoo on his right arm of the words "Natalie" "Cuatro"; as well as tattoos on his back with the words "In Memory Serelone Flew" and "Flats4," and on his right arm of the word "Flats." Saenz is believed to be a member of a Los Angeles area criminal street gang.

Despite being featured on the America's Most Wanted television program and on the websites of the FBI, LAPD and the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, Saenz has eluded capture.

As a member of the FBI's List of Ten Most Wanted Fugitives, the FBI is offering a reward of up to \$100,000 for the capture of Saenz.
