

LOYALTY OF GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES

#### I. PERSONAL HISTORY

Records of the University of California, Berkeley,
California, reflect that JOHN WILLIAM GOFMAN was born on September
21, 1918, at Cleveland, Ohio. His parents were DAVID GOFMAN
(deceased) and SARANGOFMAN, both natives of Russia. The employee
stated on his personnel record that both of his parents had become
United States citizens. He married HELEN ADELAIDS—TAHL on August
10, 1940, at Wadsworth, Ohio. Her date and place of birth were
recorded as May 18, 1917, at Wadsworth, Ohio.

From 1935 to 1939 the employee was a student at Oberlin College, Oberlin, Ohio. From 1939 to 1940 he completed the first year of medical school at the Western Reserve Medical School, Cleveland, Ohio. From 1940 to 1943 he was engaged in graduate work in nuclear chemistry at the University of California at Berkeley, receiving his Ph.D. Degree in 1943. In 1943 and 1944 he was engaged in plutonium research at the University of California.

In 1944-1946 he was a student at the University of California Medical School, receiving his M.D. Degree in 1946. From 1946 to 1947 he was an intern at the University of California Hospital. From 1947 to date he has been employed in the Department of Medical Physics at the University of California and in 1950 and 1951 he has also been employed part time as a clinical instructor in medicine at the University of California Hospital.

### II. BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION

This investigation was requested by the Federal Security Agency, Washington, D.C., based on information furnished by Cleveland T-1, of unknown reliability, who advised ISADORS AFFENVALD, a brother-in-law of the employee, is extremely pro-Communist and that GREENVALD's

antagonism towards democracy and the capitalistic system has caused ill feeling between GREENWALD and his lawyer associates. Cleveland T-1 added that GREENWALD apparently has a strong feeling of admiration for GOTMAN and that GOTMAN visited GREENWALD after attending many scientific conferences.

#### III. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

#### AT BERKELEY, CALIFORNIA

DEROTHY HURLEY, Registrar's Office, University of California, produced records which reflected that the employee was admitted as a graduate student in chemistry in August 1940 and received his Ph.D. Degree on February 6, 1943. He entered the University of California Medical School in 1944 and received his N.D. Degree in June 1946. The Registrar's records contained no information reflecting on the loyalty of the employee.

BLANCHE MILLER, Office of the Secretary of the Regents of the University of California, furnished the following information bearing on the academic employment of GOFMAN at the University of California:

From 1940 to 1942 he was employed as a teaching assistant in the Chemistry Department. In 1942 he was employed as a Research Associate in Chemistry. From 1947 to 1950 he was employed as an Assistant Professor of Medical Physics. From 1950 to date he has been employed as an Associate Professor of Medical Physics. From 1950 to date he has been employed part time as a Clinical Instructor in Medicine. The Regents records contain no information reflecting on the loyalty of the employee.

Mr. GEORGE EVERSON, Director of Scientific Personnel, University of California Radiation Laboratory, advised that from 1942 until 1944 GOFMAN was employed on a special project concerning plutonium research under the direction of the Chemistry Department at the University of California. He was reemployed during the summer of 1946 doing research work at the Donner Laboratory, University of California. He was again employed at the Donner Laboratory in July 1947 and has been continuously employed there to date.

Mr. EVERSON commented that in connection with the employee's work on plutonium research, he was instrumental in the

discovery of Uranium 233. EVERSON also advised that in connection with his recent research work at the Donner Laboratory the employee has made "historic discoveries" in connection with the importance of fatty protiens and their relationship to heart diseases. EVERS'N stated that he offered this information because he felt that it reflected favorably on the employee's loyalty to the United States, inasmuch as all of GOFMAN's work has been conducted under the auspices of either the Atomic Energy Commission or the United States Public Health Service, resulting in comparatively minor financial gain for GOFMAN. EVERSON stated that he would recommend GOFMAN wholeheartedly as a loyal American.

Professor WENDELL LATIMER, Chemistry Department, University of California, advised that he was the employee's immediate supervisor from 1942 to 1944 when he was engaged in plutonium research. He stated that he has known GCFMAN continuously from 1940 and he would recommend him without hesitation as a loyal and patriotic American.

Professor JOEL H. HILDERAN, Chairman of the Department of Chemistry, advised that he has known GOFMAN since 1940 and that he considers him to be "an outstandingly patriotic American," inasmuch as he had made major contributions to American science. He said he has had no reason whatsoever to question GOFMAN's loyalty to the United States. He added that he is not acquainted with the employee's family.

Mr. JAMES MILLER, Assistant Business Manager, University of California, stated that he has known the employee or vally for two or three years and he has had no reason to question his loyalty to the United States.

Dr. JOHN LAWRENCE, Director of the Donner Laboratory, stated that he has been closely associated with the employee for about five years and that he would recommend him highly as a loyal American. He stated that he is also well acquainted with GOFMAN's wife and has had no reason to question her loyalty to the United States. He also advised that he has no knowledge of the employee's relatives in the Cleveland, Chio, area. He stated that GOFMAN is presently employed as a special consultant to the Public Health Service and he is also engaged in research work at the Donner Laboratory which is partially financed by Public Health Service funds.

#### SF 121-L026

Dr. HARDIN JOHES, Assistant Director, Donner Laboratory, advised that he considers himself to be the employee's closest friend in the California area. He is also well acquainted with the employee's wife and he considers them both to be without a doubt loyal Americans. He offered information that GCFMAN is presently engaged in the study of the significance of fatty protiens in connection with heart diseases and that GCFMAN's discoveries in this connection will have important scientific significance in the near future.

JOMES emphasised that the employee is completely disinterested in financial gain and has done most of his work under the auspices of the United States Government without any thought of personal gain. Dr. JOMES advised that he is not acquainted with any of GOFMAN's family members other than his wife and child.

Mr. RCHET A. SAMS SOUCI, Administrative Assistant, Donner Laboratory, stated that he has been in close contact with the employee for ever five years. He semmented that he has had "absolutely no reason to question GCFMAN's leyalty." He also recommended GCFMAN's wife as a loyal American, but advised that he is not acquainted with any of the other relatives of the employee.

Professor RAYMOND BINGE, Chairman of the Physics Department, University of California, advised that he has been well acquainted with the employee since about 1941 and stated he would recommend GOFMAN without hesitation as a thoroughly loyal American.

Prefessor LEOMARD LOES, Physics Department, stated that he has been acquainted casually with the employee since about 1942 and that he has had no reason to question GOFMAN's loyalty to the United States.

Mrs. HAROLD RANDLES, Manager of the apartment house at 1890 Arch Street, advised that her records indicate that the employee had resided at this address between 1941 and 1944, but she was unable to furnish the exact dates of his residence and was unable to recall him.

In connection with a previous investigation Mrs. BETTI MOAKES, 1878 Parker Street, advised that she was the Manager of the apartment house at 2339 Hilgard Street in 1940 and 1941. She stated that she recalled the employee as a former resident of this building and she furnished no information reflecting on his loyalty to the United States.

The employee is unknown to the following persons residing at 2339 Hilgard Street: Miss JOSEPHINE SEEDON and Mr. FREDERICK LEGS.

#### AT SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA

Dr. FRANCIS SMITH, Dean of the University of California Medical School, advised that he has been well acquainted with the employee since 19th and advised that GCFMAN was one of the best students ever to attend this medical school and graduated number one in his class. He stated that the employee's wife is also a physician and is presently an Assistant Resident Physician in Pediatrics under Dr. SMITH's immediate supervision.

He stated that he felt he could recommend both the employee and his wife without reservation as loyal Americans. He commented that although GCFMAN is technically a clinical instructor in medicine at the University of California Hespital, all of his time in the past three or four years has been spent in research at the Donner Laboratory on the University of California Campus in Berkeley.

Mr. PETER MASON BOND, 1039 Clayton Street, advised that he has been a next-door neighbor of the employee for about three years and that he is also a social acquaintance of the GCFMANS. He stated that he sees very little of the employee, inasmuch as GCFMAN works night and day at the Donner Laboratory in Berkeley. He stated that he would not hesitate to recommend the employee and his wife as level Americans. He was muchle to furnish the names of any ofher persons in this neighborheed who would know the employee in view of the fact that GCFMAN and his wife spend so little time at home.

In connection with a previous investigation the following persons in the vicinity of 206 Judah Street were interviewed in 1947:

Mrs. A. SIERECHT, owner of the spartment house at 206 Judah Street, advised that the employee and his wife had resided there for about three or four years, that they were excellent tenants, and that she considered them to be loyal Americans.

Mrs. DCROTHI DAVIES stated that she had known the employee about three years and that both he and his wife were, in her opinion, loyal Americans. She had no knowledge of any of the employee's other relatives.

From 1935 to 1939 the employee was a student at Oberlin College, Oberlin, Ohio. From 1939 to 1940 he completed the first year of redical school at the Western Reserve Medical School, Clevelanc, Ohio. From 1940 to 1943 he was engaged in graduate work. in nuclear chemistry at the University of California at Berkeley, receiving his Ph.D. Begree in 1943. In 1943 and 1944 he was engaged in plutonium research at the University of California.

In 1946-1946 he was a student at the University of California Medical School, receiving his M.D. Degree in 1946. From 1946 to 1947 he was an intern at the University of California Hespital. From 1947 to date he has been employed in the Department of Medical Physics at the University of California and in 1950 and 1951 he has also been employed part time as a clinical instructor in medicine at the University of California Hespital.

Bureau files reflect that the Can Francisco Office is in possession of a copy of this letter. This letter reflects that Harry Christensen advised that Isadore Greenwald, the brother-in-law of this employee, apparently had a strong feeling of admiration for this employee and that Gofman visited Greenwald after he had attended many scientific conferences.

Christensen stated that Greenwald is extremely pro-Communist, and that Greenwald's antagonism toward democracy and capitalistic system has caused ill feeling between Greenwald and his lawyer associates.

This investigation should be directed toward establishing the closeness of association between the employee and his brother-in-law, Isadore Greenwald, and the Cleveland Office should set out any pertinent data concerning Greenwald. The San Francisco Office should set out the basis and the personal history data on this employee.

#### BACKGROUND DATA REGARDING APPOINTEE AND FAMILY

Personnel data concerning this appointes made available in connection with a previous investigation indicate that his father and mother are DAVE and SARAH COFMAN, both born in Russia.

Cleveland directories reflect that appointee's family has resided at the following addresses in Cleveland:

3647 Scoville Avenue 11408 Hopkins Avenue 12515 Edmonton Avenue 11610 Hopkins Avenue 3293 Tullemore Avenue

Further reference to exact periods of residence will be made in later portions of this report.

Records of the Clerk of Court, Federal District Court for the Northern District of Ohio reflect the following:

DAVE GOFMAN, born November 22, 1888 in Grodock, Russia (Poland) residing at 3647 Scoville Avenue, came to the United States from Germany in 1907. After declaring his intention on December 16, 1920, DAVE GOFMAN filed Petition Number 18812 on March 10, 1924 and was admitted to United

States citizenship on September 11, 1924, Certificate Number 2104526. DAVE GOFMAN'S petition reflects that he had two children, JACK, born September 20, 1918, Cleveland, and IDA.

SARAH GOFMAN, born December 25, 1890, Grodno, Poland, came to the United States in 1907 as SORE KAPIAN. She married DAVID GOFMAN, Certificate of Naturalization 1924-C-2104526. After filing Petition Number 66326 she was issued Certificate of Naturalization 4708257 on July 7, 1939. At the time of application for naturalization she resided at 12515 Edmonton Avenue and had two children, JOSEPH, born September 21, 1918, Cleveland, and IDA.

The records of the Bursu of Vital Statistics, Division of Health, City of Cleveland, Certificate Number 16361 reflect male child JOSEPH COFMAN was born on September 21, 1918 to DAVE and SARAH GOFMAN, both born in Russia, residing at 3647 Scoville Avenue.

The general indices of the Bureau of Vital Statistics, Division of Health, contain no reference to any other child born to the GOFMAN family in 1918.

A search of the records of the Probate Branch, Court of Common Pleas, Cuyahoga County, was made but no record was found from 1918 to the present of any action or suit to change the name of JOSEPH GOFMAN.

At Page 214, Volume 178 of the Marriage Records of Cuyahoga County is maintained the Certificate of Marriage on June 30, 1936 of ISADORS CREENWALD, age 32, born Cleveland, Ohio, an attorney, residing at 10820 Earle Avenue, to IDA COFMAN, residing at 12515 Edmonton Avenue. The application for marriage Indicates that the grooms parents are SAMUEL CREENWALD and LOTTI LANZ CREENWALD.

In connection with information set out hereinafter concerning a brother of ISADORE CREENWALD, it is pointed out that the birth records of the Division of Health for the City of Cleveland reveal that LOUIS GREENWALD was born to SAMUEL CREENWALD and LOTTIE LANZ GREENWALD on October 16, 1910 at Cleveland, Ohio. So far as these records reflect, ISADORE and LOUIS are the only male children born to SAMUEL and LOTTIE GREENWALD.

#### ASSOCIATION HETWEEN APPOINTEE AND ISADORE GREENWALD

Upon recontact, Cleveland T-1, of unknown reliability, who does not wish his identity to be divulged by the FBI or any Loyalty Board, but who is willing to appear before a Loyalty Eoard if necessary, stated that he has no knowledge of JOHN WILLIAM GOLMAN except as received from ISADORE CREETWALD, an Attorney, who is married to COFMAN'S sister, IDA. Cleveland 1-1, who occupies a substantial professional position. stated that he has known GREENWAID personally and in business transactions for four years and on numerous occasions has heard GREENWALD make statements indicating that he preferred Communism to the Democratic form of Government and favored Russia over the United States. Specifically Cleveland T-1 recalls remarks by GRIENWALD that Russia is a wonderful country, that STALIN is the greatest genius produced by the present generation; that under Communism persecution of minority groups would not be permitted; that the United States is not living up to the Yalta Agreement; and that free enterprise and individual initiative of the traditional American types are "all washed up".

Cleveland T-1 informed that in observing developments in Jugoslavia, GREENWALD originally took the position that MIHATLOVICH was a traitor and TITO a hero, but abandoned his admiration of TITO when TITO began to resist Russian domination.

However, Cleveland T-1 informed that he has no knowledge of organizations to which GREENWALD belongs.

Associates of GREENWALD known to Cleveland T-1 are SAMUEL CACZ, Attorney in the Society for Savings Building, 145 Public Square, where GREENWALD also has his offices; PHILLE BARTELL, Attorney in the same building; and ELST TARCAI, likewise an Assorney in this building.

Cleveland T-1 stated that CREENVALD and RACZ lunch together frequently; that CREENVALD and BARTELL associate together constantly, and that CREENVALD and TARCAI engage in frequent conversations in the corridor of the Society for Savings Building. Cleveland T-1 further stated that he has heard RACZ make the same type anti-Democratic, pro-Communist statements as CREENVALD.

With respect to SAMUKI RACZ mentioned above, Cleveland directories reflect that SAMUKI RACZ, Attorney, Society for Savings Building, resides at 4109 West 161st Street, Cleveland. Cleveland T-3, of known reliability, advised in August of 1949 that SAMUKI RACZ of the above address was a member of the International Workers Order.

The International Workers Order has been sited by the Attorney General as within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

With respect to PHILLIP BARTEIL, an Attorney at 514 Society for Savings Building, Cleveland, T-4, of known reliability, advised on June 2, 1941 that Mr. and Mrs. PHILLIP BARTEIL were members of the Communist Party and that Communist Party meetings were held in their home. In March of 1949, Cleveland T-5, of known reliability, advised that BARTEIL did not attend Communist Party functions at that time, but was regarded as a "Big Shot Communist".

With respect to ELSIE TARCAI, mentioned above, an Attorney with offices at 513 Society for Savings Building, Cleveland T-5 advised on December 18, 1947 that ELSIE TARCAI was a member of both the Communist Party and the Civil Rights Congress. On November 2, 1950, Cleveland T-5 advised that TARCAI was formerly active in the Communist Party and that current non-activity was probably due to national attention recently focused on the Communist Party.

The Communist Party and the Civil Rights Congress have been cited by the Attorney General as within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Cleveland T-1 further advised that CREENWALD greatly admires the appointee as a man and regards him as one of the ranking Atomic Scientists in the United States. Regarding the association between the two men, Cleveland T-1 noted that appointee's mother lives with GHERNWALD and his wife IDA, and that in visiting GREENWALD, appointee also visits his mother, Mrs. SARAH COFMAN and his sister, IDA CHEENWALD. Cleveland T-1 stated that he has gathered from conversations with CHEEN-WAID that during appointee's college days he stayed at the GREENAID home during summer and other vacations; that during summer vacations appointee and GREENMALD engaged in a joint venture in selling pencils on a wholesale scale; that in the summer or fall of 1943, appointed visited the GREENHALD family after attending a Scientific Conference, probably in New York; that GREEWALD had gone to California during the past five years, at least partially upon appointee's suggestion with a possible view to setting up a law practice; and that appointee maintains a regular correspondence with members of the GREENWALD household. Cleveland T-l is also of the opinion that appointee may have contacted the GREENWALDS' on other occasions, but he does not have specific knowledge of such contacts. According to Cleveland T-1, he did not obtain from CREENWALD any impression that appointee was dominated by CREENWALD, or any information that appointee had confided to CREENVALD any restricted

data. In this regard Cleveland T-1 stated that he has no informatin bearing upon appointee's loyalty other than appointee's connection with CREEWALD.

Cleveland T-1 advised that CHENIMALD has aroused some illfeeling between himself and certain other lawyers and businessmen by means of his pro-Communist attitude.

In this connection, Cleveland T-2, of unknown reliability, a businessman who has known GALENWALD for twenty-five years, as a result of business relations, was interviewed and advised that he would prefer not to commit himself on the subject of GREENWALD'S loyalty to the United States. Cleveland T-2 stated that he had no reason to believe that GREENWALD favored a change in the form of Government of the United States by force and violence, but that in 1936 GREENWALD had made remarks to him which Cleveland T-2 described as "Socialistic". While disclaiming any exact knowledge of the term "Socialistic", Cleveland T-2 advised that to him it meant a system under which everyone had the same amount of dollars and there were no large accumulations of wealth. Cleveland T-2 stated that these and similar ideas had been voiced by GREENWALD in 1936. According to Cleveland T-2, since that time CREENWALD has made no statements reflecting on his loyalty unless a statement to the effect that he was a member of the National Lawyers Guild could be so considered.

In connection with information set out hereinafter concerning the brother of ISADORE CREENWALD, it is noted that Cleveland T-2 advised that ISADORE CREENWALD has one brother.

With respect to appointee, Cleveland T-2 stated that ISADORE GREEWALD admires his brother-in-law greatly but has given no indication to Cleveland T-2 that he exercises undue influence on appointee. Cleveland T-2 informed that a few years ago GREEWALD visited the appointee in California and possibly stayed with appointee at appointee's residence. Cleveland T-2 is also of the opinion that appointee visited GREEWALD possibly two years ago on his way to New York.

According to Cleveland T-2, the above information concerning the association between GREENWALD and appointee was obtained from GREENWALD.

The National Lawyers Guild, mentioned above was cited as a Communist front organization by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives on March 29, 1944.

Cleveland T-6, of known reliability, states that the Communist Party considers the National Lawyers Guild to be a working ally.

Available Cleveland directories reflect that ISADORE GRFEHWALD, IDA GOFMAN GREENWALD and SARAH GOFMAN were listed at the same addresses as follows:

11408 Hopkins Avenue (1934-1935);

1251 Edwarton Avenue (1937-1939);

11610 Hopkins Avenue (1940);

3293 Tullamore (1947).

From 193k to 1936 DAVID GOFMAN is also listed at the address indicated above and in 1939 and 1940 JOHN W. GOFMAN (student) is also listed at addresses indicated above for those years. Prior to 1937 IDA GOTMAN GREENMALD is listed as IDA GOFMAN. ISADORE GREENMALD is uniformly referred to as an attorney, Society For Savings Building, 145 Public Square, Rocms 206 (1934), 409 (1941) and 622 (1947). Directories from 1941 through 1946 do not refer to SARAH GOFMAN but indicate that ISADORE and IDA GREENMALD continued residence at 11610 Hopkins through 1942, after which they are listed at 3293 Tullsmore.

Mrs. DAVID BENNETT, 12513 Edmonton Avenue, which is the suite below 12515 Edmonton, the two units constituting a duplex, advised that she is well acquainted with the appointee and his family and that she is of the opinion that they are all entirely loyal American citisens. Mrs. BENNETT volunteered that she was sware of the Russian background of the COFMAN family but stated that she had never observed any other indication of a connection with a foreign country.

Mrs. BENNETT advised that the GOFMANS and GREENFALDS constituted a closely knit unit and did not associate closely with other persons in the neighborhood. With respect to appointee particularly, Mrs. BENNETT observed that he impressed her as an entirely reliable individual of unusual talents whose patriotism was beyond question. She noted that appointee was attending college during most of the time his family resided on Edmonton Avenue, but spent some time at home during vacations.

Mrs. GEORGE SCHWEIDER, 11612 Hopkins Avenue, advised that Mrs. COFMAN owned the duplex house known as 11610 and 11612 Hopkins, and that the SCHWEIDERS had rented the lower portion of this house from her. Mrs. SCHWEIDER stated that she has known appointed a mother for many years and that she was very friendly with them during the early 1940s when they

resided at 11610 Hopkins Avenue. According to Mrs. SCHNEIDER, appointee, who is known as JACK, was away at college most of the time.

J

She stated that the normal degree of association existed between members of the family and in this connection observed that ISADORE and IDA GREENMALD were a part of Nrs. GOFMAN's family. Mrs. SCHNEIDER stated that she had never observed any indication by act or word that any member of this family group was disloyal to the United States. She had no knowledge of organisations to which any of them might belong.

Mrs. GEORGE MARKLEY, 3301 Tullamore, advised that she has known the GREENWALDS and appointee and his mother for approximately the past eight years. She stated that she regards Mrs. GREENWALD as entirely loyal to the United States. However, she stated that her knowledge of Mrs. GREENWALD, appointee and his mother was toe slight to warrant an expression of opinion as to loyalty.

According to Mrs. MARKLEY, appointed has visited his sister and mother very infrequently during the past few years and she was able to recall only one visit in the Summer of 1949 or 1950, at which time appointed left his baby with his relatives and proceeded on to New York. On this occasion, according to Mrs. MARKLEY, appointed spent a part of two days at the Tullamore address.

Mrs. MARKLEY, who advised that Mrs. GREENWALD speaks freely to her, informed that Mrs. GREENWALD had visited appointee in California several years ago and possibly was accompanied by Mr. GREENWALD on that trip. However, she was dubious as to whether Mr. GREENWALD had made this trip and indicated that while her contact with the GREENWALDS was close on a neighborly basis, she had no knowledge of any other personal contacts between appointee and the members of his family in Cleveland.

Mr. LOUIS H. FEDER, a retired clothing salesman, 3289 Tallamore, advised that he and his daughter and son-in-law, Mr. HERBERT H. KLEIN, are not on speaking terms with the GREENMALDS because of personal differences and have no use for the GREENMALDS. However, he stated that so far as he knew, all members of the GREENMALD household were entirely loyal to the United States. He advised that he is not acquainted with the appointee and had never observed him at the GREENMALD home.

### INFORMATION RELATING EXCLUSIVELY TO ISADORE GREENWALD

Cleveland T-7, a local Governmental agency which collects information of a security nature, has advised in September, 1943 that

ISADORE GREENMALD, with offices at 109 Public Square Building, residing at 12515 Edmonton, was an attorney for all Communists and had been very active in organising the picketing of the Italian Consul protesting the Italian intervention in the Spanish Civil War.

It was said by Cleveland T-3 that ISADORE GREENWALD had a brother who was active as a Communist.

Upon recontect, Cleveland T-7 sivised that this information was old and that the available records did not reflect the original source of the reports.

In connection with this information, attention is called to the data set out before indicating that ISADORE GREENMALD formerly occupied Room 109 of the Society For Savings Building, 115 Public Square.

Cleveland T-7 advised that no information is available concerning the brother of ISADORE GREENWALD. Attention is directed to information set out hereinbefore that ISADORE GREENWALD has a brother, LOUIS GREENWALD. The records of the Cleveland Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation contain no information concerning any individual named LOUIS GREENWALD.

Cleveland T-7 furnished the following data and indicated that it was received from Cleveland T-9:

"There are fifteen members of the Communist Party whose duties are to become members of various organisations throughout the city and obtain control of the organisation, and if successful in obtaining control then to try and discredit the organisation...."

"I. GREENWALD and PHILLIP BARTKIL who occupy the same office as attorneys in the Society For Savings Building, also have the duties described above and in addition distribute propaganda as to the great work of the Soviet Union and to discredit the United States."

Cleveland T-9, of unknown reliability, the origin of the above information, was interviewed and advised that he is highly prejudiced against ISADORE GREENMALD because of what he considers cheep professional conduct. However, he stated that this feeling in no way influenced his judgment concerning GREENMALD's patrioties.

Cleveland T-9 advised that because of his membership in the Socialist Party from 1915 to 1924, and his subsequent contact with the organisation Icor, he has acquired extensive knowledge concerning the

Communist Party and concerning the characteristics of Communists who may not be actual members of the Party. Cleveland T-9 indicated that his standards of judgment include such items as the common jargon utilized by all Communists and the attitude of the individual in question towards the Nati-Russian alliance and termination of that alliance in the early days of World War II.

Cleveland T-9 stated that during the early days of World War II he frequently contacted ISAFORE GREENWALD and PHILLIP BARTELL and from his knowledge of Communican concluded that both were "hardened and active Communists". He stated that he based this opinion upon their use of the conventional Communist jargon and upon the fact that they accused him of being pro-Italian and anti-United States because he stood out against Russia at all times during World War II.

According to Cleveland T-9, both BARTELL and GREENWALD made pro-Communist and anti-United States statements but he was unable to recall the exact statements made at this late date. However, he stated that he could remember that these individuals always appeared to follow the changes in the Communist Party line exactly.

It was pointed out to Cleveland T-9 that the original report made by him concerning GREENWALD and BARTELL was considerably more definite than his current information and he was apprised of the details of the data attributed to him. At this time Cleveland T-9 stated that he had made no such statements concerning GREENWALD and BARTELL as were attributed to him but that he recognised general propositions which he had given utterance to and which had apparently been specifically applied to GREENWALD and BARTELL, possibly in the official reporting of his remarks.

According to T-9, his long familiarity with the activities of Communists has familiarised him with their technique which he described as "boring from within", by which he stated he meant that Communists entered otherwise reputable organisations and attempted to take them over for the Communist Party by gaining control of offices, controlling elections, and so forth. T-9 stated that he had frequently described this technique of the Communists to official sources and in all probability had stated that there were approximately fifteen individuals who seemed to him to be Communists who would be suited by ability and temperament to practice the technique of "boring from within" in any organisations to which they might belong. He stated that in all probability he had named GREENWALD and BARTELL as persons who in his opinion would be engaged in such activities because of his feeling that they were "hardened and active Communists".

Cleveland T-9 advised that obviously the kind of information

attributed to him by Cleveland T-7 could only be supplied by a person within the Communist Party or by a person having sources within the Communist Party, and that he had never been a number of the Communist Party nor had he any sources of information who were members of the Party. It is Cleveland T-9's opinion that the data attributed to him by Cleveland T-7 no doubt originated with him but were misinterpreted or edited in the process of official reporting.

Cleveland T-9 asserted that he knew of no "propaganda" in the sense of literature distributed by GREENMALD and LARTELL, but that their oral remarks denouncing the United States and Lauding Russia might be considered propaganda on an informal level.

It is noted that the organisation Icor mentioned above, was cited as a Communist organisation by the California Committee on Un-American Activities report of 1966, Page 261.

In connection with the comments of T-9 on PHILLIP SARTELL, attention is called to information set out hereinbefore concerning PHILLIP BARTELL.

Cleveland T-7 has advised that on Sunday, July 5, 1942 the labor picnic committee of the Communist Party sponsored a picnic held at the Ranch, 14300 Turney Road, Garfield Heights, Ohio, and that this picnic was observed by Cleveland 7-8, an employee of Cleveland T-7. According to information furnished by Cleveland F-7, speakers at this picnic were POBERSONINOR, JOSEPH GRANDT, DAISH LOLICH, and ARNOLD JOHNSON.

Cleveland T-7 advised that Cleveland T-8 observed a car bearing license number JW 792 among those entering the picnic grounds and that Cleveland T-8 determined that this license was registered to ISADORE GREENWALD, 11610 Hopkins Avenue.

Cleveland T-8 was recently contacted and advised that he specifically recalls that there were no other functions going on at the Ranch on July 5, 1942. However, he noted that liquor was being dispensed by an establishment on the grounds and that particular pains were taken to eliminate those cars which merely made contact with the liquor establishment and then drove away.

Listings were made only of those cars whose occupants gave tickets to the ticket taker and thereupon entered the grounds.

Cleveland T-7 has advised that a subposes concerning information furnished by that agency will be honored.

In connection with the above information received from Cleveland T-7, it is noted that Clevelawi T-4, previously described, advised on July 5, 1942 that the entire Communist Party of Chyahoga County turned out for this picnic, plus hundreds of its sympathizers. Cleveland T-4 stated that 3200 tickets were collected at the gate. Cheveland T-4 further noted that many Fellow Travelers and sympathizers attended the picnic whom he had not seen at any of the Party's affairs since 1937.

Cleveland T-4 furnished a copy of the program for this picnic, which program is captioned "Victory in 1942 Picnic" and indicates the speakers as follows:

Chairman, JOE BRANDT, State Secretary, Communist Party

DAISY LOLICH, Cuyahoga County Secretary, Young Communist League

ARNOLD JOHNSON, State Secretary, Communist Party

BOB MINOR, Member National Committee, Communist Party

Mr. WILLIAM A. WEISS, President of the Guyahoga County Bar Association, 1950, with offices in the Keith Building, has advised that he has known ISADORE GREENWALD personally and professionally for a number of years and that nothing had come to his attention which would east any doubt on GREENWALD's loyalty to the United States.

#### EDUCATIONAL DATA CONCERNING APPOINTES

The records of Oberlin College, Oberlin, Ohio reflect that appointee attended that institution from September, 1935 to June 13, 1939, graduating with a major in Chemistry. These records contained no information concerning the loyalty of the appointee.

Mr. MED BOSSORTH, Deen of Men, advised that he would be willing to recommend appointee for a position of trust and confidence on the basis of his knowledge of appointee and further stated that he considered appointee to be a good, leyal American.

Professor HARMY N. HULMES, 329 Reemer Place, retired Head of the Department of Chemistry, Oberlin College, advised that after working closely with appointee on research matters for several years, he had no reason to believe that appointee was not a loyal American.

Professor LUKE E. STEINTR, Head of the Department of Chemistry, Oberlin College, named as a reference by appointee, stated that he would highly recommend appointee for a position of trust and confidence and had no hesitation in stating that appointee is a loyal American citizen.

(

The records of the Western Reserve Medical School reflect that appointee attended that institution from September, 1939 to June, 1940 when he transferred to the University of California. These records contained no information bearing upon appointee's loyalty to the United States.

From a revi & c \* the above college records, it was noted that appointee was uniformly known as JOHN WILLIAM GOFMAN.

#### MI SCFLLANEOUS

The records of the Retail Credit Mens Company in Cleveland and those of the Oberlin Credit Bureau, Oberlin, Ohio contained no record concerning appointee.

The records of the Cleveland Police Department, Common Plass Court of Cuyahoga County Criminal Branch, and the Oberlin Police Department, Oberlin, Ohio, were searched but no record was found concerning this appointee.

There is no record of appointee in the files of Cleveland T-7, previously described.

Cleveland T-10, T-11, T-12 and T-13, all reliable confidential informants having knowledge of the activities of the Communist Party in the Cleveland area, have been recently contacted and have advised that the appointee and his brother-in-law, ISADORE GREENWALD, are both unknown to them.

Cleveland T-1 advised that ISADORE GREENWALD frequently and feelingly relates an incident of his school days when a schoolmate said to him, "Kike, get out of my chair". GREENWALD stated that such a remark would never be permitted in Russia. Cleveland T-1 believes that GREENWALD's bitterness to the United States is traceable to a considerable degree to this incident.

Cleveland T-l advised that according to GREENWALD, appointee is trying strenuously to lose his Jewish identity and refrained from introducing GREENWALD to some of his friends in California to further this purpose.

The local Immigration and Naturalisation records concerning DAVE and SARAH GOFFAN (respectively 2530-P-18812 and 2530-P-66326) have been sent to Washington Headquarters.

captioned CL-47 in September, 1941 as follows:

"Attorneys serving Communists in Cleveland:- GREENWALD, attorney for all Communists, was very active in organising the picketing of the Italian Consul recently, protesting the American intervention in the Spanish Civil War. GREENWALD also has a brother who is a Communist."

Upon recontact by advised that he had a vague recollection of turning over the above data to the FBI but had no idea whether it referred to ISADORE GREENWALD. further stated that he did not recall the source of the information but that it might have been received from LOUIS BUDENZ or EDDIE CHEIFITZ, now an assistant to Mr. ERIC JOHNSTON in Washington, D. C.

In view of the above and further in view of the fact that identical data were received from the Subversive Detail of the Cleveland Police Department as specifically applying to ISADORE GREENMAID, 12515 Edmonton Avenue. no reference is made in the details to the information as supplied by

Further, referenced Cleveland letter of April 11, 1950 quoted the following as received from the Subversive Detail, Cleveland Police Department:

"I. GREENMALD, Chairman, Legislative Committee, Cleveland Chapter of the National Lawyers Guild. Leader in the Workers Alliance. He is a member of the Communist Party by JOHN MOSBERGER. He protested to Mayor BLYTHIN for rental of Public Hell to GERALD L. K. SMITH."

This information was received from the Clevelard Police Department in the form of two photostatic cards stepled together, the first reading, "I. GREENMALD, Chairman, Legislative Comm. Cleve. Chap., Natl. Lawyers Guild (#9#; Leader, Workers Alliance (195)".

The second, which is without any name heading read: "The above is a member of the Communist Party by JOHN MOSSBERGER. He protested to Mayor BLYTHIN for rental of the Public Hall to GERALD K. SMITH".

When contacted recently by SA F. JOHN M. BEATTIE, JOHN MOSSBERGER denied any knowledge of an I. or ISADORE GREENMALD, attorney, but stated he had furnished data concerning E. G. GREENFIELD to the Cleveland Police Department.

A check of the original cards maintained by the Subversive Detail of the Cleveland Police Department on E. C. GREENFIELD revealed a card identical in every respect with that which was furnished to the Cleveland Division as relating to I. GREENMAID. The file of the Subversive Detail relating to I. GREENMAID contains no such card. It is therefore concluded that in furnishing information on I. GREENMAID to the Cleveland Division the Subversive Detail inadvertently combined eards relating to GREENMALD and GREENFIELD. Further proof may be deduced from the fact that the records of the Subversive Detail refer to the Cleveland "Prass" on October 13, 1941 as carrying a protest to Mayor BLYTHIN against rental of the Public Hall to GERALD L. K. SMITH. A review of this paper and the Cleveland "News" and "Plain Dealer" of October 13 and 14, 1941 reveals that E. C. GREENFIELD, a field representative of the International Longshoremens and Warehousemens Union was uniformly listed as a signer of this petition. While there were numerous signers, it was noted that the name GREENWALD did not appear.

The above E. C. GREENFIELD is apparently identical with ELVADORE C. GREENFIELD, who has been well known to the Cleveland Division and was reported at one time as State Committeemen of the Communist Party.

A check of the original eard indicating that I. GREENWALD was Chairman of the Legislative Committee of the Cleveland Chapter of the National Lawyers Guild and leader of the Workers Alliance, revealed that there was no additional identifying data to connect this information with ISADORE GREENWALD. The available index cards reflected that the allegations were originally supported by Exhibite 95 as to the Lawyers Guild and 195 as to the Workers Alliance. However, Exhibit 95 did not connect the data with ISADORE GREENWALD and Exhibit 195 is lost or destroyed.

(

In view of the fact that ISADORE GREENWALD has been placed in the National Lawyers Guild by Cleveland T-3, no additional efforts have been made to verify this information furnished by the Cleveland Subversive Squad and the information is not utilized in the details of this report.

It is further noted that the Cleveland file on E. C. GREENFIELD reflects that he has been a leader of the Workers Alliance. It is therefore believed that the statement that I. GREENMALD is a leader in the Workers Alliance is a further scrambling of the information in the Cleveland Police Department files.

Cleveland T-9, who is JOSEPH MOLDAVER, attorney, Room 502 of the Engineers Building, 1365 Ontario, has advised that he was a very active, participating member of the Socialist Party from 1915 to 1924, Branch 17, 5610 Scovill Avenue. He indicated that at one time he was Financial Secretary of the Socialist Party in Cleveland.

MOLDAVER stated that over the period of pears he observed the split-off of the left wing Socialists who eventually attached themselves to the Communist Party. In this connection he stated that at one time the left wingers of the Socialist Party threatened to kill him because of what they regarded as his conservative position. MOLDAVER advised that he fell out of favor with the Socialists because he refused to malign other groups, and charges were brought against him in the Party alleging that he had campaigned for someone outside of the Party for a position in the local Cleveland government.

In 1924 he stated he was officially "kicked out".

It is MOLDAVER's position that many of the techniques now utilised by the Communist Party were perfected in the Socialist Party and taken with the left wingers when they secoded from the Socialist Party.

MOLDAVER has been interviewed on numerous occasions by Agents of the Cleveland Division with respect to individual security matters and has furnished information of value. It is apparent that he has a store-house of information concerning radical matters in Cleveland from prior to World War I up to possibly 1910, and consideration is being given to interviewing him on an overall basis.

MOLDAVER stated that even after he had observed the Communist Party members to take over the Jewish organisation Icor by the usual Communist techniques, he accepted an invitation in approximately 1934 or 1935 to address the group on the subject of the NIRA. He stated that this was the second occasion on which he nearly lost his life to the Communists.

During the course of his speech he asserted that Roosevelt had accomplished more through the MIRA than Stalin had accomplished in five years, and was immediately barraged by insults and seised and nearly thrown out of the third story window of the building where he was speaking. According to MDIDAVER, he was saved through the intervention of a personal friend who was nonetheless a member of the left wing group of Icor.



#### RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION



This letter reflects that Harry Christensen advised that Isadore Greenvald, the brother-in-law of this employee, apparently had a strong feeling of admiration for this employee and that Gofman visited Greenwald after he had attended many scientific conferences.

Christensen stated that Greenwald is extremely pro-Communist, and that Greenwald's antagonism toward democracy and capitalistic system has caused ill feeling between Greenwald and his lawyer associates.

This investigation should be directed toward establishing the closeness of association between the employee and his brother-in-law, Isadore Greenwald, and the Cleveland Office should set out any pertinent data concerning Greenwald. The San Francisco Office should set out the basis and the personal history data on this employee.



#### I. PERSONAL HISTORY

Records of the University of California, Berkeley. California, reflect that JOHN MILLIAM COPMAN was born on September 21, 1918, at Cleveland, Obio. His parents were DAVID COPMAN (deceased) and SARAH GOPMAN, both natives of Russia. The employee stated on his personnel record that both of his parents had become United States citizens. He married HELEN ADELAIDS FAUL on August 10, 1940, at Madeworth, Ohio. Her date and place of birth were recorded as May 18, 1917, at Wadeworth, Ohio.

From 1975 to 1979 the employee was a student at Oberlin College, Oberlin, Ohio. From 1939 to 1940 he completed the first year of medical school at the Western Reserve Medical School, Ulaveland, Ohio. From 1940 to 1943 he was engaged in graduate work in nuclear chamistry at the University of Galifornia at Berkeley, receiving his Ph.D. Degree in 1943, In 1943 and 1944 he was engaged in plutonium research at the University of California.

In 1944-1946 he was a student at the University of California Medical School, requiring his M.D. Degree in 1946. From 1946 to 1947 he was an interm at the University of California Mospital. From 1947 to date he has been employed in the Department of Medical Physics at the University of California and in 1950 and 1951 he has also been employed part time as a clinical instructor in medicine at the University of California Mospital.

### II. DASIS YOR INVESTIGATION

This investigation was requested by the Federal Security Agency, Washington, D.C., based on information furnished by Cleveland E-1, of unknown relighity, who savised ISADOTE GREENALD, a brother-im-law of the ampleyes, is extremely pre-Communist and that GREENALD's

SF 121-4026 antagonism towards democracy and the capitalistic system has caused ill feeling between CREENALD and his lawyer associates. Cleveland T-1 added that GREENWALD apparently has a strong feeling of admiration for GOFMAN and that GOFMAN visited GREENWALD after attending many scientific conferences. III. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION AT BERKELRY, CALIFORNIA DOROTHY HURLAY, Registrar's Office, University of Califormia, produced records which reflected that the employee was admitted as a graduate student in chemistry in August 1940 and received his Ph.D. Degree on February 6, 1943. He entered the University of Califernia Medical School in 1944 and received his M.D. Degree in June 19h6. The Registrar's records contained no information reflecting on the loyalty of the employee. BLANCHE MILLER, Office of the Secretary of the Regents of the University of California, furnished the following information bearing on the academic employment of GCFMAN at the University of Californias From 1940 to 1942 he was employed as a teaching assistant in the Chemistry Department. In 1942 he was employed as a Research Associate in Chemistry. From 1947 to 1950 he was employed as an Assistant Professor of Medical Physics. From 1950 to date he has been employed as an Associate Professor of Medical Physics. From 1950 to date he has been employed part time as a Clinical Instructor in Medicine. The Regents records contain no information reflecting on the loyalty of the employee. Mr. GEORGE EVERSON, Director of Scientific Personnel, University of California Radiation Laboratory, advised that from 1942 until 1944 COFMAN was employed on a special project concerning plutonium research under the direction of the Chemistry Department at the University of California. He was reemployed during the summer of 1916 doing research work at the Donner Laboratory, University of California. He was again employed at the Donner Laboratory in July 1947 and has been continuously employed there to date. Mr. EVERSON commented that in connection with the employee's work on plutonium research, he was instrumental in the - 2 -

discovery of Uranium 233. EVERSON also advised that in connection with his recent research work at the Donner Laboratory the employee has made "historic discoveries" in connection with the importance of fatty protiens and their relationship to heart diseases. EVERSON stated that he offered this information because he felt that it reflected favorably on the employee's loyalty to the United States, inasmuch as all of GOFMAN's work has been conducted under the auspices of either the Atomic Energy Commission or the United States Public Health Service, resulting in comparatively minor financial gain for GOFMAN. EVERSON stated that he would recommend GOFMAN wholeheartedly as a loyal American.

Professor WENDKIL LATIMER, Chemistry Department, University of California, advised that he was the employee's immediate supervisor from 1942 to 1944 when he was engaged in plutonium research. He stated that he has known GOFMAN continuously from 1940 and he would recommend him without hesitation as a loyal and patriotic American.

Professor JOEL H. HILLERAN, Chairman of the Department of Chemistry, advised that he has known GOFMAN since 1910 and that he considers him to be "an outstandingly patriotic American," inasmuch as he had made major contributions to American science. He said he has had no reason whatsoever to question GOFMAN's loyalty to the United States. He added that he is not acquainted with the employee's family.

Mr. JAMES MILLER, Assistant Business Manager, University of California, stated that he has known the employee casually for two or three years and he has had no reason to question his levelty to the United States.

Dr. JOHN LAWRENCE, Mirector of the Donner Laboratory, stated that he has been closely associated with the employee for about five years and that he would recommend him highly as a loyal American. He stated that he is also well acquainted with GOFMAN's wife and has had no reason to question her loyalty to the United States. He also advised that he has no knowledge of the employee's relatives in the Cleveland, Ohio, area. He stated that GOFMAN is presently employed as a special consultant to the Public Health Service and he is also engaged in research work at the Donner Laboratory which is partially financed by Public Health Service funds.

Dr. HARDIN JONES, Assistant Director, Donner Laboratory, advised that he considers himself to be the employee's closest friend in the California area. He is also well acquainted with the employee's wife and he considers them both to be without a doubt loyal Americans. He offered information that GOFMAN is presently engaged in the study of the significance of fatty protions in connection with heart diseases and that GOFMAN's discoveries in this connection will have important scientific significance in the near future.

JONES emphasized that the employee is completely disinterested in financial gain and has done most of his work under the auspices of the United States Government without any thought of personal gain. Dr. JONES advised that he is not acquainted with any of GOFMAN's family members other than his wife and child.

Mr. RCBERT A. SAMS SOUCI, Administrative Assistant, Donner Laboratory, stated that he has been in close contact with the employee for over five years. He commented that he has had "absolutely no reason to question GOFMAN's loyalty." He also recommended GOFMAN's wife as a loyal American, but advised that he is not acquainted with any of the other relatives of the employee.

Prefessor RAIMOND BIRGS, Chairman of the Physics Department, University of California, advised that he has been well acquainted with the employee since about 1941 and stated he would recommend GCFMAN without hesitation as a thoroughly loyal American.

Professor LEGNARD LOES, Physics Department, stated that he has been acquainted easually with the employee since about 1942 and that he has had no reason to question GOFMAN's loyalty to the United States.

Mrs. HAROLD RANDLES, Manager of the spartment house at 1890 Arch Street, advised that her records indicate that the employee had resided at this address between 1941 and 1944, but she was unable to furnish the exact dates of his residence and was unable to recall him.

SF 121-4026 The employee was unknown to the following persons at the above address, both of whom have resided there for eleven years: Miss MILIRED MITCHELL and Mrs. LAURA DEMINI. In connection with a previous investigation Mrs. BETTY MOAKES, 1878 Parker Street, advised that she was the Manager of the apartment house at 2339 Hilgard Street in 1940 and 1941. She stated that she recalled the employee as a former resident of this building and she furnished no information reflecting on his loyalty to the United States. The employee is unknown to the following persons residing at 2339 Hilgard Street: Miss JOSEPHIME SEEDON and Mr. FREDERICK IKERS. at san francisco, california Dr. FRANCIS SMITH, Dean of the University of California Medical School, advised that he has been well acquainted with the employee since 1944 and advised that GOFMAN was one of the best students ever to attend this medical school and graduated number one in his class. He stated that the employee's wife is also a physician and is presently an Assistant Resident Physician in Pediatrics under Dr. SIITH's immediate supervision. He stated that he felt he could recommend both the employee and his wife without reservation as loyal Americans. He commented that although GOFMAN is technically a clinical instructor in medicine at the University of California Hospital, all of his time in the past three or four years has been spent in research at the Donner Laboratory on the University of California Campus in Berkeley. Mr. PETER MASON BOND, 1039 Clayton Street, advised that he has been a next-door neighbor of the employee for about three years and that he is also a social acquaintance of the COFMANS. He stated that he sees very little of the employee, inasmuch as GCFMAN works night and day at the Donner Laboratory in Berkeley. He stated that he would not hesitate to recommend the employee and his wife as loyal Americans. He was unable to furnish the names of any other persons in this neighborhood who would know the employee in view of the fact that GOFMAN and his wife spend so little time at home. -5SF 121-L026

The employee was unknown to the following persons in the vicinity of 1047 Clayton Street: MILIRED A. ROBERTSON, 1053 Clayton Street; ELEANOR J. SUMMERS, 1053 Clayton Street; and Mrs. F. R. GORSELINE, 1055 Clayton Street.

In connection with a previous investigation the following persons in the vicinity of 206 Judah Street were interviewed in 1947:

Mrs. A. SIERRECHT, owner of the apartment house at 206 Judah Street, advised that the employee and his wife had resided there for about three or four years, that they were excellent tenants, and that she considered them to be loyal Americans.

Mrs. DOBOTHY DAVIES stated that she had known the employee about three years and that both he and his wife were, in her opinion, loyal Americans. She had no knowledge of any of the employee's other relatives.

Miss J. F. KLARS, 206 Judah Street, stated that she had been acquainted with the employee for about two or three years, but that her acquaintance with him had been se slight that she could not comment on the question of his loyalty to the United States.

Mrs. GEORGE SHELLEY, 206 Judah, stated that she had been casually acquainted with the employee for two or three years and she furnished no information reflecting unfavorably on his loyalty to the Smited States.

There was no record of the employee or his wife at the San Francisco Police Department or the Berkeley Police Department.

The files of the Retailers Credit Association at Sen Francisco and of the Alameda County Retailers Credit Association at Oakland contain no disloyal information concerning the employee or his wife. 57 101-4036

San Francisco T-1, T-3, T-4, T-5, and T-6, all of known reliability, who are familiar with some aspects of un-American activities in the San Francisco May area, including Berkeley, California, have no information identifiable with the amployue or his wife.

The records of the House Committee on un-American Activities contain no information concerning the employee,

The records of Sen Francisco Te7, a government agency conducting personnel investigation, contain 10 information concerning the employee pertinent to their investigation.

The records of Sen Francisco T-8, a government agency conducting personnel and security investigation, contain so information sencerning the employee.

Amployou's mass was checked against the records of the Identification Division of the Federal Sureau of Investigation, Veshington, D. C., and no criminal record was located.


