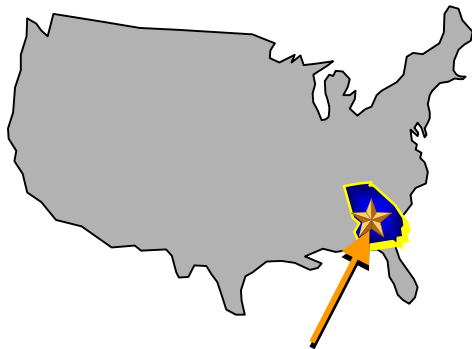

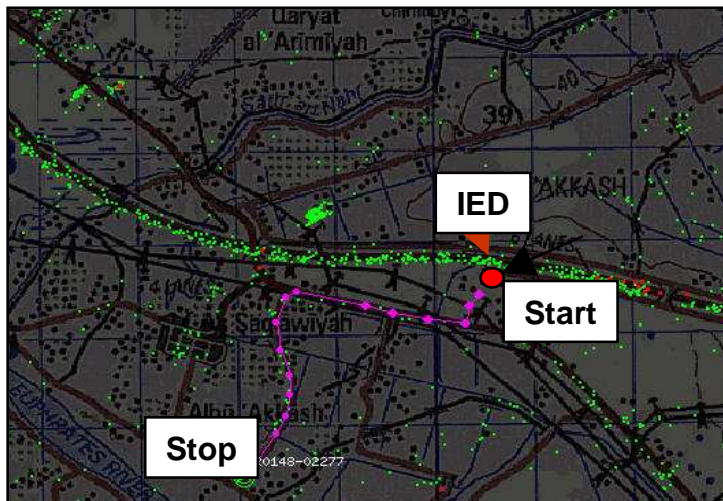

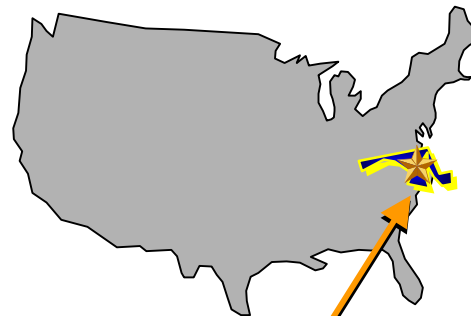


Example of JSTARS Moving Target Indicator (MTI) Data

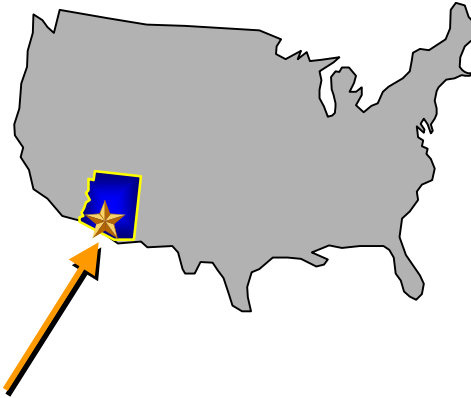

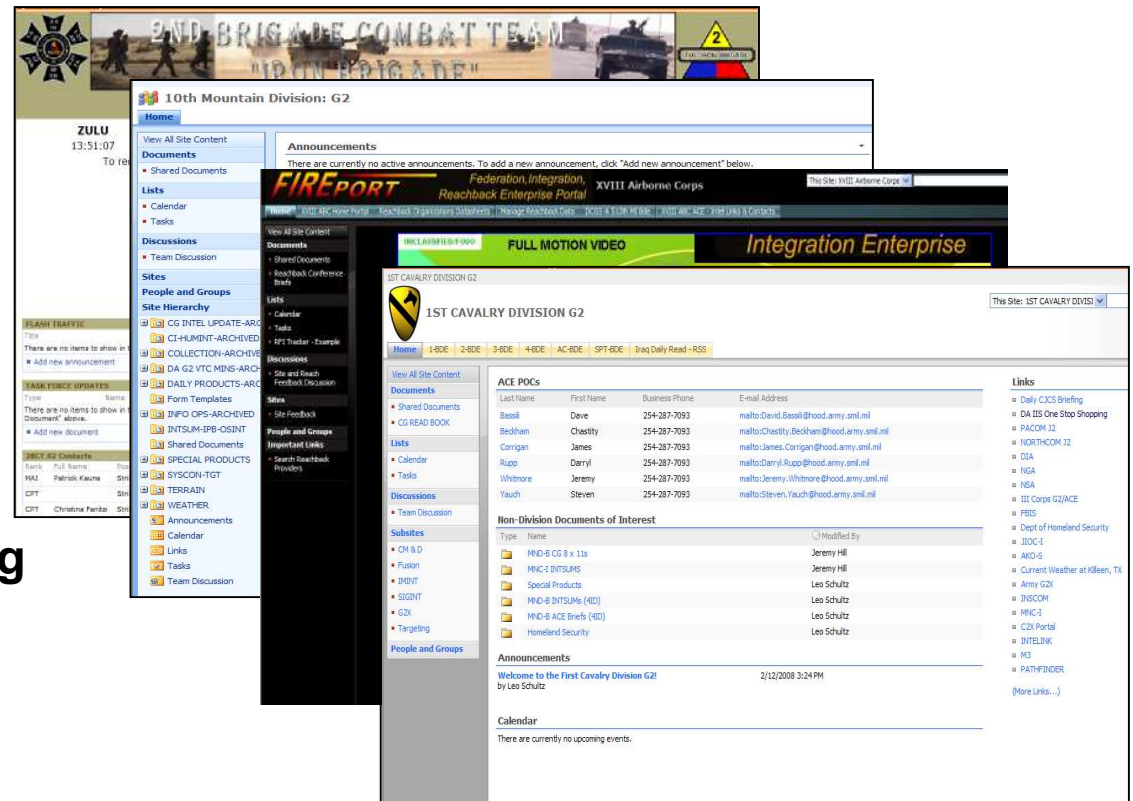

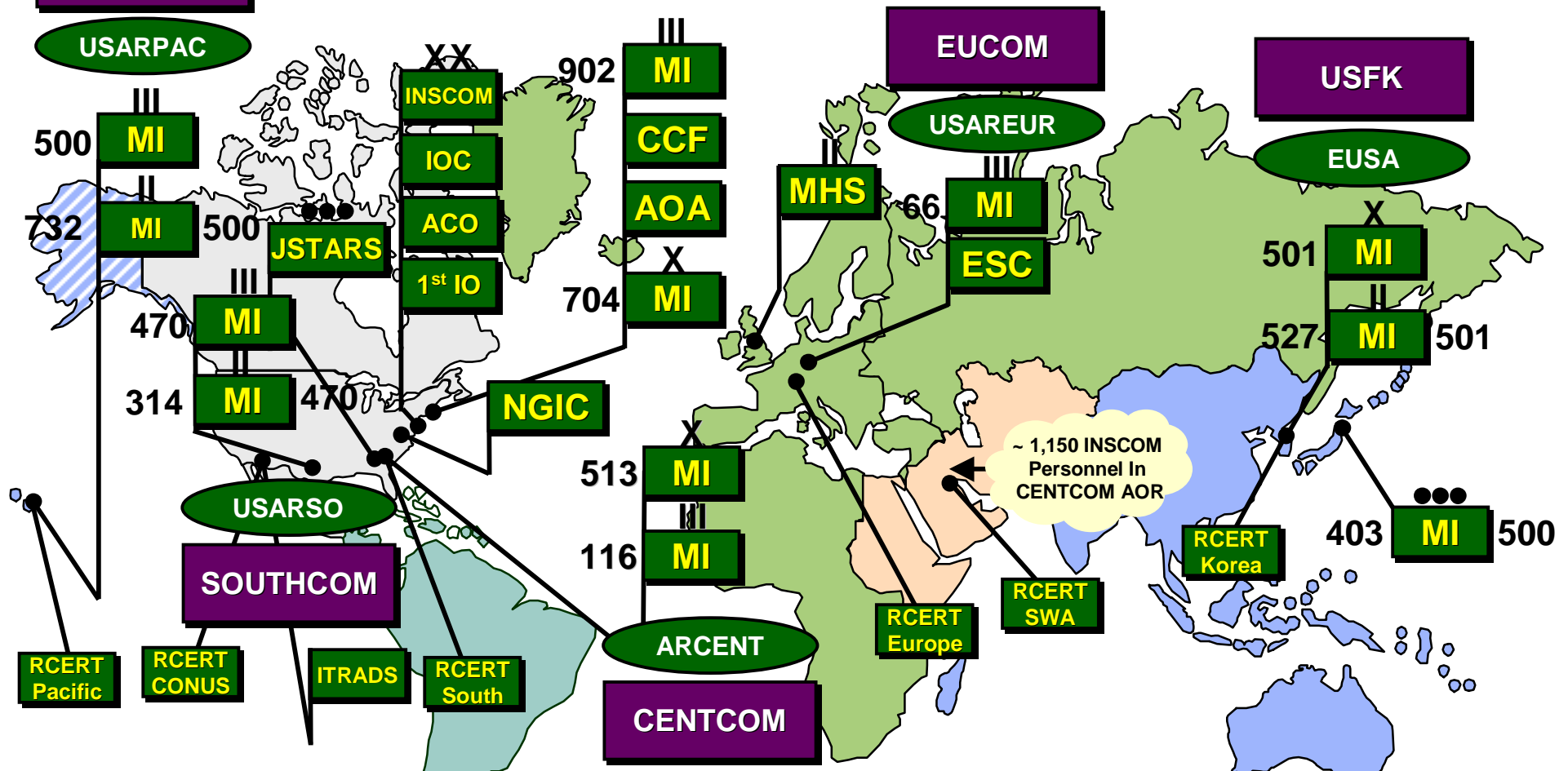

INSCOM's Global Presence

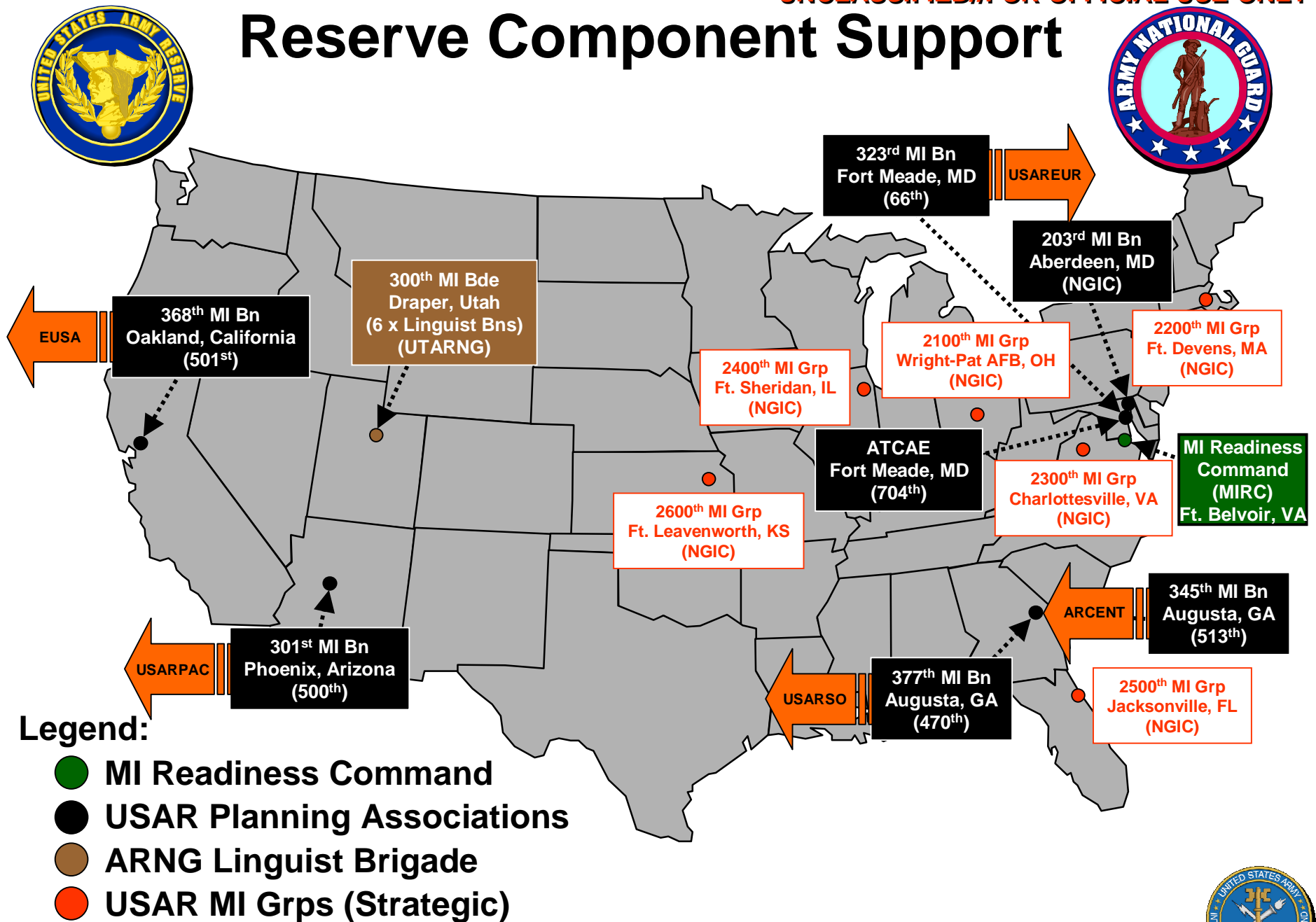

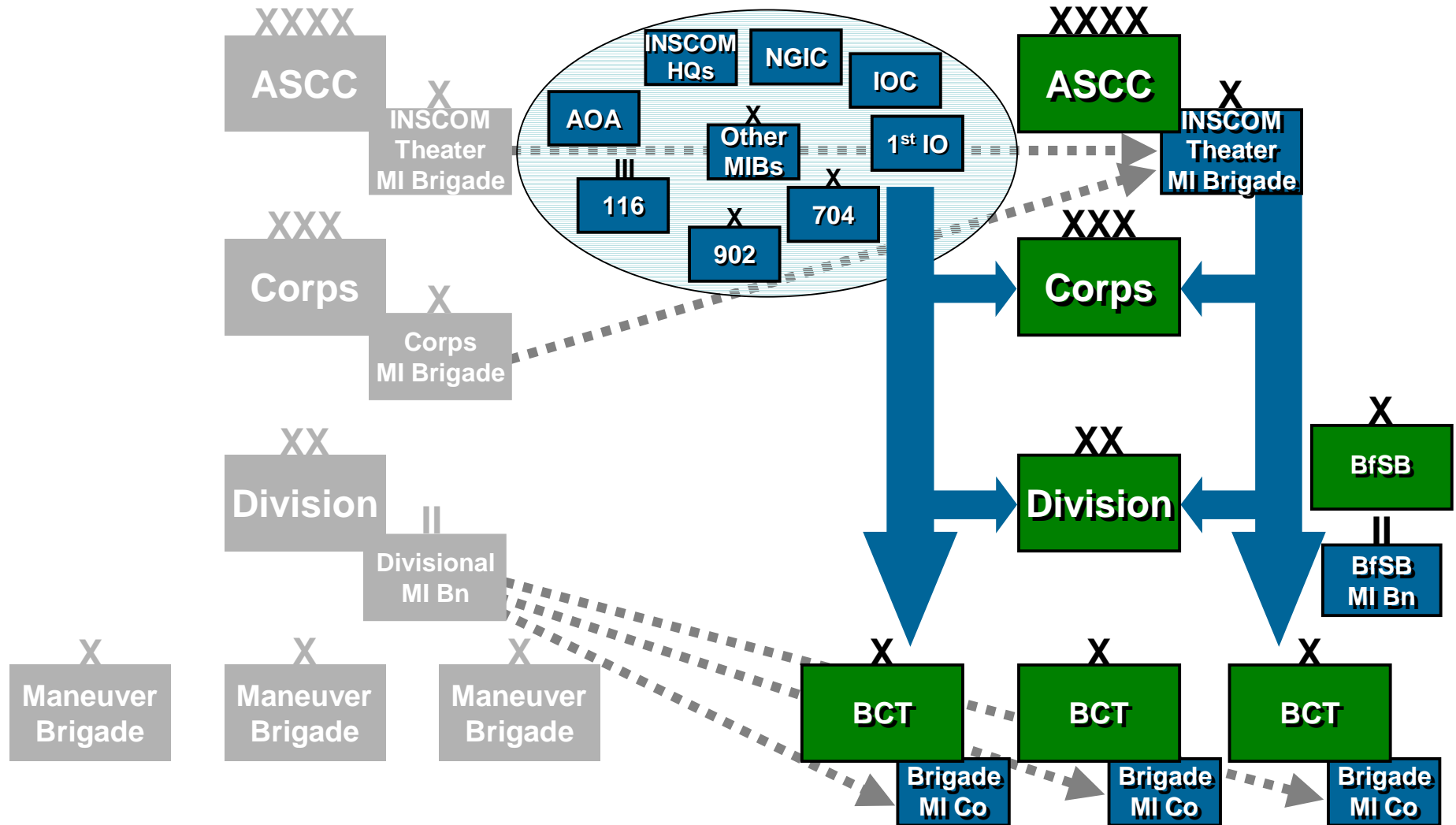

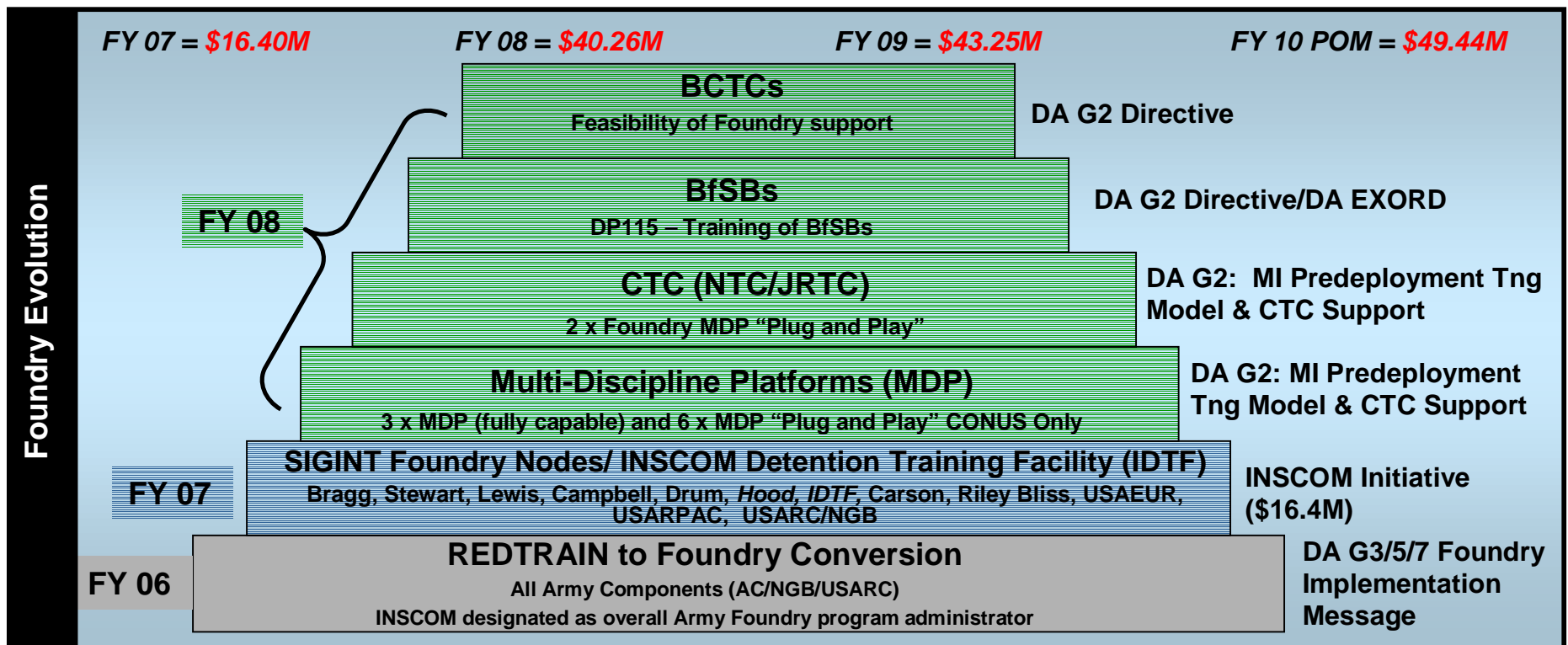
A multi-discipline intelligence training and operational framework developed, implemented and supported by INSCOM ... designed to enhance and sustain Soldiers' intelligence skills through steady state regional focus, improved functional expertise and tailorable technical training.

- Foundry is a DA G-3/5/7 and DA G-2 Priority
- Leverages national capabilities and access, addressing current, near and future mission requirements
- Training sites span the globe: OCONUS, CONUS, CTCs, NGB, USARC
- Foundry extends the reach of the national intelligence system to the tactical force

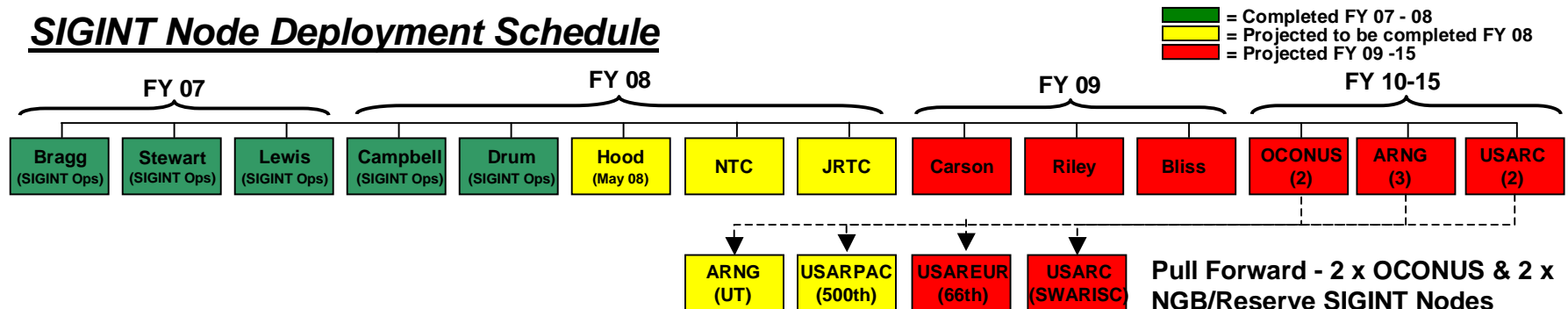
Evolution of Foundry



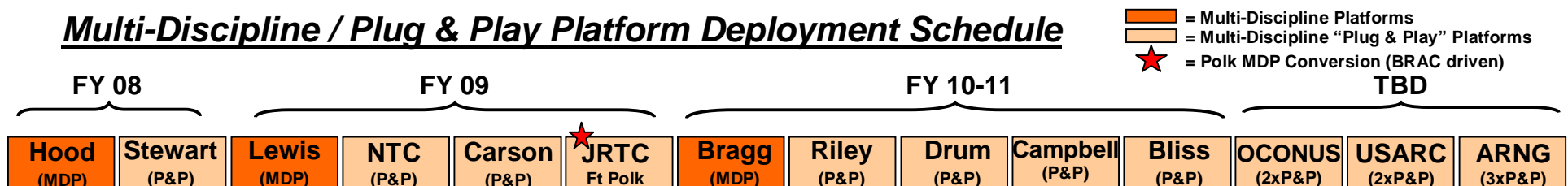
Multi-Discipline Platform Deployment Schedule

DP 115 BfSB MI Bn Support Relationship

The Basics of BfSB MI Bn Support

- **6-9 Months Prior to Deployment**
 - INSCOM Staff assists supported unit with training schedule development
 - BfSB confirms Soldier availability/gains with HRC
 - SIGINT Soldiers undergo CI Polygraph
 - Connectivity issues identified and resolved (training site needs NSANet)
 - BfSB mans IAW Operational Needs Statement (ONS)
 - INSCOM identifies Foundry enabled (funded) training
- **0-6 Months Prior to Deployment**
 - BfSB / INSCOM refine / finalize / adjust training schedules
 - Equipment identified and delivered
 - Mobile Training Teams deploy to supported unit home station (or other training site as required)
- **Deployment and Beyond**
 - INSCOM provides continuing “help desk” services via “Reach” capability
 - MTTs forward deploy as required



Closing Thoughts

- INSCOM provides dedicated, multi-discipline Intelligence and Intelligence training support to the Warfighter
- INSCOM provides augmentation - ranging from individual soldiers up to Battalion Task Force size units - to forward deployed operations as required
- INSCOM responds to Warfighter operational needs with Quick Reaction Capability (QRC) development and deployment
- INSCOM “fills the gap” between BfSB MI Bns and National Intelligence Agencies
