The heart of the argument for continuing support is the following from the CIA paper:

"The Ambassador and the Chief of Station indicate that <u>El Mercurio</u> is a significant element in promoting the opposition cause. In our view <u>El Mercurio</u>'s continued existence as an independent voice, highly respected both inside and outside Chile, is deemed essential in the forthcoming period leading up to the Congressional elections which, if Allende wins, will permit him to govern on his terms..."

CIA and State favor the proposal. The general feeling appears to be that we have little choice. El Mercurio is important. It is a thorn in Allende's side. It does help give heart to the opposition forces. Without it, the Allende Government would have much clearer sailing. And if it goes down the drain because of government pressure—as opposed to financial failure—we have an excellent "freedom of the press" issue to use there and in the Hemisphere.
