SUBJECT: CBS STORY ON ISRAEL! NUCLEAR WEAPONS

- 1. (LOU ENTIRE TEXT.)
- 2. CBS EVENING NEWS RAN A MAJOR STORY FEBRUARY 21 IN WHICH IT CLAIMED THAT ISRAEL HAD PRODUCED DOZENS OF ATOMIC WEAPONS AS WELL AS SEVERAL HYDROGEN BOMBS. THE STORY, NARRATED BY CORRESPONDENT DAN RAVIV IN ROME, WAS BASED LARGELY ON THE WORK OF TWO ISRAELI JOURNALISTS, ELI TEICHER AND AMI DEROM (PHONETIC). STORY CLAIMED THAT ISRAEL EXPLODED A NUCLEAR WEAPON IN THE SOUTH AT-LANTIC OCEAN SEPTEMBER 22, 1979, WITH THE ASSISTANCE AND COOPERATION OF SOUTH AFRICA. STORY ALSO CLAIMED THAT ISRAEL AND SOUTH AFRICA HAVE COOPERATED IN NUCLEAR WEAPONS PRODUCTION FOR DECADES, WITH SOUTH AFRICA PROVIDING URANIUM TO ISRAEL AND AT ONE POINT IN THE MID '60'S OFFERING FACILITIES FOR AN ISRAELI NUCLEAR TEST. ACCORDING TO THE STORY, ISRAEL DID NOT AT ANY TIME ASK FOR OR GET ANY ASSISTANCE FROM THE UNITED STATES.
- 3. FOLLOWING IS PRESS GUIDANCE PREPARED FOR USE BY DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN IN RESPONDING TO MEDIA INQUIRIES:
- Q: DOES ISRAEL HAVE NUCLEAR WEAPONS, INCLUDING H BOMBS?
- A: WHILE THERE HAVE BEEN VARIOUS ALLEGATIONS ON THIS SUBJECT, THE ONLY COMMENT I HAVE IS TO NOTE THE RE-PEATED STATEMENTS OF THE GOVERNMENT OF ISRAEL THAT THEY WILL NOT BE THE FIRST TO INTRODUCE NUCLEAR WEAPONS INTO THE MIDDLE FAST.
- Q: DID ISRAEL AND SOUTH AFRICA COLLABORATE IN CON-DUCTING A HUCLEAR TEST IN THE SOUTH ATLANTIC ON SEPTEMBER 22, 1979?

A: AS YOU KNOW, THE PANEL OF SCIENTIFIC EXPERTS CONVENED BY THE WHITE HOUSE HAS CONDUCED A THOROUGH
REVIEW OF ALL AVAILABLE INFORMATION CONCERNING THE
NATURE AND PROBABLE SOURCE OF THE LIGHT SIGNAL RECORDED
BY A U.S. SATELLITE OVER THE SOUTH ATLANTIC ON
SEPTEMBER 22, 1979. AFTER REVIEWING BOTH CLASSIFIED
AND UNCLASSIFIED INFORMATION AND CONDUCTING OTHER
ANALYSES, THE PANEL WAS UNABLE TO CONCLUDE WHETHER
THE SIGNAL WAS GENERATED BY A NUCLEAR EXPLOSION OR
SOME OTHER PHENOMENON.

-- THE PANEL RECOMMENDED THAT FURTHER ANALYSES BE UNDERTAKEN TO IMPROVE OUR INTERSTANDING OF THE SIGNAL. THIS IS BEING UNDERTAKEN AND WE WILL CONTINUE TO REVIEW DATA AND INFORMATION CONCERNING THE EVENT. WHILE FOLLOW-ON INVESTIGATIONS MAY PROVIDE CORROBORATIVE DATA IF A NUCLEAR EXPLOSION OCCURRED, AT THIS TIME THERE IS NO INFORMATION THAT WOULD CLEARLY CORROBORATE SUCH AN OCCURRENCE. THERE IS NO PARTICULAR POINT IN MY SPECULATING AS TO WHO MIGHT HAVE BEEN RESPONSIBLE FOR AN EVENT THAT WE CANNOT CONCLUDE OCCURRED.
