1. I THINK IT HIGHLY UNWISE TO ORGANIZE A WORLDWIDE REACTION TO THE INDIAN NUCLEAR TEST FOR THE FOLLOWING REASONS:

FIRST, IT WOULD ANTAGONIZE INDIA TO NO BENEFIT SINCE THE TEST

MUST REFLECT A LONG-TERM PROGRAM IN ANY EVENT.

SECOND, IT IS SYMPTOMATIC OF THE SELF-SERVING AND SELF-PROMOTING TENDENCY FOR THE DOMESTIC RECORD OFTEN CHARACTERISTIC OF US FOREIGN POLICY.

THE IMPACT OF OUR BREASTBEATING ON THE PROGRAMS OF OTHER COUNTRIES WILL BE MARGINAL.

- 2. THEREFORE, I WOULD LIKE YOU TO DRAFT A NSSM INSTRUCTION FOR A COMPREHENSIVE REVIEW OF THE NON-PROLIFERATION PROGRAM FOR ME TO CLEAR SO THAT WE CAN GET OUR THINKING ABOUT THE IMPLICATIONS OF THE INDIAN TEST IN ORDER TO AVOID SHOOTING FROM THE HIP.
- 3. YOU SHOULD ALSO ISSUE AN INSTRUCTION SAYING THAT THE PRESIDENT HAS ORDERED THAT PENDING THE OUTCOME OF THE NSM, ALL ADMINISTRATION SPOKESMEN ARE TO TAKE THE FOLLOWING LINE IN RESPONSE TO QUESTIONS ONLY; THEY ARE NOT TO VOLUNTEER ANYTHING: (A) THE UNITED STATES HAS LONG BEEN AGAINST NUCLEAR PROLIFERATION FOR THE ADVERSE IMPACT IT WILL HAVE ON WORLD STABILITY. THAT REMAINS OUR POSITION; (B) THIS LINE IS NOT TO BE USED TO ORGANIZE A WORLDWIDE CAMPAIGN BUT ONLY TO RESPOND INDIVIDUALLY TO INDIVIDUAL INQUIRIES IN A LOW-KEY MANNER, AND (C) ALL PUBLIC STATEMENTS AND INSTRUCTIONS CONCERNING THIS MATTER MUST BE CLEARED BY THE WHITE HOUSE.
- 4. PLEASE CONTACT HAIG TO ASSURE THAT HE SUPPORTS YOU WITH DOD AND OTHERS ON THIS POLICY.

1. I think it highly unwise to organize a worldwide reaction to the Indian nuclear test for the following reasons:

First, it would antagonize India to no benefit since the test must reflect a long-term program in any event.

Second, it is symptomatic of the self-serving and self-promoting tendency for the domestic record often characteristic of US foreign policy.

The impact of our breastbeating on the programs of other countries will be marginal.

- 2. Therefore, I would like you to draft a NSSM instruction for a comprehensive review of the non-proliferation program for me to clear so that we can get our thinking about the implications of the Indian test in order to avoid shooting from the hip.
- 3. You should also issue an instruction saying that the President has ordered that pending the outcome of the NSSM, all administration spokesmen are to take the following line:in response to questions only; they are not to volunteer anything: (a) The United States has long been against nuclear proliferation for the adverse impact it will

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have on world stability. That remains our position; (b) this line is not to be used to organize a worldwide campaign but only to respond individually to individual inquiries in a low-key manner, and (c) all public statements and instructions concerning this matter must be cleared by the White House.
