SIOP Changes and Tactical Warning (TS)

This morning at 4:00 a.m. the NMCC placed me in a "Missile Threat Assessment Conference Call." One of three radars on the West Coast indicated -- with high confidence -- that an SLBM had been launched and would impact 150 NM off the Oregon coast. Technically, the DDO in the NMCC should have initiated a "NUCFLASH" conference call, bringing you, Harold Brown, and General Jones into the net. They considered it, but in the meanwhile, the absence of a second radar confirming the track and the time of impact slipping by convinced the DDO not to raise the NUCFLASH conference. (TS)

It is a very chilling experience to pick up the phone and hear NORAD repeating "we have high confidence in the system" and wonder how to use the remaining four or five minutes. A few weeks ago, the PARCS system reported a positive track -- "high confidence." It was accurate. It was tracking a decaying space object, the J-3 reported later. (TS)

I provide this as background for another memo on SIOP matters which I shall give you for the Friday lunch with Harold Brown. I believe you can see why I am a little disturbed. I am comforted, however, by the fact that our WHCA switch works. They alert me at the lowest warning level, which occurs two or three times a year. We could have put you and the President on the line instantly, but you would have had only the uncertain data on which no confident decision could have been made. (TS)
