THE INDIAN HIGHLANDS CONTINUES. IN MAY, 163 CAMPESINOS WERE KILLED, INCLUDING MANY WOMEN AND CHILDREN. THE SAVAGE MASSACRE OF LARGE NUMBERS OF CAMPESINOS IN

SPECIFIC ATTACKS REFLECTS A CLEAR INCREASE IN ATTACKS AGAINST UNARMED INDIANS. THE KILLING OF EIGHTY GUERRILLAS BY SECURITY FORCES ALSO SIGNIFIES AN INCREASE IN MILITARY ACTIVITY. FOR THE SECOND STRAIGHT MONTH THE 138 VICTIMS KILLED BY THE LEFT SURPASSES THE NUMBER OF VICTIMS ATTRIBUTED TO THE EXTREME RIGHT, THE GOG, DEATH SQUADS, OR THE NON-ATTRIBUTION CATEGORY.

1 POLITICIAN 1 DUTCH CITIZEN 1 NIGHT WATCHMAN 80 GUERRILLAS

4. DISAPPEARANCES. THE TWENTY-THREE ABDUCTIONS RECORDED IN MAY MARKED A SHARP INCREASE OVER THE FOUR RECORED IN APRIL. AMONG THE ABDUCTION VICTIMS WERE TWO DOCTORS HUGO LEONEL ALMENGOR, KIDNAPPED IN MAZATENANGO MAY 12, AND RAFAEL MINONDO, KIDNAPPED IN GUATEMALA CITY MAY 25. FIVE RURAL SCHOOL TEACHERS WERE ABDUCTED IN VARIOUS PARTS OF THE COUNTRY, AS WAS SAN CARLOS UNIVERSITY PROFESSOR GUILLERMO CORALLA TUARCA, KIDNAPPED IN GUATEMALA CITY, MAY 22. GILBERTO PCOASANGRE, A SOCIAL PROMOTER, WAS ABDUCTED IN SAN

CRISTOBAL, EL PROGRESO ON MAY 20. MILITARY COMMISSIONER JOSE LUIS AZURDIA WAS ABDUCTED FROM A PUBLIC BUS BY ARMED MEN MAY 25 IN ACATENANGO. A BI-LINGUAL PROGRAM DIRECTOR, AUGUSTIN ALVAREZ MEJIA, WAS KIDNAPPED MAY 14 IN SANTA CRUZ DEL QUICHE. THE REMAINING ELEVEN KIDNAP VICTIMS WERE CAMPESINOS ABDUCTED IN VARIOUS PARTS OF THE COUNTRY.

- 5. PROBABLE GOVERNMENT VIOLENCE. THE GOG ARMY AND SECURITY ELEMENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DEATH OF 80 GUERRILLAS. MOST OF THESE WERE GUERRILLAS KILLED IN COMBAT OR IN ATTACKS ON GOVERNMENT INSTALLATIONS. THERE IS SOME INDICATION THAT GUATAVO ADOLFO AZURDIA LONZO WAS KILLED AND HIS WIFE KIDNAPPED BY GOG ELEMENTS ON JUNE 11 IN GUATEMALA CITY. OUTSIDE OF GUATEMALA GROUPS SUCH AS THE GUATEMALAN PATRIOTIC UNITY COMMITTEE (CGUP) AND THE COMMITTEE FOR PEASANT UNITY (CUC) CONTINUE TO PUBLISH REPORTS ACCUSING THE GOG OF THE MASS MURDER OF INDIANS IN THE HIGHLANDS AREA. WHILE AS MANY AS 163 CAMPESINOS WERE KILLED DURING THE MONTH, WE DID NOT ATTRIBUTE ANY OF THESE KILLINGS TO THE GOG.

MILITARY/GUERRILLA CLASHES DURING THEMONTH. THESE RESULTED IN THE DEATHS OF TWELVE SOLDIERS AND EIGHTY GUERRILLAS. THESE CLASHES OCCURRED IN: COYOTENANGO, SUCHITEPEQUEZ, MAY1; PARRAMOS CHIMALTENANGO, MAY 2, FIFTEEN GUERRILLA VICTIMS; NEBAJ, EL QUICHE, MAY 2, FIFTEEN GUERRILLA VICTIMS; SANTIAGO, HUEHUETENANGO, MAY4, 2 SOLDIERS KILLED, FIVE WOUNDED;



PATZUN, CHIMALTENANGO MAY 5, TWO GUERRILLAS KILLED; PALMIRA, QUEZALTENANGO MAY 7, TWO ORPA GUERRILLAS. KILLED; ZACUALPA, EL QUICHE, MAY 19, 30 EGP GUERRILLAS KILLED; MALACATAN, SAN MARCOS, MAY 21, 1 GUERRILLA KILLED; NEBAJ, EL QUICHE, MAY 22, FOUR SOLDIERS, TWO GUERRILLAS KILLED; SANTA CRUZ DEL QUICHE, MAY 22, EIGHT GUERRILLAS KILLED; SAN MARTIN JILOTEPEC, CHIMALTENANGO, MAY 23, TEN GUERRILLAS, SIX SOLDIERS KILLED.

7. CIVIL DEFENSE- GUERRILLA CLASHES. THERE WERE TWO CLASHES BETWEEN CIVIL DEFENSE (CD) PATROLS AND GUERRILLAS. THE FIRST OCCURRED NEAR SALAMA, BAJA VERAPAZ ON MAY 15, IN WHICH FIVE C.D. PATROL MEMBERS CONFIDENTIAL

WERE KILLED AND A MILITARY COMMISSIONER ACCOMPANYING THEM KIDNAPPED. ON MAY 31 IN NEBAJ, EL QUICHE GUERRILLAS CLASHED WITH A C.D. PATROL, KILLING ONE C.D. MEMBER. CIVIL DEFENSE ACTIVITY WAS DOWN THIS MONTH FROM THE SEVEN CLASHES IN APRIL. THEY CONTINUED TO BE POORLY ARMED BUT APPEAR TO BE RECEIVING INTENSIFIED TRAINING FROM ARMY ELEMENTS.

- 8. PROBABLE RIGHT EXTERMIST VIOLENCE. THERE WERE NO DEATHS ATTRIBUTED TO THE EXTREME RIGHT DURING THE MONTH.
- 9. PROBABLE LEFTIST TERRORIST VIOLENCE. (DOES NOT INCLUDE CLASTES WITH THE ARMY OR CIVIL DEFENSE PATROLS).
- A. IN ADDITION TO THE TWELVE SOLDIERS AND SIX C.D. PATROL MEMBERS KILLED BY THE LEFTISTS, THEY ARE ALSO RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DEATH OF 120 OTHER INDIVIDUALS. AMONG THE VICTIMS ARE SEVEN POLICE OR OTHER SECURITY ELEMENTS, FOUR MILITARY COM-MISSIONERS AND THE ELECTED MLN MAYOR OF SOLOLA. NOTEWORTHY DURING THE MONTH WERE FOUR MASSACRES IN WHICH TEN OR MORE CAMPESINOS WERE KILLED. BASED ON SOME EVIDENCE AND THE CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING THESE KILLINGS, WE ATTRIBUTE THEM TO GUERRILLA ELEMENTS. THERE WAS A TOTAL OF 91 MEN, WOMEN AND

CHILDREN KILLED IN THESE ATTACKS. THE FIRST OCCURRED MAY 8 IN LA DEMOCRACIA, HUEHUETENANGO WHERE TERRORISTS TOOK OVER THE VILLAGE OF CHAMAXU, KILLED THIRTEEN RESIDENTS AND BURNED HOUSES. ON MAY 10 IN CHISEC, ALTA VERAPAZ THE EGP KILLED TWENTY CAMPESINOS INCLUDING WOMEN AND CHILDREN AND BURNED THEIR HOUSES. IN COTZAL, EL QUICHE TERRORISTS KILLED TWELVE INDIANS ON MAY 18. IN THE MOST GRUESOME ATTACK OF THE CONFIDENTIAL

MONTH, TERRORISTS KILLED FORTY-SIX VILLAGERS IN SAQUIYA, CHICHICASTENANGO, EL QUICHE. THE VICTIMS, INCLUDING TWENTY-FIVE CHILDREN AND FIFTEEN WOMEN, WERE MACHINE-GUNNED AND HACKED UP WITH MACHETES. THE PERPETRATORS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN WEARING OLIVE GREEN UNIFORMS (NOT STANDARD ARMY COMBAT DRESS), AND SURVIVORS FLED TO THE ARMY FOR HELP, THUS PRESENTING A STRONG CASE FOR ATTRIBUTING THIS MASSACRE TO THE EXTEME LEFT.

B. TERRORISTS WERE ALSO RESPONSIBLE FOR THIRTEEN VILLAGE TAKE-OVERS. ORPA TOOK CREDIT FOR FOUR OF THESE WHILE THE EGP TOOK CREDIT FOR THREE. ALL OF THESE VILLAGE TAKE-OVERS OCCURRED IN THE INDIAN HIGHLANDS REGION OF THE COUNTRY. THERE WERE NINE MAJOR BOMBINGS DURING THE MONTH. THE MOST SIGNIFICANT WERE THE EGP BOMBING IN MALACATONCITOS, MAY 1 WHICH DESTROYED A BRIDGE ON THE PAN AMERICAN HIGHWAY AND THT BOMBS WHICH DESTROYED ELECTRICAL FACILITIES IN VILLA NUEVA, GUATEMALA. THERE WERE THIRTY-SEVEN ADDITIONAL TERRORIST ACTS DURING THE MONTH WHICH INCLUDED THE BURNING OF GASOLINE STATIONS, BUSES AND OTHER VEHICLES; THE DESTRUCTION OF TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH LINES; THE BURING OF FARM STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT; AND ATTACKS ON GOVERNMENT BUILDINGS. PERHAPS THE MOST DRAMATIC TERRORIST ACT WAS THE TAKE-OVER OF THE BRAZILIAN EMBASSY ON MAY 12 BY ELEMENTS OF THE CUC AND FP-31, BOTH CONNECTED WITH THE EGP. AFTER SEVERAL DAYS OF NEGOTIATIONS

WITH BRAZILIAN OFFICIALS, HOSTAGES INCLUDING THE BRAZILIAN AMBASSADOR, WERE RELEASED UNHARMED AND THE TERRORISTS FLOWN TO MEXICO. IN EXCHANGE FOR THE RELEASE OF HOSTAGES LOCAL PAPERS AND SEVERAL INTERNATIONAL PAPERS RAN COPIES OF A MANIFESTO DEMANDED BY THE TERRORISTS (REFTEL B).

GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON HUMAN RIGHTS IN CENTRAL AMERICA RELEASED ITS REPORT IN SAN JOSE, COSTA RICA. THE ASSEMBLY IS A LOOSE-KNIT, NON-GOVERNMENTAL GROUPING OF HUMAN RIGHTS ACTIVISTS WITH A LEFTIST LEANING. IN THE REPORT THE ASSEMBLY ACCUSED THE U.S. OF COMMITTING "THE GREATEST VIOLATION OF THE PEOPLE'S RIGHTS THROUGH VARIOUS FORMS OF POLITICAL, ECONOMIC, CULTURAL AND MILITARY INTERVENTION OF WHICH THE PEOPLES OF CENTRAL AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN ARE VICTIMS... ESPECIALLY THROUGH MILITARY AID TO EL SALVADOR AND GUATEMALA." THE ASSEMBLY ALSO DENOUNCED THE EXISTENCE OF POLITICAL PRISONERS IN GUATEMALA AND EL SALVADOR. THE ASSEMBLY'S FINAL REPORT APPEARED TO HAVE LITTLE IMPACT INTER-NATIONALLY SINCE THE GROUP IS NOT A PART OF ANY INTERNATIONAL ORGANIATION SUCH AS THE UN OR OAS. MEANTIME, IN GUATEMALA THE GOG'S ASTUTE HANDLING OF THE BRAZILIAN EMBASSY OCCUPATION SERVED THEM WELL IN THEIR EFFORTS TO CHANGE THEIR INTERNATIONAL IMAGE. LIKEWISE THE INCREASED GUERRILLA VIOLENCE AGAINST NON-COMBATANTS IN THE INDIAN HIGHLAND COULD, IF KNOWN, DO MUCH TO ALTER THE "GOOD GUY" IMAGE THEY HAD ENJOYED IN SOME PARTS OF THE WORLD. GUATEMALA 4822 REPORTED, HOWEVER, ON AN INTERNA-TIONAL DISINFORMATION CAMPAIGN TO DISCOURAGE THIS FROM HAPPENING.
