1958 SAF Rehearsals for May Day

- 1. Attached is a summary of the first five SAF May Day rehearsals.
- 2. In addition to the aircraft listed on attachment, US Air Attache' personnel observed the following aircraft on 14 April 1958:
 - a. A single Bear was seem in a low climb after apparently taking off from Khimki.
 - A large unidentified aircraft (possible Bear)
 was seen apparently landing at Khimki.
 - c. Three large unidentified bombers were seen from a distance of 5 or 6 miles. One observer with binoculars thought the wing aircraft were hooked up to the lead aircraft for refueling.
 - d. A ragged group of 10-12 unidentified bombers were seen from a distance of 8 miles.
 - e. A formation 7 bombers probably either Bisons or Bears were seen from a distance of 7 miles.
 - Five probable Flashlights were seen from a distance of 6 miles.
 - g. An unidentified aircraft sightly smaller than Badger (possibly Backfin) was seen from a distance of 6 miles.
 - h. One unidentified possibly delta wing aircraft was seen from a distance of 7 or 8 miles. This aircraft appeared to be smaller than Badger.
