SUBJECT: REPORT TO PRESIDENT OF SECDEF DISCUSSIONS IN KOREA

1. (S) SECRETARY BROWN ASKED THAT I PASS TO YOU THE TEXT OF MESSAGE
SENT TO THE PRESIDENT REPORTING DISCUSSIONS IN KOREA. TEXT FOLLOWS:

SUBJECT: MY DISCUSSION IN KOREA (U)

2. (S) SUMMARY. THE US-ROK SECURITY CONSULTATIVE MEETING CAME OFF
VERY SMOOTHLY. NO CONTENTIOUS ISSUES SURFACED ON DEFENSE MATTERS.
I BELIEVE THE DISCUSSIONS SERVED TO CONSOLIDATE A US/ROK SECURITY
RELATIONSHIP WHICH IS IN GENERALLY GOOD SHAPE. WHILE THE IMPOSITION
CF MARTIAL LAW IN PUSAN PROVIDED A DISCORDANT NOTE, DISCUSSION OF
THE INTERNAL POLITICAL SITUATION WITH PRESIDENT PARK WENT SOMEWHAT
BETTER THAN I HAD EXPECTED. END SUMMARY.

3. (S) MY EXCHANGE WITH MINISTER OF DEFENSE RO WENT ACCORDING

- 3. (S) MY EXCHANGE WITH MINISTER OF DEFENSE RO WENT ACCORDING TO FORM. I STRONGLY REAFFIRMED OUR COMMITMENT TO ROK SECURITY IN ORDER TO LAY TO REST CONCERNS GENERATED BY SWING STRATEGY LEAKS, AND BY MIXE MANSFIELD'S RECENT COMMENTS SUGGESTING THAT KOREA LIES OUTSIDE THE US DEFENSE PERIMETER. I INFORMED RO OF OUR PLANS TO WITHDRAW SOME 1526 U.S. MILITARY SUPPORT PERSONNEL BY THE END OF CY 1980. I URGED HIM TO SUSTAIN AND GRADUALLY TO EXPAND THE ROLG'S DEFENSE EFFORT AS WARRANTED BY ASSESSMENTS OF THE TEREAT AND AS THE ROK'S ECONOMIC SITUATION PERMITS. I EXPRESSED APPRECIATION FOR ROL ACTIONS TO FURNISH US VARIOUS FACILITIES AND INCOURAGED RO AND GENERAL WICKHAM (CINC US FORCES KOREA) TO LITVISE ADDITIONAL JOINT DEFENSE IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS TO SUPPORT OUR FORCES HERE.
- 4. (S) TO BRIEFED ME ON ROK PROGRESS IN IMPLEMENTING ITS 1ST FORCE IMPROVEMENT PLAN. HE INDICATED PRESIDENT PARK WILL SOON APPROVE A 2D PLAN (RUNNING FROM 1982-86) WHICH WILL CONCENTRATE ON IMPROVING ROK GROUND FORCE CAPABILITIES AND ENHANCING ROK MOBILIZATION CAPABILITY.
- 5. (S) BO AND PARK ESPECIALLY WELCOMED YOUR APPROVAL OF THE ROK RE-QUEST TO CO-ASSEMBLE F-5S IN MOREA AND INDICATIONS THAT WE ARE PLAN-NING TO TAKE VARIOUS STEPS (E.G., DEPLOYMENT OF AN A-10 SQUADRON TO MOREA IN THE EARLY 80'S) TO AUGMENT OUR COMBAT CAPABILITIES HERE.

RO ASSURED ME THAT THE ROKS WOULD BE PREPARED TO CONSIDER FINANCING THE A-10 BEDDOWN FACILITIES AS WELL AS TO PAY CERTAIN SUPPORT COSTS. WHILE REAFFIRMING INTEREST IN PROCURING F-16'S. RO DID NOT PRESS FOR THE SIGNING OF AN LOA THIS YEAR. I EXPRESSED OUR WILLINGNESS TO CONSIDER SPECIFIC FORMS OF COOPERA-TION TO HELP THE ROX DEVELOP SURFACE-TO-SURFACE MISSILES ON THE BASIS OF UNDERSTANDINGS CONCERNING STRICT LIMITS ON RANGE AND TECHNICAL SOPHISTICATION OF SUCH MISSILES SET FORTH IN CORRESPONDENCE PETWEEN GENERAL WICKHAM AND RO. RO ASSURED ME HIS GOVERNMENT WOULD COMPLY WITH THESE UNDERSTANDINGS. 6. (5) RO EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT RECENT CONGRESSIONAL CUTS OF FUNDS FOR JOINT EXERCISES, URGED CONTINUED US PROVISIONS OF SUBSTANTIAL FMS CREDITS. SCUGHT MORE EXPEDITIOUS HANDLING OF ROX REQUESTS TO SELL SOME LOCALLY-PRODUCED ARMS TO THIRD COUNTRIES, AND OFFERED POHANG AS A BASE FOR DEPLOYING P3C PLANES FOR ASW MISSIONS. I ASSURED HIM OF CUR INTEREST IN AND INTENTION TO SUSTAIN. JOINT EXERCISES. I INDICATED TEAT WE WOULD FURNISH FMS CREDITS BUT PROBABLY AT DIMINISHED LEVELS. REMINDED HIM THAT WE ARE REQUIRED TO PROCESS THIRD COUNTRY ARMS SALES REQUESTS ON A CASE-BY-CASE BASIS, BUT WOULD TRY TO OVERCOME ADMIN-ISTRATIVE DELAYS IN PROCESSING SUCH REQUESTS, AND AGREED TO CONSIDER ADDITIONAL TEMPORARY DEPLOYMENTS OF P3S TO POHANG FOR TRAINING FURPCSES. SUPJECT: REPORT TO PRESIDENT OF SECDEF DISCUSSIONS IN KOREA

7. (S) FRESIDENT PARK EXPRESSED GREAT SATISFACTION WITH YOUR ADJUSTMENT IN OUR TROOP WITHDRAWAL PLAN AND OUR RESPECTIVE EFFORTS TO IMPROVE THE LOCAL BALANCE OF FORCES. I EXPLAINED TO FARK THE SCOPE AND PURPOSE OF MY PLANNED TRIP TO CHINA, SOUGHT TO PLACE RECENT REVELATIONS ABOUT OUR "SWING STRATEGY" IN PERSPECTIVE, AND REPEATED THAT OUR COMMITMENT TO THE DEFENSE OF THE ROK REMAINS, ASSURED HIM THAT WE ARE TAKING STEPS TO COUNTER SOVIET EFFORTS TO PROJECT ITS MILITARY POWER MORE VISIBLY INTO THE NORTH-HAST ASIAN REGION.

E. (S) AMBASSADOR GLEYSTEEN AND I WERE MILDLY ENCOURAGED BY FRESIDENT PARK'S CALM REACTION DURING OUR PRIVATE MEETING ON KOREAN DOMESTIC POLITICAL SITUATION. AFTER HANDING HIM YOUR LETTER AND REVIEWING ITS CONTENTS, I NOTED THAT IT WAS NOT

FRESIDENT PARX'S CALM REACTION DURING OUR PRIVATE MEETING ON KOREAN DOMESTIC POLITICAL SITUATION. AFTER HANDING HIM YOUR LETTER AND REVIEWING ITS CONTENTS, I NOTED THAT IT WAS NOT OUR INTENTION TO ALLOW THE CURRENT SITUATION TO AFFECT OUR SECURITY TIES WITH THE ROK, BUT AS A PRACTICAL MATTER IT WOULD BE DIFFICULT FOR US IF THERE WERE NO RETURN TO THE MORE LIBERAL TREND ASSOCIATED WITH YOUR VISIT TO KOREA. THE AMBASSADOR EXPLAINED WHY MEMBERS OF CONGRESS, INCLUDING CLOSE FRIENDS OF THE ROK, FELT SO STRONGLY ABOUT EXPULSION FROM THE ASSEMBLY OF THE OPPOSITION LEADER. GLEYSTEEN URGED THAT PARK TAKE ACTIONS WHICH WOULD REASSURE THOSE WHO FEARED A WIDESPREAD CRACKDOWN, AND WOULD ALSO OPEN UP THE POSSIBILITY FOR COMPROMISE WITH THE OPPOSITION PARTY. WE COMPLIMENTED THE PRESIDENT ON THE DECISION TODAY TO RELEASE A NUMBER OF PEOPLE HELD UNDER EMERGENCY MEASURE 9 BECAUSE IT INDICATED AN INTENT TO LIMIT THE HARMFUL EFFECTS OF MARTIAL LAW IN THE CITY OF PUSAN.

S. (S) THE BURDEN OF PRESIDENT PARK'S RESPONSE WAS THAT HE WAS PREFARED TO ACCEPT PRIVATE AND INFORMAL ADVICE FROM THE U.S. ON DOMESTIC KOREAN MATTERS, BUT COULD NOT DO SO IF THE U.S. PUBLICLY CRITICIZED HIS GOVERNMENT BY STRONG STATEMENTS AND FUBLIC ACTIONS SUCH AS CALLING BACK THE AMBASSADOR. HE SAID THAT OUR ACTIONS NOT ONLY EMBOLDENED THE OPPOSITION TO DEFY THE

GOVERNMENT BUT ALSO THREATENED TO PROVOKE A POPULAR BACKLASH AGAINST THE U.S. FOR DICTATING TO KOREA ON WHAT ARE OBVIOUSLY COMESTIC MATTERS. AT THE SAME TIME, PARK ACKNOWLEDGED THAT RECENT GOVERNMENT MEASURES MIGHT HAVE BEEN TOO HARSH AND HE IMPLIED THAT IF WE GIVE HIM ENOUGH RUNNING ROOM HE WOULD TRY TO AVOID EXTREME ACTIONS.
