



21. (C) THE SECRETARY STRONGLY URGED THAT THE ROKG SUPPORT ONGOING USG EFFORTS IN NEW YORK TO ALLOW THE U.S. TO ABIDE BY THE ROME TREATY ON THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL COURT. WHILE THE U.S. COULD NOT SIGN THE TREATY AND DID NOT WANT TO REOPEN NEGOTIATIONS ON IT, IT HAD PROPOSED SOME IDEAS WHICH WOULD HELP RESOLVE THE SITUATION. IT WOULD BE VERY VALUABLE IF THE ROK DELEGATION IN NEW YORK COULD LEND ITS STRONG SUPPORT FOR U.S. EFFORTS, GIVEN THAT THE ROK WAS HOST TO SUCH A SIGNIFICANT FORCE OF U.S. TROOPS. FM LEE NOTED THAT THE ROKG HAD SIGNED THE ROME TREATY AND SAID THAT MOFAT WOULD KEEP THE U.S. REQUEST IN MIND.

UN PEACEKEEPING ASSESSMENTS

22. (C) THE SECRETARY ALSO MADE A STRONG CASE FOR THE ROKG TO FOREGO ITS CURRENT 80 PERCENT DISCOUNT ON UN PEACEKEEPING ASSESSMENTS. MANY OTHER COUNTRIES HAD RENOUNCED THEIR DISCOUNTS, AND IT WOULD BE APPROPRIATE FOR THE ROK ALSO TO DO SO GIVEN ITS GLOBAL ECONOMIC STATUS. FM LEE SAID THAT MOFAT WAS "DOING ITS BEST" TO INCREASE THE ROK'S PKO CONTRIBUTION, BUT THAT DIFFICULTIES REMAINED WITH THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY. STILL, HE SAID THAT HE WOULD KEEP IN TOUCH ON THIS MATTER.
