 TO JOINT ALTICCHAR COOPERATION. ENDOFFS TOURED
 THER'S DRY STORAGE PIT AREA AND THE TRE, WHICH IS
 CURRENTLY SHUT OOWN FOR MAINTENANCE. END JUMM-F-
- 2. ALT E/C CHIEF AND SETOFF VISITED TAIWAN'S
 INSTITUTE OF NUCLEAR ENERGY RESEARCH ON OCTOBER 3.
 THE VISIT, WHICH WAS INTENDED TO PROVIDE AUTOFFS
 WITH AN OVERVIEW OF INER FACILITIES, WAS ARRANGED
 BY AEC SECRETARY GENERAL LIU KUANG-CHI. IMER
 DIRECTOR CHOU MEN-CHANG, DEPUTY DIRECTORS CHANG
 SEN-1 AND HO SUNG-LIN, SPENT FUEL PROJECT MANAGER
 W.C. FANG, AND LIU MUNAG-CHI WERE PRESENT.
- D. DEPUTY DIRECTOR CHANG REVIEWED PROJECT SUMMARIES OF THE IRR CONVERSION AND FHEL MOVEMENT PROJECTS. HE ALSO PROVIDED AITOFFS WITH COPIES OF TELEX CORRESPONDENCE BETWEEN HIMSELF AND DR. DIAMOND CONCERNING THE MEETING RESCHEDULED TO TAKE PLACE IM EARLY NOVEMBER AT BROOMMAVEN. THAT TILEX CORRESPONDENCE INDICATES THAT IALMAN SPECIALISTS WHO PLAN TO AITEND THE MEETING INCLUDE Y.B. CHEN, R.Y. HURMG, SNYR JHY-JEN, AND CHANG SEN-1.
- 4. DRS. CHOU AND CHANG REPEATEDLY STRESSED IMER'S

INER OFFICIALS POINTED TO DIFFICULTIES IN COORDINATING AMONG VARIOUS TAIWAN AGENCIES INVOLVED IN CASH TRANSPORTATION ARRANGEMENTS; PARTICULARLY UNEN LATE ARRIVAL OF THE CASH TRANSPORTSHIP NECESSITATES RESCHEDULING. INTER OFFICIALS TOOM THE DPPORTUNITY AGAIN TO VOICE FOR THE RECORDINER PROBLEMS WITH THE REQUIREMENT OF ENCASING SPENT FUEL ROOS IN ALUMINUM RATHER THAN STAIMLESS

- 5. DURING A REVIEW OF THE SPENT FUEL MOVEMENT SCHEDULE, DIRECTOR GNOU POINTED TO THE RECENT CONCLUSION OF A CONTRACT WITH NAC ON DRY STORAGE PIT EQUIPMENT AS AN EXAMPLE OF TAIWAN'S SINCERITY IN MOVING AHEAD. CHOU NOTED THAT THE CONTRACT WAS SIGHED EVEN THOUGH THE VALUE, AT WS 11.3 MILLION, WAS US \$480,000 OVER EARLIER NAC ESTIMATES. AEC SECRETARY GENERAL LIU EXPRESSED THE VIEW THAT WHILE THEY ARE IN GENERAL SATISFIED WITH THE WORKING RELATIONSHIP WITH MAC, HE FELT THERE MAY BE A CONFLICT OF INTEREST BETVERN WHAT HE TERMED AS DIRECTS OBJECTIVE THAT THE PROGRAM BE "SAFE AND OUTET" AND NAC'S PROFIT MOTIVE.
- 6. AITOFFS BRIEFLY TOURED THE SPENT FUEL DRY STORAGE PIT AREA AND VIEWED THE TRR. THE TRR IS CURRENTLY SHUT DOWN FOR THREE MONTHS FOR MAINTENANCE, AND SPENT FUEL CASH OPERATIONS WERE UNDERWAY.
- 7. COMMENT: ALTHOUGH INITIALLY SCHEDULED AS A COURTESY VISIT, IMER OFFICIALS USED THE OCCASION TO ATTEMPT TO TRY AND CLEAR UP ANY MISUNDERSTANDINGS REGARDING THE NOVEMBER MEETING AT BRODWHAVEN.
 UNILE IMER OFFICIALS STRESSED THE DESIRE TO MOVE AS QUICALY AS POSSIBLE ON PROJECTS UNDERWAY, DEPUTY DIRECTOR CHANG POINTEDLY NOTED THAT SAFETY OUTWEIGHED ALL CONSIDERATIONS.
