- 2. INDIAN COMMISSION FIRST SECRETARY (PROTECT) TOLD CONGENOFF FEBRUARY 13 THAT A DELEGATION OF TIBETANS RESIDENT IN INDIA WOULD DEPART WITHIN THE WEEK FOR A VISIT TO TIBET OF AT LEAST TWO WEEKS. REFTEL DESCRIBED INITIAL PLANNING FOR THIS VISIT. THE INDIAN DIPLOMAT SAID ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE TRIP WERE MADE WITH THE CHINESE AMBASSADOR IN NEW DELHI BY HIGH-RANKING ADVISORS OF THE DALI LAMA. THE INDIAN BELIEVED THE PRC HAD BEEN "SURPRISINGLY FORTHCOMING"IN PROMISING TO ALLOW THE TIBETANS ACCESS TO A WIDE RANGE OF PLACES AND INSTITUTIONS.

LAMA IS SERIOUSLY CONSIDERING RETURNING TO TIBET. THE INDIAN FIRST SECRETARY NOTED THAT PEOPLE INSIDE TIBET HAD COMMUNICATED WITH THE DALAI LAMA TO DISCOURAGE HIM FROM GOING AHEAD WITH PLANS TO SEND THE ADVANCE PARTY TO TIBET, ARGUING THAT CONDITIONS FOR TIBETANS WERE NOT AS GOOD AS THEPRCCLAIMED. BUT THE DALAI LAMA DECIDED IT WAS NECESSARY TO SEND A GROUP OF REFUGEES TO SEE CONDITIONS THEMSELVES. THE FOURTEEN MEMBER GROUP WILL INCLUDE YOUNG PEOPLE BORN IN INDIA AS WELL AS SOME WHO CAN REMEMBER WHAT LIFE WAS LIKE IN

TIBET BEFORE 1959. THE DALAI LAMA'S REPRESENTATIVES REPORTEDLY WERE IMPRESSED THAT OFFICIALS AT THE CHINESE EMBASSY ACKNOWLEDGED THAT MISTAKES HAD BEEN MADE IN TREATINGTHE TIBETANS, ERRORS WHICH OF COURSE WERE ATTRIBUTED TO THE INFLUENCE OF LIN BIAO AND THE GANG OF FOUR.

4. THE DALAI LAMA'S ORGANIZATION REPORTEDLY HAS SUGGESTED TO THE PRC THAT AS A DEMONSTRATION OF THE FREEDOM NOW ENJOYED BY TIBETANS THE PRC SHOULD PERMIT THE PANCHEN LAMA TO VISIT THE REFUGEES IN INDIA. THE CHINESE REPLIED THAT SUCH A VISIT MIGHT NOT BE WELCOMED BY NEW DELHI. THE INDIAN FIRST SECRETARY COMMENTED THAT HIS GOVERNMENT IN FACT WOULD HAVE NO OBJECTION AT ALL TO A VISIT BY THE PANCHEN LAMA AND ASSUMED THE CHINESE FEARED WHAT HE MIGHT SAY OR DO WHEN HE WAS OUTSIDE THEIR CONTROL. THIS ISSUE WOULD BE ONE OF THE MAJOR TOPICS OF DISCUSSION BETWEEN THE CHINESE AND THE FOURTEEN MEMBER TIBETAN DELEGATION. SHOESMITH
