1. WE AGREE THAT CONVERSATION WITH ROKG OFFICIALS ON KOREAN REPROCESSING PLANS REPORTED REFTEL A INVITES MORE OPEN DISCUSSIONS WITH ROKG ABOUT THIS PROBLEM. IN A PRECEDING CABLE WE HAVE SENT INSTRUCTIONS ON A LIMITED DEMARCHE TO THE ROKG ABOUT OUR INTERPRETATION OF THE PROVISIONS IN THE U.S.-ROK AGREEMENT FOR COOPERATION CONCERNING REPROCESSING OF FUELS FROM U.S. REACTORS. WE SECRET

DO NOT BELIEVE THAT THE NARROW LEGAL CONTEXT IS THE APPROPRIATE ONE IN WHICH TO RAISE BROADER QUESTIONS OF REPROCESSING IN GENERAL, INCLUDING THE QUESTION OF ROK PARTICIPATION IN AN ASIAN REGIONAL REPROCESSING FACILITY. THIS MESSAGE OUTLINES THE BACKGROUND AND CONTENT OF SUCH A BROADER APPROACH WHICH WE HOPE TO MAKE SOON. HOWEVER, WE WISH FIRST TO GIVE CANADA AND FRANCE SOME ADVANCE IDEA OF HOW WE PLAN TO APPROACH ROKG ON THESE BROADER ISSUES, IN ORDER TO OBTAIN CANADIAN SUPPORT AND AVOID FRENCH MISINTERPRETATION OF OUR ACTIONS. 2. IN SPITE OF THE FACT THAT THEIR OWN DOMESTIC REQUIRE-MENTS WOULD NOT PROVIDE AN ECONOMIC JUSTIFICATION FOR REPROCESSING FOR A VERY LONG TIME, THE KOREANS HAVE DEVELOPED A RATIONALE FOR THEIR DESIRE TO ACQUIRE A REPROCESSING CAPABILITY, AND MAY ARGUE THAT THEIR NPT STATUS ENTITLES THEM TO DEVELOP SUCH A CAPABILITY. HOWEVER, WE HESITATE TO CONCLUDE THAT ROK PLANS ARE BASED PRIMARILY ON A DESIRE TO GARNER AS LARGE A PIECE OF FUTURE NUCLEAR BUSINESS AS POSSIBLE." NORMAL REACTOR GRADE PLUTONIUM COULD BE USED IN SOPHISTICATED BOMB DESIGNS OR, AT THE COST OF SOME UNCERTAINTY IN YIELD, EVEN IN LESS SOPHISTICATED WEAPONS. TIGHTEST POSSIBLE SAFEGUARDS AND PHYSICAL SECURITY ON THE PLANT AND ON THE TECHNOLOGY, TO URGE A SIGNIFICANT LEVEL OF SUPPLIER INVOLVEMENT IN THE PLANT OPERATION, AND TO DISCOURAGE FRENCH SALE OF A LARGER-SCALE COMMERCIAL FACILITY TO KOREA. MOST IMPORTANT, WE WILL DISCUSS OUR SPECIAL INTERESTS AND SPECIAL CONCERNS IN THE KOREAN CASE IN ORDER TO INSURE FRENCH UNDERSTANDING THAT WE ARE NOT SEEKING COMMERCIAL ADVANTAGE IN EXPRESSING TO THE ROKG OUR DISAPPROVAL OF THE REPROCESSING PLANT TRANSACTION. - -- IT IS TO BE NOTED IN THIS REGARD THAT THE ISSUE OF AN EXPORT-IMPORT BANK LOAN FOR THE ROK IS BEFORE CONGRESS. THIS LOAN MAY WELL BE DISAPPROVED UNLESS THE CONCERNS WITHIN THEADMINISTRATION AND CONGRESS REGARDING REPROCESSING ARE SATISFIED.

REFTEL E) IS AN EXPENSIVE, RISKY AND COMPLICATED VENTURE AND THERE HAVE BEEN UNSUCCESSFUL LARGE-SCALE VENTURES BY VERY COMPETENT INDUSTRIAL ORGANIZATIONS SUCH AS G.E. FEW COUNTRIES HAVE ENGAGED IN LARGE-SCALE REPROCESSING IN THE PAST, AND THOSE FEW HAVE ALL EXPERIENCED CONSIDER-ABLE DIFFICULTY. WE BELIEVE IT IMPORTANT TO TAKE A CAREFUL AND DELIBERATE APPROACH IN PLANNING SUCH A COSTLY VENTURE AS A LARGE MULTINATIONAL REPROCESSING FACILITY.
