GETTING TO KNOW KIM JONG IL

6. (S) THE SECRETARY SAID THAT CHAIRMAN KIM APPEARED WELL-INFORMED AND COMFORTABLE ABOUT SPEAKING ON A WIDE RANGE OF SUBJECTS. KIM SAID HE HAS THREE COMPUTERS IN HIS OFFICE AND USES THE INTERNET -- HE EVEN ASKED THE SECRETARY FOR THE STATE DEPARTMENT'S WEB ADDRESS. WHILE CHAIRMAN KIM IS INQUISITIVE, ASKING MANY QUESTIONS ABOUT THE REGION AND RELATIONSHIPS, HE DID NOT ASK ANY SPECIFIC QUESTIONS ABOUT THE U.S. SECRETARY ALBRIGHT SAID CHAIRMAN KIM HAD DESCRIBED PRESIDENT KIM'S LIFE AS TRULY REMARKABLE -- GOING FROM DISSIDENT TO EXILE TO PRESIDENT, A LIFE THAT WOULD MAKE A GOOD MOVIE. THIS DREW A SMILE FROM PRESIDENT KIM, WHO REMARKED THAT CHAIRMAN KIM IS AN AVID MOTION PICTURE ENTHUSIAST, TO WHICH THE SECRETARY REPLIED THAT CHAIRMAN KIM HAD TOLD HER EVERY TEN DAYS OR SO HE "CATCHES UP" ON THE LATEST FILMS AND QUIPPED THAT HE USUALLY AGREES WITH THE OSCAR NOMINATIONS.

7. (S) SECRETARY ALBRIGHT OBSERVED THAT ALL HER MEETINGS AND EVENTS WERE VERY WELL ARRANGED AND SHE HAD THE IMPRESSION THAT KIM JONG IL HIMSELF HAD GIVEN THE ARRANGEMENTS HIS PERSONAL ATTENTION. KIM CHONG IL HAD PROVEN TO BE VERY POLITE, A GOOD LISTENER AND INTERLOCUTOR, AND ABLE TO RESPOND TO QUESTIONS QUICKLY. KIM TREATED HIS SUBORDINATES WELL, LISTENING CAREFULLY, FOR EXAMPLE, TO ADVICE OFFERED BY FIRST VICE FOREIGN MINISTER KANG SOK JU, AND THEIR EXCHANGES LACKED ANY TONE OF BOSSINESS. THE SECRETARY SAID KIM HAD ALSO BEEN

PROTECTIVE OF HER BY MINIMIZING THE NUMBER OF TOASTS WITH SUBORDINATES AND ASKING A DANCE TROOP TO DO A CZECH DANCE IN HER HONOR. THE SECRETARY SAID SHE HAD THE IMPRESSION THAT KIM'S MOOD MIGHT SOMETIMES SWING BUT THAT DURING THEIR TIME TOGETHER HE WAS NEVER ANGRY. SHE NOTED THAT AFTER ONE BREAK FOLLOWING A DISCUSSION, KIM SEEMED TENSE, BUT HE WAS NEVER RUDE.

PRAGMATISM AND INTERESTS DRIVE KIM JONG IL

8_(S) THE SECRETARY ASKED PRESIDENT KIM WHETHER KIM JONG IL'S POLICIES MIGHT BE SUBJECT TO SUCH "MOOD SWINGS" AS WELL, REVERSING COURSE JUST AS QUICKLY AWAY FROM HIS APPARENT NEW POLICY OF OPENING UP. PRESIDENT KIM SAID THAT, TEMPERAMENT ASIDE, CHAIRMAN KIM IS PRAGMATIC AND WOULD NOT CHANGE COURSE UNLESS THERE IS SOME SETBACK. PRESIDENT KIM SAID HE HAD EMPHASIZED TO KIM JONG IL THAT SECRET.

IMPROVING RELATIONS WITH THE U.S. IS A "MUST" FOR THE DPRK'S SURVIVAL BOTH IN TERMS OF SECURITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. HE HAD ALSO TOLD CHAIRMAN KIM THAT SOUTH KOREA MAINTAINS A CLOSE TRILATERAL RELATIONSHIP WITH THE U.S. AND JAPAN AND COOPERATES WITH RUSSÍA AND CHINA, SO WHY SHOULDN'T THE DPRK GET ALONG AS WELL WITH JAPAN AND THE UNITED STATES. PRESIDENT KIM SAID THAT AT A DINNER IN NEW YORK IN SEPTEMBER WITH DEMOCRATIC AND REPUBLICAN THINK TANK REPRESENTATIVES HE HAD IDENTIFIED AS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT THE SHIFT IN THE DPRK'S POLICY TO ALLOW U.S. FORCES TO REMAIN ON THE PENINSULA AFTER REUNIFICATION. ACCORDING TO PRESIDENT KIM, THIS MOVE WAS DESIGNED TO HELP IMPROVE RELATIONS WITH THE U.S. AND ILLUSTRATES KIM JONG IL'S PRAGMATISM. THE POLICY COULD NOT EASILY BE REVERSED, SINCE KIM MADE THE COMMENT BOTH IN PRIVATE TO HIM AS WELL AS PUBLICLY TO ROK JOURNALISTS.

CHAIRMAN KIM HINTS MISSILE LAUNCHES TO END

9. (S) SECRETARY ALBRIGHT DESCRIBED FOR PRESIDENT KIM TWO PARTICULARLY MEMORABLE EXPERIENCES RELATED TO A CULTURAL EVENT AT A STADIUM HOSTED BY CHAIRMAN KIM ON THE FIRST NIGHT OF HER VISIT. BEFORE CHAIRMAN KIM HAD ENTERED THE

STADIUM, 150,000 PEOPLE HAD WAITED SO QUIETLY ONE COULD HEAR A PIN DROP, THE SECRETARY HAD BEEN TOLD BY ONE MEMBER OF OUR ADVANCE TEAM. BUT WHEN HE AND SHE ENTERED, THE GROUP JUMPED TO ITS FEET AND SHOUTED HIS NAME IN ADULATION FOR THREE MINUTES. THE SHOW WAS CAREFULLY SECRET

CHOREOGRAPHED AND THE TIMING AND EXECUTION FLAWLESS, A

THOUSANDS OF STUDENTS ARTFULLY FLIPPING CARDS TO CREATE

WEAK ON ECONOMICS

10.-(S) AT THE RECIPROCAL DINNER HOSTED BY THE SECRETARY ON OCTOBER 24, THE DISCUSSION TURNED TO ECONOMICS, AND THE SECRETARY SAID IT BECAME CLEAR THAT KIM'S UNDERSTANDING OF WESTERN ECONOMICS IS LIMITED. HOWEVER, KIM DID ADMIT HIS ECONOMY IS IN VERY BAD SHAPE. ENERGY SHORTAGES ARE CRITICAL, DUE IN PART TO A DROUGHT WHICH REDUCED HYDROPOWER. REGARDING ECONOMIC REFORM, KIM SAID HE HAD

ASKED RUSSIAN PRESIDENT PUTIN WHAT "OPENING UP" REALLY MEANT AND KIM SAID HE LIKED THE "SWEDISH MODEL" OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. SECRETARY ALBRIGHT SAID SHE REMINDED KIM THE SWEDISH MODEL IS BASED ON AN ALREADY WELL-DEVELOPED ECONOMY. DURING THE DISCUSSION KIM ALSO NOTED THAT HIS FATHER WAS A SOCIALIST, NOT A COMMUNIST.

11. (S) TELUSTRATING THE BREADTH OF THE DISCUSSION, THE SECRETARY SAID KIM HAD TALKED ABOUT POTATO FARMING, SAYING HE HAD READ THAT POTATOES HAD SAVED POST-WAR GERMANY FROM

FAMINE. BUT KIM NOTED THE DPRK HAD YET TO LEARN PROPER STORAGE METHODS FOR POTATOES, WHEREAS RICE IS MUCH EASIER TO STORE. HE CRITICIZED THE RUSSIANS FOR ENCOURAGING THE DPRK TO GROW CORN, A GRAIN BETTER SUITED TO FEEDING ANIMALS THAN HUMANS.

12. (S) AT THIS POINT, THE SECRETARY SUGGESTED THAT THE DISCUSSION CONTINUE WITH A SMALLER GROUP (REPORTED SEPTEL).
