CYPRUS.

1. KISSINGER TELEPHONED ME AGAIN THIS EVENING. HE SAID THAT SISCO HAD HAD ANOTHER MEETING WITH THE TURKISH PRIME MINISTER DETAILS OF WHICH THE AMERICANS WOULD BE LETTING US HAVE A REPLY TO HIS PROPOSALS FIRST THING IN THE MODRING. WE AGREED THAT AFTER, I HAD STUDIED THE REPORTS OF SISCO'S MEETING AND HAD NEWS OF THE TURKISH REPLY I MOULD TELEPHONE KISSINGER AGAIN.

2. KISSINGER THOUGHT THAT WHEN IT CAME TO TALKS THERE WOULD HAVE TO BE SOME ADJUSTMENT OF BOUNDARIES IN CYPRUS AS A FACE-SAVING DEVICE.

3. I ASKED KISSINGER WHAT HE WOULD DO IF THE TURKS WENT ON FIGHTING. HE SAID THAT THEY MOULD CUT OFF AID TO THE TURKS, AND INDEED TO THE GREEKS IF THEY TOOK UP ARMS. THE U.S. WOULD NOT ACT AS AN OPEN SUPPLY LINE FOR THIS FIGHTING, HEADWHILE MUCLEAR WEAPONS IN GREECE AND TURKEY HAD BEEN SECURED.

4. I AGREED THAT WE WOULD MAKE URGENT PARALLEL REPRESENTATIONS IN ANKARA, SEE MIFT.
