[Redacted] THERE WAS GREAT CONCERN WITHIN
SIDE OVER REVELATIONS OF SECRET DETENTION AND TORTURE CENTERS THAT
HAD EXISTED IN ARGENTINA. [Redacted] THE CONCERN WAS
BASED ON THE FACT THAT THE REVELATIONS WERE CORRECT IN THEIR
LOCATION OF THE CENTERS AND THE IDENTIFICATION OF PERSONS INVOLVED.
THIS HAS LED SIDE PERSONNEL TO SUSPECT THAT SOMEONE WITHIN SIDE
IS TRYING TO INGRATIATE HIMSELF WITH THE COMING CIVILIAN GOVERNMENT
BY MAKING AVAILABLE THIS TYPE OF INFORMATION. [Redacted]

BATTALION, AND THE OTHER IS BY "JAPONES" ((MARTINEZ)), WHO
SERVED WITH SOME INTELLIGENCE OR SECURITY SERVICE DURING THE
"DIRTY WAR". [Redacted]

[REDACTED] UNSPECIFIED HUMAN RIGHTS ORGANIZATIONS HAD COLLECTED US\$280,000 THAT THEY DIVIDED AMONG BUFANO, MARTINEZ, AND RODOLFO PEREGRINO ((FERNANDEZ)), WHO MADE DECLARATIONS ABOUT THE ROLE OF THE POLICE; THIS MONEY WAS ALLEGEDLY TO BE CONSIDERED HUMANITARIAN SUPPORT FOR THEIR FAMILIES, BUT [REDACTED] CONSIDER IT BRIBES TO THE THREE MEN TO MAKE THEIR DECLARATIONS.

THE GENERAL MOOD AT THE 601ST BATTALION WAS ONE OF DEJECTION AND PESSIMISM BECAUSE [REDACTED] BUFANO AND MARTINEZ HAD ALREADY MADE THEIR DECLARATIONS AND IT WAS ONLY A MATTER OF TIME BEFORE THEY WERE MADE PUBLIC IN ARGENTINA. ([REDACTED] COMMENT: [REDACTED] THE 601ST BATTALION BELIEVED THAT THE BEST THEY COULD HOPE FOR WOULD BE FOR BUFANO'S AND MARTINEZ' STATEMENTS TO TURN OUT TO BE MORE GENERAL THAN EXPECTED AND DISCUSS EXCESSES DURING THE "DIRTY WAR" WITH LITTLE DETAILS OR EVIDENCE; THAT TYPE OF DECLARATION, SIMILAR TO THE ONE MADE EARLIER BY FERNANDEZ, WOULD COME AS AN ENORMOUS RELIEF TO THE 601ST BATTALION PERSONNEL.)
