

- 1. South Vietnam (information up to 0830 EST)
- a. Diem's regime is toppling before a coup launched shortly after noon today Saigon time (midnight Washington time--there is a difference of 12 hours.)
- b. The coup group, headed by Army Gen. "Big" Minh, apparently has gained or is gaining the backing of all major combat units in the Saigon area.
- c. Special Forces chief, Col. Tung is prisoner of the coup forces and Special Forces units are putting up no further resistance.
- d. The Presidential guard, too, has been largely neutralized, and the palace, evidently with Diem still holding out in it, is currently under siege.
- e. Coup leaders, we understand, plan to set up an exclusively civilian government as soon as the coup is consolidated.
