SUBJECT: GENERAL— Operational/Security

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The following terminal experiments, considered to be responsive to requirements as well as operationally feasible, are suggested:

I. Test of ability to withstand interrogation.

F A. An English-speaking [REDACTED] agent selected from among [REDACTED] personnel will be recruited (unless recruitment has already been effected) and trained on a [REDACTED] controlled base for a mission directed against the [REDACTED]. The agent's mission will be to pose, under false documentation, as a leftist [REDACTED] for the purpose of collecting a) BI on [REDACTED] personalities in [REDACTED] b) information concerning channels of communication, command and infiltration of bodies into the [REDACTED] and c) information on the structure of the [REDACTED] organization in the [REDACTED]. He will be informed that should the [REDACTED] security agencies take an interest in him or arrest him that this will in the long-run be advantageous to his cover. Along with his training will go certain medical treatments covering [REDACTED] practices.

F The agent will be dispatched to the [REDACTED] and soon after his arrival there the [REDACTED] will be turned off by the [REDACTED] that the individual is, according to our files, a dangerous [REDACTED] communist agent. Our relationship with [REDACTED] is such that, having a legitimate interest in this apparent operation, we can select the [REDACTED] case officer who will conduct the interrogation of the prisoner (there are two or three capable [REDACTED] officers who have been trained by the [REDACTED]). We are also in a position to place, with the knowledge of [REDACTED], equipment to monitor the interrogation. We are further in a position to go over each day's [REDACTED] with the [REDACTED] officer and advise him on the step-by-step conduct of the interrogation, including methods employed. We can introduce a new HI operator under medical cover to attempt to break down the work done by the original HI operator.

In the event that the agent should break down and admit his connection with U. S. intelligence, we can a) deny this absolutely and advise the agent's disposal, or b) indicate that the agent may have been dispatched by some other organ of U.S. intelligence and that it should thereafter run the agent jointly with [redacted]

II. Test of ability of [redacted] techniques to cause a person to react in a manner contrary to his innate loyalties and motivations.

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A. It has become evident that at least a portion of the [redacted] [redacted] radio operators who were refused entry into [redacted] will continue to refuse to be sent to [redacted]. He should select one or more from these irreconcilables who have families in [redacted] with whom they wish to be reunited. This individual or individuals will be subjected to [redacted] techniques. As a result they will return to [redacted] of their own free will. We will arrange to have their families transported to [redacted]. Again, as a result of [redacted] techniques, upon their reunion with their families they will completely reject their wives and children. At a later date this block can be removed. F

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B. There are available in [redacted] numerous former [redacted] operatives who are anxious to get back into the intelligence business on a [redacted] basis. These persons make frequent contacts with [redacted] service elements for the purpose of getting themselves on U.S. payrolls. He would approach one of the more notorious of these individuals and indicate to him that, subject to his meeting certain preliminary requirements, he would consider entering into an arrangement which in effect would make him as principal agent for the group of intelligence operatives known to and controlled by him. Great care would be taken to avoid any commitments or appearance of commitment. He would request the [redacted] agent to reinforce his most loyal follower and would set as a condition precedent to further dealings with the [redacted] agent the requirement that this [redacted] agent be retained by us for one month on the understanding that any operation in which he would be engaged would be run jointly by the [redacted] agent and ourselves. The [redacted] agent would be taken clandestinely to [redacted] (the block being infiltrated if necessary) and trained in basic clandestine techniques. This agent would also undergo certain medical treatments concerning [redacted] procedures. On completion of training and provided that in the course of other assignment of the agent indicated his basic loyalty to the [redacted] agent, the

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[REDACTED] agent would be returned to [REDACTED] agent, the return being effected in our own presence. The [REDACTED] agent would then denounce the [REDACTED] agent as a communist, traitor, etc., and attempt to make a physical assault on him. He would use this denunciation as the ground for breaking off with the [REDACTED] agent on the basis of the [REDACTED] agent's inability to come forward with loyal and well-balanced personnel.

III. Statistical tests of susceptibility to it of representative group of [REDACTED] F (250 to 300).

G A. The [REDACTED] will select an appropriate [REDACTED] group for medical examination. Under medical cover, the [REDACTED] task force will examine each individual and apply susceptibility tests. F B/3

A Note: This group will be largely non-English speaking. It is advised that the technique of it in this country presents many unresolved difficulties; therefore, the [REDACTED] team may desire a preliminary series of experiments directed specifically to this problem. A smaller, more completely controlled, [REDACTED] can be made available over [REDACTED] for this purpose. F B/3 F

Using selected individuals from among a susceptibility group, a few basic action experiments can be run, including ones designed to test the visibility of rest it suggestion. It should be pointed out, however, that the nature of the actions to be performed there in the use of it will have to be tailored to the nature of the susceptibility from selected individuals now in the process of selecting appropriate groups. It is believed that experiments of this type will be most useful in the design for the "Legal Utilized Criminal Deterrentions". That is, and it is, are not appropriate in the first place, written in English. Specific suggestions as to the nature of these experiments, stemming from the susceptibility group will be forthcoming shortly. A F
