It is believed that the procedural instructions indicated below will cover the security interests of CTA and will minimize the amount of classified correspondence in connection with the project:

that in the interest of security considerations, GIA's connection

with this project be classified "Secret."

- (1) Correspondence between and CIA, indicating the relationship of CIA to the project should be classified Secret. This correspondence will be limited to the tasic memorandum transmitted by CIA to , a memorandum to CIA from in reply, indicating accentance of the project, and four quarterly reports providing a brief statement of the financial status of the project.
- (2) No other formal communications between and CIA are considered necessary unless difficulty brises in connection with the administration or carrying out of the terms of the contract by the contractor.
- (3) No correspondence between the contractor and CIA is deemed necessary or desirable since he is working under the direction of \_\_\_\_.

Review of technical progress reports and the work of the contractor will be worked out informally by the CIA liaison officer in accordance with arrangements previously established with representatives. All contractor's reports may be unclassified and can be handled by in accordance with their standard procedures, except that they will not be published or otherwise released for unclassified discomination outside until they have been reviewed by the CIA liaison officer.

It is believed that the procedures noted herein are compatible with the standard procedures for handling unclassified projects and will not require a facility clearance or access to classified correspondence by the contractor. Similarly, the classified correspondence between and CIA is minimized to include only that which is essential to protect CIA security interests.
