They noted that while Russia has been launching inter-planetary probes since 1960 with systems specifically designed for the purpose, the United States programs, starting two years later, has been plagued by delays and frequently improvised.

WILLIAM F. HYNES, now deceased, a retired Los Angeles Police Department Captain who in the course of his official duties in the late 1930's conducted investigations of the Communist Party (CP) activities in the Los Angeles area, advised that JOSEPH C. MURRAY, the appointee's father, using the name of ALAN MC DONALD, joined the CP in 1937. HYNES further stated that MURRAY was also known to have been a member of the CP in 1938 while residing at 523 7th Street, Santa Monica, California.

LA T-2 advised in February, 1943, that MURRAY, a member of the CP in Santa Monica, California, residing at 523 7th Street, was dropped from the CP prior to March 12, 1939, and was not to be re-admitted. MURRAY was dropped from the CP due to the fact that he had been tabbed a stool pigeon.

In 1944 who was a member of the CP and who furnished information concerning CP activities from 1943 to 1947, advised that on April 13, 1944, Mrs. CHURCHILL MURRAY of 523 7th Street, Santa Monica, California, the appointee's mother, was among those in attendance at a meeting of the Bay Cities CP Club. further advised that at a political gathering sponsored by the Ocean Park Businessmen on September 21, 1944, at 12 Pier Avenue, Ocean Park, California, Mrs. CHURCHILL MURRAY was chairman of the meeting. Mrs. MURRAY was identified at that time as being a member of the Women's Democratic National Committee and was introduced by a member of the Bay Cities CP Club. stated that Mrs. MURRAY spoke at this meeting regarding political matters in connection with the forthcoming election. said that the time and place of this meeting was the time and place scheduled for the regular meeting of the Bay Cities CP Club.

In 1944, HAROLD BURDETTE MOFFIT who was a member of the CP from 1933 to 1944, now deceased, who furnished the FBI information from October, 1940, to December, 1944, advised that in June, 1944, Mrs. CHURCHILL MURRAY was a speaker at the Downtown Forum which was operated by the Los Angeles County CP in 1944. Mrs. MURRAY's topic was "What The Primaries Show." MOFFITT said that Mrs. MURRAY at that time was Assistant Director of the Women's Division of the Democratic Central Committee.

LA T-1 advised in July, 1952, that ESTHER MURRAY was known to him as a member of the State Democratic Committee and a candidate in the 16th Congressional District. LA T-1 further advised that in the daily "People's World," a West Coast communist newspaper, September 24, 1948, page 3, appeared an article stating that Mrs. ESTHER MURRAY, Vice Chairman of the State Democratic Committee, was to be hostess at a barbecue in honor of the 59th Assembly District, Independent Progressive Party (IPP) (See Appendix), Democratic candidate.

In December, 1960, LA T-1 advised that at a meeting of the TWEN-Mar Chapter of the IPP, held on May 4, 1950, in Culver City, California, the people in attendance were urged to

LA 161-1060 support ESTHER MURRAY for Congress in the 16th District, indicating that although ESTHER MURRAY once refuted the IPP she was now ready to accept their support. LA T-1 advised that a leaflet issued and distributed by the Committee of 1000 for ESTHER MURRAY urged voters to vote for ESTHER MURRAY, a candidate for Congress from the 16th Congressional District. The Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications published May 14, 1951, by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D. C., on page 38, states that the Committee of 1000 was a communist created and controlled front organization which was created to raise funds for defense of the 19 unfriendly witnesses before the Congressional Committee on Un-American Activities investigation of communist activity in Hollywood, 10 of whom were indicted for contempt of Congress. LA T-1 advised that a clipping from the "Los Angeles Examiner" newspaper dated September 26, 1950, reflected that Mrs. ESTHER MURRAY, 16th District Democratic Candidate

for Congress, praised President TRUMAN's veto of the communist control bill.

In 1949 the FBI conducted an investigation of JOSEPH CHURCHILL MURRAY, appointee's father, under the provisions of Executive Order 9835. By letter dated June 20, 1952, the Civil Service Commission advised that MURRAY withdrew from consideration prior to decision on loyalty.

APPENDIX

INDEPENDENT PROGRESSIVE PARTY (IPP)

An informant advised on December 11, 1956, that the IPP was formed in California in 1948 and went out of existence following the 1954 election when it failed to poll sufficient votes to retain its place on the ballot.

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations," revised, December 1, 1961, p. 85, describes the IPP as follows:

Characterized as "the California section of the national Progressive Party." "The Progressive Party, including its California branch, certainly ranks as one of the largest and most successful fronts ever created by the Communists."

(Committee on Un-American Activities Annual Report for 1956, House Report 53, February 11, 1957, p. 34.)





The records of the Passport Office, Department of State, show that Dr. Murray was issued a passport in April, 1963, for travel to Europe to attend a scientific meeting. The records of the Passport Office contain no unfavorable information regarding Dr. Murray.

Security Clearance

Dr. Murray presently has a top secret security clearance with the Defense Industrial Security Clearance Office, Columbus, Ohio. Between June, 1961, and May, 1962, he had a "Q" security clearance with the Atomic Energy Commission in connection with his employment with the firm of Edgerton, Germeshausen and Grier, Incorporated, Boston, Massachusetts.

Agency Checks

Information has been received from the following governmental agencies indicating that their files contain either no record or no additional pertient information regarding Dr. Murray:

Bureau of Personnel Investigations, Civil Service Commission; House Committee on Un-American Activities; Central Intelligence Agency; Security Division, Office of the Secretary of Defense; Atomic Energy Commission; National Aeronautics and Space Administration; and the White House Office.

Miscellaneous

In 1939 William F. Hymes, now deceased, a former member of the Los Angeles, California, Police Department, advised that information came to his attention in the late 1930's that Joseph C. Murray had joined the Communist Party in 1937. At that time Joseph C. Murray was residing at 523 7th Street, Santa Monica, California.

It is noted that Dr. Murray and his parents in the 1930's resided at 523 7th Street, Santa Monica, California.

An informant who has furnished reliable information in the past advised in 1943 that Joseph Churchill Murray had been a member of the Communist Party in Santa Monica, California, in the late 1930's, but was dropped from the rolls of the Communist Party prior to March, 1939, because he was tabbed as a "stool pigeon." This informant is not available for recontact.

Party in Los Angeles, California, advised that Mrs. Churchill
Murray of 523 7th Street, Santa Monica, California, was among
those in attendance at a meeting of the Bay City Communist Party
Club. According to this informant, Mrs. Murray was identified at
that time as a member of the Women's Democratic National Committee.
Mrs. Murray spoke at this meeting regarding political matters in
connection with a forthcoming election. This informant is no
longer available for recontact.

In 1944 , who was a member of the Communist Party from 1933 until 1944 and who furnished information of a security nature to the FBI between October, 1940, and December, 1944, advised that Mrs. Churchill Murray, Assistant Director of the Women's Division of the Democratic Party Central Committee, was a speaker at a forum of the Los Angeles County Communist Party in 1944. Her topic was "What the Primaries Show." This informant is deceased.

Dr. Murray's father, Joseph Churchill Murray, was investigated under the provisions of Executive Order 9835 in 1949 at which time he was employed as a labor officer in Japan by the Department of the Army. The results of the investigation were furnished to the Department of the Army. By letter dated July 16, 1951, the Department of the Army advised that the Loyalty-Security Appeals Board, Office of the Secretary of the Army, after reviewing the results of the investigation of Joseph Churchill Murray, held that no reasonable grounds existed to doubt his loyalty or classify him a security risk.

Informants in addition to those mentioned previously who have knowledge of communist activities in appropriate areas advised that Dr. Murray and his close relatives are not known to them, and they can furnish no information concerning them.

The central files of the FBI, including the files of the Identification Division, contain no additional pertinent information concerning Dr. Murray.

Full Range of Spectrum Now Being Used to Study Sky, Caltech Symposium Told

Astronomers have to · keep looking through the "new windows" that have been opened up in the sky even though they may not always know what they're ·looking for, a scientist said Thursday at Caltech.

Bruce Murray associate professor of planetary science at Caltech, said the "new windows" are the radiation wave lengths that have been unfamiliar regions to astronomers.

Now, Murray and other speakers said at Caltech, the whole range of the spectrúm, from x rays to radar waves, is being used by science to study the sky.

'Murray spoke at the annual symposium spon-sored by the Industrial Associates of Caltech. The subject of this year's talks. is the new astronomy.

Murray's particular topic was infrared astronomy -astronomy by analysis of the spectra of infrared or heat radiation.

Possibilities Great

He said the astronomical uses of infrared radiation and its detection are a direct outgrowth of the , development of infrared sensors for military reasons. But the scientific uses have already gone far beyond such purposes, and the possibilities of the future are even more divorced from defense.

Most of the things that infrared astronomy has The wave lengths of the . discovered appear to have therefore have been called "anomalies."

> For example, Murray. said, taking a thermal profile of the darkened area of the moon has shown unexpected peaks of warmth in parts one would expect to find more or less uniformly cold.

> > Sea of Crisis

The Sea of Crisis, even after five earth days in the shadow, has still shown up as an important feature on : the infrared or heat "map" of the moon.

These and other findings of the new astronomy are 'making the moon a much more familiar place to man — so familiar that Murray said they "mark the time when the study of the moon passes from astronomy to geophysics."

Because of chemical and texture differences, no two kinds of surface material of the moon, or of any object, emit or reflect radiation in identical ways, and these differences of "emissivity," as Murray called it, will be immensely important in mapping the moon.

Exact Spot

Taking samples of the surface material, and returning the samples to earth for study, will tell science a great deal about the moon, but only about the exact spot on the moon from which the samples were taken, according to Murray.

On the other hand, he thinks it will be possible to make mineralogical maps of great reaches of the moon by studying differences in infrared radiation patterns.

Besides the anomalics infrared astronomy has found in the study of the moon, Venus and Jupiter have turned out to be somewhat different from expected when viewed in the infrared.

Murray said one would expect the distribution of heat in Venus to be uneven because the planet rotates so slowly and because any area of the surface is turned toward the sun for such long periods.

Instead, infrared astronomy found that Venus has an apparently enormous capacity to store heat, and that the heat is more uniformly distributed than was expected.

Jupiter; a much fainter infrared target, was an opposite case. It rotates rapidly, and it was thought the heat would be distributed uniformly. Instead, Murray said, latitudinal banding of heat, as on the earth, was found.

Theory Explained

He said it is suspected, however, that the banding is in the planet's stratosphere and that the distribution of heat has little to do with conditions in the lower atmosphere.

Infrared astronomy was also used as Caltech to measure the temperature of the comet Ikeya-Seki, and to show that its nucleus was not made of ice or dust, but was of iron.

EXCITING, SIGNIFICANT

Mercury Fly-By Called Choicest Plum in Space

A Mariner fly-by of the planet Mercury is the "choicest plum ripe for picking in the whole orchard" of possible space explorations, according to Bruce Murray, associate professor of planetary sciences at Caltech.

Dr. Murray said in an interview that such an expedition to the vicinity of Mercury would be as scientifically exciting and significant as any other space project now possible.

Not only would a Mercury fly-by be most significant to science, it is technologically possible with the tools the United States already has, particularly its guidance and communications systems, Dr. Murray said at Caltech.

He was the speaker at a summer scientific meeting of the Astronomical Society of the Pacific, being held at Caltech.

. Only U.S. Is Able .

Murray said the United States is the only country now able to send a space vehicle to Mercury, especially along the indirect route he proposes.

"Mercury is by far the least observed of the terrestrial planets of the solar system," he said.

"Think how much the surface pictures of Mars changed the scientific view of that planet," Dr. Murray said.

"The advances in science to be gained from similar pictures of the surface of Mercury could be incomparably greater, if only because we know so much less about Mercury than we knew about Mars."

The fact that we know so little about Mercury, however, is not the most important reason for wanting to know more, Dr. Murray said.

"Mercury is in some ways an anomaly among the planets," he said.

"For instance, although it is not much bigger than our moon, it may be as dense as the earth itself.

"We don't know why it is so dense. Is it just another moon that happens to have an iron core, or is it an earth-like planet with mountains?" he asked.

Murray said science has a great deal to learn about the atmosphere of Mercury.

"It was thought a few years ago that Mercury had a very dense-atmosphere, probably of some gas-like carbon dioxide," Murray said.

"New radar discoveries of the rotation of Mercury have led to the abandonment of that idea. But we are not sure yet what concept of atmosphere can be substituted."

Dr. Murray said Mercury rotates three times on its axis while going around the sun twice. One day on Mercury is equal to 176 earth days.

"But a few years ago the fact that

Mercury rotated at all on its axis wasn't known. It was thought always to keep the same side turned toward the sun," he said.

He said to send a space vehicle directly from the earth to Mercury would take a Saturn V rocket, too expensive a proposition to be seriously considered by those holding the purse strings of the space program.

"But we will soon have what can almost be called a unique opportunity to do it with cheaper rockets and instruments we have on hand," Dr.

Murray said.

The suggestion is that the Atlas Centaur rocket be used (the same one that is used in the Mariner program) and that instead of the vehicle being launched toward Mercury, it be directed toward Venus.

The gravitational force of Venuswould be calculated exactly to pull the space vehicle off its original course and deflect it toward Mercury.

This, Dr. Murray said, would be like having a free, extra rocket stage to carry the vehicle on toward Mercury, and would provide the equivalent energy of an enormous propulsive maneuver in space.

Called 'Bank Shot'

This procedure is known as the "bank shot," as in billiards, and was first proposed in 1963 by M. A. Minovitch.

According to Dr. Murray, the United States is the only country with sophisticated enough guidance and communications systems to bring it off.

To make the bank shot work, Mercury has to be at its farthest from the sun and Venus at its nearest, and this alignment doesn't come about often.

"The next time they will be lined up that way will be in 1970, and that is probably too soon to get everything ready, especially in view of the limited amount of money that is available for planetary exploration," Dr. Murray said.

"The next time after that will be in 1973, when the lineup of Mercury and Venus and the sun will again be favorable.

"After that, they won't be lined up right again until 1982, and then not so perfectly as in 1973.

"You can say that for all practical purposes, it's in 1973 that the shot has to be made or we can forget about it for a decade or two, and then it will be a project for our children," Dr. Murray said.

He said the necessary alignment is so rare because the celestial mechanics involved are very complicated, both Mercury and Venus having eccentric orbits.

CALLS AMERICANS TOO CYNICAL

U.S. Space Program Dying, Scientist Tells Lawmakers

America's proposed planetary program is an inadequate compromise and a sure road to mediocrity; a Caltech scientist has testified before a House space subcommittee.

In disclosing his Washington testimony, Dr. Bruce C. Murray, associate professor of planetary science, said the United States is in the process of going out of the space exploration business.

"Our program is dying in 1968," the scientist said. "Our children will read about this great human endeavor not in American literature, but in Soviet books and reports."

And it is the American people who are culpable, not the Congress or the Administration, Dr. Murray added.

Says We Are Too Cynical

"We are too cynical," he explained.
"We think of space exploration as a stunt, whereas to the Russians it is terribly important, a cultural challenge, the wave of the future that will demonstrate the promise of their society.

"It would be tragic," the scientist told the subcommittee, "if we were to ignore the challenge when it is within our means to respond.

"The planets are going to be explored only once in the history of man and that time is close at hand. We must not fail to respond because it is a challenge to our vision, to our optimism for the future, to our image of ourselves."

Dr. Murray noted in his testimony that America's leading position in planetary exploration was effectively challenged last October when the Soviets landed an instrumented capsule on Venus, the first Russian planetary success in almost 20 missions.

Russia May Try Mars Landing

"There is every reason," he warned, "to expect the Soviets to aggressively exploit their newly demonstrated space capability in an attempt to place a scientific package on Mars... They might even begin initial experiments with a first landing as early as 1969,"

The Caltech scientist pointed to the currently proposed U.S. program that would add two dual flights to Mars (orbital flights in 1971 and small capsule landings in 1973) to a double fly-by mission planned next year. There will be no life detection systems aboard, however.

This inadequate compromise, he told the subcommittee, is symptomatic of a basic weakness in the U.S. national space effort—the lack of agreement as to its character and magnitude in the period after manned landings on the moon in the Apollo program.

"We can have a program of planetary exploration at modest cost by emphasizing 'first looks' at even more distant planets," he testified.

"We can also participate in the direct exploration of the surface of Mars if we are willing to substantially increase available funds each year for the next three or four years.

"But the sure road to mediocrity and a conspicuous second place now that the Soviets are in the game, is to try to keep both options open within limited resources."

Congress, the Space Agency and other elements of the government "must come to terms on whether funds for U.S. planetary exploration can be expected to increase rapidly in coming years," the scientist contended.

If public enthusiasm is judged insufficient to support a rapid increase in funds, Dr. Murray told the subcommittee, then the search for possible microbial life on Mars—the guiding U.S. strategy—must be realistically reexamined.

Postponement until 1973 of the first U.S. landing effort on Mars, he said, incurs a high risk of obsolescence for such a mission as a result of equivalent or superior Soviet

landings in 1969 or 1971.

Perhaps, he suggested, the U.S. should wait until initial Soviet results show whether microbial life is possible on the Red Planet by detecting the presence of water and organic compounds.

Satisfactory alternatives, he declared, might include a single U.S Mars landing in 1971 or a single launch to Mercury by way of Venus in 1970 at the expense of some of the Mars effort currently proposed.

Other Challenging Objections

America, the scientists advised the subcommittee, could effectively pursue other very challenging objectives in space—close-up looks at other planets that also would be historic milestones in man's search to understand his surroundings.

Because of present superiority in long range space communications, in spacecraft reliability and in photography and other kinds of remote sensing instrumentation, he explained, the U.S. can maintain a position of unchallenged excellence in some aspects of planetary exploration.

Without a national commitment to major funding increases in future years, Dr. Murray pointed out, the U.S. could pursue opportunities for a 1970 fly-by of Mercury and an early Jupiter fly-by (launched no later than 1973) together with a 1974 Mars mission.

At the same time, he emphasized, the nation should undertake early preparations toward a once-in-acentury opportunity for the "grand tour" of Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus and Neptune.

This mission, possible in 1077-78—and not again until the year 2153—would permit each planet in turn to accelerate a spacecraft on to the next planet in a "swing-by", technique that would require no massive propellent loads.
