5:05 p.m.: alerted to the fact that the above organization would possibly march on the Headquarters complex. asked to ascertain their intentions.

5:20 p.m.: Chief, advised of the above and asked to take appropriate action.

5:45 p.m.: Chief, \_\_\_\_\_\_\_advised that his confidential sources were unaware of any proposed march or demonstration at the Headquarters complex. These sources included NBC-TV and local police authorities.

He advised that the local chairman for the Women's Strike for Peace was a Mrs. Dagmar Wilson of the whose home telephone number is The telephone number of the local chapter of Women's Strike for Peace is 232-9803.

He advised that his information as of this time was that the majority of the demonstrators had already left the D.C. area for New York and Philadelphia. Those remaining were apparently "out on the town".

8:45 p.m.: Chief, advised that as of this time he had learned nothing further concerning any additional demonstrations scheduled for tomorrow.

9:05 p.m.: Chief, with Mrs. Dagmar Wilson developed the information that her organization planned no demonstrations in the immediate future. She advised that the demonstration at the Pentagon resulted in having a petition delivered to a representative of the Secretary of Defense, which was why the demonstration was organized. They, therefore, achieved their aim.
