

Calendar of Tentatively Scheduled Future Activities of Possible Interest

"Asterisked" items are either newly surfaced activities or changed details relative to previously reported activities.

Nov.-Doc.

The American Federation of Teachers, parent creanization of the striking N. Y. C. teachers' union, plans to call a national conference of teachers and Fitizens soon to try to develop guidelines for school decentralization.

The least of AFT said that plans for the conference had not been completed but that he hoped it would be arranged before Christmas and that, "We want to avoid the kind of clash we've had in N. Y." Among those to be invited to the conference would be representatives of the union locals in the major cities of the Northeastern V. S. and community leaders, including representatives of the Hegro and Spanish-speaking communities.

The 165,000 member AFT has endorsed the idea of "effective community responsibility and involvement through elective representation" in the operation of schools in minority-group communities.

But the lesson to be learned from the prolouged N. Y. dispute Market Said, is that, "You can't have instant decentralization - it is something that has to be very carefully constructed."

Fall 1968

*The conservative University of Alabama, enrollment over 20,000, has in the rask week experienced the emergence of a student movement associated with the "How left." Calling itself the Dissident Student Organization and numbering less than Cifty persons (members and sympathizers), the group is flexing its musele with the University administration. 110) president walk with has notified University President, Dr. Frank ROSE, of his intention to invite the following apostles of dissidence to speak on campus in coming months: Plack Fanther Eldridge CLEAVER; Jerry RUBIN, leader of the

Youth International Carty (YTTTES); Herbert APHRECEP, Communist theorist; and thirk FUED, SIG head at Columbia who led the Columbia riets last spring. BOSE announced that no University of Alabama facilities would be available to the four and that the school does not recognize the student group's right to have any speakers it choses. Now the ACLU is seeking a federal court injunction on behalf of the IGO to allow the four speakers.

November 1969

*Reportedly, it was announced at a recent meeting of the Black Fenther Farty at Jersey City, New Jersey, that the BFF planned no further activity until after election day. It was further announced that the party will act simultaneously across the country following the elections. No details on this proposed activity were disclosed.

November 9

*Roston - Cambridge, Massachusetta - The November ?
Mobilization Committee has requested parade permits
for a march from Cambridge to Boston ending at the
Boston Commons.

November 9

*Feoria, Illinoia - The Feoria Committee on Victnam will hold a peace rally.

November 10

Los Angeles, California - The Los Angeles Veterans for Feace in Vietnam (VFV) received a permit to march and demonstrate. The march will no to the Los Angeles City Hall for a rally. Speakers will include Rear Admiral A. E. TRUE, Brig. General (retired) Hugh HESTER, Master Sgt. Den 1990AN, and Vietnam veterans. The VFV and the Vietnam Veterans against the War have distributed leaflets in the Los Angeles area announcing the parade and rally.



*Tacoma, Washington - The GI-Civilian Alliance for Feace will hold a rally for the purpose of planning a GI march for Dec. 8, which it hopes will attract 5,000 demonstrators.

A previously announced GI march to be held on Veterans Thy has been cancelled because of lack of interest and failure to properly organize it.

November 11

Walthem, Massachusetts - Allegedly SIG at Branders University will attempt to disrupt CIA recruiting activities this date by obstructing the entrance to the building where interviews were to be held and by disrupting the interviews.

The trial of James Earle RAY, the accused killer of Hartin, Luther KING, Jr., is scheduled to start in Memphis, Tennessee.

November 1h

A <u>national</u> "draft eard turn-in" to symbolize noncooperation with the Selective Service System, is being sponsored by The Resistance, a militant antidraft group.

The War Resisters League, a preifist home and the Fuerto Rican Peace Center will hold "turn-ins" at Tampa, Florida, and San Juan, Fuerto Rico, respectively.

November 13

*The SIG chapter at the University of Oregon met in Jate October and made plans to demonstrate on November 13 when a bus, carrying draftees leaves Eugene for the induction center at Portland.

November 13

Washington, D. C. - More than 1.000 participants are expected to attend a four-day conference at Howard University, called "Towards a Black University." The purpose of the conference will be to define the structure and mechanics of a black university which has as a primary concern, revolutionary unity and excellence in a black society. Local Negro residents will be invited to attend.

This move is designed to prevent the same sort of apathy that was displayed by local residents at the Black Fower conferences held in Hewark last year and Philadelphia this summer. The conference director is a light of militant student leader at HOWARD. Among individuals who have accepted invitations to participate are:

CARLACHAEL, prime minister of the militant Black Penther Farty.



November 17

The Communist parties of the Soviet Union and fiftyseven other parties recently agreed in a meeting in Budapest to shelve plans for a World Communist Summit Conference in Mescow on 25 November. Another preparatory meeting has been called for 17 November to examine the date for calling the International Conference and the method of its further preparations. The decision to postpone the Hoscow Conference appeared to be a bitter blow for the Kremlin who appeared to visualize the summit as a demonstration of loyally to Moscow as the main center of the World Communist Hovement despite the defection and "splitting tactics" of Communist China. The last World Conference, attended by seventy-eight parties, almost eight years ago, was an unsuccessful attempt to evert the historic rift between Moscow and Paking. Sixty-seven delogations, representing about 3/4 of the world's communist parties, attended a nine-day conference in February, and March and agreed to call the Moscow summit for 25 November. Those parties which attended in February, but stayed away from the meeting which

ended Leday, were these of Canada, Coylon, the Lominican Republic, Jordan, Bicaragua, Bepal, Fanama, Fortugal and Norway. The Icelandic Farty sent observers in February.

Six ruling communist parties, those of China, Albania, Yugoslavia, No. Vietnam, No. Korea, and Cuba - boycotted both gatherings but came back as observers to the meeting. A low-level Czechoslovak delegation attended.

In Rome, officials of the Italian and Romanian communist parties ended a ten-day meeting with a call for the right of communist parties to decide their own political lines without cutside interferences. Both the Italian and Romanian parties have criticized the Soviet-led invasion of Czechoslovakia.

November 18

Oakland, California - This date has been set for the trial of the seven young men under conspiracy indictment for their part in organizing the October 1967 demonstrations in front of the Oakland Induction Center. The charge against the Oakland Seven "conspiracy to commit a misdemeaner" carries a maximum penalty of ten years, imprisonment plus a \$10,000 fine.

Over 10,000 people participated in the demonstrations at the induction center. Support for the 'Oakland Seven' is being organized.

November 20


Abbie HOFFMAN, Yippie leader, arrested and charged with defacing the American flag on 3 October during HCUA hearings has a trial date set for 20 November. He pleaded NOT guilty at his arraignment.

November 28

South Tend, Indiana - The National Student Association Convention on <u>White Racism</u> is scheduled on this date. The University of Naryland formed a Campus Coalition Against Racism (CCAR) in early October. The research that will emanate from the CCAR will be used to represent the University of Maryland at the NSA Convention.

November 79-Dec. 1

*A Hemispheric Conference to End the War in Vietnam will apparently meet in Montreal to develop soor-dination against U. S. intervention in Vietnam and the Americas. This meeting had earlier been indicated for 12-14 October. A planning meeting was held in Montreal on 7-8 September. A flyer washed in connection with the conference proclaims that approximately 2,000 people from throughout the hemisphere - over 1/4 from Canada will attend. Among

It was indicated that the conference would deal with U.S. involvement in Latin America only so far as it affects the Vietnam War.

Delegations representing the Democratic Republic of Victuam and the National Liberation Front will be present.

Initiated by a broad coalition in Montreal, the meeting will include activists from the U.S., Canada and many countries of Central and South America. Unification and expansion of the peace movements in these areas will reputedly be the conference's goal. Among speakers are to be:

Cheddi JAGAN, Communist former Trime Himister of Pritish Guiana (Guyana) and Pavid PELLINGER of the National Mobilization Committee. Communists, Pacifists, Negro militants, and liberals are included in the U.S. delegation.

Nov. 29-12c. 1

Chicago, Illinois - The Young Socialist Alliance (youth section of the Socialist Workers Party) has called for a national convention of Revelutionary Socialists over the Thanksgiving workend. Representatives from the German SIG - French FCR - Japanese Zengakuren and Socialists from Haly, England and some of the Gocialist Black countries are expected. Purpose of the convention reportedly is to discuss building a serious revolutionary organization in the advanced industrial countries including the U.S.A.

December 1-5

Princeton, New Jersey - It can be anticipated that the U.S. A. will be Soundly chastised as wall as



present when more than eighty leading intellectuals from throughout the world will guther at the Institute for Advanced Studies to assess many of the problems that will confront the next American Freeident.

Plans for the five-day seminar on "The U.S. - Ita problems, Impact and Image in the World" were to be announced on 28 October in Lendon and in Paris by Shepard STONE, President of the International Association for Cultural Freedom. The association is a private organization of scholars, writers, and men of public affairs that is receiving financial support from the Ford Foundation.

Pr. Carl KAYSEH, director of the Institute for Advanced Studies, and Jean-Jacques SERVAH-SCHREIBER, publisher of the French weekly, L'Express, and the author of the best-selling book "The American" Challenge," will be co-chairman of the conference.

Stone said. "We hope that the incoming administration will be represented at the meeting as we shall gather some of the most articulate and influential critics and advocates of American policy.

Two Soviet scholars who have accented invitations to the meeting are Anatoly A. GEONYRO, son of Fereign Hipister Andrei A. GRONYRO, and Stanislav HFHSCHLKOV, a director of the Institute of World Economy. Several distinguished East European scholars and writers have been invited. They include Milovan DJILAS (Togoslavia) and Ivan SVITAK (Czech Communist Party liberal).

An American contingent of thirty-one participants will include a number of former Government officials - among them McGeorge BUHLY, George W. PALL, John K. GALBRAITH, Arthur SCHLESINGER, Jr., and George KERNAH. Among the British to attend are: Frof. Alan BULLOCK, chairman of the Board of the Association for Cultural Freedem; Alastair FUCHAN, director of the Institute of Strategic Studies; and Geoffrey MARTIH, chairman of the National Union of Students. A number of other European as well as Jatin Americans will attend.

Perhaps not the least interesting of the other American participants will be: Lillian HELHAM, playwright; Roy INIDS, Pirector of CORE; Duniel PELL, prof. of Sociology at Columbia University; Irving HOWE, editor



of MISSETT; Edward CHIIS, Frof. of Goriology, University of Chicago; Saul PELLOW, novelfat; and Morman FOLHORETZ, editor of Commentary magazing.

December 2

No. Air, Maryland - The trial of N. Pap RROWN on charges of arson and inciting to riot in Cambridge, Maryland, has been scheduled with Judge Marry E. DWYER, presiding.

December 2

*Oakland, California - The April 6, 1968, "Shootout Crowd" of the Black Fanther Farty have had their trial set for 2 December. Eldridge CLEAVER, Hinister of Information of the BFF is one of the six defendants. All pleaded innocent to a variety of charges stemming from the shoot-out with the Oakland Police Department in Oakland. This was the confrontation during which Pobly MUTTOH of the PTP's was killed. CLEAVER has_ been stating that he will not return to prison that he will hide out in the black chettes - and that he will kill anyone who attempts to imprison him. CLEAVER has been ordered to return to prison on 27 November following revocation of his parole because of his involvement in a gun battle with Oakland, California, Police in April 1988.

December 5

*How York City - The Guardian, self-styled independout radical newspaper, holds its 20th anniversary celebration at the Fillmore East.



December 7 & 8

*Task Force - the underground newerag published in San Francisco - aimed at servicemen and veterans - carried a notice in its October 25 edition calling for GI actions December 7 and 8: "1. Organize - teach-ins; vallies, marches, discussions, GI dinners, etc. 2: Contact - Local vets, student anti-war groups for assistance. 3. Write - F. O. Nox 31268, San Francisco, 9031, so we can inform you of what's happening around the country."

December 9

Ics Angeles, California - The brial of Girban R. SIRIAH on the charge that he murdered Bebert F. KERNEDY, has been delayed until 9 Procedure on a motion by the defense. Superior Judge Herbert V. WALKER, the Senier Criminal Court Judge in Los Angeles County presided over the hearing and will



preside at the trial. Judge WALEUR, early, over presention objections, that he intended to sequester the jury, once it was sworn. He said that jury scheetien would begin December 9, and that if no jury was selected by December 23, he would recess the trial until January 2, 1969.

December 13

Hew York City - The National Emergency Civil Liberties Committee annual Rill of Rights dinner is scheduled for the Americana Hotel. The NECLC is the eld ECLC rejuvenated with a new name. December 21

Washington, D. C. - The HCUA subcommittee after holding three days of open hearings into the conduct and connection of some groups and individuals in the INC disorders is in recess until 21 December. Five of the seven witnesses subpected have not been heard and are expected to return. They are Invid PELLINGER, Rennic DAVIS, Tom HAYIMA, Jerry RUMIN, and Abbic HOFFHAM. Robert GREENPLATE of the IMAC and Pr. David YOUNG of the Nedical Committee for Human Rights who testified last week were released from their subpochas but could be summoned back.

January 1969

*Guerrilla, an underground publication, recently proposed that in January 1960, independent revolutions to cultural Revolutions.

"The Congress should be organized to include the independent revolutionary media, various representatives of the underground communities, and other independent revolutionary organizations and individuals who are interested in total cultural revolution whether they be activists, anarchists, poets and artists, or socialists.

- (1) The red and black should attempt to formulate a broad program of cultural revolution which includes an analysis of the tasks facing cultural revolutionaries from the point of view of the ecology, morphology and cybernetics as well as from the more traditional revolutionary informations.
- (2) Foldrize the underground. The CIA and other intelligence agencies have begun to consciously infiltrate the cultural revolution via grants, take



MERMINA believes it is necessary to name and define the counter-cultural revolution so that a conscious federation of cultural revolution may be built.

(3) The Congress should ablempt to fermulate its own A-year plan of cultural revolution. Social revolution as a weapon of cultural revolution.

One is scheduled for 3 January if the Electoral College fails to give a majority to any candidate and the choice of President is placed in the hands of the House of Representatives, or for Inauguration Day, 20 January if the "peace" movement believes the new President will refuse to change policies regarding U. S. involvement in Victnam.

January 3, 1969

Included in the new program allegedly adopted by the IMICENVH (Chairman Invid IMILINGER) at a September 1h administrative committee meeting in P. C. - "Bally supporters to pressure House of Representatives on 3 January and the new President at his imagination 20 January 1969.

January 18


Thilagelphia, Tennsylvania - The Black Liberation Alliance, formed October 18-20 at Columbus, Ohio, by 50 discatisfied members of CORE from five states will hold its first convention. Temperary officers were elected at Columbus. It was decided that the organization will strive for basic social, economic, and political change in the U.S. A. rather than reform. It will seek racial separation, black nationalism, and the formation of a separate black nation within the boundaries of the U.S.


January 20

January 20

Washington, D. C. - The Administrative Committee of the National Mobilization Committee to Find the Marin Vietnam (NAC) met on October 12 and 13 at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Cambridge, Massachusetts. Approximately forly people attended; including David McLIINGER and Rennie DAVIS, NAC leaders; Sidney PECK, a former member of the Communist Party; and Arnold Johnson, a member of the CFUSA national Committee. The Committee decided that there was need for tight security against FEI investigations of anti-piot law violations. A working committee was formed to make plans for a demonstration at Washington, D. C., during the Presidential Inauguration.

March 1969

*Appeal of the conviction of Pr. Benjamin SPOCK;
Rev. Wm. Gleane COFFIN, Mitchell GCOHAN, and
Michael FERRER for conspiring to urge others to
break the duaft law is expected to come before the
Supreme Court in March.

On h Hovember, attorneys for Dr. SFOCK filed a statement in the U.S. Court of Appeals that the conviction violated their constitutional right to free speech. They filed ten issues on which they here to everturn the conviction, raising the question of whether conviction was "based upon constitutionally protected speech."

April 1969

The 19th Annual Convention of the CFUSA has been scheduled for this time.

All who plan to attend are used to bring their draft cards - presumably for a mass burning, turn-in, or some such display.

The Frace & Freedom Tarty (PFP), which spensored Eldridge CLEAVER's presidential candidacy, is reportedly highly upset with his announced "disassociation" from PFF. PFF has reportedly suffered significant financial loss from CLEAVER's failure to meet speaking obligations, for which FFF has posted bond. FFF notes that CLEAVER has become increasingly "anti-white," and midwestern FFF leaders suspect that he has become mentally unbalanced. There are allegations that the PFF, of which he is Minister of Information, intends to spirit CLEAVER out of the U. S. to an undisclosed location, to prevent his being returned to Jail.
