
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SITUATION INFORMATION REPORT

As the fall semester approaches, college and universities across the nation are preparing for the resumption of radical campus activity. The tactics seem, in most institutions, intellectually geared to east the students in the role of co-determinators of academic as well as disciplinary community policy and on the other hand to beef up campus security forces capable of maintaining order and relative tranquility no matter what. Past events (at Harvard and Columbia, for example) have, in the knowledgeable opinion of principal administrators, tended to sympathetize college moderates from both faculty and student body when outside police authorities are summoned. The well-reasoned objective then of President Cordier at Columbia, Elliott at George Washington. Puscy at Harvard and many others is to keep campus revolt familial if possible, localized if possible and under control within the academic commune. Undoubtedly, the strong possibility of infringing, limiting, and restricting Federal legislation, looming in the background, should academe be unable to solve its varied problems, has crossed the minds of secondary educators. Notre Dame's president Hesburgh cloquently summed up the societal juxtaposition of the universities in America last year when he said that an invaluable asset of a free society is manifested in and enhanced by a system of educational freedom. Once the teacher is controlled in what he may teach and how he may teach it, other accouterments and vestiges of individual liberty are in serious jeopardy.

A number of past hot spots are also trying to remove the cause of protest, be they local problems or general and universal in nature. At Columbia, Dr. Cordier has announced plans for building low rent, high rise apartments for students, faculty members, and Harlem dwellers in Morningside Heights (originally a gymnasium and sports arena was planned on the property). At Maryland, American University. George Washington University, and many other schools, recruiting of Negro students is in high gear. George Washington will increase its Negro enrollment by 25 percent (in a total student body of 13,000, still only about 200 Negroes will attend George Washington in September). On other





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
compuses. ROTG program: have been tagged for academic and administrative review and threatened with extinction or the loss of academic credit - undoubtedly, in many cases, to mollify the thrust of a proclaimed student radical revolutionary objective.


In the other camp, the movement, irrationality, philosophical differences, feuding and racial polarization resulted from the efforts of summer. The grand coalition of black Panthers and white radicals (principally SDS-NQ) expected by many, to emerge from the west coast confab in July failed to nesterialize and chiefly resulted in arguing over "who occupies the vanguard of the revolution?" The SDS summer "work-in" has been of limited success and only in a few locations. Negro students have broken with the National Student Association further polarizing white and black collegians and further undoing the work and accomplishments of rational and dedicated civil rightists over the past several decades. The search in the Negro community, on and off campus, for a "blatk identity" is lashing back and general charges of white racism are being made by black separatists, black nationalists and, in fact those who must be labeled black racists.

With regard to the summer work-in program planned by the SDS to radicalize the American workers, there is no evidence that even a slight, much less a meaningful revolutionary contribution resulted. The SWIP in Obio for instance degenerated into a training camp for civil disturbance. Several SWIP training sites (in Akron, Cleveland, and Columbus), coed communal houses, characterized by incredibly filthy living conditions have been operating since June. Sex is taboo (a manifestation of male chauvinism) as is drug use (for fear of detection and arrest) and the locations reportedly are guarded by SDS members. Friends and relatives are reportedly forbidden to enter.

Training for these commune dwellers is divided into two main areas. The first segment involves ideological indoctrination designed to instill a sense of involvement and dedication among the participants. Group members are taught that a revolution must come in the United States and that SWIP is the opening phase of this conflict. Similar uprisings are predicted in the world's under-developed nations. Books issued to SWIP participants include the works of Mao Tse-tung, Lin Phao, Fidel Castro and Che Caievara. Coupled with political indoctrination is training of a more practical sort. Instruction is given these "revolutionary communists" (a cliche most often attributed to principal SDS spokeswoman Bernadine Dohrn) in karate and figearms. Radicals in the Ohio SWIP training process are not expected to return to school in the fall

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


because they will engage in revolutionary work on a full-time basis.

The Ohio communes have been plagued with numerous difficulties. Physical problems, such as fifth and the lack of any sanitary considerations in the communal bouses is reported. Ideological differences, personality clashes, and run-ins with police have hampered a smooth operation. SDS has apparently been unable to attract wide support for this program either in other Ohio communities or in adjoining states. Therefore, while individual graduates may create problems in coming months it is not likely that large scale and general disturbances will be precipitated by the Ohio SWIPers.

What fall holds on the American college scene defies definitive prediction. Events on one campus may well trigger activity on another that otherwise might not have occurred. The targets are clear. The Negroes will seek "black relevancy" through adoption of a black studies program and "black identity" through the functioning of a black student union. The primary radical student targets are the war, the draft. ROTC nationally and local favorites such as coed dorms, fewer social restrictions, pot and halfucinogenics, and on some campuses, adoption of a free speech program. Radical successes will probably be fewer than last year, white-black dialogues will also be fewer and more strained and hopefully the heretofore silent, moderate magnamajority will more forcibly evidence its desires and presence.

Bernadine Rae Dohrn is the most vocal and erudite spokeswoman of the SDS-national office. She presently holds office on the national interim committee, the body within SDS that runs the national office between conventions. She previously (until the June 1969 convention) was the Inter-organizational Secretary, one of the top three national offices. Miss Dohrn, who publicly described herself as a "revolutionary communist" in June 1968, is an ideological party-liner perhaps a bit more radical than the CPUSA. She, in philosophy, is a Maoist but is against the PLP Negro exclusion (believed by PLP to be nationalistic and hence not purely revolutionary in terms of the "workers of the world revolt" syndromes.) She is also not in agreement with the PLP worker-student alliance theory.






Miss Dohrn was born in January 1942 at Chicago. She holds a BA degree (June 1963), a MA degree (June 1964) and a Doctor of Law degree (June 1967) all from the University of Chicago. In 1967 and 1968 she served as Student Director of the National Lawyers Guild (cited by HCUA as a communist front). Miss Dohrn was one of twenty-seven American student leaders who met with the NLF of Victnam at Budapest in September 1968 to discuss prospects of further student unrest and further draft unrest among GI's. (A trip incidentally paid for by Ramparts Magazine.) She additionally is a leading advocate of the nation-wide drive to organize high school student radicals, a drive which has unfortunately been very successful in some regions. Miss Dohrn was recently a principal guest speaker at a rally held at Berkeley's now infamous Peoples Park. Miss Dohrn is 5' 6" tall and weighs 125 pounds. She is a semi-"life styler" (long straight hair - but clean).

Miss Dohrn in a recent (mid-August) interview reported by Charles Hightower in the Daily World claimed to have met recently with representatives of the Provisional Revolutionary Government of South Vietnam (formerly the MLF) at Havana. After the meeting Miss Dohrn predicted the total defeat of American Imperialism in Asia and a "complete and total victory" for the PRG. As for Korea, she predictably took the straight and narrow party path (if it serves American interest she's against it). "It became clear to us that the struggle of the Korean people is a crucial struggle for the liberation of Asia. To our generation who grew up not knowing the issues of aggression in that war, when there was organized resistance in our country, we were greatly impressed by our discussions on the Korean situation."

Miss Dohrn is an intelligent, knowledgeable, and dedicated communist (with a small "c"). She seems to be a student of revolutionary history and oratorically has the gift of expression that stirs the radical soul. In the judgement of many, Miss Dohrn has taken or will takeover the progressive, new left female revolutionary leadership role once held by Betina Aptheker, peacenik Joan Baez and several others.

Five Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) officials, including Jeff Jones, the Inter-organizational Secretary, and




Bernadine Dohrn, the former Inter-organizational Secretary, were arrested at Chicago. Illinois, on 22 August. Police found a knife and a twenty-two caliber pistol in the car. Dohrn was in possession of three vials of material which are being checked to determine whether the material is a form of narcotics. They were arrested when police stopped the car driven by Jones for have a defective light. Jones was unable to show proof of ownership of the car, although, it was later determined that it did belong to him.

It is reported that an officer of the extremist Black Panther Party is planning to travel to North Vietnam to attempt to obtain the release of twenty United States prisoners of war in exchange for the release of Panther Buey P. Newton who is serving a manslaughter sentence in California.

It would appear, having noted perhaps with envy and some degree of alarm the increased activism of both anti-war and racial groups within the armed services, that activists on the extreme right have been encouraged to also enter that previously verboten area for agitation and revolutionary action.

A recent investigation into an airman's association with the National Socialist White People's Party (aka American Nazi Party, ANP) revealed a new tactic of the ANP designed to recruit new members and promote racial discord within the armed services. The ANP has organized a group called the White Servicemen's League and is circulating a leaflet entitled Why Tolerate The text of the leaflet is directed towards white mem-Treason. bers of the Armed Forces and suggests that National Socialism is the answer to the "race problem." It requests that white servicemen stand with National Socialism in defense of their race and their nation. It also urges them to join the White Servicements League, described as an organization "pledged to the unconditional support of white racial interests." ROPERT FRANCISM WILLIAMS

According to current press reports, Robert F. Villiams, a 44 year old expatrices Americas-born Regro from Roards, Routh Carolina, vilo for the past eight years has kept up a barrage of militant anti-V.S./pro-Commist prepagands from Cuba, Red China, Routh Viet Rou, and Tanzania, is scheduled to arrive in Detroit, Medicas, by plane from Loudon; England on Saturday, August 30th. Villiam, a fugitive from Federal justice on charges of kidnapping a white couple in Monroe, North Carolina, and holding them as hestages during racial disorders instigated by him in August 1961, fled to Cuba, via Canada, and there requested "political caylum". This Castro happily granted him; and he became a leading propagated for Castro's Government.

Villians, former precident of the Course, North Carolina, NAACP who was custed by its Estional Executive Director in 1960 after he operated an exact Engro militia in Union County, North Carolina, had not confined his various activities to the focal scene and in early 1961 and a tour on behalf of the Fair Play for Cube Committee, during which he took part in a FFCC meeting in the San Francisco Day area. New York City - The Black and Puerto Rican Student Community which led campus disruptions at City College of New York last spring are planning to disrupt the City. College of New York registration. It plans to have up to 500 individuals participating.

Washington, D. C. - The Caesar Chavez-led United Farm Workers Organizing Committee, which has been promoting a grape boycoft to demand higher wages for grape workers. plans to demonstrate at Washington, D. C., on 7 September. The demonstrators will hold a rally at the Sylvan Theater near the Washington Monument. At the conclusion of the rally, they will march to Arlington Cometery, where they hope to hold a mass near the grave of Robert F. Kennedy. They are considering inviting Mrs. Ethel Kennedy to be one of the main speakers.

Rew Orleans, Louisiana - Southern University was the scene of much disruption the past school year and former students have now organized The Black People's Party, which is calling for the repeal of riot legislation, a retraction of the governor's statement that troops would be sent to troubled campuses, the reinstatement of suspended and expelled students, and the dismissal of legal charges against students arising from last year's disruptions. Reportedly a group of expelled students plans to disrupt registration activities at the University beginning 9 September.

Chicago, Illinois - Eugene Gladstone, a member of the Steering Committee of the New Mobilization Committee to End the War (main organizer and sponsor of the proposed major demonstration of the Fall - November 15 - in Washington, D. C.), has stated that organizers will wisit campuses after school starts in September to develop support for the Fall demonstrations. A militant, but non-violent. demonstration will be held in Chicago to support the "Chicago


September 15-20

San Francisco, California - A five-day International Industrial Conference (IIC), a quadrennial affair conducted by the National Industrial Conference Board and Staintord Research Institute (SRI), will be held at the Fairmount Hotel in San Francisco. The emphasis since the first conference in 1957 has been on "Closing the World's Income Gap." The conference will bring together some 500 representatives of major industries, technological, and financial firms like U. S. Steel, IBM, Chase Manhattan Bank, etc. General Conference Chairman is David Rockefeller: Chairman of the International Council is John Loudon of Royal Dutch Shell; and U. S. Council Chairman is Roger Blough of U. S. Steel.

The April Third Movement, a coalition of protest groups at Stanford University, Palo Alto, California, which has previously been active in demonstrating against the Stanford Research Institute, has announced that it will sponsor demonstrations September 15-20, during the Conference, The April Third Movement, which is dominated by SDS, is to act as the coordinator for radical demonstrations at the Conference; and Stanford University is to be used as a base of operations. An early estimate is that from 3,000 to 5,000 radical demonstrators, mainly from SDS, will travel to San Francisco for the Conference. The students say the conference "is designed to consolidate the dominion of the multi-national corporations in the third world." The movement has also announced that it will continue its investigation of Government research at both the Institute and the University and will also consider the areas. Authorities feel there is a definite possibility of violence during the demonstrations.

September 16

Southwest, United States - Mexican American and other Spanish-speaking votaths intend to shut down the schools of the Southwest on 16 September in a demonstration of solidarity and protest on the anniversary date of the



Mexican Revolution. According to Rudolpho Corky Convoles. leader of the Grasade for Justice, it will be a demonstration to change the whole educational system to relate to our needs.

September 24

Chicago, Illinois - Triat has been set for 24 September for the "Chicago Eight" protest leaders indicted on charges of conspiracy to incite a riot in connection with the disorders at the Democratic National Convention last fall. All eight pleaded "not guilty" in Frderal District Court on "April. Each defendant also faces charges of crossing state lines to foment disorder or to otherwise Fedate the Civil Rights Act of 1968. Rennie Davis, Bobby Scale, John R. Freines, and Lee Weiner had their travel restrictions eased but are required to keep the Court tully informed of their movements.

September 27.

Chicago, Illinois - SDS is reported to be planning to participate in a demonstration on 27 September in support of the trial defendants, the self-proclaimed "Conspiracy Eight." Other protest activities are being planned later during the trial.

October - November *In view of the number of actions already noted as planned for October and November, 1969, they are not repeated in this week's calendar. As additional or new information becomes available re this period, it will be included in subsequent issues.
