





5. Information obtained by on 27 September 1968 from a source of unknown reliability indicated that groups of four Black Fanthers, driving Volkswagens, are cruising in the South Bay area. Three of the occupants wear white turtle-neck sweaters and the fourth, the team leader, wears a black turtle-neck sweater. They reportedly cruise until they find a police unit. Then they reportedly attempt to commit a traffic violation; and, when cited, they provoke an incident. 'As a means of identifying themselves to each other, they remove the hub caps on the rear wheels of the vehicles. Advised that the following license tags reportedly are on Volkswagens in the possession of Black Panther members:

a member of the Black Panthers, was stopped by police officers on 28 September 1968 because he was driving with his 'lights off at 4130 s.m. became belligerent and told the officers he was stopped only because he was black and they were white. Officers observed a bandolest of 25 rounds of "four-10"-guage shotgun shells on the front seat and a box of .22 caliber long rifle ammunition. said, "I'm not going to tell you honkys anything. You'll find out soon enough." When asked why he was wearing an army field jacket, replied, "The next time one of you honkys stop me, I'm going to put a builst in your head; andthen everybody will know why we wear the jackets."




