- 1. At 1100 hours on the 31st of January 1968 the undersigned met with the Special Agent for the Federal Bureau of Investigation is
- 2. The purpose of this meeting was to make arrangements for the introduction of Subjects to the FBI representative. Special Agentical
- 3. At the specific direction of the Director of Security, the undersigned made the above arrangements for the purpose stated.
- responsible for the past year for the handling of Subjects through Gperation MERRIMACK in an effort to permit access to possible information regarding possible demonstrations or acts of civil disobedience against this Agency, its installations or its personnel.
- 5. The activity of Subjects for the past year did not involve information regarding the internal security of the United States until recently when the Came exposed to information indicating Soviet involvement in the Women's Strike for Peace organization in Washington, D. C.

Agent to be introduced to Subjects through at 1730 hours this date. During the meeting with Special Agent described his past relationship and handling of Subjects. Special Agent was informed by and statement signed by Subjects that their initial impression to being handled by the FBI was negative. However, they realized that it was their patriotic duty to have an audience with Special Agent and would be happy to listen and talk with him with regard to their past activities.

7. If Subjects do or do not agree to continue their activities under the supervision of the FBI, this, it is clearly understood by Special Agent and the undersigned as well as will be a matter of decision for the Subjects to make. Regardless of the decision by Subjects, they will not be used further in Operation MERRIMACK without the specific approval of the Director of Security on any future requirements.
