

SUBJECT: MICHAOS Survey of Stations, August-September 1972


- 1. The Special Operations Group, Counter Intelligence Staff and Headquarters conducted
  a cable survey of Headquarters conducted
  August and September 1972. The survey was initiated
  prior to the survey of those stations by the Inspector
  General but the time span of some of the replies coincided
  with the IG survey.
- 2. The following analytical summary of the responses covers the extent of foreign liaison involvement with MHCHAOS requirements, problems involving station liaison with the FBI and any special problems raised by stations regarding the legitimacy/objectives of the MHCHAOS program.
- 3. Cables to field stations were custom-tailored to each station but all contained the following common background paragraph:

"To insure common basis this review re targetting. Has recapitulating following FYI. Generally, the bulk of our collection effort involves coverage of selected visitors/travelers for possible direct or indirect linkage with hostile foreign govts/groups/ parties/intel services, as means of determining basis existence/extent of foreign exploitation of/involvement in domestic U.S. dissidence/ extremism. Info from all appropriate station unilateral assets as well as from liaison is needed. Altho liaison aspect represents occasional duplication with FO IPCS or visiting rep, CIA, not FOI, has primary CI responsibility abroad and stations. are primary action arm of . M.S. God in dealing with liaison services on MICHAOS-related matters. Further, and most important, CA has responsibility of providing, upon request,

special finished studies/reports, etc., on matters involving MiCHAOS. These normally have very short time deadline and must be prepared on basis of immediately available CI info; we cannot rely on timely receipt of such info from foreign liaison via FO/Hqs. The number of specially required special/CIA studies/reports has been increasing, with more to date this year than all of last year."



thought that a redefinition of the scope of the program was needed because of the increasing appearance of U.S. citizens in activities involving the has been told that use of MICHAOS channels to report U.S. involvement in such activities is necessary to identify and monitor linkages in foreign efforts abroad to support/encourage/exploit domestic U.S. dissidence.

- b. commented that it did not wish to call into question the general formulation of CIA responsibility for counter intelligence abroad (cited in paragraph 3 above). It suggested, however, that the Station "continue to exercise its pre-eminent responsibility for CI matters which can be identified with hostile foreign states or institutions...and leave with the FBI, as in the past, concern for the activities at home or abroad which cannot reasonably be associated with such hostile foreign direction."
- 8. Essentially CIA does exactly what suggests above. There is a problem in that field stations often do not know the full background on individuals on whom information is sought regarding their foreign-related contacts and activities while abroad. The bulk of such requirements on CIA originate in the Department of Justice, including the FBI. Some are self-initiated when there is a history of prior contact/involvement with the Chinese Communists and/or Cubans, DRY/PRG representatives. Soviets, North Koreans the sole purpose of the toverage is to determine if there are foreign linkages and the purpose/objective involved. Negative reporting on the absence of hostile foreign linkages is as important as positive reporting.

The foreign linkage aspect of the requirements and the foreign locus of the clandestine collection action (unilateral and liaison) constitute the rationale and justification for this particular exercise of the Agency's responsibilities for collection of foreign counterintelligence information. CI/SO, in conjunction with all the CS operating divisions, exercises a continuing scrutiny of its requirements to the field to insure that day-to-day traffic fully reflects paragraph 8 above.
- 11. An active collection program, however, requires the use of appropriate field personnel on a need-to-know basis determined by each Chief of Station.
