LEADERSHIP SIMINAR FOR STUDENTS OF THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

#### SECTION I - REQUEST

The United States National Student Absociation respectfully requests a grant in the amount of One Thousand and Eight Dollars and Eighty Cents (\$1,008.80) for the support of a Leadership Seminar for Student Leaders of the Dominican Republic.

#### SECTION 11 -FUFFOSE

During the period of the Irujillo government, demogratic student forces in the Leminican Republic found it impossible to function due to government supression. With the fall of Trujillo, these groups found themselves in a position to operate openly and to exercise the Desessarv functions of student leadership.

It is unfortunate that due to the long period of supression, the experience of student leavers is severely limited. Fecupating this, the United States National Student Association undertook negotiations with student leavers of Venezuela, and a seminar has been arranged which will provide necessary leavership training to a group of four student leaders of the Lominican Republic.

It is hoped that the seminar will provide the students with semistication at both the theoretical and technical planes which will be explicit to student programs within the Dominican Republic. We believe that the experience resulting from the seminar will have immediate effects upon the quantity and quality of student programs. It should also prepare the students for their dealings internationally with other student organizations.

#### SECTION III -PERIOD

The Program will begin with attendance at the World Christian Democratic Youth Congress which begins in Caracas on May 7,1962 and will end on May 25,1962.



#### ANGOLAN STUDENT CONFERENCE IN THE UNITED STATES

SECTION I - The United States National Student Association (USNSA) Pespectfully requests of the Foundation for Youth And Student Affairs a grant in the amount of four hundred and thirty six dollars and twenty five cents to cover the expenses of an Angolan Student Conference help during the period December 9 - 10, 1961.

#### SECTION II - Purpose

The Angolan Student Conference in the United States was held Greenland, Fennsylvania during the period December 9 - 10, 1961.
