MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR.

Mr. Carusi called today and stated that he had heard a rumor to the effect that Dillinger had been apprehended in Detroit. I called the Detroit office in connection with this matter and Agent Meekins stated that the International News Service had called that office and advised they had a flash in Chicago to the effect that Dillinger had been apprehended in Detroit; that the information originated with the Ferndale Police; that at 1:30 some woman called the Ferndale Police Department; that she was driving in the vicinity of Woodward when she observed a Buick Coupe bearing Indiana license teg 457554; that it was driven by a man; that his features resembled Dillinger's; that she followed the automobile for a few miles so she could get a good look at the man; that the man looked like the photographs she had seen of Dillinger and she communicated this information to the Ferndale police. Agent Meekins said that he had just received a call from the International News Service to the effect that the license referred to was issued to one W. R./Riblet, of Elkhart, Indiana. He stated that this information had been communicated to the Cincinnati office with instructions that they determine the identity of the owner of the car. Agent Meekins advised that no one has been taken into custody and that the information was based on the telephone call from the woman in question, said call being an anonymous one. Agent Meekins was instructed to immediately convey this information to the Chicago office with instructions that said office cover the matter.

Mr. Purvis was instructed to get in touch with Agent in Charge Larson and advise him that he should not return to Detroit at the present time but should continue his stay in Muncie in an undercover capacity in an effort to obtain further information through Barry, referred to in a teletype message from Chicago, and the confidential informant.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR.

Agent in Charge Larson called from Muncie, Indiana, and advised that the set-up there looks good; that Monday morning his informant called him at Detroit that later at Huncie he gave him information to the effect that Hamilton and Dillinger were going to kidnap Mr. Ball; that Hamilton was at Muncie at the Pastime Club looking over the situation; that yesterday morning a detective at the Muncie Police Department called Agent Morton at Indianapolis and advised him that he wanted to see him immediately on a kidnaping matter; that Morton went to see Collins, the detective, and Collins told Morton the same information as the informant had given Larson; that Collins told him that a reputable attorney by the mame of Guy Ogle, who is now running for Judge, confidentially told lim, Collins, last Tuesday night that a man by the name of pencyllians, who had served a sentence at Leavenworth on a Post Office robbery charge. got drunk last Tuesday and told him, tigle, that a men by the name of Y. Y. Smith known as Dr. Smith, had told him last Sunday that he was going to send a stranger to see him; that this stranger came to see Williams and discussed a kidnaping deal with him and told Williams that they wanted him to act as go-between. Mr. Larson advised that his informant told him last Monday that Millians is to act as go-between in the Ball case.

Agent in Charge Larson discussed the advisability of having an Agent ride to work with Mr. Ball in the morning and home with him at night, to act as a guard. He was instructed not to suggest this procedure to Mr. Ball. Mr. Larson said that Mr. Ball did not take the matter very seriously but that he was going to see him again this afternoon when he will advise him that he has received the same information from two different sources.

Mr. Larson advised that he is keeping in close touch with developments and will send in a detailed report relative to this matter this afternoon.

Dear Sir:

There are enclosed, herewith, copies of letters addressed by me to Mr. Dwight H. Green, the United States Attorney, and to Mr. H. C. W. Laubenheimer, the United States Marshal for the Northern District of Illinois, in connection with the John Herbert Dillinger, with aliases, Pugitive, National Motor Vehicle Theft Act.

I communicated with Mr. Green by telephone and informed him of the fact that I had been informed by Mr. King, Chief Deputy Marshal, Chicago, that he plans to remove Evelyn Frechette from Chicago to St. Paul, leaving Chicago at 6:00 P.M. today, wis the Burlington Railroad, and that he plans to send only one Deputy Marshal and a woman guard with her. I also informed Mr. Green that in view of the fact that it is my information that Dillinger hopes to release his friends in the Columbus, Ohio, Penitentiary, as well as the Frechette woman. I believed that he would desire to take this matter up with the United States Marshal, in order to see that such steps as are necessary be taken to sufficiently sugment the guard removing the Frechette woman to St. Paul.

Mr. Laubenheimer called me this morning and stated that Mr. Green had brought this matter to his attention and I reiterated my suggestion to the Marshal. He inquired as to whether I could send any Special Agents along for this purpose and I informed him that I could not do so, and that I would suggest that he take such steps as are necessary to procure sufficient deputies or guards for this purpose.

There is also attached, hereto, a copy of a letter received from Mr. Green concerning this matter today.

Dear Sir:

Receipt is hereby acknowledged of your letter of even date with reference to the removal of Evelyn Frechette, with aliases, to St. Paul, Minn. Please be advised that I have discussed this matter with H. C. W. Laubenheimer, United States Marshal for this district, and have advised him of the importance of having sufficient guards in removing this defendant to St. Paul, Minn. He stated that under the departmental regulations it was necessary for him to have a woman guard accompany the defendant and that he would have to send such a woman guard, together with a male deputy, and that the only arrangement he could make of this character was to have a deputy who was married accompany this defendant, together with his wife. I advised him of the information you had given me regarding possible attempts on the part of John Herbert Dillinger to rescue this woman from the custody of the authorities and that it was your opinion and my opinion that he should have four additional men as guards. He then stated that if you wanted to send some of your men, as you did in the Sankey case, that that would be entirely satisfactory to him. He also stated that he was considering having this defendant removed from Chicago to St. Paul. Minn. via airplane, and that if so, it would not be necessary for him to send a woman guard along as the trip would only consume two and one-half hours and that he thought you would be able to spare some men for at least a day. I told him that it was advisable for him to discuss this matter with you and he stated that he would do so.



: JOHN DILLINGER, with aliases, I. O. 1217 - FUGITIVE, et al. MAYTA. HARBORING FUG. FROM JUSTICE. 8t. Paul file No. 26-2454.

Concerning the proposed coroner's inquest relative to the death of Edward Green with aliases, you are advised that Mr. Hamni has informed me that a few days ago, two local newspapers in St. Penl telephoned him to inquire concerning a proposed inquest. Mr. Hanni replied that he had no information concerning such a proposal. He stated that the following day, or later in the afternoon, Assistant County Attorney Lynch called at his office with United States Attorney Sullivan of St. Paul; and Mr. Lynch advised that Mr. Thompson of the St. Paul Dispatch had questioned him as to the goroner's inquest concerning the death of Green and the part that he was to take in this inquest. Mr. Lynch stated at the time that he understood that Thompson was the instigator of the inquiry. The County Attorney said that he informed Thompson that if he did enything about this matter, he would start with an investigation of the shooting at 95-95 South Lexington Avenue for the purpose of initiating prosecution against those who had attempted to murder efficers.

Mr. Hanni advised also that some remark was made, either by Assistant County Attorney Lynch or by some newspaper correspondent who called by telephone (he does not remember which), indicating that the Deputy Coroner, as well as Reporter Thompson, had made the inquiry as to what right a Federal agent had to some to St. Paul and shoot down a citizen without giving an explanation for it.

Mr. Henni stated that some time later, the Deputy Coroner, Michael Leonard, called at the St. Paul Division effice and asked for Mr. Mathan or Mr. Clegg and both of them were out at the time, and Mr. Hanni agreed to call Mr. Leonard upon the return of either. In keeping with this agreement, Mr. Hanni called the Deputy Coroner subsequently; and while Mr. Hanni was engaged in a conference with three individuals in his office, Deputy Coroner Leonard stuck his head in the door and Mr. Hanni asked him

to wait for a moment. Mr. Hanni completed his conference with those who were present with him and then went to look for Mr. Leonard and he was gone.

Upon first calling, Mr. Leonard indicated that he desired to obtain the names of those who would be proper witnesses at a coroner's inquest and that this inquest was merely for the purpose of keeping the records straight.

United States Attorney Sullivan indicated that he called on Mr. Hanni with Assistant County Attorney Lynch but he disclosed that he had no personal knowledge that Thompson was the instigator of this inquest.

On Saturday, April 14, 1934, Deputy Coroner Leonard come to the St. Paul office and asked for Mr. Mathan. Mr. Mathan took him to Mr. Sullivan's office where at a joint conference, it was agreed that if it were necessary to hold an inquest, Mr. Hanni would attend and would afford such information as might throw light upon the manner in which Edward Green came to his death. The Deputy Coroner seemed to be extremely nervous and apologetic.

On Monday, April 16, 1954, Thompson of the St. Paul Dispatch called at the St. Paul office and asked Mr. Mathan for the names of the witnesses who were to appear at the inquest. Mr. Mathan told Mr. Thompson that inamuch as the inquest was his, Thompson's personally initiated and personally conducted inquest, the inquiry should be directed to Mr. Thompson, who, of course, would be fully informed as to the facts. Thompson then stated that he was putting the "heat" to the proper local officials only in order that the citizens of St. Paul might be protected. Mr. Mathan said, "You mean the criminals of St. Paul." Mr. Thompson said, "Mo. The citizens." This colloquy was not acrimonious and both parties thereto appeared to be in the best of humor. It is recorded here only as indicating admission on the part of Mr. Thompson that he is responsible for the inquest in question.

In a later conference on the morning of Monday, April 16, 1954, with United States Attorney Sullivan, Mr. Sullivan stated that to the best of his recollection, this is the first time an inquest has been conducted into the shooting of a gangster by the law enforcement efficials.

There is attached hereto a copy of a proposed statement which Mr. Hanni is to make in the event he is subposed to appear before the coroner's jury, together with copy of answers to questions which may be asked at that particular time. Arrangements are being made so that at the time of the inquiry, Mr. Hanni, Mr. Mathan, and United States Attorney Sullivan are to be present.

There is also enclosed herewith a copy of a memorandum submitted by Special Agent R. C. Coulter relative to the identification of Edward Green as one of the perpetrators of a bank robbery at Sioux Falls, South Dakota.

Special Agent in Charge Werner Hanni has communicated with Charles Tierney, Chief of Detectives of the St. Paul Police Department, who advised Mr. Hanni that he had never heard of an inquest relative to the killing of a gangster in St. Paul by police. Mr. Tierney has been connected with the Police Department for fourteen years.



MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR.

Agent in Charge Larson called from Muncie, Indiana. He stated that he had talked with his confidential informant there yesterday; that the informant told him that Hamilton is in Muncie; that he is supposed to be there figuring to "snatch" a man by the name of Ball, a millionaire manufacturer of fruit jars. Mr. Larson stated that his informant left yesterday morning with specific instructions as to what he should do but that he has not returned as yet; that he is waiting for him at the present time; that he does not think his failure to return is an indication that he will not produce; that he has confidence in the informant and believes that he will return.

Agent in Charge Larson was instructed to handle this matter independently and not to request local assistance. He was told that if the local authorities had any information he should take advantage of same. He was also instructed to clear all of his information through the Chicago office and was told to call the Chicago office at least once a day and in the event of any developments he should call as often as necessary.





Dear Sir:

Reference is made to your letter dated April 14, 1934, and annexes thereto, wherein reference is made to the fact that Miss Amanda Thomas, daughter of the Warden of the Ohio State Penitentiary, Columbus, Ohio, intends to visit Washington, D. C., this week, and anticipates stopping at the Army & Mavy Hotel; also, to the alleged plan which has been uncovered whereby the subjects in this case intend to kidnep and hold Miss Thomas for ransom for the release of subject Dillinger's associates who are now confined in that Penitentiary.

Miss Thomas was located at the Army & Navy Hotel, 820 Connecticut Ave., N. W., and in accordance with arrangements made with her, she was interviewed at the Washington Field Office by Special Agent R. P. Burfuss in the presence of Special Agent Louis Loebl. During this interview Miss Thomas gave a detailed statement of the conditions existing in the Ohio State Penitentiary and more particularly furnished data and information having to do with the activities of the immates which may have some bearing on a further attempt by subject Dillinger to make a delivery at that institution. I am transmitting herewith nine copies of an unsigned statement which incorporates all the data furnished by Miss Thomas.

Miss Thomas stated that she has no fear or apprehension of being molested or troubled in any way during her stay at Washington and she was informed that should anything of an unusual nature occur during her stay here, that she should immediately telephone to the Washington Field Office during the day and to Mational 7117 at night. She stated that she intended to leave Washington for New York City on Friday, April 20, 1934. Agent Burruss informed Miss Thomas that if she so desired the New York Office would be informed of her arrival there and of the hotel where she intended to stop and that the Division would extend to her every cooperation and protection which may be needed.

Miss Thomas took occasion to state that she has had very close cooperation afforded her in the past by Agent Harris, the resident Agent at Columbus, Ohio, and she rather indirectly indicated that should an Agent call upon her in connection with this matter upon her return to the institution, next week, or should an Agent interview her father, who is the Warden of the institution, that they would be very pleased to discuss what additional information may come to their attention with that Agent.







Memorandum for Special Agent in Charge R. A. Alt:

Reference is made to Division letter, dated March 21, 1934, transmitting a communication received by Mr. Hoover from Senevieve Bledsoe, dated at Kissimmee, Florida, March 9th.

From Mr. C. N. Phillips, Assistant Postmaster, Kissimmee, Fla., it was learned that Miss Bledsoe came to that city around March 5, 1934, from Tuscon, Arizona, and rented post office box number 252. She wrote several letters to the postmaster from Tuscon for a box reservation. Since her arrival in Kissimmee, she has been staying with one W. W. Harris, self styled writer and inventor. Mr. Harris is about seventy years old, and has been in Kissimmee for almost a year. According to Mr. Phillips, Miss Bledsoe has acted queerly, and has been in communication with the Division, the Pinkerton Detective Agency and Attorney General Carey D. Landis of Tallahassee. In fact, she gave Mr. Landis as one of her references when she applied for the post office box.

W. W. Harris, 109 Bass Street, informed that he met Miss Bledsoe at Inglewood, Fla., in October 1933; that at that time she, like himself, was a guest at the resort hotel in that city. He further stated that he is a writer and inventor, and, because of the interested to literary tastes, a friendship sprung up between them, and, she being a stenographer, helped him with some of his work. Mr. Harris knew her in Inglewood for about three months. While there also Bledsoe was visited by her mother, Wrs. M. R. Gennon of Tallahassee, Florida, who is probably employed in one of the state offices in that city. Miss: Bledsoe left Inglewood and went out West. For a while she was in the Veterans' Hospital at Whipple, Arizona, having been in some way connected with military forces during the late war. While confined in the hospital she communicated with Mr. Harris, and after leaving the hospital, she went to either Prescott or Tuscon, Arizona, and from there she wrote to Mr. Harris asking him if he could employ her for stemographic work, if she came to Florida. Mr. Harris left Inglewood about a year ago and has since been living in Kissimmee. Mr. Harris advised Hiss Bledsoe that he could use her for part time secretarial work, and, accordingly, she left Arizona and proceeded to Kissimmee, Fla., arriving in the latter city around March 5, 1934.

Mr. Harris further informed me that Hiss Bledsoe is an excellent stemographer, and has at no time given any indication of being mentally

C., had informed the Washington Field Office that she was leaving Washington by train at 1:00 P.M. Miss Thomas furnished this information to the Washington Field Office, as previously requested, when she was interviewed by Agents at that office concerning the rumor that Dillinger and his gang were planning to kidnap and hold her for the release of their associates now in the penitentiary.



MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR.

Mr. Clegg called me from St. Paul this morning concerning the automobiles situation growing out of the Dillinger matter. He states three automobiles are involved. One, a Terraplane, which was purchased and belongs to Bessie Green and which was driven up to the house the afternoon Eugene Green was killed. He states there is a machine gum bullet through the motor of this car; that Bessie Green wants to claim the car and he does not believe that there is any way in which the Division could take possession of this particular machine.

A Hudson car was driven to Mankato by Van Meter and Herrell and Mr. Clegg states that there will probably never be any attempt to secure the return of this car.

A Ford car was abandoned in front of the Lexington Avenue apartment which had a machine gum in it.

Mr. Clegg has talked with the United States Attorney and exhibited to him papers used in Chicago in securing possession of a car there involved in one of our cases. The United States Attorney states that the papers are absolutely no good and that the rightful owner could come in and secure possession of the car. He suggested that the Director of the Division or the Agent in Charge at St. Paul declare that the Division has possession of the Hudson and Ford cars and he believes that by this procedure the continuel use of the cars may be secured because the rightful owners are not likely to appear in view of the fact that the rightful owners of the Hudson and Ford cars would be charged with crimes upon making an appearance. This procedure will not result in securing title to the cars but continued use of them.

I told Mr. Clegg to follow this procedure and do whatever the United States Attorney believed to be necessary to secure these cars. I instructed him to advise the Division in detail as to the procedure followed as I thought it might be some indication of some way in which we might handle the situation involving the armored Cadillac now in the possession of the Division at Washington.

From a chicago source, I have learned that the above THEODORE RENZ ALIAS BIG TED" was accompanied when robbing banks by a small man about 5 feet 3 or 4 inches in height, who acted as a machine gunner for RENZ on such occasions. Incidentally, for your information, it may be that if above machine gunner are one and the same man, that THEODORE RENZ is also with DILLINGER at the present time. Benz also has a younger brother who generally accompanies the gang, but as yet have not learned his name; however, your department may have this information.

I have inclosed herewith a photo of HENZ for your use.


